Subject: Property of Files.

To : Joint Directors, Panama Sub-Commission, A.C.

1. There has been under discussion for some time the
desirable disposition of those Property Control files affecting
individual properties. More particularly the possibility
has been considered of obtaining permission to turn such files
over to the interested Embassies and Legations. It would
appear important that this question be cleared at the present
time.

2. There are two sets of files on each property, one
regional and one Headquarters. The question has been discussed
at considerable length with Sr. Di Venuti, Principal Attorney
by the American Embassy, and an inspection made of the
archives at AC. At that time the matter was discussed with
Captain Collins, the Archivist, who approved the view that
no AC files should leave archives. He further stated that
all files should be available to interested agencies and that
Property Control files when needed could be loaned to
whichever or withdrawn by the embassy for its private use.
It was Sr. Di Venuti's initial opinion that such an arrange-
ment would be satisfactory if it is contemplated that the
archives would remain under military or other Allied control
with the consequent assurance that high standards in their
maintenance would continue to exist.

3. It is the view of the undersigned that the opinion
of the Archivist should prevail and that considerable con-
fusion might eventually result if the files left AC control.
In the event, for example, that a mixed office commission be
established, centralized files would be highly important
in the studies and determinations of such commission.

Further questions may arise, even in future years, as to actions taken by personnel in the Property Control Division and for the protection of such personnel files should be available for instruction at any time. A ruling is requested as to whether or not the various subdivisions may be advised that it will be our policy to insist that Property Control files shall be placed for permanent custody in the Archives.

1. The Consulate-General, Genoa has applied through the British Embassy for permission to take into its custody all files of the Property Control Office Genoa relating to British properties in the Genoa Consular District.

2. The disposal of these files forms part of a wider question which is at present under discussion at this H.Q., and the procedure for the disposal of your records will remain as prescribed in Establishment Memorandum No. 3. *62 MAR 45*

3. If the Consulate-General desires to borrow certain records, the request should be confined to those specific files for which immediate usefulness exists at the time the request is made. The loan of files "in case they might be needed" cannot be considered.
