STAFF MEETING HELD 1 JULY 1946

Meeting opened at 16:00 hours. Colonel Walton presided.

1. Colonel Walton stated that there were no announced changes in plans for future operations of Allied Commission.

2. Lt.Col.Snapp reported that the food situation in Italy at the present time is excellent. During the month of June some 300,000 to 400,000 tons of the new wheat crop had been delivered to the Ammassi. The price of wheat delivered to the Ammassi is much higher this year, and therefore much more effective insofar as obtaining early deliveries. The price with bonus, up to July 10 is about 3,000 lire per quintale for soft wheat and a little more for hard wheat.

Decision has been made to restore the 2,000 grams pasta ration for July.

At the present time there is no thought of repaying diversions, since these diversions were made when the UNRRA import program fell considerably behind schedule.

Sugar shipments will be greatly delayed, according to the last reports, but the 100 gram sugar ration will be continued during July.

Col. Snapp reported that a study of the 10-day reports submitted by Venezia-Giulia/Udine over the last 120 day period indicate that the stocks of food on hand and being unloaded now will be enough, if they continue to issue at the same rate as during the last four months, to last nearly a year. This includes such items as meat, fish, milk, fats and oils, dried vegetables and powdered eggs. It is felt that some action should be taken to avoid spoilage of this food in the warehouses. Col. Walton directed that Lt. Col. Snapp give this matter his attention, and if necessary make an inspection trip to Venezia-Giulia/Udine.

Col. Snapp also reported that some food shipments marked for Allied Commission and stored in Naples were completely lost by spoilage. Col. Walton directed that Col. Snapp clear this situation up through UNRRA and the Italian Ministry of Food, since such food shipments have been turned over to UNRRA and the Italian Government and they should not be allowed to assume that the food is A.C. food and let it rot in the warehouses.

It was reported that prices have not changed much.

Major Laughlin stated the POL situation was about the same as last week.

There are some indications that the informal meetings held by CIF and the employees' association are making headway and it is hoped that complete settlement will be negotiated.

The production of coal for Sardinia for the month of July will be approximately 73,000 tons. The actual arrivals of coal in June were 129,550 tons. Stock on hand as of 1 July is 370,000 tons, estimated arrivals during July, 450,000 tons; permitted allocations for July 475,000 tons.

Allied Commission has received information concerning the final agreement on power between France and Italy. The areas of Drige and Tende Valleys which are reported to go to France will include the hydro plants situated in those areas. It is

reported that France, however, is to insure that a part of the power output from the plants involved will continue to go to Italy.

4. Major Elliott reported that a tobacco warehouse at Lecce has been deroquisitioned during the past week. G-5, AFHQ has confirmed that the U.S. Navy is to take over the Ansaldo plant. Navy Sub-Commission is inquiring into this matter.

5. Capt. De John stated that his work on deroquisitioning is limited to deroquisitioning other than industrial properties. At the moment his work is largely that of liaison between the requesting party and the military authority. Col. Walton asked that Major Elliott and Captain De John review their activities to determine where, if possible, coordination and consolidation of their activities could be arranged.

6. Lt. Arnsberg stated that two coal ships are due to arrive in Venezia-Giulia/Udine this week. He is suggesting that they follow allocation's made on ship's manifest.

A coal ship is due to arrive from the U.S. about 6 July. No further reports have been received regarding coal shipments from the Ruhr. Notification has been received that loading of Ruhr coal would start about 4 July.

POL allocations have been made by the U.S.T. for Venezia-Giulia XIII Corps for 1000 tons of fuel oil. AFHQ has instructed that AMG Udine get their supply from XIII Corps on loan pending reply from Washington. No answer has been received, but this will be followed up.

7. Col. Walton stated that Lt. Col. Scoggins, Director of the Transportation & Shipping Branch is to leave the Economic Section for duty in Trieste. He expressed appreciation to Col. Scoggins for his services. Col. Walton asked that Col. Scoggins and Col. Snapp try to make an arrangement whereby XIII Corps would supply its own man for the Port Liaison work, thus releasing Capt. Vaughn, Transportation Officer, A.C. for duty here.

8. Major Bates stated that Major Roworth.. will be leaving the Milan Office of CEM shortly, and Major Strochan-Audas is going on leave to England sometime this week. Lt. Warren will

be in charge of the Milan Office. Inasmuch as the Milan Office is due to close within a few days Major Dates said he would like to send the Chief Clerk from Rome to Milan to assist in preparing the files for shipment to Rome. Col. Walton concurred.

9. Lt. Mollin submitted the charts showing status of the files of all Trenches. Col. Walton enjoined all Directors make every effort to get their files ready for turn-over to Archives.

10. Major Rothery stated that the determination of the items for import into Venezia-Giulia is a major problem at the moment. Reserve Commodity Lists have again been furnished XIII Corps and it is hoped that within a short time this matter will be resolved.

Meeting adjourned at 16:45 hours.

1. The statement made at your Conference yesterday by Economic Section that Archives are not in a position to receive Records in any quantity is incorrect and should be disbursed. I have reported to Col. Walton substantially as follows:-

- (a) Until a Records Officer is appointed to e Branch, plans to take over their files cannot be discussed. FOOD Section R/O has still to be selected. Two demands to Economic Section have been made. (This also applies to Public Relations. His successor may however be less busy.)
- (b) Until Master Files can be prepared and agreed with the Branch concerned, it would be illogical to accept files. The whole of C1/C2/C3 files have had to be carefully card-indexed since in several cases the same file number has been used in three different sub-divisions. This has taken my staff two days to co-ordinate but is now done. In another office of this Section old files are still being cleaned and sorted.

(c) The remaining Branches and Sub-Committees are well-in-hand although no one can inform me when is "D" Day for Alcan's close down or which Branch will close first. Further, how much "D Day" will be allowed after closing down date. I have therefore to concentrate upon the largest Sections first.

2. Archives Branch is neither overworked or understaffed. I am holding the two vacancies of Officers (A) (B) for Micro-Film co-ordination when it becomes as we do not want them yet. What we could do with is two good O/S's on long release. C 1 (A), (B), know this but good men are hard to find.

3. The Branch is working very well indeed and providing it is not necessary to take key officers away for such things as MARINA COORD, or P.G.C.U. (which is another report to you) I can guarantee continued output of ~~20~~ Twenty thousand documents daily (total last night 1,497/240) and the taking over of H.Q. files in an organised way during the next fortnight.

CIVIL SUPPLY COMMITTEE AND CENTRAL ECONOMIC COMMITTEE

The files in this archive group were sent to Archives by Region 3. They were compiled by Lt. Col. Kerrall, and were left by him in the custody of Region 3. It seems clear, however, that they should not be regarded as Region 3 files. Lt. Col. Kerrall was at one time assigned to Region 3, and presumably left the files with that office as a matter of convenience.

During the latter part of 1943 and the early part of 1944, Lt. Col. Kerrall was Chief Supply Officer, AMG 15 Army Group. The following extract is taken from cable Ds 277, 25 Mar 43, in file CSC 216 -

"Lt. Col. Kerrall Chairman newly formed Civil Supply Committee established supplies to co-ordinate Resources Board matters on civil side for all Italy....."

It seems evident that these files were opened by Lt. Col. Kerrall in his capacity as Chairman of the CSC. Under the authority of AFHQ Admin. Memo. 92 (19 Dec 43), the Central Economic Committee was created, and this body absorbed the functions of the CSC (see Lt. Col. Kerrall's note dated 2 Jan 44 in file CSC 215).

This archive group falls naturally into three sections, indicated by the different prefixes of the files themselves - CSC, CSC, and AMG.

The CSC series appears to relate purely to technical Economic and Supply matters. The CSC series seems to have been commenced at a later date, and to relate to the "domestic" affairs of the CSC. The files numbered CSC 250 - CSC 255 were received as part of the CSC series. They have been retained in that arrangement, because they are of a technical nature, and appear to be a continuation of the CSC series, despite the changed prefix. It is probable that they were given the CSC prefix because the CSC held

been absorbed by the OEC before the date on which these files were opened.

The file series bearing the prefix ANC appears to duplicate, as regards both title and serial number, the Economic and Supply files of ANC 15 Army Group. The original files of ANC 15 Army Group have already been accounted for; some of these files are now with Archives; others are still with the Economic and Supply section (E.C.) or with its sub-commissions. The papers in the files which belonged to Lt. Col. Merrall are copies, almost without exception. It is thought, therefore, that this fragmentary ANC series partly reproduces files of the original ANC 15 Army Group series, and that Lt. Col. Merrall extracted certain information (in the form of copies) from the ANC 15 Army Group series, and kept duplicate files on the more important matters, for his personal reference and convenience.

The files so far received from the Economic Section do not form part of any recognisable numerical series. They appear to be collections of papers made at different times by different officers of the Economic Section.

The condition in which these papers were received leaves a good deal to be desired. Many of the files are unbound, and some of the papers are not even arranged in file covers. In the absence of any close knowledge of the details of the work of the Economic Section, it would be difficult to re-arrange the papers in proper form. Moreover, they appear to be fragmentary, and in the absence (at the present time) of any other records of Economic Section for reference purposes, any work which might be done on the papers at this stage would necessarily be incomplete and inconclusive. From a superficial examination, it would appear that many of the papers are of considerable importance. The papers are therefore being retained exactly as received, in the hope that at some later date, when further Economic Section records have been received in Archivus, a clearer indication of the content can be given

redundant files to Archives however, in some cases, (e.g. Ports and Warehouse
Division) it is necessary to retain files so that UNRRA may have ready access
to them.
3. Since the Economic Section has consolidated and in anticipation
of lessening UNRRA needs for our files it is expected that the volume of files
being turned into Archives will increase.

TO : Supply Group,
Food & Agriculture Sub-Commission,
Industry & Utilities Sub-Commission,
Transportation & Shipping Sub-Commission.

1. Further to previous oral instructions, each Sub-Commission or Branch whose work will eventually be carried out by UNRRA is requested to start and maintain parallel files on UNRRA matters and on joint UNRRA/AC/SC/10 matters handled by the Sub-Commission or Branch.

2. No specific instructions are considered necessary as to the method by which this will be accomplished since the Sub-Commissions and Branches are free to use their previous system subject to the provisions of para 3. However, for your guidance, the solution used by Economic Section has been to use registry books for the Bureau of Requirements and Distribution identical with those used by the Economic Section; to use the same system of file references, substituting "AC/" for "UNRRA/" and to cross-reference policy correspondence or combined AC/UNRRA correspondence so that copies or extracts thereof may be found in both sets of files.

3. It is desired that, whatever system of filing classification is adopted in each Sub-Commission/Sub-Branch, an identifying symbol be used as integral part of the file reference, as follows:

AC/	- Bureau of Requirements & Distribution
SUPGP/	- Sub-Bureau of Supply Operations
NSDP/	- Sub-Bureau of Relief Supply
INMAR/	- Sub-Bureau of Industrial Rehabilitation.

The symbol will be inserted according to the assignment of the originator of a particular communication; for example, the Director of Ports & Shipping Division will prepare UNRRA letters under the "SUPGP/" file

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symbol, whether for his own signature or for that of any higher official.

b. It is the intention of this Section, under the provisions of para 8, Executive Memorandum #7, reference 1/AB, Office of the Executive Commissioner, dated 5 January 1946, to accomplish a borrowing of files of units being formed for transfer to UNRRA. Consequently, it is the responsibility of the heads of these units to prepare now for the forthcoming transfer of files. It will be necessary to sort out immediately those files which will clearly not be required in the UNRRA operation. The balance should be carefully screened in order to determine whether they will be needed in toto for several months or whether a few documents can be abstracted or borrowed.
