To Executive Commissioners.

1. The statement made at your Conference yesterday by Economic Section that Archives are not in a position to receive Records in any quantity is incorrect and should be disabused. I have reported to Col. Walton substantially as follows: -

(a) Until a Records Officer is appointed to a Branch, plans to take over their files cannot be discussed. PWD Section 2/3 has still to be selected. Two demands to Economic Section have been made. (This also applies to Public Relations. His successor may however be Leonburg.)

(b) Until Master Files can be prepared and agreed with the Branch concerned, it would be illogical to accept files.

The whole of COMINT Files have had to be carefully card-indexed since in several cases the same file number has been used in three different sub-divisions. This has taken my staff two days to co-ordinate but it is now done. In another office of this Section old files are still being cleaned and sorted.

(c) The remaining Branches and Sub-Branches are well-in-hand although no one can inform me when is "D" Day for Alois's close down or which Branch will close first. Further, how much "D Day" will be allowed after closing down date. I have therefore to concentrate upon the largest Sections first.

2. Archives Branch is neither overworked or understaffed. I am holding the two vacancies of officers (A) (B) for Micro-film co-ordination when it comes on as we do not want them yet. What we could do with is two good clerks on long release. G 1 (A), (B), know this but good men are hard to find.

3. The Branch is working very well indeed and providing it is not necessary to take key officers away for such things as MALAYA OFFICIAL or P.C.S.M. (which is another report to you) I can guarantee continued output of of Twenty thousand documents daily (total last night 1,497,240) and the taking over of H) files in an organized way during the next fortnight.

4. We do NOT want any more officers at present and we feel that your Conference should not have been disturbed upon a subject that might easily be investigated at a lower level.

5. I would like to call a quick meeting of all the officers (and any others interested) in the Main Conference Room on WEDNESDAY next at 9 a.m. (if convenient) and should be grateful if you could find the time to open the meeting.

(1) ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

(a) DETAILS. Details of application entered in Logbook and not card completed by Sign. Arnold. Application card and not card mailed to Mr. Martin, who entered into his personal register, file the file required, located not card, and sends file and card to Sign. Arnold, who enters details as to date and destination of file in Logbook.

(b) FILE. The Logbook is kept and the procedure as in (a) carried out in the manner by Mr. Martin.

(2) REVIEW OF FILES. All files not on loan should be checked at least once a fortnight, and reports for files return sent to the Department which has possession.

(3) RETURN OF FILES. Files are mailed to Mr. Martin who replaces them in their original order in the appropriate bundle or case, writes the date of file return in his register, attaches not card and sends it to Sign. Arnold, who closes her Logbook of the relative outstanding cases.

Yours of the 4th. inst: ref. 16/AB

I regret being unable to furnish you with any further details especially those requested with the 4th. par. of your letter under reply.

However, the best person to give you these is Capt. Phillip Garigue, whose present address is c/o Lloyds Bank, 6 Pall Mall London W.1 who was the officer the last to have this card and the one to have sent it, together with the A.M.G. material from Genoa to Rome. The said card was handed to him by Capt. Armstrong SCL/Z officer of Nice which fact was confirmed to me by Capt. Andrews who is acting here to-day as CIO Security frontier Officer and was present. I have just hear from Garigue hence his address.

I would avail myself of this opportunity so as to ask you a question. I have some undertakings signed by the Provincial Commissioner of Imperia on the strength of which a lorry, which was recuperated by us (a group of ex internees at Mathausen concentration camp) and which had erroneously been handed over to a group of patriots, was to be returned to us, and in fact was -

handed over to me. Immediately on the departure of the A.M.G. these patriots, on occasion of my absence in Rome, broke into the garage helped themselves to the lorry and now claim it as theirs. They have no right as the orders in my possession signed by the then provincial Commissioner, representative of the British Government, are in my possession. To whom must I refer to have these orders enforced. Useless applying to the Security Officer of Genoa as he has made a terrible blunder over the matter. All undertakings signed by the A.M.G. are official and are recognised by the Italian Government. What I want to know is to which British Official must I apply so as to have them enforced. I am enclosing herewith a resumé of the facts and if you will refer them to the right department, I shall be greatly obliged to you.

To be caddled by the Italians is bad enough, but to find that the British are letting us down is heartbreaking.

However, large numbers of bills relating to AMG Regional expenditure have been received by the Liaison Groups and forwarded by Sub-Accountants to this HQ for approval, usually with a statement that no Regional records are held by them.

2. A similar situation is apparent concerning queries raised by this HQ on the Sub-accounts held by Regional Officers and now carried on by Sub-Accountants of Liaison Groups.

3. While this HQ is fully prepared to give all possible assistance to Sub-Accountants, in fact, such assistance in the majority of cases is limited to stating whether expenditure is proper or otherwise. These statements can only be based on relevant AC Establishment Memoranda which are also in the possession of Liaison Groups.

4. It is patently the responsibility of Allied Commission to meet its proper liabilities even though constant personnel changes may involve local investigation and searching of records in order to establish the propriety of claims.

5. The presence of Liaison Groups in the Northern Regions enables local investigation to be undertaken; however, it is apparent that the absence of Regional accounting records is greatly increasing the difficulties of Liaison Group Sub-Accountants.

6. After consultation with the Director of Finance Sub-Commission, and in view of the urgent and serious nature of this problem, it is now proposed that the Liaison Groups to which this letter is addressed request the return to them from HQ Allied Commission Archives of all cash books and accounting records relating to the Regional and Provincial Administrations previously located in their areas. One Liaison Group has already made a similar request to this office, but it is observed that such records are held by Archives and not by Allied Financial Agency.
