I have personally seen the Church and can testify that the work detailed on the preventivo is necessary in theory. After perusal by Ing. Perricone, please return the estimate to this Office.

DATE: 17 November 1943.

1. Reference the attached copies of a letter from Lt.Col. Peletti of 9 Nov. (para.29) and Capt. Hammond's reply of 15 Nov. (paras 3&4)
2. No considered policy has as yet been formulated by ACC/AMG.
3. The attitude hitherto adopted by the Advisers on Fine Arts to AMGOT as regards war-damaged churches and other ecclesiastical structures has been:-
 - a) that they were only authorised to advise on repairs to churches or other ecclesiastical buildings of the following categories:-
 - i) these "notified" as national monuments.
 - ii) these which though not "notified" as national monuments are of artistic or historic value.
 - iii) those not falling under i) or ii) but which contain works of art which need to be preserved and protected.
 - b) that they are not competent to advise on repairs which are designed solely in order to facilitate the use of the church or other such structure for ecclesiastical purposes (cult).
4. Two provisions of Italian Law may be noted in connection with this matter:-
 - a) that the Soprintendente dei Monumenti is consulted in all cases of repairs (other than purely utilitarian) to churches more than 50 years old.
 - b) that, as a war measure only, the Genio Civile is entrusted with repairs of a purely utilitarian character to all churches damaged by warlike action.
5. It is therefore suggested that all cases of applications for funds for the repair of churches or other ecclesiastical buildings should be referred in the first instance to the Regional Adviser for MFA&A, unless it is abundantly clear that he is not concerned. The Regional Adviser for MFA&A, if the matter comes within category 3.(a) above, will make his own recommendations to the RCOA: if it comes within categories 3.(a) and (b) or within (b) alone, he will either consult with other divisions concerned, and submit a joint recommendation, or he will return the case to the RCOA with the

intimation that he is not concerned with it. In the latter event the R
RCAO will either make a decision himself on grounds other than artist-
ic or historic, or will refer the decision to the Province concerned.

Subject : Allegations of the Bishop of Messina.

1. Attention is called to your Buck Slip forwarding in duplicate a letter from the RCAO regarding certain allegations of the Bishop of Messina. The original of the RCAO's letter is returned herewith; the copy kept for file.

2. The Bishop's allegations are based on inaccurate information:

a) Payments approved by this Office are not loans. They are payments made by AMG for in the name of the Italian Government, to be made good to the Allies by the Italian Government in the ultimate settlement, and represent payments which the Italian Government might normally be expected to make for the Salaries, Maintenance, and Conservation of Monuments, Works of Art, Libraries, Archives, and such other matters as properly come before this Office. No loans have been recommended.

b) At Caltanissetta, an estimate of 4,478,623.00 lire for complete restoration and completion of the Cathedral was submitted. The FO Caltanissetta recommended a grant of Lire 921,076.00. This Office recommended an initial grant of Lire 500,000.00 for immediately essential work of conservation with the possibility of further grants if absolutely necessary. This was approved by Major Nash, Lt. Col. Menapace, Col. Spofford, and Brig. Gen. McSheery. A further sum of Lire 40,000 was requested by the CAO and SCAO for the Church of San Domenico and was approved by the same officers just mentioned. Both of these Churches are National Monuments, to the best of this Office's knowledge.

c) Two grants of Lire 800,000 have been made in Palermo. The first represented a second three month's grant to the Superintendent of Monuments for work on the artistic part of National Monuments (churches and other). For the first three months he got 500,000. His total estimates ran over four million and this will have to be increased. The second 800,000 was to the Genio Civile for work on the static part of National Monuments. This was part of a total of over seven million requested for work on Monuments, in which he is supposed to collaborate with the Superintendent. For a long time he did no work, and has only just begun. He is controlled by his own list of churches held in this office and both he and the Superintendent submit their bills for approval - or should - the Genio has not but the Superintendent does.

This office about to present a list of complaints against the Genio to the Sub-commission on Public Works and it may be that he has used his grant for other than monumental churches.

3. The problem raised by the Bishop and by the RCO is at present under consideration by the Administration Section, particularly with reference to the Sub-commissions on MFA&A, Education, and the Interior, and a policy should soon be formulated and announced in a directive.

4. The Bishop might have made a case from certain instances which were referred to the AMCOT advisers, either specifically as non-monumental churches or without indications as to their monumentality. The Advisers never felt that they had enough experience to formulate a policy or that it lay in their competence. However they also felt that the repair of a non-monumental church (or other church bldg., as a Bishop's Palace) might be justified on the grounds of public utility. They therefor usually referred such cases back to the SCAO's and CAO's with the statement that it did not lie in their competence and should be settled locally. This Office is not therefor in a position to assert that no non-monumental church has been repaired. It is certain, however, that such cases have been few and the sums involved slight. A specific instance is that of the Bishop of Mazara's Estimates referred recently by you to this Office, to which a reply was made, as you may recall, in the above sense.

SUBJECT: Repairs to Archiepiscopal Palace.

Reverend and Dear Monsignore De Gaetano:

1. The whole subject of repairs to the Archiepiscopal Palace at Palermo has now received careful study in the light of your letter of the 10th November and the minutes of the meeting of the 6th Nov. It is now the decision of this Headquarters that the procedure outlined below be followed subject to any change of Policy.
2. A sum at present not exceeding Lire 800,000 will be advanced to the Regia Tesoreria by the Allied Military Government through the Civil Affairs Finance Officer for the Province of Palermo for the account of his Eminence to be devoted to the essential repairs of the Palace.
3. That all bills for work done be examined and approved by the Departments of Public Utilities and of Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives of A.M.G. and presented for payment to the Regia Tesoreria.
4. That in accordance with the agreement reached on the 6th November, the following scheme of repairs will be carried out at present:-
 - (a) Repair the garden wall to a height of four metres, or as high as is necessary to make the property safe from looting or trespassing.
 - (b) The roofs should be made watertight, save in the badly damaged part facing the garden. (This has been done on the side opposite the Cathedral.)
 - (c) In so far as supplies permit, the quarters and offices of the Cardinal and his Staff should be made habitable and usable.
 - (d) Windows and other openings in parts of the Palace other than those referred to in para. (c) above should be closed to the degree necessary to keep out the weather.
5. Any measures considered necessary by the Superintendent of Monuments for preserving artistic elements of the Palace, such as frescoes, should be undertaken, all such measures to be approved by the Advisor for Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives.
6. That his Eminence shall be ~~mainain~~ entitled to employ such

below be followed subject to any change of Policy.

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6. That His Eminence shall be ~~entitled~~ entitled to employ such workmen as he chooses subject to approval by the Genio Civile or by the Superintendent of Monuments, where necessary.

7. It is hoped that the above repairs recommended may be effected for less than the sum of Lire 800,000 approved. If however they exceed this sum, further application should be made to the Office of Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives.

8. Any repairs to exterior or interior parts of the building not necessary under the above items, such as plastering, painting, or reconstruction of inside walls, should not be undertaken at this time.

9. The interior of the Seminary should not be put into condition for use, unless His Eminence chooses to do so at his own expense or from

funds from source other than A.M.G. The seriously damaged parts of the non-monumental sections of the Seminary, which include both the old part facing on to the garden and the new part in the main court, cannot be repaired by A.M.G. unless the Advisor on Education deems it absolutely essential to reopen the Seminary.

10. That representatives of His Eminence, of the Superintendent, of the Genio Civile, and of A.M.G. meet at frequent intervals to examine and discuss the work in progress.

11. It is realised that these decisions do not in every respect meet with all your suggestions, but it must be understood that the present position of the Allied Military Government is, so to speak, one of custodianship for a future Italian Government, who may not be in a position to meet the legacy of obligations left by the Allied Governments.

12. In conclusion we should like to thank you for your helpful cooperation in this matter.
