MOVEMENTS

Buenos Aires - to move direct to Sorrento and not via Naples.

Transport - sufficient ships to move Brindisi to Sorrento. Col. Grant reported that 18-odd place vehicles bound for Italy were at our disposal, had tentatively a plan for fifty. Choice of sea route not made to Naples owing to busy movements. AFM to be wired for Transport Officer. One at Naples and one at Sorrento necessary. One accommodation reported by Captain Peoples at Palermo over Sorrento.

Furniture - moving at Naples with the Allied Advisory Council members. Not to strip Salerno office but seek in town. Furniture must be taken. Telephones possibly available in Naples owing to destruction of Calabria in March. Office to be sent immediately on reoccupation.

Admiral General's office - To be split and to share Brindisi, not through to Naples between Naples and Sorrento.

Interactions - difficulties. Four officers and 10 to join Sorrento party. Emphasis on a sound knowledge of both languages and cultural standards.

ITALIAN MINISTRY

Meeting to be held by General Radoglio. Brigadier Goeterboer considered it important as it may influence final decision of Italian Government to take over territories. General Joyce wished Chiefs of the necessary sub-commissions to attend.

NAPLES AREA

There are three possibilities:

(a) SORRENTO - Big enough to house Italian Government and 150 officers with 100/100s of ACC, but involves moving a convalescent camp, rest centre etc.

(b) SALERNO area - Big enough to house Italian Government and about 100 officers with 100/100s of ACC. Involves getting permission for occupation of ecclesiastical buildings and moving naval party.

(c) NAPLES - Big enough for rear ACC, but not suitable for Italian Government or advance ACC. Accommodation for 200 officers maximum plus 100/100s.

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Certain Sub-commissions only to be with Italian Government. Liaison officers for others. Colonel Rathbone to deal with the composition of the party.

Mr. Gastercock reported that the services division was fully understood by Mr. Bright. There was a great discrepancy as to figures of requisitioned wheat between Regions I and II and it was requested that exact figures of requisitioning by Regions I and II be produced forthwith.

Brig. Gunterbock reported that the current situation was fully understood at Bridging. There was a great discrepancy as to figures of requisitioned wheat between EMC and Regions and it was requested that exact figures of requisitioning by Regions I and II be produced forthwith.

Increased Rations to Commanders

No announcement made in the press as to their exception. It will do apply to all regions and will solely increase the training note armed forces. Region 15th Army Group and Brigadier to be informed.

Increased Rations

Proposals were generally accepted with modifications to conform with the existing schedule. A general wage increase for civil servants was to be published. Major to Brigadier and 15th Army Group.

Other Measures

Information was awaited as to the result of the recent levy of 50 kg or produce in Region I. The suggestion of house to house searches was made and referred to loan officer and transport. The same for that purpose. Brig. Gunterbock proposed something was best done and it was suggested that officers meet Col. Pintula to formulate a plan.

Block Market

The formation of this Committee had been approved in principle.

PARTS OF AGENDA

Difficulties were reported and the despatch of six officers was urgently desired to supervise unloading of stores. Lt. Col. Wancort also wanted advice on currency.

Personnel to attend

Were not to be sent without prior acceptance.

CORR

A confused situation. Mining Division was a sub-section of Industry and Commerce. The Fuel sub-section was to become inactive and the Fuel sub-commissioner being reorganized by AFHQ. A policy for the Surdienkun was to be worked out and Foytakun was to be handled in the same way as that situation was confused also. Brig. Wainman suggested that G-1, Economics and Shipping enquire into the matter.

Personnel of Italian Troops

No specific instruction had been received. MSS had been asked to supply for authority. Payments were to be made only in case of military necessity. Negotiations should be conducted with Italian Banks for advances could be made by them to the Government. It seemed that the payment of advances might very naturally be placed in private hands instead of the U. S. Treasury. Payment had been made to Italian troops.

Italian Ministry of Communications

Had been formed and was to conform to the Italian structure. It consisted of the amalgamation of Posts and Telegraphs. Further information was wanted. Capt. Stone was responsible for Posts and Telecommunications.

Balize

The situation produced by recent AFHQ directives requires classification. Wayne Devine and Lt. Col. Denehy were dealing with the matter.

Telecommunications

A great amount of work being done. Italian-Palestine cable with a reservation of six circuits for the Italian Government was hoped to be restored in three weeks. (15th Army Group). Italian-Palestine cable was being repaired and the Italian Government had permission to restore land lines in No. 2 Region. Intelligence and Communications were to produce a censorship embodying dual Government Policy. Current Italian Government communications at present are through AFHQ for official purposes only. Regions to be advised, when arrangements have been made.

PROCEDURE OF ITALY COMMISSION

Planning and direction in Palestine. Strategic Command Post, British & French. Head of Government, according to AFHQ, and officers should be prepared for the command.

a complicated situation. Mining Division was to sub-division of Industry and Commerce. 1. 10/2 The Chair of Staff stated that it was too early for sub-committees to receive their own names. The names had been cut down and suggested that the recommendation be deferred for three weeks. This was agreed to. Mention was made of Old and New. It was decided that sub-committees should submit their proposals to a new suitable distribution. Col. Albercht to locate persons concerned.
2. Party to be formed. The various being designated to British liaison committee between Italian Govt., Military Mission and HQ Faliero. Col. Albercht was charged by their selection.
3. The C of S stated that he, H.M. Baldwin and certain other officers had been called to come over to Paris to discuss policy and lines of course would be issued.

ADMISSIONS SUB-COMMITTEE

- (a) C. of S observed that the statement that persons not of U.S. or British nationality were to be served for, was not quite true, in that it included displaced persons. He added that the Italian population were looked after by ... Q.A.
- Col. Karpfman stated that 1. Displaced Italians were not in responsibility and that the Italian government had handled them.

1. IV/AT The Chief of Staff advised that it was too early for sub-combinations to realize their own goals. One feature had been cut down and suggested that the recommendations be deferred for three weeks. This was agreed to. Mention was made of the plan B and it was decided that sub-combinations should submit their plans needs with a view to more equitable distribution. Col. Abbott to locate personnel on hand.
2. Party to Britain. Ten officers were appointed to Britain on 14-15 Oct. Officers involved Italian Govt., Military Mission and HQ Italian, Col. Abbott was assigned in their selection.
3. The 3 of 3 stated that Col. Abbott, Franklin and certain other officers had been called to confirm 15. Franklin, Joyce and others. An order would be issued.

#### DISCUSSIONS SUB-COMMISSION

- (a) Col. Orton observed that the statement that persons not of U.S. or British nationality, not to be considered, was not quite true, in that it included all nationalities. He advised that non-national personnel were looked after by A.R.A.Q.
- (b) Col. V. Greenhalgh stated that 1. Unbiased Indians were not responsible, 2. Indians were available and sorting #185 took place. It was suggested that Public Health officials may report so that the Sub-Commission could handle the issue without the ICRC being put into the right liaison channels.
- (c) Mr. Newcombe stated the ICRC should not have appeared, but the Chairman of Staff agreed that the security question be completed before movement.
- (d) Mr. Newcombe advised that India had not yet received its first equipment for the medical part.
- (e) The Chief of Staff mentioned the fact that the Italian National Committee had no convention rights in Italy. It was preferable to have a separate Italian Commission to handle the ICRC's functions under the Italian Sub-Commission to work with A.R.A.Q. and no responsibility in Italy.
- (f) Mr. Newcombe advised that India had not yet received its first equipment for the medical part.

(f) Dismissal of Displaced Persons depended on category and was subject to security and the idea of a separate Sicilian committee was deprecated by the Chief of Staff.

Orders had been received as to disposal of all nationalities barring Chinese and Russians and instructions were issued by the Chief of Staff to cable as to their disposal.

Screening was to be done by the Sub-Commission.

It was recommended that screening on the P. scale be at important points other nationalities being under our supervision. The Chief of Staff suggested that in view of nationalities a power be conceded with on the subject.

It was stated that the raising of either a Japanese and/or Labour Corps was not acceptable.

Mention was made as to the disadvantage of the Italian civilian compared with the refugees in matter of food etc. and it was stated that there was surplus labour in Sicily, but possible employment of EPs (other nations) was to be enquired into.

Displaced persons necessities. It was observed that Camp Foggia, was a drain on local markets. There was no obligation to use Army rations. The Chief of Staff instructed that a telegram be sent to AFHQ stating the position, mentioning that rations were being used and that this did not apply to the Ital. S. Brig. He also emphasised that no money was to be issued direct to the Italians and that it was to go through the Govt. Chain and that all records were to be kept in quantities, the Sub-Commission and Nations concerned to be advised whence responsible for the bulk issues.

Clothing. 100,000 sets class III would be available by Jun. 1 and that it was expected that D.P.s would have share, but it was a responsibility of the Italian Govt. and a Jugoslav problem. Some supplies arriving through nations and others through R.A.F. bases.

Medical attention it was stated, was obtained from Red Cross and local sources under L.D. on D.P. staff.

(g) Accommodation. Chief of Staff said that D.P. Sub-Commission was to assume responsibility as soon as possible, working with Prisoner of War Sub-Commission.

Transport. Chief of Staff suggested use of Italian Army Transport as far as it could and was to be arranged through the Allied Military Mission and Italian Govt. in Trapani.

(h) Contact with Italian Government. Chief of Staff said medicals was in mind in liaison with the Italian Government. The D.P. Sub-Commission should have an officer in Trapani.

(i) Location of Sub-Commission. Chief of Staff suggested that they should move forward to work with the Rear Link from Foggia to Palermo. This was agreed and also was recommended that an officer be sent in advance to Compty. Chief of Staff said he would check up points in detail. D.P. Sub-Commission to take over Central Compt.

(j) Red Cross Assistance. British, American and Italian were available. The Red Cross was not recognised at moment. The matter was in hand.

(k) Provision of Personnel. Chief of Staff recommended the matter be left with Col. Abright. Original Quota of Intelligence Officers not thought necessary. Note that Comptys were to be given full powers to do what ever necessary.
