1. With reference to the attached priority message N° PPS - 4943, I.B.S. N° 7392, received this day from "SENOR PARGO" (PARGO 221), requesting information as to the circumstances of the arrest and subsequent release of two alleged members of the Fascist Police - Vincenzo D'ANGELO and Michelangelo TROMBETTA, also asking whether they were afterwards employed by A.M.G.
2. The records of Special Police Section show that Vincenzo D'ANGELO, a lawyer, of Via Italo Balbo, Ionia, Catania Province, was arrested on 18th August 1943 by 310 Field Security Section at Ionia Catania. This case was examined by the Review (Classification of Civilian Internees) Board and on the basis of the information contained in the Field Security arrest report, namely that he was an ex Political Secretary and Federal Inspector of the Fascist Party and a Magistrate of the Military Court at Rome, it was decided by the Board that he must REMAIN IN INTERMENT INDEFINITELY and he was therefore placed in the appropriate category A(a).
3. It is recorded that Michelangelo TROMBETTA, a teacher, of Via Impero 526, Ionia, Catania Province, was also arrested on 18th August, 1943 by 310 Field Security Section at Ionia, Catania, and as the Field Security arrest report showed that he was a "member of the Fascist Commission of Discipline" it was decided by the Review Board that he, too, should remain in internment, but that his case should be reviewed again in 3 months time (viz 1st December, 1943).
4. On 6th November, 1943, however, information was received from N° 1 District H.Q. that both of these men had been unconditionally released by order of the General Officer Commanding N° 1 District. The Review Board had no recourse but to accept the decision G.O.C. N° 1 District which had already been put into effect and both internees

were, therefore, entered in the D(a) Category as "unconditionally released",

5.

This office has no record of either of these two having been at any time employed under Allied Military Government. It is brought to notice, however, that our records of provincial employees of A.M.G. are at present incomplete as the return of "Schede Personale" relating to such persons, asked for by this Headquarters has not yet been received from some provinces among which is the province wherein D'ANGELO and TROJENITA are domiciled - Catania.

Memorandum.

24 January 1944

SUBJECT: Arrest of Fascists.

TO : Chief Commissioner.

1. Reference Cable 26734 dated 11 January 1944 A.F.H.Q. to A.M.G. flagged "A" and cables flagged "B", "C" and "D".

2. The facts as we know them are:

- (a) Dangelo and Trombetta are leading fascists.
- (b) They were not arrested by A.M.G. and we have no information as to who arrested them.
- (c) They were released by G.O.C. No.1 District.
- (d) They have never been employed by A.M.G.

3. If we send this information as it is for the answer to the Parliamentary Question, we shall be asked why did not ACC/AMG take action. I suggest therefore that after enquiring of G.O.C. No.1 District, Public Security No.1 District should be instructed immediately to consider the case of these two men and A.F.H.Q. should be informed of action taken. This will enable a satisfactory Parliamentary answer to be framed.

371 PW Camp is now established at P.O.M. (T4194) in POTENZA PROVINCE as an interment camp for Civil PW.

2. Disposal.

Civilians trusted on security grounds with a view to interment will continue to be placed in the nearest PW Camp. Hence they will be sent out through PW channels to 371 Camp.

3. Records.

(a) Interment Slips.

As added to para 3 of this HQ instruction quoted above, a record of arrest ("Interment Slip") will be issued by the officer i/c the P.S. Section or C.I.C. Detachment making the arrest, will be handed over to the authorities i/c the PW Camp in which the prisoner is originally placed. This slip will accompany the prisoner to 371 Camp.

(b) Authorisation.

Although the HQ/CIC officer can issue a clearance with a view to interment, they will be responsible for authorising the interment. When any of the above "Interment Slip" or report of the case, it will consider whether interment is justified or whether the prisoner should be released. In the latter event it will be for his benefit to release. In the former event, it will indicate its authorisation in the manner shown in (c) below.

(c) Consolidated records.

(d) Return for interment.

2. The Question will be instructed to re-establish the existing Italian system of alien (stranieri) control, and check all existing records.

PUBLICATION OF LOCAL ORDERS

- (a) all non-Italian nationals will be required to register before a given date with the police authority who normally deals with alien registration;

8. All aliens, except those mentioned in paragraph 4, will conform with the existing Italian law which relates to aliens.

9. Exceptions to the internment provision at sub-paragraph 7(a) will only be made on the authority of the SGAO who will forthwith submit (through channels) to the Chief of Public Safety Sub-Commission his reasons therefor.

10. Special consideration will be given, however, in the case of German nationals who are natives of Czechoslovakia or any other place lately incorporated into the German Reich.

APPLICATIONS TO TRAVEL MORE THAN 10 KMS.

11. Written application to travel more than 10 kms. will be made to the police authority referred to in paragraph 3(a).

12. Applications will be passed to the provincial CAFO, who will either approve the application or refer them with his recommendations to higher authority.

13. The result of all such applications will be endorsed on the blank page of the alien's identification card.

14. A record of all applications dealt with will be maintained by the Questori.
