1. I wish to put on record the excellent work carried out by Capt. J.M.WERNITT and Lt.A.W.GOODGE during the road journey of the main body of this H.Q. from PATRICO to SAFIUS 18th to 24th December 1943.

2. These officers were appointed Transportation Officers and assistant P.O. respectively of the convoy and were responsible for the movement, parking, repair of crippled vehicles, the loading re-adjustments necessitated by breakdowns, and the embarkation on L.S.T.'s and ferries.

3. In all these matters they carried their work in a highly satisfactory manner. The fact that 103 out of a total of 105 vehicles reached their destination as a convoy over a distance of 540 miles speaks for itself, especially in view of the fact many of the drivers were unacquainted with their vehicles. The latter were NOT in many cases in a high state of running order.

4. Neither of these officers ever spared themselves physically, and worked hard and enthusiastically throughout the journey.

18 Dec. to 24 Dec. 1943.

1. Composition of Convoy.

(a) In accordance with I.B.S. movement order No.A.G. 371.5 (17583) of Dec. 8, 1943, the convoy left PALERMO at 0630 hours Dec. 18 1943; the convoy consisted of:

2. Routine, Running

(A) The intention each day was to run for as many hours as possible during the hours of daylight, leaving some period during daylight for maintenance of vehicles or reorganisation for the following day's journey. To carry this out an early start was made each day and a decision made during the midday halt as to the next staging area to be reached; an advance party was then sent forward which included the Q.M. and water truck to make preparations for the reception of the convoy.

A ~~new~~ group was always maintained at least thirty minutes ahead of the main body, its function being to give warning of difficult passages to contact traffic control points, and to reconnoiter for staging areas.

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Report on move of A.M.C. HQ etc., (cont'd)

- (b) A log of running times, halts and staging areas is attached, appendix "A", the average M.P.H. of 14.7 is good, when consideration is given to the nature of the terrain crossed and the inexperience of drivers in convoy work.
- (c) For the purpose of control the convoy was divided into blocks of 20 vehicles under a Captain, the heavier vehicles running at the head of the column. It was found in practice that in order to maintain an even pace throughout the column, one heavy vehicle riding behind each block commander is advantageous, a reorganisation to effect this was carried out on the fourth day.
- (d) The five M/Cs for traffic control were hardly adequate and the motorcycle riders were worked very hard at times. They are commended for the hard work they put in. The block commander also functioned most satisfactorily.

3. Feeding

- (a) Rations carried were sufficient for a journey of nine days, this proved adequate. They consisted of American "K" & "C" types, supplemented by tea, coffee, and porridge from British Sources.
- (b) Sufficient British cooking equipment was carried to enable porridge and tea or coffee to be served each morning in addition to "K" ration and at night hot stew made from pooling the meat portion of American "C" ration was served in addition to a hot drink and the biscuit portion of "C" ration.

4. Medical

- (a) The convoy was in the medical charge of Major J.S.Lewis (A) and Major R.P. Rogers (A) one officer moving in the center of the column and one at the rear in an ambulance ready to receive casualties.
- (b) This organisation worked satisfactorily and there was little delay in dealing with the officers injured in the one accident in which personnel of the convoy were injured.
- (c) Sanitary arrangements at some of the established Staging Camps are not very satisfactory and need improvement, this is especially so at No.1 assembly area Messina. A report by Major J.S.Lewis on this subject is attached as appendix "B".
- (d) When it is necessary to use a staging area not already established it is essential to have a sufficient working party carried forward with the advance party to prepare adequate latrines. They must be equipped with signs and lanterns.
- (e) Two cases of sickness occurred during the journey, one of jaundice and one of influenza, both were reported during the latter stages and were brought forward in an ambulance to NAPLES for treatment.

5. Vehicles

- (a) In general the vehicles brought forward were in a fair average condition, some were not however really in suitable condition for a journey of 500 miles. One, a German Bus, can hardly be considered to have been road worthy its brakes proved to be most inadequate.

In view of the above and the inexperience of many drivers in convoy and mountain driving the vehicles were put to a severe test.

(b) Captain J.W. Merritt and Lt. A.M. Goodloe are commended for their excellent performance in getting 103 vehicles out of a total of 105 to their destination as a convoy.

o. Driving

(a) Driving steadily improved with practice and the keeping of distance was maintained satisfactorily.

(b) Three accidents occurred, one of which proved fatal, another may have fatal results.

1. An elderly man was knocked down by a falling animal drawing a cart touched by one of the convoy vehicles; this man, in a dazed condition, fell in to a concrete culvert and sustained serious head injuries.

2. A boy of 10 years was knocked down and killed.

3. A jeep carrying Captains BALLANCE (A) POWELL (A) TEAVEN (A) over turned after a skid on a dangerous piece of road covered with oil.

(c) It is to be noticed that two of these accidents occurred late in the day when the light was beginning to fail and drivers were tired. The conclusion to be drawn is, that it is better to start a day's journey early and stop early provided an average day's run has been accomplished.

X (d) The driving of the wrecker truck by T/S J.W. Sheets was a notable performance, especially in view of the distance it was necessary to tow one 2 1/2 ton exa truck.

7. Route

(a) The route taken was that shown in the movement order as far as NICASTRO, where an alternative road through COSAZZA was taken. This route rejoined the scheduled route at L CO NEGRO, the decision to take this road was done on the advice of the Movement Control Officer, Reggio, who had recently made a route survey between NAPLES and REGGIO, and strongly advised this course.

(b) The road surface generally was good and the scenery excellent. The road between NICASTRO and LAGO NEGRO has a good surface and sufficient width for two way traffic for the whole distance. It is not suitable for a convoy of really heavy vehicles owing to the steep gradients and difficult hair pin bends to be negotiated. It is doubtful also whether some of the temporary bridges will take weight over 20 tons.

785016Report on move of A.M.C. Hq. etc., (cont'd)DAILY HISTORY

Dec. 16th. Convoy ran from Palermo to Barcellona staged after dark at an orange grove this was the longest day's journey, being 140 miles. The road was of good even running surface. The only obstacles being ford crossings over the numerous rivers. Accident No. 1 referred to in paragraph 6 above, occurred this day.

Dec. 19th. Convoy ran from Barcellona to Messina and formed up in assembly area No. 1. A.M.C. (mv) was unable to furnish Ferries this day. The convoy therefore remained at the assembly area ready to move at short notice. Two vehicles (jeeps) developed engine trouble and had to be handed into 312 Armored Troop work shops R.E.M.E. Messina. The convoy staged the night at the assembly area. Officers and other ranks being allowed into town between 1400 hours and 1800 hours. A strict guard was placed as juvenile felons hung around vehicles ~~sneaking~~ to take equipment and packages. Some kit however was lost.

Dec. 20th. Convoy was called forward on 0930 hours for embarkation. It was moved in 5 L.C.I.S and 1 Train ferry. Three blocks Nos. 1,2,3, reached Gioiatarro where they staged for the night. The remainder of the convoy under command of Lt. Col. W.J. Legg staged the night in Reggio assembly area. Accident No. 2 referred to in paragraph 6 above, occurred this day.

Dec. 21st. The main party of the convoy moved off at 0900 hours having to wait for the tail to catch up. The whole convoy reached Sanbleuse by 1400 hours. An excellent staging area was found at the mineral baths; these afforded an opportunity for all ranks to bathe. Distance covered by the head of the column was 95 miles and the tail 108 miles. Good average day run on fair roads with steep gradients. Accident No. 3 referred to in paragraph 6 occurred this day.

Dec. 22nd. Column came by the route Nicastro and Cosenza and staged at Piano di Corte. This was the most difficult piece of the road in view of the steep gradients encountered between Nicastro and Cosenza and again at Tassia. The running surface of the road is good having enough width for a two way traffic. An ox was killed this day by the wrecker truck. As the animal was on its way to the slaughter house the ~~woman~~ was satisfied.

Dec. 23rd. Convoy moved from Piano di Corte to Atene running through similar country to the previous day. The gradients not being quite as severe. Road conditions were good with heavy rain after midday. March discipline was very good all day. It was necessary for the vehicles to pull tight at the right side of the road for staging which was done on the road side. Lt. Goolow went forward with a damaged vehicle to Salerno and reported back at 0100 that it was essential for the convoy to reach that town by 1200 hours if it were to proceed into Naples the following day. It was therefore decided that an early start should be made and the journey attempted.

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Report on move of A.M.C. Hq. etc., (cont'd)

Dec. 24th. Convoy moved off early at 0830 hours reaching Salerno at 1045 hours, moved on into Naples arriving at 1445 hours, where the dispersal of the convoy was taken in hand by officers of AMG Headquarters Naples. The road surface during this day was the worst encountered on account of the very bad broken road, and large diversion at BATTI PACLIA.

Conclusion

(a) The journey as a whole ran smoothly and well, the spirit of cooperation by all concerned was good. The ease of command and control was greatly helped by the week of preparation made available by the several delays imposed before the starting date. Had it not been for this and had it been necessary to move on the 10th Dec., as originally planned, it is my opinion that the convoy would not have reached its destination as a formation.

To move such a body in strange vehicles with drivers of little experience of convoy running and staging requires a large measure of administrative detail before departure.

The latter was very ably taken care of by Lt. Col. W.J. Legg who acted as second in command of the convoy and very largely contributed to the measure of comfort and easy handling attained during the journey.

I. ORGANIZATION:

- Your convoy designation is 121201-S. (This number will be shown on the front of each vehicle)

- Your convoy commander is Col Cripps (Br.).

- You will place heavier loads, slower driving vehicles at the head of your column.

- Maximum number of vehicles per March Unit will be 20. Maximum number of March Units will be 5. Time gap between March Units will be 25 minutes. Time gap between Serials will be a minimum of 25 minutes.

- With convoys of ten (10) vehicles or more an officer in a command vehicle will be in charge.

II. TIME AND SPEED SCHEDULE: (T) is CP #1 Palermo

- Your initial point (T) is 0700 hours on Dec. 12, 1943.

- Your convoy will conform to the following time table:

- Convoys of ten (10) or more vehicles will avoid stopping the whole column by sending a small advance party (including driver, truck(s) when desirable) to check at all control stations on the route in order to receive instructions, receive information concerning road conditions, receive instructions on escort.

2. The lead vehicle will pass I at 0700 hours on Dec. 12, 1943.

4. Convoy of ten (10) or more vehicles will avoid stopping the whole column by sending a small advance party (including kitchen, truck, wine desirable) to check all Control stations on the road and route(s) at least thirty (30) minutes ahead of the main body. Advance party thus be able to furnish required information, receive instructions, schedules from Control stations, and assign port drivers, or escort.

III CONVOY CHARACTER

1. Speed:

- a. Speeds will be commensurate with safety at all times.  
b. Maximum speed on highway outside of city limits will be thirty (30) miles per hour during daylight hours and twenty (20) miles per hour during hours of darkness unless otherwise designated by military signs.

2. Density—Open country seventeen (17) vehicles per mile, i.e., a minimum distance between vehicles of one hundred (100) yards, to be maintained at all times. In cities and towns interval between vehicles will be maintained and individual vehicles will receive speed to required speed limit.

3. Flags—A blue flag will be carried on the lead vehicle and a green flag on the tail vehicle of each serial.

### III CONVOY ORGANIZATION CONT'D

4. Guides--To aid in organization of convoy at T, to control movement of convoy through towns or over one-way bridges, or through intersections or other points of potential conflict, guides will be posted by Convoy Commander as needed.
5. Balances--Balances or limits for vehicles will not be made in towns, or between, defiles, curves, or with vehicles standing on the travelled portion of the roadway. Vehicle interval may be adjusted to meet exigencies of terrain in curve. Vehicles on either side of a rever closer than seventy-five (75) yards one from the other.
6. Passing--No convoy will overtake another convoy proceeding in the same direction without specific authority shown in the Road Movement Approval.
7. Radio--Complete radio silence will be maintained except in an emergency.
8. Convoy Commanders will be responsible for disciplining and policing of their convoys. Orders will be issued by Convoy Commander to prevent personnel from throwing any articles from moving vehicles.
9. Convoy Commanders may, at their discretion, clear highways of civilian vehicular traffic to the extent necessary to permit free passage of convoys.

### IV SUPPLY AND TRAFFIC PASS

Current information concerning the availability of munitions, water points, bivouac areas, Ordnance units, First Aid Stations and hospitals can be obtained at Highway Control Stations or Highway Division, Transportation Section, Island Base Section.

### V VEHICLE INSPECTING

Drivers of disabled vehicles will signal the following vehicles to proceed. Such vehicles will not be stopped; they may be left under guard and must be reported to nearest Highway Control Station.

### VI LIGHTS

1. Between sunset and sunrise all convoys will operate with "dim-out" lights and with marker lights lit.
  2. Dim-out lights will conform to either of the following standards (ATC Cir. 59, 26 July 1943):
    - a. Headlights will have the face of the lens painted black with white removed to allow for a crescent shaped area two (2) inches long and one-half inch high with top or stock one (1) inch center line of lens.

VI LIGHTS  
1. Between sunset and sunrise all convoys will operate with "dim-out lights" and with marker lights lit.

2. Dim-out lights will conform to either of the following standards (AFWQ Cir. 59, 29 July 1943):
  - a. Headlights will have the painted black-out shield as used in Great Britain.
  - b. Headlights will have the base of the lenses painted black with paint removed to allow for a crescent shaped space two (2) inches long and one-half inch high with top or street one (1) inch below center line of lenses.
3. If vehicles are operated during an alert the marker lights will be lit.

VII AIR STRIKE  
In the event of Actual Air Attack, vehicles will halt at open interval along the side of the road and suitable weapons will be brought to bear on attacking aircraft. Personnel not running weapons will disperse and take cover.

VIII ACCIDENTS  
1. In all cases of accidents the driver will immediately fill out the Driver Report (Form No. 26) and Army Form AFM 1 (ng - It).

2. Form 27 - investigating Officer's Report will be completed.
3. It will be the Convoy Commander's responsibility to see that the nearest Claims Office is advised through channels of all pertinent information. In the case of serious personnel injury all possible assistance will be rendered and the facts reported in the most expeditious manner.

IX DISCIPLINE ON MAPS  
Attention is directed to the fact that the careless and unauthorized discharge of firearms is a violation of the gift article or car. Personnel in charge of firearms are enjoined from the unauthorized use of any weapon. Convoy, senior and non-commissioned officers will appoint the senior officer in each unit command, who will be responsible for the conduct of or private in each vehicle to ensure direct response and for the maintenance of discipline at all times.

SUBJECT: Road Condition from Stefano to Messina

1. 6 mile west of San Stefano: 130 ft. one way, combination rail and highway bridge - Triple - Double Bailey.
2. 1 mile west of Stefano: Timber bridge with concrete by pass to take all weights.
3. 2 mile west of Caronia: Dirt washed in road - care should be taken in wet weather.
4. 1½ mile west of Caronia: Concrete viar - High water limitation only.
5. 6 mile east of Caronia: (T. Furino) Concrete viar. High water limitations only.
6. 7 mile west of Capo d' Orlando: Concrete viar. High water limitations only.
7. 5 miles west of Capo d' Orlando: Concrete viar. High water limitations only.
8. 6 miles west of Patti: Crater at east end of tunnel. Sharp turn to right going east. One way traffic - very dangerous - Should have control when convoy passing through.
9. Patti: Debris in streets narrows to one way. Control on Convoy.
10. Milazzo junction: Highway very rough in this area.
11. From 9 mile from Messina to Messina the road is steep and very crooked. 2½ ton with trailers can make turns if great care is used. Larger vehicles would have considerable difficulty and should attempt only in daylight. Many 2½ drivers will have some trouble. 3 bomb holes in this area causing one way traffic around them.
12. Summary: No normal convoy should have difficulty over this route if care is used at tunnel and in area prior to Messina.
13. This information gained 15-16 October 1942.

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

1. Speed Limits - The maximum speed of vehicles in the Metropolitan Area of Naples is as follows:

- a. During daylight hours, 25 miles per hour, except streets posted otherwise.
- b. Tunnels, 15 miles per hour.
- c. During hours of darkness, 15 miles per hour.
- d. Bridges, as individually marked.

2. Parking - Parking areas are provided at Piazza Plebiscito (Coords 210482) and Piazza Garibaldi. Parking is prohibited where NO PARKING signs are erected.

3. Vehicle Lights.

- a. Forward of the Corps rear boundary total blackout will prevail, excepting where Corps Commanders have authorized blackout lights on vehicles.
- b. In rear of the Corps rear boundary,
  - (1) Vehicles at night will use low-beam or dim headlights except during an air raid when blackout will prevail.
  - (2) The practice of throwing missiles at or firing at vehicle lights will not be tolerated.

4. Movement During Red Alert - The following restrictions are placed on vehicles:

- a. Emergency vehicles on alert missions are authorized to move during the alert at such speeds as may be necessary to discharge operational duties. Dim-out lights may be used on such vehicles when so directed by a commissioned officer.

- b. Upon the sounding of the alarm all vehicles in motion but not on an alert mission will be immediately parked on the right hand side of the road, close to the curb line or on the shoulder of the road. All lights will be extinguished. Street and road intersections will be kept clear.

5. Conduct in Vehicles.

- a. Shooting by the driver of a government vehicle is not authorized while operating the vehicle.
- b. Personnel riding in motor vehicles will conduct themselves in a military manner.
- c. Not more than four (4) persons, including the driver, will be carried in 1/4-ton trucks.
- d. The transportation in government vehicles of civilians not in the employ of the Allied Forces is prohibited.

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


