GENERAL ORDER NO. 17

LABOR RELATIONS

Whereas in Sicily by General Order No. 8 and in Calabria, Lucania and the Province of Salerno by Regional Order No. 5, the Fascist Corporative Syndicate System was dissolved and a method provided for reestablishing and assuring freedom of labor organization;

Now, therefore, in furtherance of the objectives of said General and Regional Orders, I, CHARLES M. SPOFFORD, Colonel, G.S.C., Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I

Right of Organization

Employees shall have the right to organize, hold meetings, and select representatives of their own choosing for the purpose of collective bargaining with respect to all matters pertaining to or connected with their employment, including such matters as concern hours, wages, working conditions, grievances, disputes and mutual social and economic assistance.

ARTICLE II

Effective Date

This Order shall become operative in Sicily, Calabria, Lucania and the Province of Salerno on the date hereof.

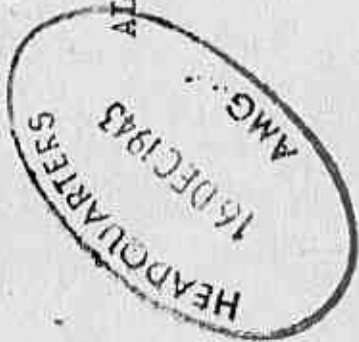

PROCEDURE REGARDING CIVILIAN INTERVIEWERS

I. All Regions will institute a Regional Review Board to classify and review all cases of Civilian Interviewers within their respective jurisdiction.

Each Regional Board will be composed of:-

- a representative of Public Safety
- a representative (s) of Military Security Services
- a representative of Legal

II. Regional Boards will sit in session at least every two months, and will deal with all cases, including interviewers made within 7 days of the coming of each Board.

III. Categories - Cases will be classified in one of the following categories:-

a. (a) For indefinite internment

- (1) Dangerous Fascists
- (2) Anti-Race
- (3) Persons considered as politically dangerous to Allied Military or Civil Services.

(b) For internment for not less than 3 months and then for release on conditions as set out hereafter:-

Similar cases to A (a) of a minor nature.

IV. For handing over to proper authorities for criminal prosecution where record shows commission of crime for which no trial has been held.

V. For continued internment pending further inquiry.

(b) For internment for not less than 3 months and then for release on conditions as set out hereafter.

(Similar cases to A (a) of a minor nature.

B. For handing over to proper authorities for criminal prosecution where record shows commission of crime for which no trial has been held.

C. For continued internment pending further inquiry. **2369**

D. (a) For immediate unconditional release.

(b) For release on conditions as shown hereafter.

E. Special cases POW, deserters, etc.

Conditions of release for categories A (b), and E (b)

(1) That following release and immediately upon arrival at his intended address, he will report in person to the Officer in charge of the Carabinieri Station having jurisdiction. (The intended address chosen by the interned must be approved by Public Safety).

(2) That he will report thereafter and until further notice to the Officer in charge of the said Police Station all continuous changes of a period of 48 hours or more from his registered address.

RELATIONS WITH REGIONAL H.Q.

1. General Principles. The Regional Civil Affairs Officer (RCAO) shall be responsible to the CCAO for the administration of military government in his region. - (iii) The subject matter raises legal, political or ecclesiastical questions of a character which may require handling by AMG HQ or higher headquarters (e.g. policy as to internees and foreign nationals, matters affecting ecclesiastical personnel, repeal or suspension of Fascist laws.)
- (iv) The subject matter involves a substantial change in Italian law or administrative procedure, other than of local application (e.g. modification of laws.)

- (iii) The subject matter raises legal, political or ecclesiastical questions of a character which may require handling by AMG HQ or higher headquarters (e.g. policy as to internees and foreign nationals, matters affecting ecclesiastical personnel, repeal or suspension of Fascist laws.)
- (iv) The subject matter involves a substantial change in Italian law or administrative procedure, other than of local application (e.g. modification of social insurance systems, agricultural control, tax structure, labor laws).
- (v) The subject matter involves policy affecting insurance companies organized or operating on a National basis (e.g. banks, insurance companies.)

(a) Appointments or removals of Prefects and other administrative officers of like rank will be subject to prior approval by AMG HQ. Appointments or removals of certain judicial, educational and other officials, some of whom are mentioned in Appendix B hereto and others to be separately notified, will also be subject to such prior approval. Appointments or removals of all officials will be reported to AMG HQ.

2. Personnel. RMOs will command all personnel assigned to their respective regions. RMOs, together with the senior regional officer of the opposite nationality, will have the power to discipline personnel under their command and will make recommendations for promotions and transfers to or from the Region.

In the case of many officers and some IM/ORs assigned to regions, the field of activity in which they are to be engaged will be specified. Any assignments of such specialist personnel must be observed except in cases of emergency and then only for the duration of the emergency.

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3. Communications. Orders to personnel in the regions, including specialist personnel, will be issued only by the RCAG. Communications on technical matters from a Sub-Commission or Division Chief AG HQ to the specialist personnel in the regions must be sent through the RCAG.

Officers from AG HQ may and will make frequent inspection trips within the regions. On such occasions they will make their presence and the nature of their mission known to the RCAG, or where impracticable, to the nearest SCAG. No orders or directives will be communicated by such officers to the specialists in the field; technical observations may, however, be so communicated from HQ personnel to specialists in the Regions or vice versa. If these are in written form, copies will be furnished to the RCAG.

4. Procedure. For obvious reasons it will be desirable that procedure adopted by RCAGs, particularly in dealing with the Italian administration, shall be uniform as between the regions. In cases where uniform procedure has been or is hereafter prescribed by AG HQ, such procedure will be binding uniformly on the staffs in each region.

5. Proclamations and Orders. Proclamations and orders of a public nature which are published by posting up or publication in a newspaper are of three types, Proclamations, General Orders and Regional Orders. (See Appendix C hereto.)

(a) Proclamations. All proclamations are signed by the Military Governor and will only be issued on the authority of AG HQ.

(b) General Orders. All General Orders are signed by the CCAG or his Deputy and will only be issued on the authority of AG HQ.

(c) Regional Orders. RCAGs may publish within their Regions orders signed by the RCAG which shall be described as "Regional Order No.....".

6. General Uniformity. It is obviously impracticable to establish by specific category all of these matters which are within the authority of the RCAG and those which are reserved for AG HQ. APPENDIX B

SPECIFIC LIMITATIONS ON THE POWERS OF ROACE

Public Safety

- (d) Release of inter-urban telecommunication facilities for restricted civilian use will be made only after AMG HQ has procured AMG approval.

RELATIONS WITH REGIONAL HQ

1. General Principles. The Regional Civil Affairs Officer (RCAO) shall be responsible to the AMG HQ for the administration of military government in his region. Generally speaking he will have full power of command and decision on all matters relating to government, subject to the following limitations:

a. Action taken will be within the framework of policies established by AMG HQ by proclamation, order, directive or otherwise. Interpretations issued by AMG HQ of proclamations and orders will be binding upon each region. Questions of interpretation raising any point likely to effect other regions must be resolved by AMG HQ.

b. Certain institutions or activities which by their nature must be dealt with on a uniform basis throughout occupied territory will be specifically reserved from the scope of authority of the RCAO, and action in such cases will be directed from AMG HQ. AMFA is one activity so reserved. Others will be separately notified.

c. Matters where ^{an issue} policy has not been established and which do not effect ^{an} activity specifically reserved to AMG HQ will ^{nevertheless} be referred to AMG HQ when:

(i) The subject matter is likely to effect occupied territory as a whole, as opposed to the specific region (e.g. price and wage scales).

(ii) ^{involves a} Subject matter relating to direct relationship with other regions (e.g. inter-regional shipments, inter-regional supply move-

ment, movement of refugees, etc.)

(iii) Subject matter raising ^{as} political questions of a character which may require handling by AMG HQ or higher headquarters (e.g. ~~relations with national Italian government officials~~ ^{interests of} foreign nationals, etc.) ^{as public affairs of the United States}

(iv) ^{as} Subject matter involving ^{as} ~~a~~ change in Italian law or administrative procedure, other than local application (e.g. modification of social insurance systems) ^{as}

2. Personnel. RCOs will command all personnel assigned to their respective regions. RCOs, together with the senior regional officer of the opposite nationality, will have the power to discipline personnel under their command and will make recommendations for promotions and transfers.

In the case of many officers and some EM/ORs assigned to regions, the field of activity in which they are to be engaged will be specified. Any assignments of such specialists personnel must be observed except in cases of emergency. ^{when they are the only of a temporary nature}

3. Communications. Orders to personnel in the regions, including specialist personnel, will be issued only by the RCO. Communications on technical matters may be sent directly from a Subcommittee or Division Chief AMG HQ ~~and~~ to the specialist personnel in the regions, provided that in each case a copy of the communication is sent to the RCO.

Officers from AMG HQ may and will make frequent inspection ^{groups} within the regions. On such occasions they will make their presence and the nature of their mission known to the RCO, or where impracticable, to the nearest SCAO. No orders or directives will be communicated by such officers to the specialists in the field; technical instructions may, however, be so communicated. ^{if in conformity with the policy of the RCO}

GENERAL EISENHOWER'S ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

Released at 2200 hours, 10 November:

As Commander-in-Chief of Allied Forces, I wish to announce the formation of the Allied Control Commission for Italy which, following the Italian surrender, has today assumed the duty of carrying out the Armistice and of aligning Italian economy in complete support of the United Nations fight against Germany.

Major General Kenyon A. Joyce, USA, has been appointed Acting Deputy President of the Allied Control Commission with headquarters at the seat of the Italian Government. He is the active head of the Control Commission, operating directly under the Commander-in-Chief of Allied Forces to whom he is responsible. The Commission has control of the military and economic activities of Italy, as envisaged in the terms of the Armistice.

Italy has a new role in the war. That role is to fight the common enemy--Germany. The Control Commission will see that all of Italy's economic resources and manpower are utilized where they can do the most good in that fight.

In all areas behind the combat zone, Allied Military Government of Enemy Territory will gradually be replaced by Italian administration exercised under supervision of the Control Commission. We look to the Italian Government to broaden its political composition and strengthen its administrative structure, and the transfer from Allied Military Government to Italian administration will keep pace with this development. This does not mean the return of Italian territory to unrestricted Italian control.

Allied Military Government still goes forward with the 15 Army Group to organize the territory as the Germans are expelled. Allied Military Government continues to press onward as a spearhead, taking charge of communities disorganized by the Nazi retreat and destruction, restoring common civic life once burdened with Fascism, and clearing the path immediately for further military movements towards the front.

When the Armistice was granted, the Allied Commander-in-Chief appointed a Military Mission headed by Lieutenant General P. W. Mason MacFarlane to the Italian Government. It functioned at the temporary seat of the Italian Government, and the scope of the Mission corresponded to many of the duties of the Allied Control Commission. The Mission's duties have been performed as planned, and it is now replaced by the Allied Control Commission.

General MacFarlane, who has rendered outstanding service, is returning to his post as Governor of Gibraltar.

Well in advance of the surrender, plans were made and personnel brought forward so that we should be prepared for the problem of Post-Armistice control. The Allied Control Commission was established. It is divided into four

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sections: (1) Military; (2) Political; (3) Economic and Administrative; (4) Communications. Each Section, with its proper Sub-Divisions will operate in fields as so dictated by the times.

Personnel was drawn from especially military officers and civilian experts. Some of them were sent to this theatre for duties involving Civil Affairs. Others are technicians. Others were engaged in Allied Military Government work.

In all of this change it should be borne in mind that the Italian Government is bound by the terms of the Armistice which stipulates that "The Commander-in-Chief of Allied Forces reserves to himself the right to take any measures which in his opinion may be necessary for the protection of the interests of the Allied Forces for the prosecution of the war, and the Italian Government binds itself to take such administrative or other action as the Commander-in-Chief may require."

Pursuant to the agreement reached at the Tripartite Conference at Moscow, an Advisory Council for Italy has been established in conjunction with the work of the Allied Control Commission for Italy. The Advisory Council will deal with day-to-day questions other than military preparations and will make recommendations to coordinate Allied policy with regard to Italy. In the first instance the Advisory Council will be composed of representatives of the United States, the United Kingdom, the Soviet Union, and the French Committee of National Liberation. Later, representatives of Greece and Yugoslavia will be added to this Council.

The United Nations are converting Italy into an effective instrument of war against Germany. They look to the Italian Government to produce tangible results. By rallying the entire people to a vigorous resistance to the Germans, the Government of Italy may hasten the redemption of its country and prove its value to the United Nations.
