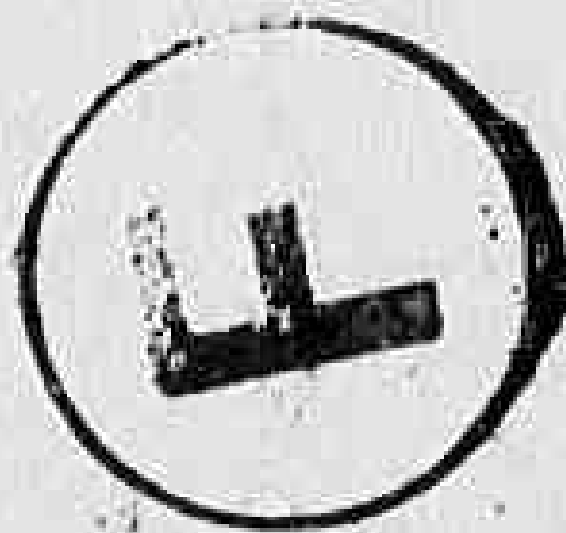

- 1 In accordance with MTOUSA telegraphic Order No 774, Maj. Aldo L. RAFFA reported to the Commanding Officer, University Training Command at Florence Italy, on or about 5 July 1945.
- 2 Maj. RAFFA was subsequently accorded a 30 days respite in accordance with AG 204-Raffa, Aldo L (O) of 7 July 45.
- 3 The Officer in question is now in the midst of a large volume of work involving the suspension and removal of Fascists from Government offices and business enterprises. He has recruited a staff of civilian employees who are under his direct supervision. Major RAFFA's wide experience, his fluency in Italian and his familiarity with the work already accomplished in North Italy, render it most desirable that he be permitted to continue his work for at least 30 days from 7 Aug 1945 (the expiration date of previously accorded extension).
- 4 There is no officer available who can replace Major RAFFA in this work (which comes within the Armistice conditions) and his departure at this time would probably mean a cessation of properly supervised operation in Lombardia and the dispersal of his trained staff.
- 5 Accordingly, it is requested that every possible effort be made to secure an additional 30 days from University Training Command so that Maj RAFFA may complete this important work.

Dear Sir,

In accordance with MTOUSA telegraphic order no. 774
Major ALDO L. RAFFA, O-900915, is reporting to your command
for temporary duty.

In the hope that you may decide that Major Raffa's
services are not vital, or that they can be dispensed with
shortly, I wish to emphasize that his services are absolutely
essential to the military government of this region and that
for the time being, at least, there is no officer to take his
place.

Major Raffa is the Regional Epuration Officer for all
of Lombardy Region. As such his job is to organize and supervise
the Italian Commissions which remove or suspend Fascists from
governmental offices in the various provinces under the
provisions of General Order 35. In addition, with the issuance
of General Order No.46, he now has the added responsibility of
organizing and supervising commissions within every private
industry in the Region. This task requires unusual tact and
judgment, based on actual experience as well as a fluent
knowledge of the Italian language. Major Raffa has been
engaged in this line of duty for over two years in this
theatre and the ETO and in fact was brought back from ETO
to help complete the epuration job in Italy.

Unfortunately we have been unable to procure another
officer with the same qualifications, with the result that
Major Raffa has had to carry the burden alone, and there is
no qualified officer now available to take over his duties.

For these reasons, it would be greatly appreciated if
you could excuse Major Raffa from his temporary assignment
with you. In the event that is not possible, would it be at
all feasible that his schedule be so arranged that he could
spend part of each week at the university training command
and part here ? 4369

Any efforts you can make in the interests of the service
as indicated will be greatly appreciated.

3. Definition.

a. Required Officer Personnel - Those officers with low Adjusted Service Rating Card (ASRC) scores, and whose individual services and qualifications are essential to the command as a matter of military necessity, even though they may have high ASRC scores.

b. Non-Required Officer Personnel - Officer personnel with the highest Adjusted Service Rating Scores, whose individual services and qualifications are not essential to the command as a matter of military necessity or for whom a qualified replacement is available or is not required; and those officers for whom an appropriate assignment is not available.

4. It is requested that a review be made of the above personnel and that a report be furnished this headquarters by 15 July 1945 listing personnel. For required personnel a separate letter will be forwarded giving reasons for the individual's retention predicated upon the operational requirement for the continued services of the individual. It is pointed out that this headquarters will not be the final authority for the determination of personnel whose ASRC score is equal to or above the critical score who will be retained as required personnel. Justification for determination of any officer as required must include information as follows:

- a. Name, rank, ASN of officer concerned.
- b. Adjusted Service Rating Score.
- c. A detailed description of position officer occupies, his duties in that position, his particular qualifications to fill it.
- d. A comprehensive statement that will substantially show why the position which the particular officer is now performing is of military necessity.

In the meantime it is, I think, essential that she should keep in touch with developments of the scheme and with the many points that arise now that the scheme is under general discussion.

1. Reference your inter office memo dated 1 July (attached)
2. I am strongly opposed, as I know Lord Stansgate is also, to the proposed exchange of Capt Hammond for Major DeWald.
3. I do not consider that Capt Hammond would make as suitable a Director, nor do I consider he should be accepted as a director while Major Ward Perkins is in the MFA Sub-Commission, in view of the latter's seniority and capabilities.
4. This matter was discussed yesterday with Colonel Newton, although the attached correspondence had not then been received. Colonel Newton is opposed to any change of personnel at this time. Furthermore, he considers that the establishment of officers in this Sub-Commission is too low, and would on the other hand be more inclined to recommend that Mason Hammond be returned to this theatre in addition to Major DeWald rather than on an exchange basis. I agree with this view.
5. I therefore recommend that no exchange of personnel be made, and that if the ceiling can be increased, it is requested that Capt. Mason Hammond be returned here as a member of the Staff of MEAA.

Vice President, Economic Section.

1. Request that you instruct Directors of Sub-commissions to refrain from informing Regions that transfers of their specialist personnel "have been arranged." Several recent incidents have occurred in which the Directors of Sub-commissions have so informed Regions and the transfers were impossible for reasons unknown to the Sub-commission. Since demands for personnel are received from many sources both from inside and outside ACC, it is impossible to keep Directors informed of all contemplated plans for the use of all personnel. In many cases, these plans are changed for good reason within the day or hour. Further, the internal organization of forward Regions, such as IV and V are many times unknown to Directors and disruption of Provincial teams is quite likely to be caused without intending it. To give notice of changes which later can not be made or without consultation with any HQ which may be involved, gives rise to confusion and irritation.

2. Consultation with RCs and SCAOs reference their personnel problems is within the province of Directors and is to be encouraged. Possible transfers may be discussed but no promises should be made in reference thereto.

3. All requests for transfers, attachments or temporary duty of specialist officers should be processed through the Establishment Officer, or the Executive Officer (B) who is responsible for all personnel placements (not directly to G-1). In all cases of disagreement between RCs and Directors of Sub-commissions as to the assignment or relief of a specialist officer, the situation will be presented to the Establishment Officer for decision. Co-operation of Directors will be very much appreciated.
