Under GHQ letter 4327/7/44 dated 8 Dec 45, authority has been given allowing officers in Age/Service Release Groups 25 and later, who are at present ineligible for LIAP, to proceed on LIAP provided they sign a statement that they will agree to serve a minimum of four months from the time of rejoining their units or formations ex LIAP.
2. The same terms apply to Other Ranks.
3. It is emphasized by G.H.Q. that this is an arrangement whereby extra man power may be made available to the army and it is not to be used as a means to send men on LIAP for compassionate or other reasons.
4. ~~THREE~~ ^{THREE} copies of all statements signed in accordance with para 1 and 2 above will be forwarded, before departure on LIAP, to G-1 (B) this H.Q. for onward transmission to GHQ 2nd Echelon.

This will take immediate effect. Such personnel will not repeat not proceed on LIAP although vacancies may have been allotted. Reason is expected early release.

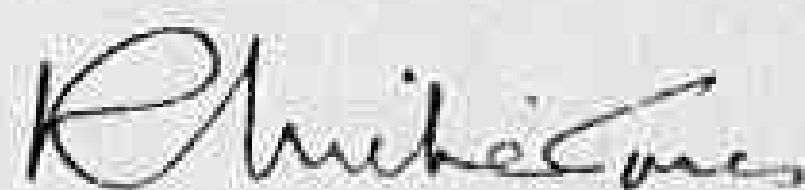

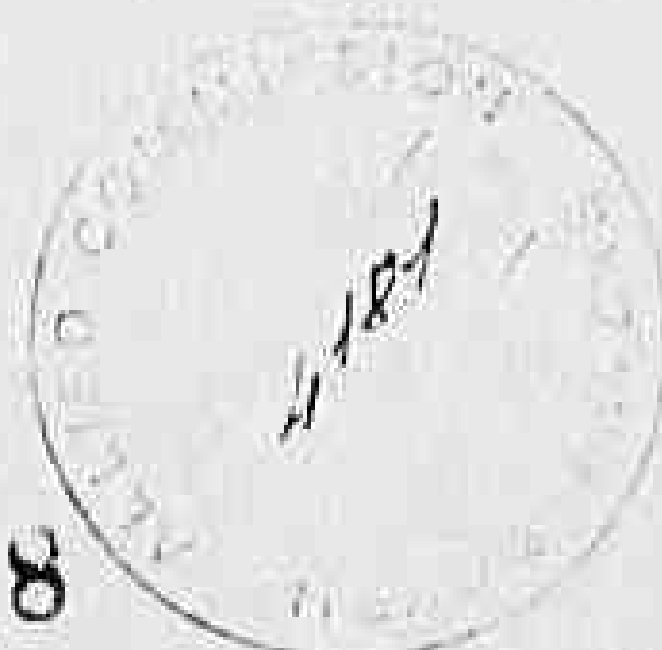

SUBJECT: Leave for Officers.

TO : Regional Commissioners, Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI and VII.

1. With reference to para.4 Minutes of Regional Commissioners' Conference, 15-16 April, "Local leave" was authorised by the Executive Commissioner provided that not more than 20% of officers were on leave at any one time, and that the officers did not make any attempt while on such leave to enter Army areas. It was further agreed that the above provisions should also apply to EM/ORs. Travel will be regularised by the issuance of Regional Orders under authority of this letter placing the officers or EM/ORs on temporary duty for not to exceed six(6) days at the location for which the leave is requested. The order placing them on temporary duty will authorise the travel.

2. The Regional Commissioners of Regions I and VI have previously been authorised to order air travel in the name of HQ ACC and that authorisation is extended to this type of temporary duty. Regional Commissioners will so space the authorisations for air travel on this temporary duty that the MATS will not be over-crowded with officers on "local leave".

3. HQ ACC and Regional Headquarters of Regions to which officers and men are ordered will be notified three days in advance of contemplated arrival time so that accommodations may be provided.
