Final sitrep UMBRIA-MARCHE REGION.

This Headquarters closes with effect 2359 hours 9 May 1945; all Provincial offices except ANCONA already closed; ANCONA continues to continue under military government. This Region's portion of German denouement (7) consisted in surrender of 15 vessels, chiefly E-Boats but including 1 U-Boat, with total crews of 1300, at ANCONA on 6 April. DONNA RACHELE MURROLINI and 2 younger children due momentarily to arrive at "R" Internes Camp at TERNI. TERNI Province had best olive collection record of region considered as percentage of target, though PERUGIA Province had larger total collection. PESARO had best collection of grain in relation to target figure, with PERUGIA again having largest tonnage. Final harvest figures for UMBRIA-MARCHE REGION:

New court of appeals for URBAN opened at FUSKUL on 28 April by Minister of Justice; ceremony attended by Regional Commissioner and other allied officers. *Good. Satisfactory* Arrival of sugar shipments makes possible URBAN Province's first general issue of sugar in 6 months. *Good. Satisfactory* All Provinces instructed to make drastic reductions in circulation permits to allow use of available quantities of PGL for industries, mills and truck pool grain movement. Olive oil collection in Region now at approximately three-quarters of target figure; URBAN-RAIDING grain collections 117% of goal. Grain collections through 28 April: URBAN 60,886 tons 121%, URBAN 47,312 tons 109%, URBAN 7384 tons 109%, URBAN 37141 tons 181%, URBAN 91,335 tons 111%, URBAN 25,549 tons 102%. Demonstration staged by about 500 persons at PERAKO regarding complaints on price of wheat; situation competently handled by Provincial Public Safety Officer in cooperation with Guesure and no trouble resulted. PERAKO CITY curfew moved from 2200 to 2300 hours with full approval of military authorities. UNP-approved paper NICO-THUOLICH in ANKOR suspended publication for lack of paper while 162 papers, including some of purely pornographic nature are being published in KONT. ^{Local-Savakachung} TUMI Province has 3-months supply of salt. ^{Outage-Savakachung} Efforts being made to arrive at consolidated figures for need of coal and POL in region, including harvest. Numerous drugs being uncovered daily in PERAKO CITY, indicating that adequate supplies exist. Lack of rain causing reports of possibly serious damage to spring-sown crops throughout Region; autumn-sown wheat suffering only in thin soil, looking very good on better land, particularly in Thakian plain where nightly heavy dew are as beneficial as rain. All ISMENIA-MAJONE provinces now have exceeded target figure for collection of last year's grain harvest. Wheat collection totals through 21 April: ANKOR 60569 tons 121%, MOULI 47048 tons 109%, MAJONE 75573 tons 109%, PERAKO 37055 tons 176%, PERAKO 91142 tons 113%, TUMON 25305 tons 101%; Regional totals 334692 tons 116%. ISMENIA-MAJONE olive oil

Sitrep UMBRIA-MARCHE region. Control of military government in 2 UMBRIA provinces, TERNI and PERUGIA, assumed by this HQ on 16 March. Last provincial officers in 4 ANCONA provinces removed on 11 March. This HQ closed at 2000 hours 1 April and reopened at PERUGIA 0800 hours this date. Prefect of ANCONA held farewell party for regional and provincial officers on 28 March; Prefect expressed his appreciation for help Allies had given him and in turn both provincial Commissioner and Regional Commissioner made short speeches.

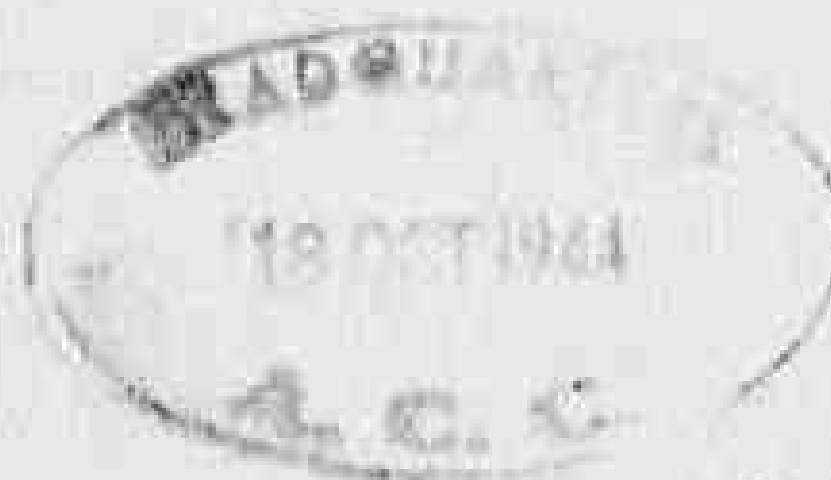

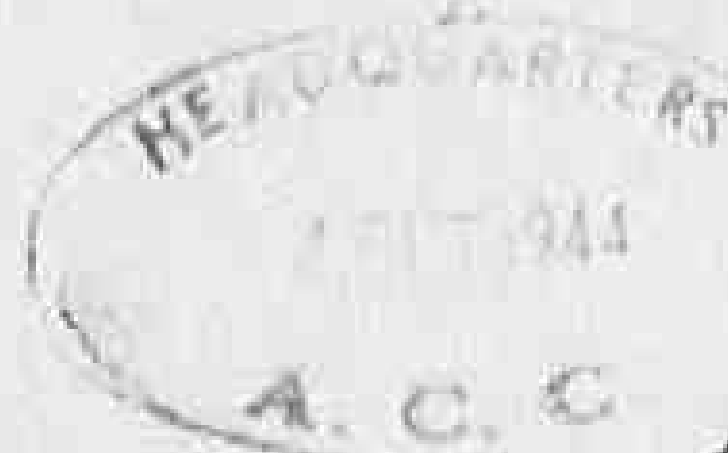
