SUBJECT: Civilian Employees

TO : Regional Commissioner, Piemonte Region

1. Reference is made to your 042 of 19 April.
2. Your attention is invited to our 56.1/20/EST of 16 April, to which your letter cited above replies.
3. It is believed that the language of our letter of 16 April, and the intent thereof, is clear, in that Italian civilian employees will not be taken forward without specific authority in each individual case, which will be granted for exceptional reasons only.
4. Pending receipt from your Headquarters of individual requests for authority to move these civilians forward, and specific approval by Hq. AC, in each case, no Italian civilians will accompany Piemonte Region forward of its present location.

SUBJECT : Civilian Employees

TO : Acting Executive Commissioner, Hq. Allied Commission, CMF

1. Reference your 56.1/20/EST dated 16 April 45.
2. There is a small number of civilian personnel employed as Executive and Administrative Assistants, who have been working for this Region for the last six months. These men are all trained personnel and are essential for the work of the special divisions by whom they are employed. They are either men associated with or having expert knowledge of the Compartimento of TURIN or senior members of important engineering works situated in the Region.
3. Their Schede Personali have all been approved some months ago. They have been vetted by Public Safety, and this HQ is in possession of passes issued by Fifth Army permitting them to move forward. One of the Executives was employed in AMG Eighth Army before coming here.
4. These male assistants have now been fully trained to take their part in their respective departments, and if this order is enforced, the work of months will be wasted. It is submitted that these civilians should be allowed to move in to the North with this HQ, and that the employment of all such persons should be left to the discretion of the Regional Commissioner.
5. It is not intended to move any interpreters or clerks forward. There will, of course, be a number of Italian drivers who will be necessary to move this Region forward, and it is suggested that the authority to use them should also remain with this HQ.

The Commission is reconsidering the matter of taking civilians from the south to the northern regions. It is opposed in principle to this practice. Application may be made in individual cases for exceptional reasons only, but no Italian civilians will be taken forward without specific authority of this Headquarters of each individual case. This applies to civilians of all categories, whether they are interpreters, clerical, or other assistants.
