TRAINING OFFICERS

1. ORGANIZATION

No. 3 Platoon (Trainee) consists of 3 Sections with 3 Platoon Officers and supervising and in immediate charge of the training of 3 Sections.

2. DUTIES

(a) Platoon Officers

Platoon Officers are:

- Squad Leader, F. T. L. (1/c Sections 1, 2 and 3),
- Squad Leader, A. T. (1/c Sections 4, 5 and 6),
- Squad Leader, C. (1/c Sections 7, 8 and 9).

They will be responsible to the Platoon Commander for the supervision and completion of training, in accordance with training programme, of the 3 Sections under their command; for discipline, and for the accuracy of all returns submitted in respect of their Sections and the personnel therein.

On Saturday of each week, Platoon Officers will examine the Training Books maintained by their Section Commanders. A specimen copy of the Training Book is attached hereto as Appendix 'A'. They will examine same and endorse in evidence of their agreement with the accuracy of the entries therein. At the same time they will obtain from Section Commanders a certificate stating that training has been completed by the personnel of their Section in accordance with the programme and the details thereof contained in the Training Book.

Platoon Officers will render to the Platoon Commander not later than 18.00 hours on the last day of each month a certificate in the following form:

On Saturday of each week, Platoon Officers will examine the Training Books maintained by their Sections. They will examine the Training Book in attached hereto as Appendix "A". They will examine same and advise in relation of their agreement with the contents of the entries therein. At the same time they will obtain from Section Commanders a certificate stating that training has been completed by the personnel of their Section in accordance with the program and the detailed program contained in the Training Book.

Platoon Officers will render to the Platoon Commander not later than 10.00 hours on the last day of each month a certificate in the following form:

Platoon Officers will act in turn as Duty Officer at training exercises and, on the day of their duty, will sign the Platoon Training Roll Book as evidence of the accuracy of the entries therein. Duty personnel will be as laid down by the Platoon Commander.

In the absence of the Platoon Officer on duty, Section Commanders of the 3 Sections for which the Platoon Officer is normally responsible will assume duty as Platoon Officer.

Section Commanders are responsible to the Platoon Commander through their Platoon Officers for discipline in their respective sections, and for the implementation of instructions issued by the Platoon Commander or Platoon Officers.

They will assist in: 1. Training work in which will be entered in record of the training performed by the unit in their section (See Appendix A). 2. This book will be available for inspection at all times by the Platoon Commander or Platoon Officers.

Section Commanders will render a weekly certificate (in form similar to that rendered by Platoon Officers to the Platoon Commander - see Appendix A) stating the training performed by the personnel of their section in accordance with the program of training contained in the Training Book. This and copy of certificate will be at the discretion of Platoon Officers.

In the absence of the Section Commander the next senior NCO in the section will assume command.

(c) Platoon Sergeant

Senior NCO will perform a weekly tour of duty as Platoon Sergeant in accordance with a roster to be maintained by the Platoon Commander.

The Platoon Sergeant will carry out such instructions as may be given to him by the Platoon Commander or by the Platoon Officers.

He will maintain the Platoon Training Book in which will be recorded attendance at the 8.15 parade on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and which will be signed at each parade by the Duty Officer, and be available for inspection by the Platoon Commander, and be available for inspection by the Platoon Officers.

He will collect from Platoon Officers by not later than 12.00 hrs. on the last day of each month their monthly certificates to the Platoon Commander, and therefrom he will prepare a certificate (in similar

They will maintain a training book in which will be entered a record of the training performed by the men in their Section (see Appendix 1). This book will be available for inspection at all times by the Platoon Commander or Platoon Officer.

Section Commanders will render a weekly certification (in form similar to that rendered by Platoon Officers to the Platoon Commander - see Appendix 1) showing that training has been completed by the personnel of their Section in accordance with the program and the record described in the Training Book. This and the certification will be at the discretion of Platoon Officers.

In the absence of the Section Commander the next number man in the Section will assume command.

(c) Platoon Sergeant

Junior NO 1 will perform a weekly tour of duty as Platoon Sergeant in accordance with a roster to be maintained by the Platoon Commander.

The Platoon Sergeant will carry out such instructions as may be given to him by the Platoon Commander or by the Platoon Officers.

He will maintain the Platoon Readiness Book in which will be recorded attendance at the 8.15 parade on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and which will be signed at each parade by the Platoon Officer, and be available for inspection by the CO, ~~Platoon Commander~~ NO 1 Coy (clerk) or Platoon Officers.

He will collect from Platoon Officers by not later than 12.30 hrs. on the last day of each month their Monthly Certificates to the Platoon Commander, and therefrom he will prepare a certificate (in similar form) to the CO. 3. DISCIPLINE

In the event of the need for disciplinary action, charges will be supported by documentary evidence and will be delivered by the Section Commander concerned to the Platoon Officer who will transmit to the Platoon Officer concerned. Platoon Officers will consult the Platoon Commander in respect of all cases where disciplinary action is considered necessary.

4. Method of Instruction

(a) General

Monthly Training Programmes will be as approved by Company Commander, No. 1 Company (Clerks).

Training lectures will be delivered in the Main Conference Hall, 3rd Floor, Ministry of Communications Building, from 08.45 hrs to 09.45 hrs on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week, commencing Monday 3 March 1945. All persons attending training lectures will provide themselves with writing materials for the purpose of taking notes.

There will be NO SMOKING in the Conference Room.

Training not covered by training lectures will be carried out under Section arrangements under the supervision of Platoon Officers, at times which will interfere to the minimum with normal duties.

(b) Preparation of Lectures

Personnel of the three Clerks Platoons will follow the same basic programs.

The three lecture periods referred to in sub-para 4(a) above will each require the equivalent period of study outside lecture hours.

Platoon Officers will be responsible for the preparation of subject material and for provision of lectures in accordance with separate instructions to be issued by the Platoon Commander.
