2. Under these circumstances there is little hope of providing replacements for Sub Commissions which are already comparatively well staffed.

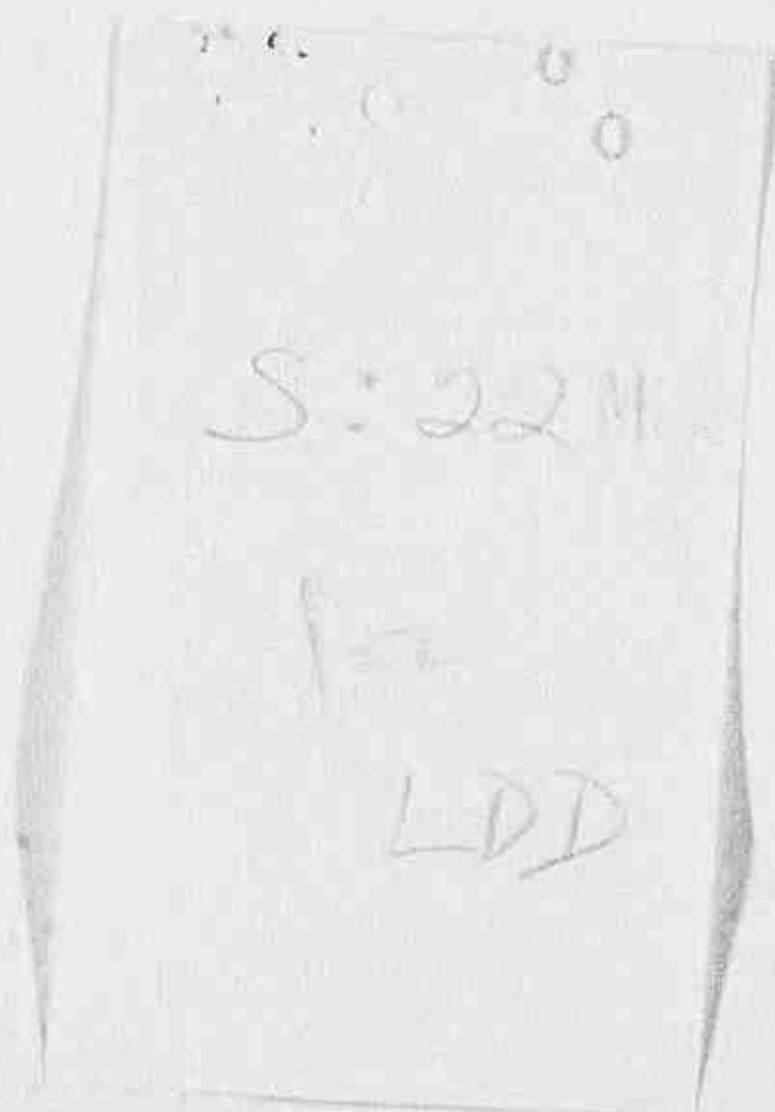

Because of his former connection in the labor field, and his knowledge of Italian, he is admirably suited for this assignment. I have been informed that he is considered unavailable because of a very recent assignment to the Interpreters' Pool.

2. It is obvious that exceedingly important work must be done with the Italian Government in furthering our war aims in the areas turned over to that Government. In charge of the very important Salerno Office is Captain R. M. ALBRIGHT, who, since his initial assignment to this post in Brindisi, has had to operate absolutely alone without any help. The situation has become extremely critical now that Captain Albright has to maintain two offices, one with the Italian Ministry of Labor at Vietri sul Mare, and the other at ACC Rear Headquarters, Tribunale Building, Salerno. In addition, he must make frequent trips to the head office of the Sub-Commission in Naples. Clearly, the addition of one Enlisted Man of the calibre of Sergeant Sorisi, to give Captain Albright direly needed assistance, is an urgent matter requiring affirmative action.
