1. The following G.H.Q. ruling with regard to eligibility of personnel for Privilege Leave or LIAP is forwarded for information of all concerned.
2. In all cases eligibility will be determined by the actual geographical location of the individual at the time when the individual is to be granted Privilege Leave or LIAP.
3. It follows therefore that in cases where a Headquarters of any description is in South Italy and has units, sub-units or individuals attached to units in North Italy or RTA, or vice versa, the eligibility of all personnel on the strength of that Headquarters will be determined by the physical location of the individual and NOT by that of his Headquarters.

In view of the fact that personnel due for PRISON up to and including 31 Dec 45 are likely to have left the Theatre by 31 Oct 45, it has been decided, as a temporary measure, to extend eligibility for LIAP to those personnel who are in Age/Service Groups 20 and 21. This concession will hold good only until the 15th September 45, by which time it is considered that most of the long service men in Groups 20 and 21 will have been granted leave.

2. The ruling contained in GR0 829/45 para 5 will continue to hold good in all respects, with the exception that until 15 September 45 the Age/Service Groups for men will read 1-19. After this date they will automatically revert to 1-21. Eligibility rules for women remain as at present; medical officers are ineligible if in Age/Service Groups 1-11, and Nursing Officers if in Groups 1-16.

3. It is emphasized that this relaxation of the current regulations is designed solely to even out differences of leave between the really long service personnel and those who actually qualify for PRISON. It is NOT to be inferred that the inclusion in LIAP of these two additional Age/Service Groups indicates any recalculation of the release scheme. There has been no alteration in the statement made in the House of Commons that the very early twenties will be released by the end of this year.

4. No additional allotment has been made to this HQ over and above that already made for August.

2. The leave destination is limited to the United Kingdom and places within areas controlled by British or Dominion authorities. In the latter case, the previous permission of the authority concerned will be obtained by A.I.H.Q. before despatch.
3. Leave to foreign countries will not be considered unless the individual has very strong claims.
4. The period of leave will be 61 days in the country in which leave is authorized.
5. From date of re-embarkation the individual will be deemed to commence a fresh tour of service abroad, limited to a maximum period of two years. Personnel whose A.S./Service Release Groups are called forward for release during this two years period will be released with their A.S./Service Release Group 2331.
6. (a) Acting rank will be relinquished by officers and other ranks on the 29th day after leaving this theatre.
(b) Temporary rank will be retained throughout the leave and travelling period.

- (a) Personnel eligible shall be those qualified for posting to the United Kingdom under PTHON.
 - (b) Personnel must be in Age/Service Release Group 27 or later (if 472, Age/Service Release Group 13 or later) or, if in earlier Age/Service Release Groups, must have deferred their release for one year or more.
2. The leave destination is limited to the United Kingdom and places within areas controlled by British or Dominion authorities. In the latter case, the previous sanction of the authority concerned will be obtained by A.F.B.Q. before despatch.
 3. Leave to foreign countries will not be considered unless the individual has very strong claims.
 4. The period of leave will be 64 days in the country in which leave is authorized.
 5. From date of re-embarkation the individual will be deemed to commence a fresh tour of service abroad, limited to a maximum period of two years. Personnel whose Age/Service Release Groups are called forward for release at this two years period will be released with their Age/Service Release Group **2331**.
 6.
 - (a) Acting rank will be relinquished by officers and other ranks on the 29th day after leaving this theatre.
 - (b) Temporary rank will be retained throughout the leave and travelling period.

On return an officer will be reabsorbed into his former vacancy with effect from the date of arrival back at his unit. In the event of his or her unit or formation being disbanded or the War Establishment being reduced so that the former employment no longer exists, temporary rank will be relinquished with effect from the date of disembarkation in this theatre.
 - (c) Vacancies may be filled and promotion granted to the temporary incumbent and the date of relinquishment by the former holder. Officers and Other Ranks of British service or of Colonial Forces administered by the War Office commissioned or enlisted in the United Kingdom or Eire, who are normally resident outside the United Kingdom or Eire, and who have completed four years' military service, including any service with British Naval or Air Forces, outside their country of normal residence are eligible for 61 days leave in their country of normal residence.

2. Leave destination is limited to places within areas controlled by British or Dominion authorities. The previous sanction of the authority concerned will be obtained by AFHQ before despatch.

Leave to the United Kingdom for personnel not normally resident there is not permitted.

3. Leave for foreign countries will not be considered unless the individual has a very strong claim.

4. From date of re-embarkation the individual will be deemed to commence a fresh tour of service abroad limited to a maximum period of two years. Personnel whose Long Service Release Groups are called forward for release during these two years' period will be released with their Long Service Release Groups.

5. (a) Acting rank will be relinquished by officers and other ranks on the 29th day after leaving this theatre.

(b) Temporary rank will be retained throughout the leave and travel period.

On return an officer will be re-absorbed into his former vacancy with effect from the date of arrival back at his unit. In the case of his unit or formation being disbanded or the War Establishment being reduced so that the former employment no longer exists, temporary rank will be relinquished with effect from the date of disbandment in this theatre.

(u) Vacancies may be filled and promotion granted to the temporary incumbent with the date of relinquishment by the former holder. 7. Personnel who apply for and are granted leave under the terms of this G.R.O. will not be permitted to alter their decision after leaving this Command.

8. Retired rolls of personnel applying for leave under this G.R.O. will be forwarded direct to G.R.O. 2nd Echelon. 1. As from the date of publication of this G.R.O. the qualifying date for eligibility for return to UK will be that on which four years' unbroken service overseas are completed, reckoned from the date of embarkation in UK for the journey which actually reaches an overseas destination.

2. (a) Periods of leave or duty, aggregating not more than six months, spent in the UK during the four years do not constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility and will be counted as overseas service and will contribute towards the qualifying period.

(b) Time spent in UK aggregating more than six months will constitute a break in an overseas tour, and a new tour of overseas service starts on the next date of embarkation.

(c) Time spent in UK in the following circumstances will be ignored in assessing the six months referred to above:-

(i) As a patient in a Medical Unit or H.S. Hospital after admission immediately on disembarkation.

(ii) On leave in addition to PENSION (LEAP).

(iii) On leave granted to personnel from overseas before posting to the UK.

2. (u) For the purpose of this FRO overseas service will include, in addition to all overseas operations, service in

(1) MEK, NWEP, Persian Islands and Iceland.

(11) Service abroad in the case of personnel serving on vessels based overseas.

(111) Periods spent overseas as a Prisoner of War.

(b) Civilian service overseas cannot be computed when assessing eligibility for FRO or LILLO.

(c) Subject to the above para a soldier is eligible to be considered for inclusion in the FRO or LILLO provided that :-

(1) The overseas Commander does not consider his retention is necessary on operational grounds.

(11) He was enlisted or commissioned in the United Kingdom into British Service.

(111) He was enlisted or commissioned locally into British Service and either his normal residence is in the United Kingdom or he would normally be returning to the United Kingdom at intervals during his employment abroad.

(b) Personnel enlisted or commissioned into local forces are not eligible to return to the UK under the FRO or LILLO Scheme, but an officer commissioned into local forces and subsequently granted a King's Commission is thereby rendered eligible for inclusion in the FRO or LILLO subject to residential qualifications as in para 4 (a) (11) above. In such cases overseas service for FRO purposes will date with effect from the date of the King's Commission.

5. British Service personnel who are eligible for return to UK and who have been away from INDIA for a period of four years may be posted to INDIA in lieu of return to UK, subject to the conditions given in para 6 below. Periods of leave or duty, not exceeding in the aggregate six months, spent in INDIA during the four years do not constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility.

6. Posting to INDIA under para 5 above will be confined to those personnel who have definite roots in INDIA, as follows :-

(a) Those resident in INDIA on enlistment or commissioning, or before joining the British Army.

(b) Those married to Indians or Anglo-Indians.

7. Personnel posted to INDIA under para 5 above will be granted 28 days' repatriation leave. Before being posted to INDIA or elsewhere they will be granted a further 14 days' absorption leave.

8. Personnel eligible for FRO and in Age/Service Release Groups 27 or later, or if in earlier Age/Service Release Groups whose release has been deferred, who

who having resided in the United Kingdom or its colonies normally to returning to the United Kingdom at intervals during his employment abroad.

(b) Personnel enlisted or commissioned into local forces are not eligible to return to the UK under the PRISON Scheme, but an officer commissioned into local forces and contemporaneously or subsequently granted a King's Commission is thereby rendered eligible for inclusion in the PRISON Scheme subject to residential qualifications as in para 4 (a) (iii) above. In such cases overseas service for PRISON purposes will date with effect from the date of the King's Commission.

British Service personnel who are eligible for return to UK and who have been away from India for a period of four years may be posted to INDIA in lieu of return to UK, subject to the conditions given in para 6 below. Periods of leave or duty, not exceeding in the aggregate six months, spent in INDIA during the four years do not constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility.

6. Posting to INDIA under para 5 above will be confined to those personnel who have definite roots in INDIA, as follows:-

- (a) Those resident in INDIA on enlistment or commissioning, or before joining the British Army.
- (b) Those married to Indians or Anglo-Indians.

7. Personnel posted to INDIA under para 5 above will be granted 28 days' repatriation leave, before being posted to SEAC or elsewhere they will be granted a further 14 days' unexpired leave.

8. Personnel eligible for PRISON and in Army/Service Release Groups 27 or later, or if in earlier Army/Service Release Groups whose release has been deferred, who are normally domiciled in the U.K., may apply for 60 days' leave in lieu of posting to the UK (EILEP), subject to the conditions laid down for EILEP.

9. Personnel of British Service in Army/Service Release Groups 27 or later, or if in an earlier Army/Service Release Groups whose release has been deferred, who are in the U.K. or EILEP are not eligible for PRISON, but may apply for 60 days' leave to their country of domicile (EEMDOL) on completion of 4 years' overseas service outside the country of domicile subject to the conditions laid down for EEMDOL.

10. Personnel will be eligible to be called forward by GHQ 2nd Echelon as soon as their overseas period is completed. In such cases personnel may necessarily be called forward shortly before or after the actual completion of the qualifying period. In the event of an officer or other rank who considers himself eligible not being called forward he will notify his examining officer who will forward his name to GHQ 2nd Echelon stating the circumstances.

11. Where, due to the exigencies of the service, a man cannot be spared, a certificate to this effect, signed by an officer not below the rank of brigadier will be forwarded to G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon, who will delay his calling forward for a period of one month.

12. Personnel returning to the U.S. under this scheme will be struck off strength on this date with effect from the date of embarkation. They will be granted 20 days' restriction leave, and before being posted to another theatre will be granted a further 14 days' embarkation leave. Unless they volunteer for service in any other theatre, they will only be liable to be posted to North-West Europe.

13. Leaving rank will be relinquished by officers and other ranks with effect from the date of leaving the unit or appointment. Temporary rank of officers will be retained for a period of 61 days with effect from the date of disembarkation in UK/US/CA or until taken as the strength of a unit and filling a specific vacancy in the War Establishment of that unit, carrying a lower rank, whichever is the earlier.

14. This scheme is voluntary on the part of those qualified. In all cases where an officer or other rank does not wish to take advantage of this scheme, his name will be returned to HQ and General accompanied by a signed certificate to that effect. Such certificates may not be revoked until six months from the date on which they were signed. Cases in which earlier revocation is required for exceptional reasons will be submitted to HQ through the usual channels. Full statement of the circumstances involved will accompany the application.

15. Nominal rolls of personnel applying for posting to USA in line of return to the UK under para 5 above will be forwarded direct to HQ and General, GOC. All rolls will be accompanied by a recommendation of the commanding officer stating that the individual concerned fulfils the conditions given.

16. Attention is drawn to GRC 319/44, as amended by GRCs 10/45 and 4/45/45 whereby married personnel may apply for the return to the UK of their wives and children. This application should be made six months before personnel become entitled to repatriation; in view of the long number of families involved it may not otherwise be possible to return families at the same time.

As from 1 Jul 45, personnel listed at para 4 (a) (iii) above returning to the UK under PRISON or LILEY who are granted passages at 10 expense for their families will NOT be entitled under the Release Regulations, Chapter VI, to further passages for the repatriation of their families, even if on release the individual himself is eligible for repatriation under the Regulations.

Personnel who are affected by this rule who, because of it, do not wish to take PRISON or LILEY will be allowed to defer without the restriction contained in para 14 above.

17. The provisions of this GHO are applicable to officers and exiles of the AGS for whom the qualifying period referred to in para 1 above will be two years.

1. Allotment of Vacancies within Units

LIAF vacancies will be filled by units according to length of continuous service overseas, subject to the exceptions in para 6 below.

2. Allotment of Vacancies within Formations

In order to achieve uniformity within formations, so that personnel with comparatively short service are not sent on leave in one unit, while in other units personnel with longer service are kept waiting for vacancies, formations will allot vacancies in the following manner:-

- (a) Vacancies will first be allotted in proportion to members of war with over 3 years and less than 5 years service overseas plus those with over 2 years service who have relinquished python until all such individuals have been granted vacancies. These personnel will be known as Group 1.
- (b) As soon as Group 1 have been allotted vacancies, the proportional allotment will be made in accordance with numbers of personnel with over 2 years service and under 3 years, and thereafter in succession to those with over 2 and under 2 years and those with over 1 and under 2 years continuous overseas service. These groups of personnel will be known as Groups 2, 3 and 4 respectively.

3. Allotment of Vacancies by HQ

- (a) A similar system will be followed by this HQ in allotting vacancies to Armies and Districts. To enable this to be done, each Army and District and other formation receiving a direct allotment from this HQ will forward a monthly return to reach this HQ by the seventh day of each month showing numbers of eligible men under command on the first day of the month in each of the four groups specified in para 2 above. Monthly allotments will be made by this HQ on the basis of these returns about the tenth of the month.

- (b) As training will be arranged on the basis of the monthly allotments made three weeks in advance it will not be possible for vacancies to be carried from one Army or District to another by units moving from one to another; except where large numbers are involved and special arrangements can be made. Normally a unit as moving will surrender its vacancies and obtain a new allotment when reaching its destination. Owing to the number of vacancies available, this should not cause hardship. When large movements occur, the Army or District from whose command the movement takes place will send details as soon as possible to G1(Pr)HQ in order that allotments can be adjusted.

(b) As soon as Group 1 have been allotted vacancies, the proportional allotment will be made in accordance with numbers of personnel with over 21 years service and under 3 years, and thereafter in succession to those with over 2 and under 21 and those with over 1 and under 2 years continuous overseas service. These groups of personnel will be known as Groups 2, 3 and 4 respectively.

3. Allotment of Vacancies by Area

(a) A similar system will be followed by this HQ in allotting vacancies to Indian and Districts. To enable this to be done, each Army and District and other formation receiving a direct allotment from this HQ will forward a monthly return to reach this HQ by the seventh day of each month showing numbers of eligible men under command on the first day of the month in each of the four groups specified in para 2 above. Monthly allotments will be made by this HQ on the basis of these returns about the tenth of the month.

(b) As trains will be arranged on the basis of the monthly allotments and three weeks in advance it will not be possible for vacancies to be carried from one Army or District to another by units moving from one to another, except where large numbers are involved and special arrangements can be made. Normally a unit so moving will surrender its vacancies and obtain a new allotment when reaching its destination. Owing to the number of vacancies available, this should not cause hardship. When large movements occur, the Army or District from whose command the movement takes place will send details as soon as possible to G1(Dr)AA in order that allotments can be altered.

4. Eligibility

All officers and other ranks of the following categories are eligible for ICAF except those also ineligible by para 5 below:-

- (a) British personnel of the British service.
- (b) British personnel of Colonial Forces administered by the War Office.
- (c) British personnel attached or permanently attached (i.e. those on British rates of pay) to the Indian Army.

5. Disqualifications

The following are ineligible for ICAF:-

- (a) Personnel within six months of PENSION or Release, except as stated in

para 6 (b) below. The age/service groups which for this purpose are to be considered likely to be released within six months will be notified from time to time. At present, the groups are 1 - 24 for men and 1 - 28 for women, except for certain categories such as Full Colonels and above and JGs, whose rate of release is likely to be slower than the normal.

(b) Personnel under suspended sentence unless authorized by Corps or District Commanders.

(c) Personnel with less than eighteen months continuous service overseas (twelve months in the case of members of the Royal Air Force) and those who have previously had 24 or 28 or similar leave, except as stated in para 6 (b) below. Such personnel are likely to receive leave under different conditions when all entitled to leave have had leave.

Leave on Compassionate Grounds

- (a) SOs may give leave to a limited number of eligible men before their turn on the basis of length of service overseas, on reasonable compassionate grounds.
- (b) Vacation may be given by formation, etc. Commanders on reasonable compassionate or other grounds to personnel included under para 5 (a) and (c) above.
- (c) Leave on compassionate grounds will not normally be granted unless the applicant does not wish to be posted or has been refused posting or is likely to be refused posting.

Officers Vacancies

No fixed proportion of vacancies will be allotted to officers. Vacancies will be allotted to all ranks on the basis of eligibility specified above.

Period of leave

1. The following information regarding the grant of LIAP to British personnel in AMG/AC of Italy is notified in amplification of this office letter of even number dated 3 May 45 (Not to all addressees).

2. This Headquarters now receives a LIAP allotment to cover all personnel in the formation, the number of vacancies varying periodically. For information it is notified that vacancies allotted for the current draft, LIAP 14, are 7 officers and 16 G.Ns.

3. The present policy is to concentrate all personnel at this HQ, where the necessary documentation is performed and arrangements made for personnel to move as one party to the Reception Camp. With the introduction of EOAD LIAP however, a certain amount of confusion has arisen and clarification has been requested from A.2.H.Q. It is not yet known how EOAD LIAP will be applied for AMG/AC personnel in the Northern Regions and therefore the information contained in this letter is subject to alteration. Until further instructions are issued on this point, Regions in Nos. 1 and 2 District and Eighth Army Areas will on no account accept vacancies from these Headquarters, as this HQ will continue to nominate eligible personnel.

4. Nominees are selected primarily by length of service, a nominal roll of both officers and G.Ns being maintained for this purpose. Due to the increased number of new personnel joining the Commission, these rolls are becoming increasingly difficult to maintain with complete accuracy, and to ensure an absolutely fair allocation of LIAP vacancies it will be necessary to request periodical nominal rolls of officers and G.Ns with dates of embarkation for different periods. This will be done by means of the Daily Bulletin. The nominal rolls should only include eligible personnel who are available and desire LIAP. This method will obviate the necessity of this HQ having to confirm these two points, prevent the consequent loss of time and the necessity of having to reallocate the vacancy.

- (a) All ranks will travel in KT and will carry ID.
- (b) All ranks will carry mosquito nets which will be handed in at the Reception Camp and re-issued on return.
- (c) All personnel who will eventually qualify for return to the UK under PAYMENT are eligible for LIAP. Such personnel are defined as follows:-
 - (a) British personnel of the British Service
 - (b) British personnel of the Colonial Forces administered by War Office.
 - (c) British personnel attached or permanently attached (i.e. those on British rates of pay) to the Indian Army.

7. Personnel who come within the following categories, however, disqualify for consideration when allotments are made:-

- (a) Personnel within 6 months of DISCHARGE, i.e. personnel with 3 1/2 years or more overseas service.

- 2 -

(b) Personnel within 6 months of Release. It is ruled at present that this will apply to those in Age/Service Groups 1 - 24 inclusive. Individuals within Groups 1 - 24 who have volunteered to serve on for a period of less than 12 months or who for any other reason will not be released with their groups are however, eligible.

(c) Soldiers under suspended sentence unless special authority has been obtained.

(d) Personnel who have less than 18 months continuous service overseas and those who have already had leave to U.K. in the case of Women's Services, the minimum is 12 months.

8. It is now possible to consider compassionate cases for ILAP, but applicants must have either been refused or are not desirous of a compassionate posting. It must be borne in mind that ILAP is primarily a reward for good service and careful consideration should be given to all applications for compassionate leave before submission to this HQ.

9. Conditions enumerated in paras 6, 7 and 8 above are also applicable to ILAP and should be read in conjunction with this HQ. letter of even number dated 2 July 1945.

10. It is again pointed out that the above is subject to alteration, particularly in relation to the introduction of ROAD ILAP for personnel of this formation, and advice will be given as soon as AFHQ policy is known.
