The question of the trials of individuals concerned is a matter solely for the Italian authorities and not one in which this Hq. can intervene in any way. As AMG has been withdrawn there is no legal Officer in the area who holds any watching brief. This Headquarters has no reason to consider that trials held in this country are anything but fair, and has no information which would lead it to believe that this case was being dealt with other than according to normal Italian standards.

On 24 March nineteen hundred forty six, in the presence of three witnesses and being in full possession of my mind faculties, I, here undersigned

ROCCHI Enrico, civil refugee in the Tabora camp (Territory of Tanganyika) Card 1890, residing in Rome, former president of Dire Dawa, Italian East Africa, by the present power transfer to my wife Mrs Lucia FIVETTA ROCCHI, living in Rome, via Appia Nuova 343, the faculty of withdrawing from the Bank of Italy the nine years 3% 1949 Treasury Bonds deposited to my name unto the Bank of Italy itself, amounting to 200,000 lire, and the corresponding amount of interests due.

Such a sum was paid in by me to the Bank of Italy of Dire Dawa on February 24, 1946.

1. Reference your 3/Y.B/CA of 27 Feb. 45, covering letter dated 1 Feb. 1945 from Major P.A. NEGRETTI to C.A. 2B, War Office.

2. Enquiries have been made in Como and the following facts established, all of which indicate that Carlo Daelli, the solicitor has not fully represented the true situation to Major Negretti.

(a) An official agreement was made between Sig. Carlo Daelli who signed P.P. Carolina Cherubina Corti Negretti and a Sig. Pierfranco Gaslini. The date of a/m agreement was 16 July 43 and allowed for the letting of 3 rooms and kitchen on ground floor, two rooms on first floor and 2 attic rooms for servants. It contained all the usual provisions for cost of lighting and water etc. and expiry was three months after the end of "Stato di Guerra" which of course has not yet come to pass.

(b) After the Armistice with Italy 8 Sep. 43 the house was requisitioned by the Germans who evicted Sig. Gaslini and used it as billets.

(c) In July 45 after Como had been liberated, sig. Daelli

(e) It would therefore appear that as far as Sig. Gaslini is concerned, he acted in good-faith and has carried out his part of the contract made with the legal representative of Carolina Cherubina Corti Negretti.

3. As to the two rooms occupied by the 3 Germans who have been resident in Italy for 25 years, while they were put there by the Germans, there is little doubt that they can be made to leave. They also can show receipts for rent paid to sig. Daelli.

4. Two other rooms are occupied by an Italian family but proof of right of occupation was not immediately available, but is expected in the course of a few days.

5. On advice taken from the British Consulate, it appears that while Major Negretti's Aunt was English by birth, she became Italian by marriage and thus the property is Italian owned and could therefore be requisitioned if vacant by either the Allied or Italian Authorities.

6. The fact that Mrs. Carolina Corti Negretti is now dead and the property left to English subjects has to be proved according to Italian law. At the moment all property whether Allied or Italian appears to be able to be sequestered or requisitioned if vacant.

I am to ask you to inform Mr. Salvatore that this administration cannot serve as an intermediary for settlement of private affairs between non-residents. Nevertheless we have interviewed Mr. Essalegh who states that all his capital including the 40,000 Lire were looted during the second invasion of Cyrenaica. He himself was taken by the Italians in 1942, put in a concentration camp for a long time and is now penniless.

I am to ask you to convey this information to Mr. Salvatore.

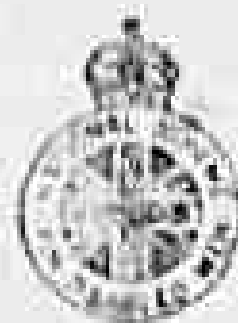

It is pursuing the goal of helping physically and morally the workers, especially those living in the most stricken regions, such as that of Chieti, by adopting a criterion absolutely non political and democratic.

But the abovementioned requisitions irremediably compromise the work of Assistance initiated at Chieti and carried on in spite of enormous difficulties and by dint of remarkable financial sacrifices.

I beg therefore your High Command to examine the possibility of having the already requisitioned premises returned to the provincial branch of the E.M.A.L. of Chieti and to prevent further requisitions.

While confidently awaiting your action, please, accept my best regards.

- 1 With reference to your 9272/EC of 2 Jan 46, I have the following comments:
- 2 It is considered that the Allied Commission has adhered strictly to the policy of ensuring that the Italian administration and legislation was purged of Fascism and that Fascist ideology and teaching was suppressed, in support of the Allied pledge to the Italian people that they may determine their own free and democratic form of Government.

One of the many tasks of the Allied Military Government was to find competent officials free from the taint of fascism so as to reconstitute a satisfactory Civil Service.

There has always been, especially more recently, a tendency, should the Allied Commission or Allied Military Government or, indeed, Ministries of the Italian Government itself, have by action or inaction hampered in accordance with accepted policy or procedure the activities of Leftist elements, for such elements to raise the cry that a reactionary trend or movement is being supported. Instances referred to are such as restrictions as to political activity or the holding of public meetings in Allied Military Government territory or when enquiries or precautions have been ordered in view of possible disorders in which Leftist influence is suspected.

No instances can be thought of in respect of which it might be argued that the Allied Commission has, by a policy of neutral 3282 in Italian domestic affairs, encouraged reactionary elements in endeavours to gain control of the Government.

The Foreign Office would like to be able to refute these statements, particularly that about the release of warehouses and factories. The British Ambassador would accordingly be grateful if you could let him have material for a reply.

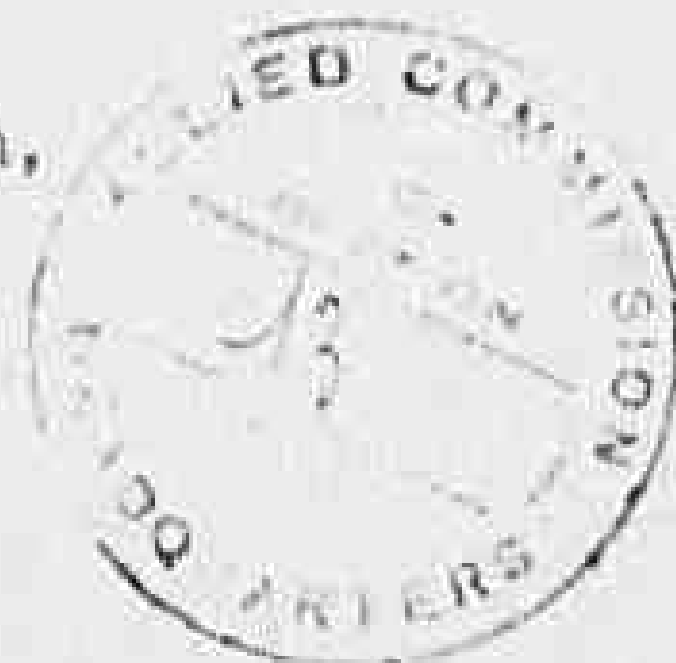

When all is said and done, I have suffered tremendously under Nazi-Fascism, have had to abandon hearth and home with 3 little children, and found everything plundered. Finally, Werner fought under the British flag, and I worked for two years for the Italian Partisans, thus taking part indirectly in the war against the Germans. Now, however, there is no help to be found anywhere; everywhere dear ears and no understanding. I am in great hopes that you may have some sort of connection, or perhaps friends through whom you could get into communication with someone to put in a word for me and to urge the military government here to interest

/themselves

themselves in me. The Consul of the Province is Lieutenant Colonel Miller. That would be very nice and advantageous for me !!!

And now to my everyday life. You will receive a mild shock when I tell you what the cost of living is. It was a sweet thought of yours to send me 5 £ (?); it hasn't arrived yet, but I am expecting it. But don't do it again. You also have need of it, and it is, as you say, a drop in the ocean. My house alone costs 6000 L monthly, the maid 1000, 3000 the children's education (about 1500 - daily food - L 24,000) 24,000 food. Exclusively of clothing and sundries I spent L 34,000 on bare housekeeping expenses. To be sure, this includes heating and light, as these are included in the rent. You can see what I have to earn just to be able to afford this. It often makes my brain reel. Luckily, I have done various good business deals during these last months which enable me to get things a bit in order, and I hope I continue to be successful. For about a week, explosions that endanger and frighten the whole
borgata have been taking place in the I.C.S.S. quarry, which is at the dispo-
sition of the 838 ENGINEERS of the American Army.

German prisoners depending from the 838 ENGINEERS are working in the
said quarry.

Another explosion broke the panes of Villa Parini, via Appia Nuova
1012, at the corner of Via Appia Pignatelli, at three or four hundred meters
from the quarry.

The great explosion of the 22nd Inst. at 11,30 caused ver great
damages.

Practically all the panes, including some painted ones of considerable
thickness, on the side facing the quarry, have been broken. Some of them, in-
side the villa, were moved.

Should explosions of the same kind take place again, there might be
worse damages or even casualties.

The house of the watchkeeper in via Appia 1010 had all its panes
broken on the side looking towards the quarry.

We beg to have the necessary action taken at once to avoid that such
explosions should happen again: it must be kept in mind that a crowded borgata
lies next to the quarry, and that in winter, life is very painful for the
population for there is a complete shortage of glass panes.

We also beg you to help the population by making an allocation of
glass panes.
