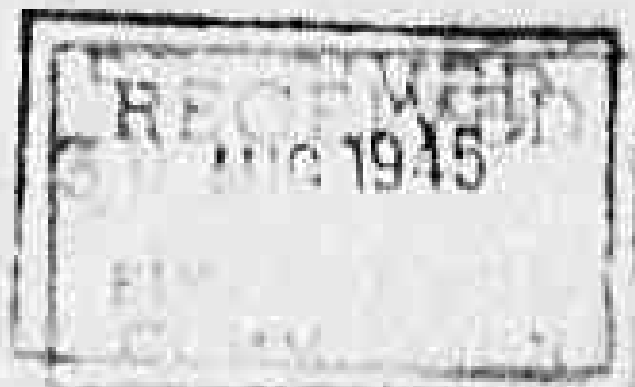

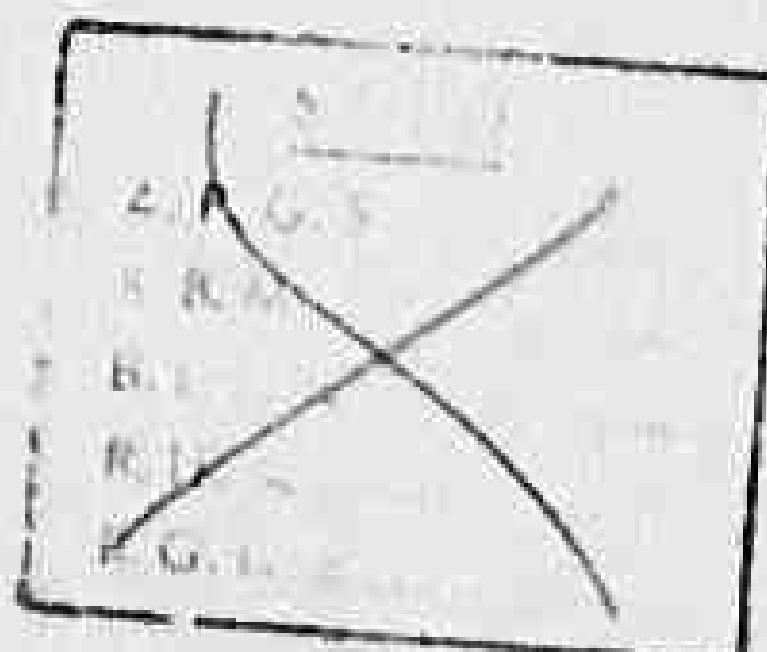
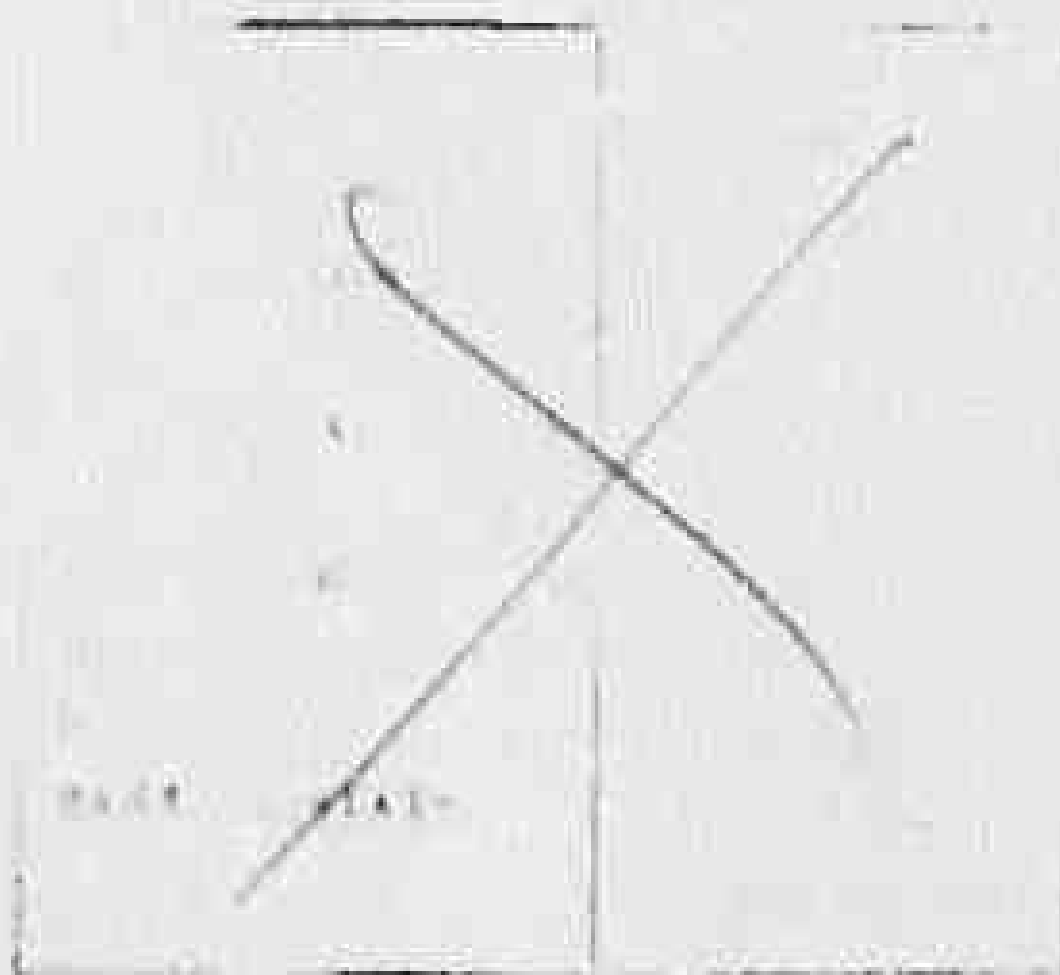

2. I have today 21st August 1945 visited "D" Transit Camp, Rome where I was informed that two representatives of the Italian Government visited this unit on 20th instant to make arrangements to interview two detainees named HELLFERRICH and Von NOENSTEIN.

3. These two men are held at the disposition of G-2 (CI) AFHQ and authority to see them can only be issued by that section. I was told that G-5 Section AFHQ were not empowered to give permission for such persons to be interviewed and in any case representatives of the Italian Government would not be allowed to carry out any interrogation at "D" Transit Camp.

4. I ask that a copy of this report together with enclosure be forwarded to Civil Affairs Section. I have not informed the Italian Authorities that the permit in this case cannot be accepted.

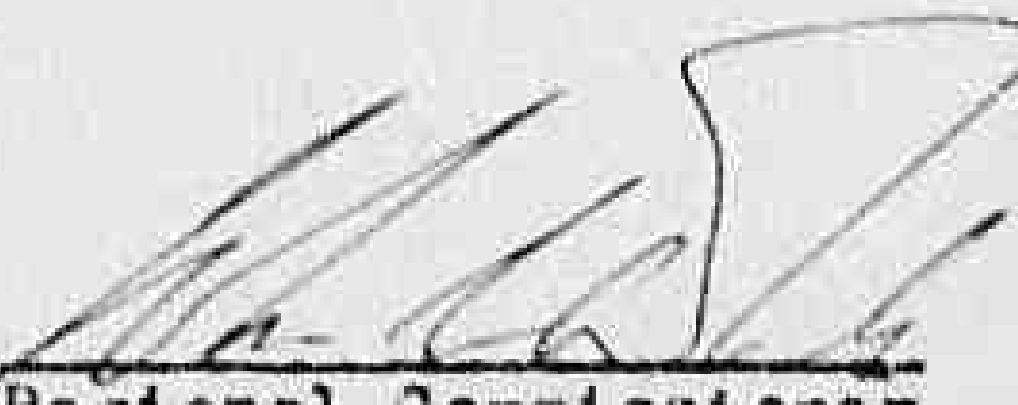

I am Emilia Ricci, 62 years old, widow of Amici, on the brink of the tomb, suffering from various serious illnesses since over five years. I take the liberty to request Your Excellency to help me in my painful affairs which I set out here in brief:

Last July the "Roma" Hotel, situated in Pian di Valle (Terminillo), owned by my son, was twice requisitioned. For unknown reasons he, his family and servants were put out of his hotel and the concern closed and guarded by the R. Carabinieri.

Last September, after about two months, as the charges were unfounded, his hotel was returned to him and he and his family began willingly to repair it, although seriously damaged and looted by the German troops, who had occupied it for eight months.

While my son was repairing the hotel, this and the other hotels at Terminillo were requisitioned two months ago by the Allies, who requested him to administer the bar and laundry, which he did willingly. But, on 7th inst. his wife and son were arrested and the following day transferred to the concentration camp of Cospea (Terni) where they are still. His whole property since then has been abandoned and all the buildings not occupied by the Allies, closed. His interests are at the mercy of others, for he and his family are not permitted to attend to them.

His fourteen year old son was ~~xxx~~ put out of the hotel and at first taken into an orphanage, although all his relations are in Rieti. It was later possible to entrust him to my other son. I repeat that I know nothing of the charge against my son Giuseppe. I know only that his whole business which cost him immense sacrifice is going to ruin. Without superior orders for sequestration, everything is being carried off and there is nobody to prevent it. The food stuffs have been requisitioned by the "Seprel", and the farm animals kept by my son for food, have also disappeared.

My son can no longer provide for me, and I must live the last days of my life in privation.

I am sure that the honesty of my son will be recognized once more ^{as it always} has been.

Last July the "Roma" Hotel, situated in Pian di Valle (Terminillo), owned by my son, was twice requisitioned. For unknown reasons he, his family and servants were put out of his hotel and the concern closed and guarded by the R. Carabinieri.

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My son can no longer provide for me, and I must live the last days of my life in privation.

I am sure that the honesty of my son will be recognized once more ^{as it always} has been.

My son is not liable to censure. Born at Rieti on 5 Oct 1894. He began his hotel career at 14 years of age, perfecting his work abroad. (Switzerland, France and England).

In 1915 he was repatriated from London to take part in the World War 1915-18. After his discharge, he took up his residence at Rieti, and with his earnings from abroad, he bought in 1919 the "Centrale" hotel-restaurant, repairing it and enlarging it. By persevering in his work, he was able to buy the "Croce Bianca" hotel also, and founded the "Terminillo" boarding house. In 1930, following the destruction of the "Centrale Hotel", he was granted in exchange by the Municipio of Rieti, the "Cafe"-restaurant of the Theatre, which he repaired and enlarged at great expense.

Following the destruction of the "Croce Bianca" hotel, the Municipio paid him an adequate recompense.

- 2 -

When the skiing became popular at Terminiello, Amici built an air-raid shelter restaurant at Pian de Mosce. In 1934-35 he began the construction of a building at Pian de Valle as a Rest House, and therefore passed the Terminiello boarding house to another. With the money from this sale, with his earnings made previously at Rieti and with loans, he was able to begin the construction of the present "Roma" hotel. In 1939 he was obliged to make a mortgage loan of 1,000,000 lire at the Banca del Lavoro, realizing 800,000 lire, payable in six monthly rates for 25 years, dating from the 1st July 1939. Moreover the Ministry of Popular Education, granted him a contribution of 100,000 lire (granted to the hotel owners of all the provinces of Italy, to various amounts according to the value of their properties, in order aid tourism to develop. (according to R.D.L. of 1938). This contribution is paid directly by the Banca del Lavoro, at 10,000 lire six monthly, for a period of 25 years dating from 1st Jan. 1940.

I must be remembered that the system of settlement of the loan is heavy. The interest for 25 years is about equal to the borrowed capital, so that although the contribution granted by the Ministry of Popular Education, will be completely absorbed by the interests it is not sufficient to cover the interests completely.

All the transactions are recorded, as may easily be ascertained in the various bodies. - Ministry of Popular Education - Banca del Lavoro - Ministry of Finance - Registering Office - Filing Office - Mortgage Filing Office.

Although he was registered - whether he wished or not - in the ex-fascist party, as were also all those who were obliged to work, he has never carried on any political activity or ever taken part in any public manifestations of the past fascist regime.

His hotel, early prosperous, caught the eyes of a few envious persons. It had many and various customers. As if by rumour, he is accused of having given board to Mussolini and the Germans. That is true. But how many hotels, in the whole of Italy, have not been frequented by such persons? Why do not those envious persons mention, rather, that my son was honoured on various occasions by such an illustrious personage as H.R.H. the Princess Mafalda, sister of Your H.M., and by her noble sons.

My son's sacrifices during his whole life are immense and have stirred the admiration of the whole town. Modest, conciling, above all an indefatigable worker, he has undertaken even the most humiliating work with passion, allowing himself no rest, providing it helped to bring prosperity to his business.

Your Highness! I implore you with an aching heart and with tears in my eyes, to authorize my family to safeguard the interests of my son, in order that his property, fruit of thirty years honest work, be not dispersed.
