Reference your 611/EC of 17 September 1945.

1. The proposals for the organization of Headquarters Allied Commission and AMG and Liaison fields staffs are approved in principle except that the Economic Group at Milan will be dissolved by 1 December 1945 and if necessary may be replaced by a normal liaison group. This should, in turn, enable further slight reductions in HQ Allied Commission.
2. It is stressed, however, that, as circumstances change, the organizations must be subjected to review at frequent intervals.
3. As the proposed staffs on the American side are within the agreed allotment of 700 officers and EM approved by CG APOUSA, effective 1 December 1945, no further action is now required. The probable reduction on the American side is shown in Appendix A.
4. a. On the British side you will prepare a TE proposal in accordance with this HQ 210/Org-3 of 6 December 1944 for consideration by the TEC at this HQ.
b. The proposal will be divided into three parts as follows:
 - (1) Part I - HQ, Allied Commission, to include officers, ORs and transport.
 - (2) Part II - AMG Venezia Giulia, to include officers, ORs and transport.
 - (3) Part III - Civil Affairs Pool to cover AMG Udine and the islands and also the Liaison Groups throughout Italy. Proposal will include officers, ORs and transport and must be supported by appropriate schedules showing the proposed distribution of personnel and transport.

Announcement is made of the designation of Colonel C. B. FINDLAY, as Director, Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

XIX - DESIGNATION OF CHIEF LEGAL ADVISOR

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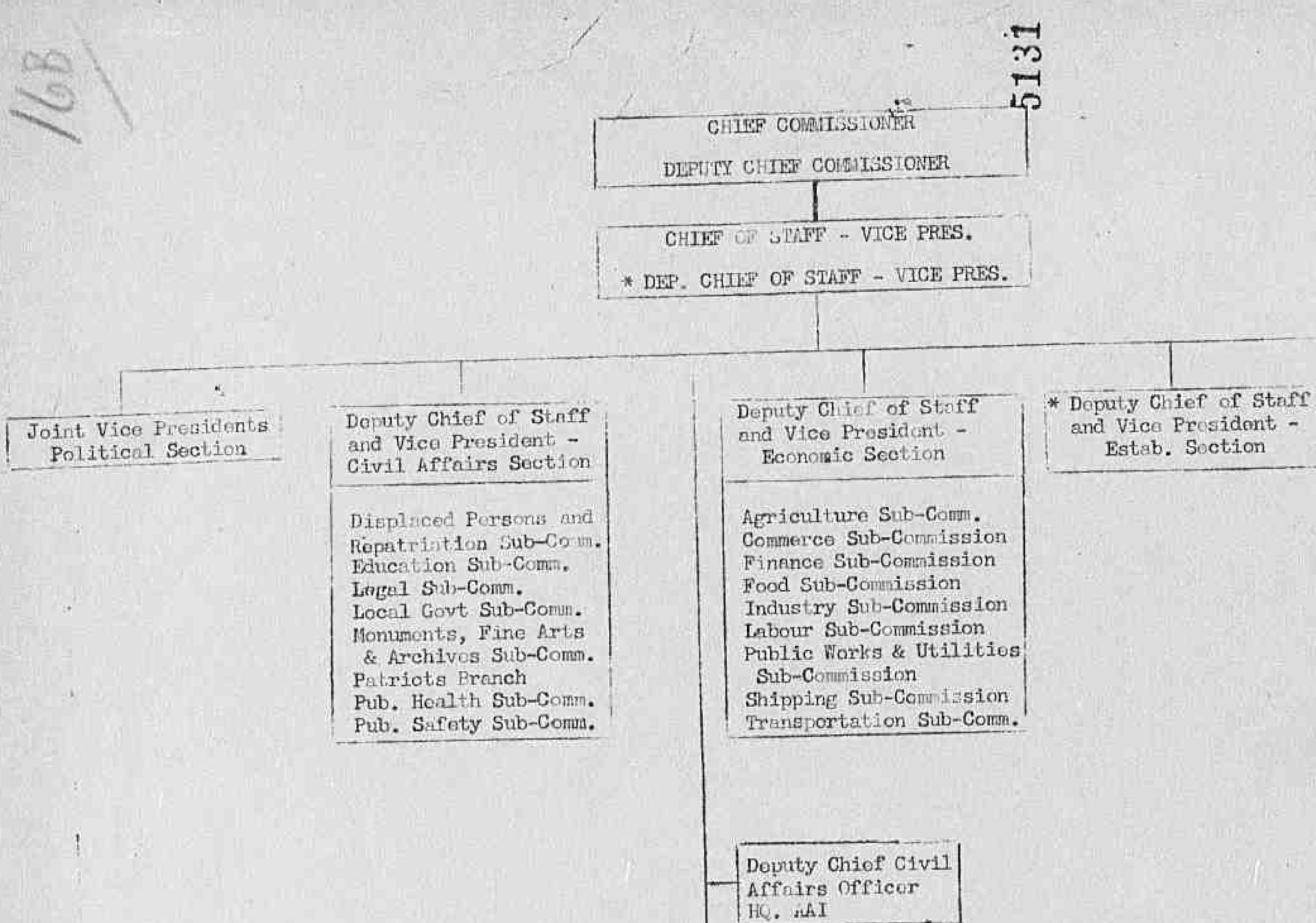

At least twenty American Officers must be taken off the strength of A.C.C. at once.

4. It may be that Vice Presidents of Sections will wish to alter the ceilings of some of their Sub-Commissions and such suggestions will be carefully considered so long as it can be done without altering the ceiling of the whole Section.

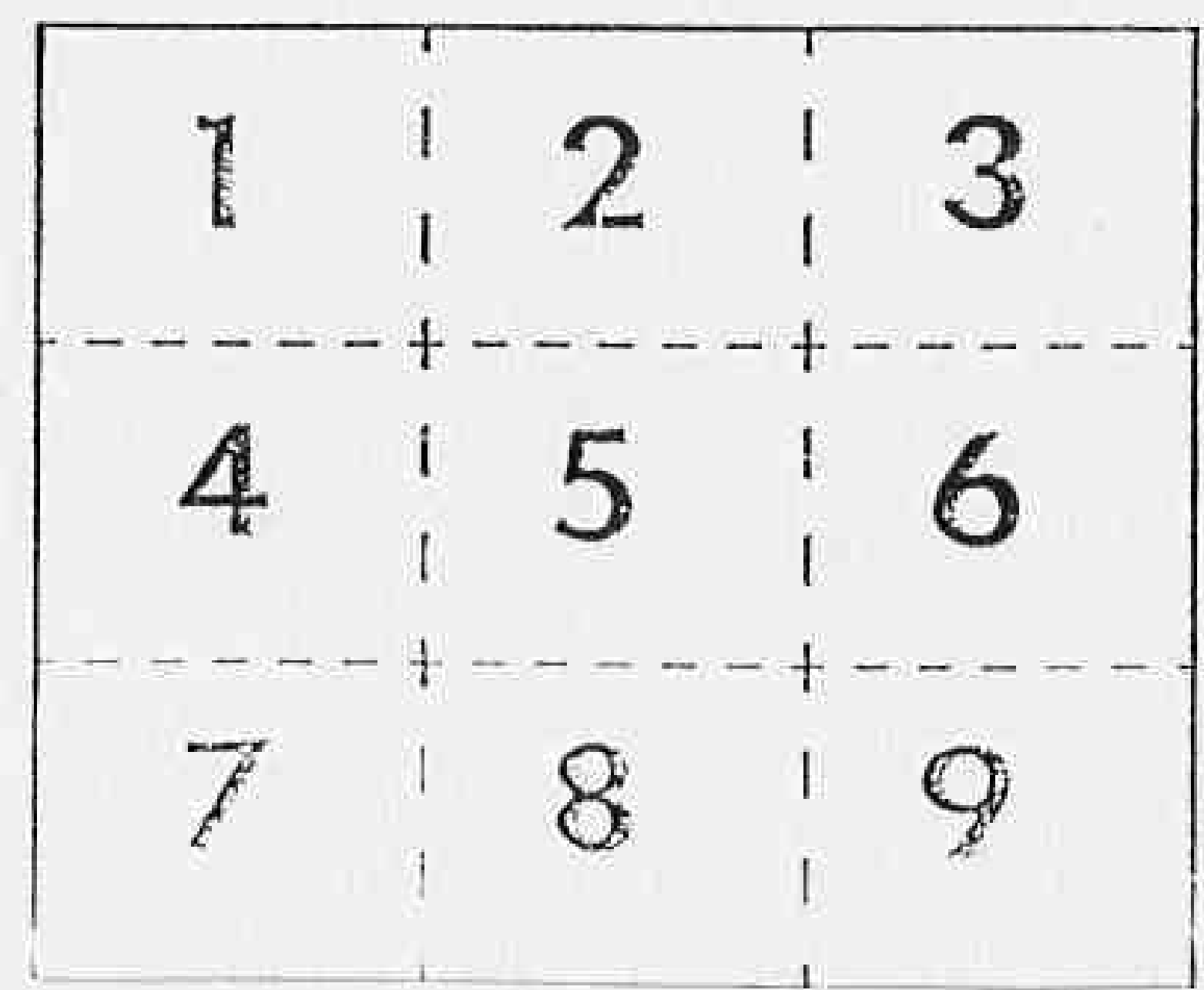
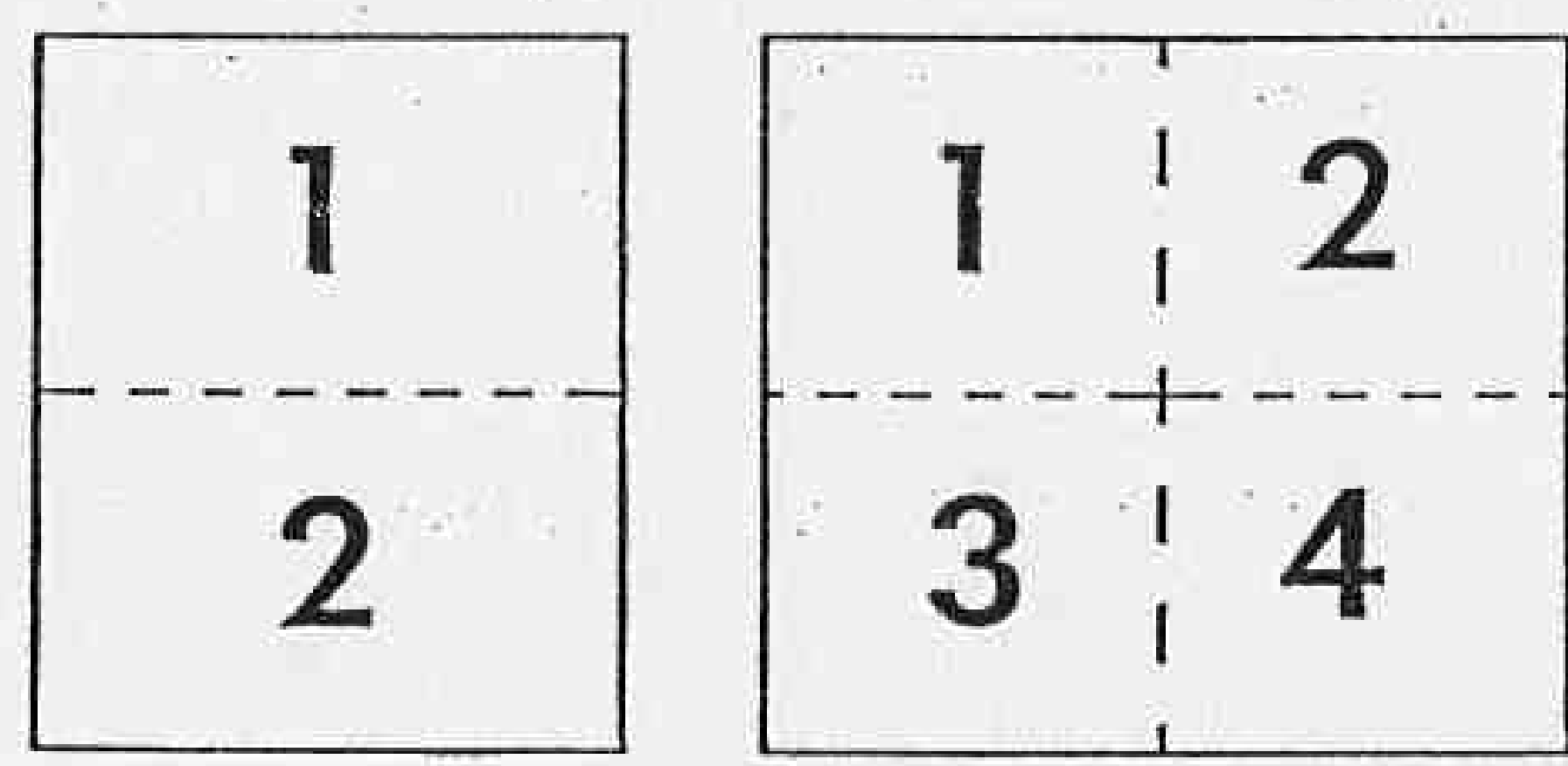

TO : Executive Commissioner.

1. Reference your 16031/3/G1 dated the 12th of June 1944.

2. Attached as Appendix "A" is the recommended strengths of Sub-commissions for Regions 1-12 and Army AMGs. From this it will be seen that there are two main observations to be made.

(a) LEGAL. It is not considered that the Legal Sub-commission can function satisfactorily under its present obligations unless their ceiling is increased and it is recommended that this be done. It was always understood that the ceiling of 61 officers, Legal Sub-commission, was up to the Rimini-Pisga Line. The territory to be taken over is more densely populated and includes a number of very large cities.

(b) PUBLIC SAFETY. According to Appendix "C" of your 16031/3/G1 shows 120 police officers in the field as the total ceiling for Public Safety Sub-commission. This makes no provision for Headquarters staff of 9 officers. It is therefore recommended that an increase of 9 officers to the Public Safety Sub-commission should be made. If, however, this is considered impossible, the necessary numbers to provide for the Headquarters staff will have to be made by the reduction of officers from Regions 10, 11, 12.

3. Attached are copies of comments of the directors of Legal and Public Safety Sub-commissions for your information. In the absence of the Vice President on duty this date, this letter is forwarded unseen by him in view of the fact that the matter is urgent. Nominal rolls of the officers transferred to the new Regions are in course of compilation and will be forwarded as soon as possible.

The shortage of Medical Officers has now reached a critical stage and this Sub-Commission is being pressed on all sides for additional staff.

On April 15th, when ceilings for all Sub-Commissions were being fixed, this Sub-Commission was given a total of 56 for Headquarters and for all Regions up to the Rimini, Pisa line. This figure included Medical Officers, Welfare Officers and Sanitary Engineers. I then asked that the ceiling should be raised from 56 to 62, the idea being that the additional six should be Medical Officers. This, if anything, was an understatement of our requirements but as we were told that the ceiling had been fixed for 2675 Regiment, every effort was made to keep our figures as low as possible.

2 already available

No authority has yet been received to implement my request, nor do I know whether AFHQ has been consulted on the matter; this has been referred to in the monthly report for April.

When Medical Officers were withdrawn for ETOUSA, I envisaged that if not replaced there would be a shortage when the Armies advanced and this has now happened.

The policy of moving officers forward as Regions become established has always been carried out, but this source of supply is now exhausted.

At the moment the assignment of Medical Officers to Regions and Armies is as follows:

Secondly, the military authorities (AM, etc), are rightly placing upon Sub-Commissions of A.C.C., particularly in the Economic Section, an increasing responsibility in every field, e.g., roads, electric power, railways, etc. Thirdly, allied troops are so numerous in occupied and liberated Italy that the standard of all material work must be higher than that to which the Italians are accustomed; constant supervision is therefore necessary.

6. The ranks of the Sub-Commissions are therefore swollen. The proportion of specialists to provincial officers is, of course, more in liberated Italy than in territory under AM and the specialists in the former area are only there because without their presence some work vital to Allied interests would break down. The population must be fed, roads and bridges must be mended, railways and power houses must be operated,

labour must be controlled, agricultural and mining production must be increased, distribution of supplies must be controlled. The Italians appear unable to supervise these natural activities at the tempo required by the Allied war effort without physical guidance and control of allied officers. Once the tempo can be diminished, the guidance and control can be relaxed. On the basis of the figures recommended provincial officers in liberated territory will be reduced to a bare minimum there can, at any rate be no accusation that we are continuing allied military government in liberated Italy.

7. The issue for decision at your Vice Presidents' meeting is:-

TO : Vice President, Admin. Section. (9)
Vice President, Economic Section. (9)
Telecommunications Sub-Commission.

1. The ceiling for the total officer strength of the Allied Control Commission including all Regions, Sub-Commissions and American appointments to the Army Sub-Commission, has been laid down at 1222 - 611 American, 611 British. This ceiling is intended to cover the territory up to the RIMINI - PISA line but it is probable that if the rest of the territory falls with rapidity, we should be expected to cover the whole of Italy with this number.

2. It is not proposed to lay down War Establishments for Sections or Regions owing to the necessity for maintaining elasticity within the Commission. It is, however, necessary to lay down a basic distribution of these officers amongst Headquarters, Sections, Regions and Sub-Commissions.

3. I attach herewith as Appendix "A" a table which shows suggested ceilings for the various Divisions of this Commission. You will notice that I have divided the figures between Headquarters and the field, i.e., the Regions, and that I have shown a small reserve in each Section.

4. I should be grateful if Heads of Sections would give this matter their immediate attention and prepare their comments on the figures proposed. If it is possible the numbers should be reduced. If the numbers shown are not sufficient for any one Sub-Commission, I would ask Heads of Sections to manipulate them that the total shown for their Section is not increased. I would ask that a case be prepared for any increase in any Sub-Commission. I suggest that the reserve be absorbed at the discretion of the Head of the Section.

5. I should be glad if Vice Presidents when preparing their comments would define the distribution of officers amongst Regions where this is practicable.

6. I am anxious to complete the picture for submission to the Chief Commissioner before the Regional Commissioners' meeting on 14th April and I suggest, if it is convenient to Vice Presidents, that we should meet on 7th April to discuss the picture presented in the attached list.

SUBJECT: Establishment

TO : All Regions, AMG Armies, and Sections, Sub-Commissions and Branches of HQ.

1. Present Position

a. The authorized strength of the 2675 (American) Regt., ACC is 829 Officers, 15 Warrant Officers and 1045 EM. Of these, 74 EM are detached on special duty, but still carried on the strength of the Regiment.

b. The authorized strength of AMGAC, the British Unit created by War Establishment No. NA/266/1 dated 6 January 1944 is 663 Officers and 1347 ORs.

c. On the strength of the above two units is borne the whole of the personnel allotted to ACC-AMG in Italy.

d. The number of Officers scheduled to proceed to U.K. is:

American 200
British 90

The British Officers are being replaced from U.K.; similar replacements will probably not be forthcoming for the American Officers. There will be no further bulk demands for personnel of ACC for other theaters.

2. Sub-Establishment for Regions, etc.

a. The question of Sub-establishments /IOs for Regions, AMG Armies, and Sub-Commissions and Branches of Headquarters has been under consideration, and it has been decided that no attempt will be made to issue them. It is realized that this decision will cause some difficulty and uncertainty in Regions and Sub-Commissions, but the question is fraught with so many complications that it has been found impossible to arrive at any other satisfactory solution.

b. The chief reason for the decision is that conditions, and with them the weight and direction of effort are and will be constantly changing. It is therefore impossible to allot personnel on any permanent basis, and it would be useless -- in fact positively harmful to issue Sub-establishments /IOs which would be subject to constant amendment. Personnel will therefore be allotted by this HQ as and when required in accordance with the volume of work to the extent permitted by available numbers. All that can be said is that for the present Region I will operate with about 110 Officers, Region II with 117, and Region III will be gradually reduced to about 40 after its territory is handed over to the Italian Government.

Letter, dated 1 March 1944, Subject: Establishment (Cont'd)

3. Ranks and Promotion

a. The question of ranks and promotion will similarly be dealt with centrally by this Hq because it is not possible to lay down any fixed ranks for Officers or Em/OR in Regions since the total personnel will vary as territory is handed over and duties become supervisory on the one hand or operational duties increase under AMG on the other. Similarly, the volume of work in Sub-Commissions is not constant.

b. Recommendations for promotion of Officers (as to which separate instructions on the British side have been issued in Exec Memo No. 19) will therefore be submitted without regard to whether there is or is not a suitable assignment in a higher rank in the particular region, Sub-Commission, etc., in which the Officer being recommended happens to be serving at the time.

c. Instructions regarding the promotion of both EmS and ORs are being issued shortly.
