- 1 This responsibility for issuing Movement Passes is an additional function recently thrown upon the Public Safety Sub-Commission by order of the Exec Comar. I am satisfied that the present staff is fully occupied and cannot undertake the additional work and that an increase of staff is necessary.
- 2 The work entailed is not sufficient to keep an officer fully employed but work in connection with MTAs movements outside of Italy is also increasing and may be expected to increase further.
- 3 Public Safety Sub-Commission is also expected to have extra work thrown upon it when Rome Regional and Provincial HQs close.
- 4 I think that the increase asked for is justified and should be granted. In my opinion the work is capable of being performed by an SO-3. I recommend that the Establishment be increased accordingly.

4. 7 officers with AMG and Regions are recommended to be struck off the posted strength of the Sub Commission as they do not in actual fact belong to the Sub Commission.

1. Attached hereto as Appendix "A" are the nominal rolls and proposals with regard to the Section's office and the sub-commissions under its control.

2. In connection with these the following observations are made:-

- a) Reference Item III sub para. (a) the whole future of medical supply branch is at present under discussion with AFM who have certain proposals to make, until a decision is reached in this matter no move of the personnel of this branch should be made.
- b) With regard to EM/OP personnel in the Civil Affairs Section itself the total of 3 shown includes Pfc BONANNI 32885660 who is employed as a whole-time interpreter and translator. His services are essential as there are certain translations which it is not possible to give to Italian civilian personnel, furthermore he organises and runs the translators branch in this Section. It is therefore essential to retain his services. This reduces the clerical staff to 2 British O.Rs. It has been found that during the past five days, with the additional work entailed in this section, that 2 O.Rs are insufficient. It is therefore requested that the ceiling be raised by one and that L/Cpl. Saxott, S/629267, at present surplus to establishment in Public Safety sub-commission, be transferred to this office.
