- 1 The attached table and its appendices shows the proposed distribution of officers and I shall be glad if you will let us know if you have any comments.
- 2 The table shows the proposals under present circumstances and is not intended to be conclusively binding either as to the number of officers to be employed in various Regions or as to the names of the officers to be so employed. Both postings and numbers are subject to variation in accordance with later views or requirements.
- 3 In the case of Legal and Public Health Sub-Commissions, neither Director can give a forecast of the names as the numbers in the Sub-Commissions are hardly sufficient to meet requirements. The teams (with names) will have to be built up as the situation develops and from those Regions which at the time can best spare them.

SUBJECT: Regional Establishments

TO : Vice President, Administrative Section

1. Reference your 4/1A/AS of 26 June 1944:
2. As you are aware, I have no officers in the field. I would, however, point out that my authorized ceiling of 7 has never yet been filled and I find it very difficult to carry out the work which I wish to unless this ceiling is filled.
3. I have exploited every source I know and every channel from Brigadier Lush through Colonel Albright and Colonel Farren, but the Interior Sub-Commission, in spite of what I consider to be its very high level work, is persistently, it would seem, denied their admitted ceiling level.
4. Major Dollard, American, who was applied for, has now been denied to me. Under the circumstances, I do not wish to press this application at present.
5. I applied for a specific officer, Lt. G. Hammond, British, who I know would fit into this Sub-Commission, and who I could most usefully use to the benefit of other trained and more experienced officers, and I request my application for this specific officer be pressed with all the force possible by your section.

SUBJECT: Redistribution of Public Safety Personnel

TO : Vice President, Admin, Section.

1. The attached list indicates a tentative redistribution of Public Safety personnel in accordance with the allocation suggested by RC & MGSection.

2. It is noted that the proposed allocation makes no provision for Hq. Public Safety Sub-Commission; but it is assumed that provision therefor will be made at the present authorized strength. If in fact it is intended that the proposed allocation should exhaust the authorized strength for Public Safety personnel the numbers for Regions X, XI, and XII should be reduced to 14, 14, and 16 respectively to compensate therefor on the basis that they will be the last regions to be occupied and provision for them can be made in due course.

3. As to the proposed allocations in its other aspects it is felt that no useful purpose would be served by comment at this time since it has not been made known when or under what conditions of government the redistribution will be made effective. Certainty exists only as to those regions which have been turned over to the Italian government for administration and as to these the proposed allocation is considered adequate.

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3. This is the best "functional" utilization of the personnel now available to Education. The concentration, technically, at Headquarters gives mobility for a changing situation. As matters now stand, we have no officer to spare to Sardinia (and are having to impose formal educational duties upon a reluctant officer of another Sub-Commission). As for Regions VI and VIII, we are making ready for them by perfecting policies at Headquarters, techniques in the Regions, and jointly making ready for all regions elementary text-books and operative types of extra-class organizations (of teachers, of parents, of youth).

4. This Sub-Commission, like others, could do a better job with a larger staff. It could do a less poor job without a depletion of staff. That said, I do not make a special appeal for differential treatment. We will adapt

4. At the present time the Allied Military Court situation at Naples requires the continual use of 26 officers in the city itself. In the event that Region 4 including Rome is occupied, the situation at Naples would become impossible because of the removal of presently attached officers. The Military Authorities naturally require the continued function of Allied Military Courts at Naples because of the large number of thefts and because of the prostitution situation. Any breakdown of the Naples Courts would be regarded as critical by the Military Authorities. There are nearly 6,000 new cases per month, of which 3800 are dealt with in the AM Courts, not including prostitution cases. A program is now under way to turn over to Italian Courts all possible cases.

5. The suggested ceiling would seriously cripple the work of this Subcommittee.

6. It is urgently requested that the ceiling be 11 in headquarters to include 3 trouble shooters and 50 in the field. Even this suggested ceiling would only work if it is possible to throw about an extra 2000 - 3000 cases a month onto the Italian Courts in Naples (which must be considered very doubtful) when Rome is occupied. Also it does not take into consideration Region 8 inasmuch as it would seem likely that if territory in Region 8 is later occupied legal officers from other regions will be found. 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7. Region 8 when entirely occupied will require approximately 12 legal officers who will be drawn primarily from Regions 2, 3 & 5.

8. The figures reached in para. 6 have only been ascertained after

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prolonged conference between Legal Subcommittee and Regional Legal Officers and it is considered that these figures (which were ruthlessly cut down by CLO after submission by RLOs) are the bare essential requirements if Allied Military Courts are to function.

9. It should be borne in mind that not only does the Legal Subcommittee perform normal Subcommittee duties, but unlike other Subcommissions spends much of its time in advising HQ ACC and its various sections and Subcommissions on the legal aspects of their many problems.

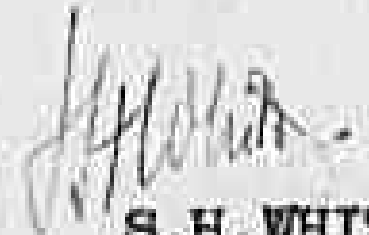
The Figures of Officers in the Field.

Public Safety say, that they cannot say what staff is required in Regions. All other ~~Regions~~ ^{sub Coms} are supplying these figures.

The attitude of PS is they are not in a position to say. They entirely overlook the fact that it is their duty to plan how the staff available can be used to best advantage. They suggest apparently that all that is necessary is for Regions to say how many they want and all they have to do is to draw a line underneath and add it up. This is a surrendering of the powers of decision to the lower formation - which anyhow is not in a position to weigh the comparative needs of other Regions - or to see that Regions are run on more or less parallel lines.

There is neither leadership, guidance or control.

I submit that PS should be instructed to investigate the requirements of the Regions and make a plan of what is really necessary, differentiating the various functions (police, prisons, fire etc) which it may be necessary to have in each Region.

3. It is considered that a reduction to an establishment of 8 officers would necessitate an amalgamation of Fire and Civil Defence with Prisons. Having regard to the separate technical knowledge and qualifications involved which cannot be expected from the same officer and having regard also to the very heavy responsibility imposed by the administration of Prisons under the present difficulties, such a step would effect an economy of manpower at a depreciation of efficiency which in my view would not be justified.

4. There is no doubt that the present prison situation is extremely critical and that even the provision of one whole time officer at this headquarters to cope with these problems is by no means fully adequate.

5. I consider the appointment of a separate Prison Officer essential and further that the remaining 8 officers represent the basic minimum needs of this Sub-Commission if efficiency is to be maintained.

I recommend therefore that this establishment be approved at 9 officers.

TO : Vice President, Administrative Section

1. Reference your ACC/1/10.1/AS of 1 April 1944, in the first place, it will be noted the Interior Sub-Commission has no officers "in the field".
2. The Executive Commissioner has ruled that all CAOs in the field, shall be regarded as field officers of the Interior, and it is with this aim that the present courses are being held, in order that these Civil Affairs officers in the field may be better informed and better instructed in the special duties of local government.
3. On the other hand, it is essential that this Sub-Commission should send its own experts on tour in Regions, in order that advice may be given directly and that reports be made to the Director on developments and activities of local government.
4. There is no possibility, in my judgment, of reduction in numbers. The first basic distribution, who were to be appointed to this Sub-Commission, was laid down at a recent date, at 11. In consequence of a verbal and personal conversation with the Executive Commissioner at Main HQ, I understood that he firmly approved of a total basic distribution of 7 officers, including a Director, to the Interior.
5. I now note the suggestion that this number should be reduced to 6. I consider that 7 is the lowest possible ceiling compatible with efficiency, and even then, these officers must be particularly selected and must have a real, intimate and expert knowledge of their subjects.
6. I am anxious indeed that at least one officer of the Interior Sub-Commission (not, of course, always the same individual) should be in the field on tour, bringing in reports of Regional and Provincial Commissioners on Prefects, Sindaci, attending local Giunta meetings, and keeping the work in the field completely alive.
7. One office administrator is essential if the Sub-Commission is to be efficient. A further officer is indispensable to this Commission for permanent liaison work with the Italian Government. At present, it is indeed true that practically the whole time of 1 officer is taken up with the Italian local government and with communications and interviews with the Minister of the Interior's subordinate staff.

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8. I regard these 3 dispositions of officers as indispensable to efficient work, and I require a minimum of 4 over and above these 3 to cope, in an efficient manner, with the workings of the Interior, although indeed, I have every hope that all Regional Officers will consider themselves primarily part and parcel of this Sub-Commission.

9. The Executive Commissioner himself stated to me firmly that the number of 7 would not be lowered, and I have every hope, therefore, that this number will be approved, as opposed to 6 officers, as given in the Memorandum of 31 March.

This ceiling is intended to cover the territory up to the RIMINI - PISA line but it is probable that if the rest of the territory falls with rapidity, we should be expected to cover the whole of Italy with this number.

2 It is not proposed to lay down War Establishments for Sections or Regions owing to the necessity for maintaining elasticity within the Commission. It is, however, necessary to lay down a basic distribution of these officers amongst HQs, Sections, Regions and Sub-commes.

3 I attach herewith as Appendix "A" a table which shows suggested ceilings for the various divisions of this Commission. You will notice that I have divided the figures between HQs and the field, i.e., the Regions, and that I have shown a small reserve in each Section.

4 I should be grateful if Heads of Sections would give this matter their immediate attention and prepare their comments on the figures proposed. If it is possible, the figures should be reduced. If the numbers shown are not sufficient for any one Sub-Comm, I would ask Heads of Sections so to manipulate them so that the total shown for their Section is not increased and I would ask that a case be prepared for any increase in any Sub-Comm. I suggest that the reserve be absorbed at the discretion of the Head of the Section.

5 I should be glad if VPs when preparing their comments would define the distribution of officers amongst Regions where this is practicable.

6 I am anxious to complete the picture for submission to the Chief Commissioner before the Regional Commissioners' meeting on 14 April and I suggest, if it is convenient to VPs, that we should meet on 7 April to discuss the picture presented in the attached list.
