Subject: Port of Messina.

1. The following paraphrased translation of a censorship intercept is forwarded for information. The intercept was obtained by the Civil Censorship Group, Italy from a letter which was sent in April 1945 to the Interministerial port Committee, Rome by Franco FABIANO, Secretary of the Committee of National Liberation, Via Madonna Mercede, 6, Messina;

"The provincial C.L.N., Messina petitions making Messina a free port.

The long history of Messina as a free port, from the time of Roger the Norman 1061 until free ports were abolished in Italy in 1862, is recalled. The geographical position of Messina at the cross-roads of maritime routes East and West and its facilities as a port in every respect are set forth, for example:

1. It is a center for more than 40 navigational lines from almost every part of the world and possesses means of the first order for fuel supply and supply of naval stores; a tremendous commercial and agricultural hinterland consisting of the fertile zone of Calabria, rich in numerous products and activities and also the splendid Northern and Southern Ionian Coasts; fertile plain of Milazzo renowned for its early season products.

2. Messina has all the elements necessary and indispensable for the much wished industrialization of Sicilian agriculture.

3. In consideration of the foregoing and particularly considering the fact that the City was destroyed by earthquake December 1908 and again damaged more than any other city in Sicily by the operations of the
