1. 750/2/CA of 5 June 1944 is cancelled.
2. Members of the A.C.C. may now proceed to Rome without passes provided they have obtained permission from the Head of their Section or Independent Sub-Commission.
3. That part of 751/7/CA of 7 June 1944 relating to Italian officials is cancelled. Members of the Italian Government now have permanent passes. Italian officials may be granted passes to travel to Rome by the Secretary General at Naples or Salerno, without reference to the Security Branch, provided assent is given by the Head of the relevant Section or Independent Sub-Commission.

SUBJECT : Home Occupation - Control of Entry.

- 1 The following regulations apply to visits to Home.
- 2 No visit may be made without the express sanction of the CC.
- 3 A permit will only be granted where the duty is essential.
- 4 Applications for permits will be submitted to Adm Section and will specify Name, Rank, Number and appointment of the officer concerned, short particulars of the duty he is to perform, the inclusive dates necessary for the performance of that duty and a certificate signed by the Director that the visit is essential for ACC purposes.
- 5 Officers to whom a permit is granted will report arrival at and departure from HOME to the SCAG, and at the conclusion of his visit return without delay to his station and surrender the permit TO the Sec. Br RC & HI

SUBJECT: Visits of Members of the Allied Control Commission to the City of Rome.

TO : Distribution below.

1. The attached instructions are forwarded. (Not to all)
2. Until further orders, no member of this Commission, except those assigned to Rome Sub-Region, Region IV, AMG 5 and 8 Armies, will be permitted to visit the city of Rome without the express permission of the Chief Commissioner.
3. Applications for such permission will be submitted in writing to the Security Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section by heads of Sections, independent Sub-Commissions, Branches and Regions concerned, certifying that the visit of the member is essential in the interests of this Commission, stating his name, rank, serial number, and appointment and specifying the inclusive dates and purpose of the visit.

4. If the Chief Commissioner approves, a permit in a special form will be forwarded to the Adjutant of this HQ, who will issue the necessary Travel Orders and forward them, with the permit, to the member concerned. Without this permit, the Adjutant will not issue Travel Orders to Rome. On completion of the visit, the permit will be returned to the Security Branch.

5. Any member to whom a permit is granted will report to the S.C.A.O. Rome Sub-Region upon arrival and departure and, at the conclusion of his duty, will return immediately to his proper station.

SUBJECT: Control of Civilian Movement - Entry into City of Rome
and Fifth Army Area.

TO : Distribution below.

1. It is anticipated that numerous applications will be made by civilians as well as by Italian officials for permission to enter the City of Rome and Fifth Army area.

2. The granting of such permission will depend upon the military operations in progress and upon the expediency of allowing additional civilians into Rome which is already seriously overpopulated.

3. Such permission will be given subject only to the following conditions which must be strictly observed.

4. For this purpose the control of movement will operate in three phases:

Phase I in which all movement into the City of Rome as well as into the Fifth Army and Corps areas will be prohibited without the prior approval of C.G.S. & H.Q. A.A.I. This phase is already in operation and applies equally to Allied personnel as well as to civilians. Special instructions as to members of A.C.G. are contained in 750/2/CA of 5 June 1944.

Phase II in which for purposes which are essential and which will assist the prosecution of the war, and for these only, permission may be given by A.M.G. Rome or Fifth Army for entry into the City of Rome or into those Provinces which are still part of Fifth Army or Corps areas. Where members of the Italian Government or essential Italian officials are concerned, or in other exceptional circumstances, application may also be made to this Headquarters. In cases of Italian Government officials applications will be made to the Secretary General's Office in accordance with the existing practices. The Secretary General will pass these applications to R.C. & M.G. Section. All other such applications for travel which satisfy the A.M.G./AOC Officer to whom they are presented, must be forwarded to Security Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section where the matter will either be dealt with or referred to the A.M.G. of destination.

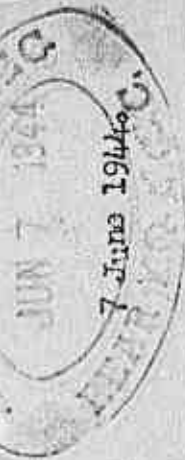
The date on which Phase II will operate will be notified as soon as possible.

Phase III in which in addition to purposes authorized during Phase II, civilians will be permitted to travel for urgent business or domestic reasons. Such permission depends upon the position of the Army Control Line and will be dealt with in the same way as travel into A.M.G. Provinces is controlled at the present time. The date of Phase III will also be notified and will commence at the conclusion of Phase II.

6. This order should be read as an addendum to Control of Movement Order, reference 316/76/CA of 26 April 1944, and all such passes issued will be in strict conformity with this previous directive.
