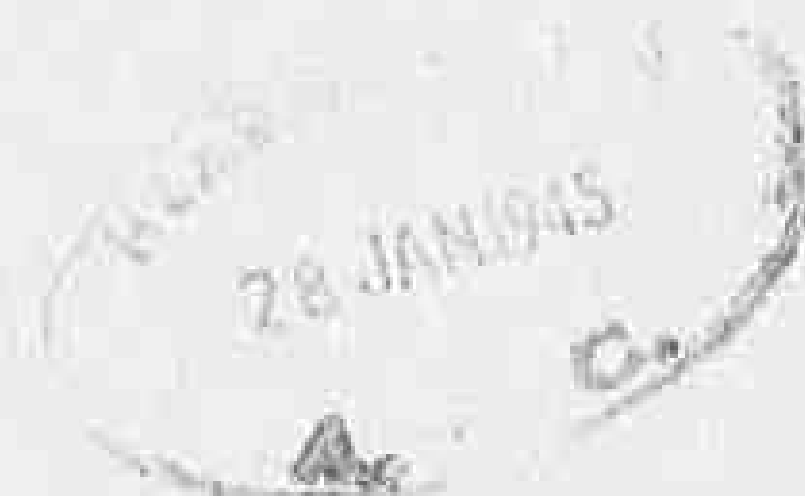

1. On 29 Dec. 1944, I was informed, by telephone, from Africa, by "major" (name redacted) that 1500 military blankets had arrived there for distribution to demobilized American in Italy, and that they had arranged with Major V that these blankets would be sent on the following day, by Lorry, to LEBBIA (1, 2, 3) and CUBA (4).

2. These blankets had not arrived by the 15th January, and, after consultation with you, it was decided to wait 25 days for them in order to get them distributed. It was impossible to get into communication by telephone with Major V either from LEBBIA or CUBA.

3. On Monday, 16 January, I sent four Lorries driven by Italian Army soldiers, in charge of a Corporal (Italian) to LEBBIA from LEBBIA with 2,000 blankets which had arrived by road from you. I instructed the Corporal to go on to LEBBIA with three of the Lorries, after unloading at LEBBIA, and return to LEBBIA with the blankets. He carried a note from you authorizing him to collect them.

4. On Tuesday, 17 January, I sent four Lorries loaded up with the blankets. They were handed to him by an Italian. The Corporal states that he is sure that the blankets he carried (they were in rolls of varying sizes) in the presence of an officer, but this report was not confirmed. In view of this, he got the 4 to telephone to the A.I.C. office at LEBBIA asking that a responsible officer be present to check the blankets on to his Lorry, but in reply he was told that this was not necessary and that he had to load up and get away. He left at 1500 hours. No blankets to load the blankets was provided.

5. The last of the three blankets did not arrive at LEBBIA until 17 Jan. owing to difficulties and conditions (two arrived on the 16th) as one broke down. The drivers and soldier escorts (except) slept in the Lorries, and never left them unattended during the whole journey. The Corporal remained with the broken down lorry.

6. The blankets, on arrival at LEBBIA, were unloaded and counted one by one. Instead of 1500, only 750 were received, a deficiency of 750. He was handed an unsorted list of names relating to 1500 blankets arranged to give. This was handed to you on 18 Jan. He did not sleep for them.

7. This reveals an unsatisfactory state of affairs, and is in sharp contrast with the careful and painstaking way in which the 1500 were carried out the day, in and out of all material that conditions has sent here to be distributed to demobilized Americans, and, moreover, is a reflection upon the Allied authorities.

8. I have complete confidence in the Corporal and Italian Army drivers and escorts. The former realized that he was being placed in an impossible position and did his best to reach LEBBIA. He and his men have taken themselves not only to the Lorry and honest in the work they have done here, but also very conscientious.

9. I express that a searching investigation be made regarding the blankets apparently unaccounted for, and the names in which these blankets were sent to LEBBIA were handed to the Corporal in charge of the Lorry sent to collect them.

1. Action has been taken by this headquarters to provide blankets for civil purposes in Italy, as indicated by copy of signal LAC 847 attached.
2. It is noted that there is an urgent immediate requirement for 9,600 blankets. British services have arranged for the withdrawal of 10,000 from P.W. camps in 3 District to meet this requirement. The AC was previously notified that delivery of this total quantity could be made at once (conversation Capt Grady - Major Brown refers), however due to the recent additional P.W. requirements only 5,000 can be delivered immediately. We are informed that the remaining 5,000 will be delivered within one month to the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission, Rome.
3. The 10,000 blankets presently being made available are to be replaced from the first consignment received from the Z.I. on the basis of LAC 847. It is requested that this section be notified at such time as replacement has been arranged.

Blankets for Italian civilians.

Excepting food, most immediate and critical supply requirement in ITALY is for blankets. Substantial quantities have never been supplied from military sources.

In the area of CASSINO and in the devastated belt along Highway 6 which was behind the HITLER Line there are approximately 246000 homeless persons, and unless blankets or equivalent are provided much privation, disease, and unrest may be expected. The immediate requirement for this area is 100000 blankets. There is a further requirement for 200000 blankets to meet the minimum needs of Italian Refugees who pass through camps in the forward area and to accommodate a static population of 10000 Allied nationals in camps under AC control. From appraisals based on conditions of Refugees passing through the lines it is considered that minimum essential requirements in ITALY North of PISA RIMINI will be approximately 250000. Total need therefore 550000 blankets. 2597

None are available from Theatre stocks.

Of total Balkan allocated availability of 1538000 it is proposed to divert 320000 to ITALY, this to be a portion of CAL Airgram 22. The 180000 which was the North ITALY portion of CAL Airgram 22, as divided by this Headquarters, will be applied. It is further requested that of total of
