1. Between the 13th and 26th of December, in twenty-five communes of Sicily, public resentment flared up against the military recall and the recent grain measures.
  2. The most serious outbreaks took place in towns listed below:
    - Dec. 15: Cavantina (Ariente). Draft cards destroyed, public buildings looted.
    - Dec. 17: Aciello (Trapani). Public buildings plundered. Four Carabinieri wounded.
    - Dec. 17: Frigintini (<sup>Reggino</sup>). Grain warehouse sacked.
    - Dec. 17: Palazzolo (Siracusa). Government records burned.
    - Dec. 17: Colerino (Siracusa). Municipal building destroyed.
    - Dec. 24: Capizzi (Messina). Carabinieri barracks stormed to effect release of draft evader.
  3. In other towns notices in the form of handbills or mural inscriptions were the only outward evidences of public dissatisfaction. The following are a few examples.

The following order of the day was drawn up by the Committee of National Liberation, Palermo Region, during its meeting of December 29, 1944.

Having carefully examined the recent events in Sicily which followed the military recall ordered by the National Democratic Government:

Having considered the violence, devastation, and fires caused to public buildings in several large cities and towns of Sicily, which have revealed a certain degree of preparation and organization led by well-known elements of Separatism and loyal Fascists;

Having considered that the demonstrations themselves, which were started by a small number of youths against the military recall, developed into popular revolts against land proprietors and their protectors in public administration;

Having observed that the manifestations took place:

1. Because the people are exasperated by their desperate financial conditions which have only deteriorated as a result of liberation.
2. Because this deterioration is due to the fact that the articles of general consumption, which were not turned into the market, were put on the black market by the producers and profiteers who are accumulating wealth at the expense of laborers, employees, professionals, artisans, and agricultural laborers.
3. Because regional, provincial and communal offices, entrusted with alimentation, are still in the hands of representatives of the former Fascist regime, and land pro-

4. Because the armed forces, police and carabinieri, are too few, too weak, and are shot through with Separatist and former Fascist elements.
  5. Because the manifestations have degenerated into violence due to the absentmindedness and bewilderment of public authorities;

the criminal activity of the Sicilian reactionary forces, Fascist Unitarians of yesterday, the Fascist Separatists of today, and anti-nationals of all time, who are responsible for the actual misery of the people and who want to make capital out of it with violence, for the purpose of provoking a civil war and preventing any contribution to the effort of liberation and the rebirth of the Italian people and Sicily;

## AND DEMANDS FOR THE HIGH COMMISSION:

- A strengthening of power in the framework of regional autonomy, in order to provide the energetic and urgent removal:
- a. Of those public officials who are rebellious or that is still worse, accomplices of Fascists.
  - b. The urgent separation of offices entrusted with alimentation, which include personnel who sabotage and obstruct the execution of ration laws.
  - c. A shakeup of personnel in communal and provincial administrations with the formation of Boards, Deputazioni, etc., representing the Committee of National Liberation for the promotion of a policy of consumption which may check the black market, by meeting the needs of the poorer classes.
  - d. The arrest and removal to concentration camps of Fascist criminals who carry out activity in favor of Nazi-Fascism.
  - e. The admission of strong forces into the armed corps of Sicily, forces which must represent the diverse democratic currents, and selected by the anti-Fascist parties of the Committee of National Liberation, in order to train them to fight against anti-national forces and to respect the law.

1. RACCUTA (Messina) - Dec. 22, 1944

About a hundred women assembled at the municipal building to protest the High Commissioner's grain measures, and to demand the re-opening of the grain mills. Local authorities persuaded the women to disperse by promising them prompt action.

2. ALIA (Palermo) - Dec. 24, 1944

Manifestos appeared on the walls of the town advising young men not to report for the draft. The notices were confiscated at once by local carabinieri. No public disturbances occurred.

3. CORLEONE (Palermo) - Dec. 26, 1944

The following poster was noted:

"Citizens of Corleone, do not waste ammunition. Save it, for it may be useful on the day of victory. Long live Mussolini! Down with the House of Savoy! If anyone destroys this poster, he will be shot."

1. With reference to your cable No.541 of 25 JAN 45 (copy attached for easy reference) I personally made this morning a strong formal protest to the High Commissioner who had arrived from Rome yesterday.

Energetic measures had already been taken to apprehend these bandits but no results have yet been reported. One Carabinieri has been killed when endeavouring to arrest suspects.

2. In connection with this matter the High Commissioner pointed out to me that full approval had not yet been given to the formation of a Battalion of Carabinieri specifically armed with automatic weapons to deal with bandits in Sicily. (This matter is referred to on page 3 of Brigadier Upjohn's D.O. Bulletin No.18 - 9/3.1/AS of 3<sup>rd</sup> DEC 44.)

The High Commissioner raised this matter with me previously on 19 DEC when I looked into it and informed him later that my information was that the Italian Government had approved this scheme (vide D.O. letter referred to above). The High Commissioner, however, is of the opinion that some form of approval from the Allied Commission is still awaited. I have directed my Public Safety Division to have this matter cleared up with your Headquarters but I would appreciate it if the matter could be looked into on the basis of the foregoing remarks.

3. Information has come to hand that there was a further outrage in the Caltanissetta area on 27 JAN when a train was held up by about 30 armed bandits and about 80 passengers were robbed. Full details have not yet been received. So far as is known no Allied personnel are involved.





Major Manuel, A.M.P.S.O. Sicily, reports that as a result of enforcement of the call-up, arrests in connection therewith and for violations of curfew regulations, minor disturbances began to occur on 3 January in the Province of Regusa, Sicily, reaching serious proportions on 6 January when 100 Italian soldiers, who had been sent to quiet the disorders, were beaten and disarmed by the populace. Additional troops were dispatched on 7 January and further reinforcements are contemplated. Latest unconfirmed reports state that serious disorders occurred in Vittorio, Comiso and Modica, resulting in the death of 4 Italian soldiers and 8 CCR. Situation considered serious.

Report received from HQ. CCR Rome that all communication lines to Regusa had been cut.

Above information telephoned to Duty Officer, G-5 AFHQ immediately upon receipt.

Major Manuel stated that signals had been sent to this HQ on 6 Jan. and 7 Jan., but until 9 A.M. 8 Jan., they had not been received at this Sub-Commission.



H.E. Berruti, Chief of Cabinet Interior, telephones to inform Admiral Stone of the following:

Since two days a seditious uprising is taking place in the Province of Ragusa, Sicily.

Apparent reason: call to arms.

Rebel armed action was taken against the town of COMISO, which is believed to be held by the rebels.

The telephone line between Ragusa and Comiso has been cut and the railroad damaged.

It appears that an artillery unit has been overwhelmed in the same zone.

Uprising appears limited within the Province of Ragusa.

The High Commissioner for Sicily has sent reinforcements of troops and Carabinieri, which are en route.

Also General Ronca has been sent from Catania to take command of the zone.

As direct information are lacking and the situation is uncertain, the High Commissioner has requested two fighting planes to support the troops.

The Air Ministry is willing to send two of the fighters stationed at Lecce Airport. The needed authorisation from Air Force Sub-Commission is being requested. Will you please support the request?

Additional information received by Ministry of Interior from Sicily.

Infantry units 200 strong which left Siracusa on the evening of 6th for Ragusa have clashed near Giarratano with the rebels. It appears that 6 Carabinieri were killed, and so were 4 soldiers, many wounded. Rebel casualties are not known. The troopers did not reach Ragusa.

Gen. Ronca has left Catania for Ragusa with 40 Carabinieri.

Col. Leonardo left Caltanissetta with the only available tank in order to retrace men of his battery which started for Ragusa yesterday and that is supposed to have been disarmed near Comiso.

Brig Carr has visited Sig. Aldisio and suggested to send some fighter planes to Ragusa in support of the troops. He believes that this action should prove very useful.

Reference the attached correspondence.

1. I have seen General Browning and discussed with him
  - a) the question of leaving 2 battalions in Sicily and therefore sending 2 battalions from Sardinia to Calabria, and
  - b) sending an additional 2 battalions from Sardinia to Sicily as suggested by the Minister of War.
2. With regard to (a) General Browning had already discussed this matter with the Minister of War and he agrees that it would be better to leave the existing SARDAUA Division in Sicily and to transfer 2 battalions from SARDINIA to CALABRIA. He has accordingly written a letter (copy attached) to CO AAL.
3. With regard to (b) so far as General Browning is concerned he has no objection to ordering a further 2 battalions from Sardinia to Sicily, but he points out that we shall have to consider whether the transfer of these additional battalions to Sicily will not leave Sardinia dangerously low in armed forces from a public safety point of view especially having regard to the airfields there.
4. Accordingly I propose to write to Regional Commissioner Region VI and ask his views.
