OCCUPATION OF THAT PART OF NORTHWEST ITALY

DIRECTED IN OPERATIONS INSTRUCTION NUMBER 7

1. OBJECT. The object of this directive is to define the administrative responsibilities for the occupation of that portion of NORTHWEST ITALY in the Compartimento of LIGURIA now occupied and to be occupied by the 92d Division.

2. OPERATIONS.

a. See Operations Instruction Number 7, Headquarters 15th Army Group, dated 25 April 1945.

b. Administratively, the occupation of the Compartimento of LIGURIA will be carried out in two (2) phases:

(1) Phase I - Military occupation and the elimination of German or Fascist Italian formations and the re-establishment of law and order among the civilian population terminating in the establishment of Allied Military Government.

(2) Phase II - The assumption of responsibility for military administration and Allied Military Government by AFHQ (see paragraph 15 below).

c. The execution of Phase I is the responsibility of 92d Division. The Regional Commissioner for LIGURIA with his regional Headquarters and the Headquarters, 57 Area with supporting units, are placed under operational command of 92d Division to assist and advise in the local administration of the Compartimento of LIGURIA. These Headquarters and supporting units will revert to Headquarters, No. 2 District upon initiation of Phase II. Headquarters, 57 Area will be under the administrative command of No. 2 District during Phases I and II.

d. 92d Division is responsible for calling forward personnel of Headquarters, LIGURIA Region. Headquarters, 57 Area, after agreement with 92d Division, is responsible for calling its supporting units forward. Allied Commission is responsible for transportation for Headquarters, LIGURIA Region.

3. AFHQ Administrative Responsibilities - Phase I.

a. As set forth in letter AFHQ, dated 25 January 1945, file AG 323/061 GDS-O, subject: "Occupation of Northwest Italy", AFHQ is respon-

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(2) Phase II - The assumption of responsibility for military administration and Allied Military Government by AFHQ (see paragraph 15 below).

c. The execution of Phase I is the responsibility of 92d Division. The Regional Commissioner for LIGURIA with his regional Headquarters and the Headquarters, 57 Area with supporting units, are placed under operational command of 92d Division to assist and advise in the local administration of the Compartimento of LIGURIA. These Headquarters and supporting units will revert to Headquarters, No. 2 District upon initiation of Phase II. Headquarters, 57 Area will be under the administrative command of No. 2 District during Phases I and II.

d. 92d Division is responsible for calling forward personnel of Headquarters, LIGURIA Region. Headquarters, 57 Area, after agreement with 92d Division, is responsible for calling its supporting units forward. Allied Commission is responsible for transportation for Headquarters, LIGURIA Region.

3. AFHQ Administrative Responsibilities - Phase I.

a. As set forth in letter AFHQ, dated 25 January 1945, file AG 323/061 GDS-O, subject: "Occupation of Northwest Italy", AFHQ is responsible for:

- (1) The opening and operation of Port of GENOA.
- (2) Repair of the GENOA-ALESSANDRIA railroad.
- (3) Construction and operation of petrol pipeline and bulk storage facilities from GENOA to ALESSANDRIA.

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- (4) Coordination of the repair of the main state cable routes operating through L/C, Signals, Headquarters 15th Army Group.
- (5) Supply sufficient motor transport to 92d Division for lifting civil supplies from LEGHORN forward. Units concerned in this task will be under the 92d Division for local administration.

b. Units in support of Headquarters, 57 Area have been furnished by AFHQ for the missions listed in sub-paragraphs (1), (3) and (4) above. MES is to supply troops required for the mission specified in sub-paragraph (2) above. Allied Commission is to supply units necessary to carry out the mission specified in sub-paragraph (5) above. Requests for such transportation are to be placed upon G-5, Headquarters 15th Army Group.

4. 92d Division Administrative Responsibility - Phase I.

a. The 92d Division with Headquarters 57 Area and Regional Headquarters of LIGURIA will be responsible for:

- (1) The establishment of Allied Military Government.
- (2) The initiation of civil relief measures.
- (3) The initiation of the repair of the following roads:
 - (a) LA SPEZIA to GENOA.
 - (b) GENOA-ALESSANDRIA. (That part of road in 92d Division Zone of action.)
- (4) Rendering all assistance possible to Headquarters, 57 Area to enable them to prepare the Key Plan for GENOA and carry out such other directives for the rapid development of the Port of GENOA as are issued by AFHQ.
- (5) Traffic control on the main arteries of military supply.
- (6) Coordination of the rehabilitation of electric power and water systems at GENOA and such other places as may be notified.
- (7) Allotment of accommodation in conjunction with Headquarters 57 Area.
- (8) The initiation of the mobilization of civil resources (to be coordinated with Headquarters Allied Commission through Headquarters 15th Army Group).

5. Administration of U.S. Forces - Phase I.

a. Supply.

- (1) Until GENOA is secured.

(a) PBS has agreed to deliver Class I, III and V supplies to truckheads in support of 92d Division

c. Units in support of Headquarters, 57 Area have been furnished by AFHQ for the missions listed in sub-paragraphs (1), (3) and (4) above. MRS is to supply troops required for the mission specified in sub-paragraph (2) above. Allied Commission is to supply units necessary to carry out the mission specified in sub-paragraph (5) above. Requests for such transportation are to be placed upon G-5, Headquarters 15th Army Group.

4. 92d Division Administrative Responsibility - Phase I.

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- (2) The initiation of civil relief measures.
- (3) The initiation of the repair of the following roads:
 - (a) LA SPEZIA to GENOA.
 - (b) GENOA-ALESSANDRIA. (That part of road in 92d Division Zone of action.)
- (4) Rendering all assistance possible to Headquarters, 57 Area to enable them to prepare the Key Plan for GENOA and carry out such other directives for the rapid development of the Port of GENOA as are issued by AFHQ.
- (5) Traffic control on the main arteries of military supply.
- (6) Coordination of the rehabilitation of electric power and water systems at GENOA and such other places as may be notified.
- (7) Allotment of accommodation in conjunction with Headquarters 57 Area.
- (8) The initiation of the mobilization of civil resources (to be coordinated with Headquarters Allied Commission through Headquarters 15th Army Group).

5. Administration of U.S. Forces - Phase I.

a. Supply.

(1) Until GENOA is secured.

- (a) PBS has agreed to deliver Class I, III and V supplies to truckheads in support of 92d Division and attached troops; 92d Division to place daily demands on PBS for such supplies for delivery to designated truckheads; 92d Division to operate truckheads.
- (b) PBS has agreed to supply Engineer expendable stores, including Bailey Bridging, on direct demand from 92d Division; PBS to move such stores to 92d Division Engineer dump.

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(c) If transportation is not available in 92d Division, PBS has agreed to furnish not to exceed two QM Truck Companies to 92d Division to haul Bailey Bridging from 92d Division Engineer dump to bridge sites and for other Engineer purposes. If these companies are desired, request therefore will be made upon 15th Army Group.

(d) PBS will supply Class II and IV items (except major items and items in excess of T/RA and/or T/E) on requisition; 92d Division to draw such items from PBS Base Depots. Demands for major items and excess equipment will be made upon Fifth Army.

(e) Ammunition will be supplied by PBS based on allocation made by 15th Army Group. 92d Division will submit to this Headquarters a recommended allocation for each 10-day period, beginning 6 May; recommendations to reach above Headquarters, 48 hours in advance of date of beginning of 10-day period.

(2) After GENOA is secured.

(a) All supplies (except major items and items in excess of T/RA and/or T/E) to be drawn from PBS; 92d Division to utilize own organic transportation for haul from PBS depots to own supply points; demands for major items and excess equipment to be placed upon Fifth Army.

(b) Ammunition to be allocated by 15th Army Group.

(3) Material status reports will be submitted to Fifth Army.

b. Personnel. Administration of U.S. military personnel will be under Fifth Army.

6. Administration of British Forces - Phase I.

a. Maintenance.

(1) British troops under command 92d US Division, including Headquarters 57 Area and supporting units, will initially be maintained by road from COLLE SALVETTI under arrangements of 60 Sub Area. 57 Area will be responsible for coordinating and submitting all demands for British troops to 60 Sub Area.

(2) At a later date maintenance will be by sea either over the beaches or through the Port of GENOA. This will be the responsibility of AFHQ. C-in-C Med has advised that maintenance by LST over the beaches is in any case unlikely to be possible before 7 May. Further instructions will be issued on this subject.

(3) All units will move self contained and will carry supplies and POL to the maximum capacity of their 1st line transport.

- (e) Ammunition will be supplied by PBS based on allocation made by 15th Army Group. 92d Division will submit to this Headquarters a recommended allocation for each 10-day period, beginning 6 May; recommendations to reach above Headquarters, 48 hours in advance of date of beginning of 10-day period.

(2) After GENOA is secured.

- (a) All supplies (except major items and items in excess of T/EA and/or T/E) to be drawn from PBS; 92d Division to utilize own organic transportation for haul from PBS depots to own supply points; demands for major items and excess equipment to be placed upon Fifth Army.
- (b) Ammunition to be allocated by 15th Army Group.
- (3) Material status reports will be submitted to Fifth Army.

b. Personnel. Administration of U.S. military personnel will be under Fifth Army.

6. Administration of British Forces - Phase I.

a. Maintenance.

- (1) British troops under command 92d US Division, including Headquarters 57 Area and supporting units, will initially be maintained by road from COLLE SALVETTI under arrangements of 60 Sub Area. 57 Area will be responsible for coordinating and submitting all demands for British troops to 60 Sub Area.

- (2) At a later date maintenance will be by sea either over ⁴⁰¹² the beaches or through the Port of GENOA. This will be the responsibility of AFHQ. G-in-C Med has advised that maintenance by LST over the beaches is in any case unlikely to be possible before 7 May. Further instructions will be issued on this subject.

- (3) All units will move self contained and will carry supplies and POL to the maximum capacity of their line transport.

b. Calling forward of British Units for 57 Area.

- (1) Headquarters 57 Area after coordination with 92d US Division will be responsible for calling forward units nominated for GENOA as required.
- (2) Owing to the lack of transport at present the number of units which can be maintained by road will be extremely limited. It is therefore essential that in the initial stage minimum administrative troops be called forward as are essential for:

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- (a) Rendering assistance to 92d US Division in controlling the town.
- (b) Reconnaissance and planning of the town, port and installations.

c. Medical.

- (1) Cover will be provided for British tps under command 92d US Divis on or 57 Area initially by 68 FDS. Surgical facilities will be provided by US medical units of 92d US Division. British cases for evacuation will be cleared through US channels to US hospitals in LECHORN, thence under arrangements 60 Sub Area to British hospitals. At a later date AFHQ will provide a British general hospital for GENOA. When craft are able to enter the Port, 68 FDS will clear cases to LECHORN by sea and AFHQ will arrange for the necessary personnel and equipment to be made available both for the craft and the reception area at LECHORN. Air evacuation to FLORENCE will be carried out when the IG GENOA begins operating.

d. Reinforcements.

- (1) Reinforcements for British units under command 92d US Division or 57 Area will be provided from 1 CRU, SAN GIOVANNI, R. 0245, under arrangements Adv Rfts Sec Fifth Army, which will remain located in FLORENCE. AFsW 3308/9 in respect of the above mentioned units will be rendered as follows:

- (a) Original to CHQ 2d Echelon.
- (b) Duplicate to Adv Rfts Sec Fifth Army.

e. PW.

- (1) All enemy PW will be handed over to nearest American PW cage/enclosure.

f. Recovery.

- (1) Road clearance will be responsibility of 92d US Division.
- (2) British vehicle casualties will be towed forward by unit or other available transport to 16 Port Workshops GENOA as soon as established or back to 612 L of C Workshops LECHORN.

6. Repair. British vehicles and equipment casualties will be repaired by 16 Port Workshops at GENOA as soon as established or 612 L of C Workshops LECHORN whichever is nearest.

7. Allied Ex-PW. Allied ex-PW, escapers and evaders will be routed to 6 Det Allied PW Repatriation Unit, at present located at LECHORN Q 0145. This Det is available for calling forward to GENOA when required.

8. Disposal of Captured Animals. 92d US Division will be responsible

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Surgical facilities will be provided by US medical units of 92d US Division. British cases for evacuation will be cleared through US channels to US hospitals in LEGHORN, thence under arrangements 60 Sub Area to British hospitals. At a later date AFHQ will provide a British general hospital for GENOA. When craft are able to enter the Port, 68 FDS will clear cases to LEGHORN by sea and AFHQ will arrange for the necessary personnel and equipment to be made available both for the craft and the reception area at LEGHORN. Air evacuation to FLORENCE will be carried out when the IG GENOA begins operating.

d. Reinforcements.

- (1) Reinforcements for British units under command 92d US Division or 57 Area will be provided from 1 CHU, SAN GIOVANNI, R.0245, under arrangements Adv Rfts Sec Fifth Army, which will remain located in FLORENCE. AFaw 3308/9 in respect of the above mentioned units will be rendered as follows:

(a) Original to GHQ 2d Echelon.

(b) Duplicate to Adv Rfts Sec Fifth Army.

e. PW.

- (1) All enemy PW will be handed over to nearest American PW cage/enclosure.

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- (1) Road clearance will be responsibility of 92d US Division.
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8. Disposal of Captured Animals. 92d US Division will be responsible for safeguarding of captured animals. Animal Collecting Centers will be established where necessary. Holdings will be reported to Headquarters 15th Army Group, who will issue disposal instructions.

9. Allied Military Government During Phase I.

a. Civil Supplies:

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- (1) Headquarters Allied Commission is responsible for stock-piling civil supplies for LIGURIA in LECHORN area. These stock-piles will be sufficient to provide an initial ration of 200 grams of bread per day plus supplementary scales.
 - (2) 92d Division will be responsible for the movement forward and local distribution of civil supplies from Allied Commission warehouses in LECHORN.
 - (3) AFHQ is to furnish 92d Division necessary transportation to move civil supplies from stock-piles to forward points and for local distribution.
- b. Finance: Adequate supplies of Allied Military Lire are available on demand from Allied Commission.
- c. The Directorate of Labor, Labor Offices, etc., will cooperate with 92d Division in making available sufficient civilian labor for all military requirements.

d. Public Safety:

- (1) Headquarters Allied Commission will be responsible for concentration of CC RR, fully equipped and ready to take the field. Headquarters Allied Commission will provide CC RR with a distinctive shoulder patch in order to distinguish them from CC RR to be found in LIGURIA.
- (2) 92d Division will be responsible for the calling forward of CC RR as required.
- (3) Headquarters Allied Commission will be responsible for transportation of CC RR to Rear Divisional area. It is the responsibility of 92d Division to transport CC RR to their stations.

e. Public Health: Headquarters Allied Commission is responsible for stock-piling adequate medical supplies for LIGURIA at LECHORN. 92d Division is responsible for transportation and distribution forward.

10. Refugees, Repatriates and Displaced Persons:

a. The screening, registering, maintenance and movement of all refugees, repatriates and displaced persons, including Russians, in LIGURIA will be the responsibility of 92d Division. Initially, free movement (unrestricted travel) of refugees, repatriates and displaced persons will be prohibited.

- (1) The procedure set out in the following directives will apply for nationals in the 92d Division area:

(a) Russian Nationals: Letters, Headquarters MTOUSA, AG 383.7/414 A-C, 9 March 1945 and 9 April 1945, "Disposition of Soviet Citizens".

(b) Other Nationals: (Exclusive of Italian Republican Army) Chapter XVIII, Administrative Instructions for U.S. Prisoners of War Enclosures in MTOUSA, AG

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(b) AFHQ is to furnish 92d Division necessary transportation to move civil supplies from stock-piles to forward points and for local distribution.

b. Finance: Adequate supplies of Allied Military Lire are available on demand from Allied Commission.

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(b) Other Nationals: (Exclusive of Italian Republican Army) Chapter XVIII, Administrative Instructions for U.S. Prisoners of War Enclosures in MTOUSA, AG 383.6/526 PMG-O, Headquarters MTOUSA.

b. Headquarters Allied Commission will attach to LIGURIA Region certain specialists and equipment for dealing with refugees, repatriates and displaced persons. Initially, this personnel will be attached to 92d Division to advise and supplement the existing Staffs until Phase I is completed.

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11. Civil Relief (Clothing):

- a. Headquarters Allied Commission, in cooperation with American Red Cross and American Relief for Italy, will make available such clothing as is obtainable to meet the initial emergency needs and will stock-pile such items in forward areas.
- b. 92d Division will be responsible for calling forward and distributing this clothing from Allied Commission stock-piles.

12. Partisans: The proper treatment of Partisans will be the responsibility of 92d Division. (See Appendix "1" to Headquarters 15th Army Group Operations Instruction No. 5, dated 12 April 1945.)

13. Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives: It will be the responsibility of 92d Division to prevent unnecessary damage to historical monuments, deposits of important documents (archives) and artistic treasures. Administrative Memo No. 20, AFHQ, dated 3 April 1945, subject: "Preservation of Property of Historical and Educational Importance to Italy", will be the document of reference and direction. Headquarters Allied Commission will attach to 92d upon its request, trained officer specialists to assist and advise the formation Commanders in this important field.

14. Administration Buildings for AMO and Allied Commission: It is expected that all forms of local government will come under the control of civilian agencies at an earlier date than in the present liberated portions of Italy. All public buildings and equipment will be reserved for the services named below and be at the disposal of civil government a) early as commensurate with military necessity. The service buildings required are:

- Prefecture
- Municipi
- Carabinieri Caserma
- Police Stations
- Court houses
- Police Barracks
- Prisons
- Reformatories
- Fire Stations
- UNPA (Bomb disposal and mine clearance organization)

15. Administrative Responsibilities - Phase II.

a. During this phase, responsibility for administration of this area will pass from 92d Division to AFHQ. Headquarters, No. 2 District, will be the local AFHQ agency responsible for continued British military administration and Headquarters, Allied Commission for civil administration. MTCUSA will be responsible for the supply and administration of any U.S. forces remaining in this area.

b. 92d Division, after coordinating with No. 2 District, will recommend to Headquarters 15th Army Group when administrative responsibility for all, or any part of its area will pass from 92d Division to AFHQ.

OF NO. 2 DISTRICT IN NW ITALY

(To be read in conjunction with No. 2 District Operation Instruction No. 22)

GENERAL

1. The object of this instruction is to define in general terms the responsibilities of No. 2 District in the military administration of NW ITALY.
This instruction will be re-issued in a further revised and expanded form when HQ No. 2 District assumes its new role.

The instruction is based on AFHQ letter AG 323/061 GDS-O dated 25 Jan 45, subject occupation of NW ITALY, as amended by letter of same reference dated 30 Jan 45.

Detailed procedure regarding certain of these responsibilities will be published in administrative instructions Nos. 2 - 20, the titles of which are shown in Appendix "A" attached hereto. Administrative instructions to cover further requirements will be issued as necessity arises.

MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO BE RENDERED BY

2. AFHQ is to control direct, and provide all resources necessary for, the execution of the following requirements:-

(a) Port of Genoa

- (i) Repair of the port to enable 2000 tpd to be discharged and cleared.
- (ii) Discharging and clearing 2000 tpd which will include the maintenance of the military forces in NW ITALY.
- (iii) Controlling and co-ordinating all discharge and clearance up to a total of 2000 tons daily.

(b) Railways

Repair of the following railways:

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GENERAL

1. The object of this instruction is to define in general terms the responsibilities of No.2 District in the military administration of NW ITALY. This instruction will be re-issued in a further revised and expanded form when HQ No.2 District assumes its new role.

The instruction is based on AFHQ letter AG 323/061 GDS-O dated 25 Jan 45, subject occupation of NW ITALY, as amended by letter of same reference dated 30 Jan 45.

MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO BE AFFORDED BY AFHQ IN NW ITALY

2. AFHQ is to control direct, and provide all resources necessary for, the execution of the following responsibilities:-

(a) Port of Genoa

- (i) Repair of the port to enable 3000 tpd to be discharged and cleared.
(ii) Discharging and clearing 2000 tpd which will include the maintenance of the military forces in NW ITALY.
(iii) Controlling and co-ordinating all discharge and clearance up to a total of 3000 tons daily.

(b) Railway

Repair of the following railways:

BOLOGNA - ALESSANDRIA
ALESSANDRIA - TORIN
The easiest route to MILAN
GENOA - ALESSANDRIA

(c) Petrol Bulk Storage and Pipeline

- (i) Bulk Storage at GENOA.

The responsibility for the rehabilitation of bulk storage at GENOA and construction of the pipeline is delegated by AFHQ to CE No.2 District.

15. HQ Movements NW ITALY is being established in MILAN adjacent to HQ No.2 District, with movement staffs at each Area and Sub-Area HQ. The responsibility of HQ Movements NW ITALY is to coordinate the detailed operation of port, railway and road movement in NW ITALY, in conjunction with the Staff of HQ No.2 District.

ALLIED COMMISSION

16. The organization of the Allied Commission in NW ITALY is defined in a separate instruction.
17. In general, the responsibilities of HQ Allied Commission are to ensure the prevention of unrest and disease, and the rehabilitation of industry.
18. HQ Allied Commission is also responsible for the provision of civil manpower and materials, to assist HQ No.2 District in the execution of the tasks detailed in para 3.
19. All dealings between Districts and Area/Sub-Area HQ and the Italian civil authorities will be carried out through the appropriate Allied Commission/Allied Military Government HQ.

1. The attached copy of the Staff Memorandum Number 5, Headquarters IV Corps, is circulated for your study and comment. It represents a departure from the previous organizational functioning of Allied Military Government within combat organizations and is intended to apply to the situation where the primary mission of a task force is to establish and support military government. Your comments are desired. I propose to visit the IV Corps Headquarters in the very near future and would like to have the comments before my departure.

2. I have just heard that the Commanding General, IV Corps has proposed that all A.M.G. officers assigned to IV Corps be transferred from the 2675th Regiment, and corresponding British formation, and be assigned to IV Corps. He also contemplates requisitioning 200 additional officers for military government duties with the Corps. His proposals have been forwarded through command channels and will, no doubt, be referred to us by A.F.H.Q. for comment prior to a decision.

1. GENERAL

a. The object of this Staff Memorandum is to define the administrative responsibilities of the various staff sections of the IV Corps and to establish staff procedures to be followed in the military occupation and administration of Northwest Italy.

b. The mission assigned to IV Corps during the occupation and the tenure of its administration is the "Military occupation (of Northwest Italy) and the elimination of any remaining GERMAN or Fascist ITALIAN formations; and the re-establishment of law and order among the civilian population, terminating in the Establishment of Allied Military Government".

c. Upon completion of the above mission, control of the territory liberated will be transferred to the General Officer Commanding District No.2.

2. ORGANIZATION.

a. In order to execute this mission, IV Corps headquarters necessarily will be augmented by additional personnel, both commissioned and enlisted, to perform the duties connected with the increased activities contemplated by the directives mentioned above. In some cases, the expansion of IV Corps headquarters will even take the shape of additional sections, sub-sections and branches. In view of the fact that our participation in this particular phase of operations may be of limited duration, it is considered administratively sound to fit this augmentation into the existing military structure of this headquarters instead of setting it up as a separate agency operating in cooperation with our staff sections rather than as a part of them. From past experience it is believed that the military organization of a Corps headquarters is wide enough in scope and flexibility to assimilate all of these increased personnel and activities. At this juncture it is visualized that no activity is apt to develop which cannot be integrated efficiently into the normal staff operating procedure of this headquarters. By following this method of absorbing the additional personnel and offices into the existing staff structure of the IV Corps, it is believed that this headquarters, when the time comes, can be withdrawn from the area and can turn over to our successors with the greatest administrative efficiency and least interruption. This then will be the guiding principle in the augmentation with which we are confronted.

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b. Members of the Staff of District No.2 will be attached to appropriate staff sections, Headquarters, IV Corps. In addition to their duties as a British Increment for the administration and supply of British troops under IV Corps command, they will be available to assist the sections to which they are attached in the solution of problems arising from the military occupation. At times and in places indicated by the Commanding General, IV Corps, and with the assent of the G.O.C., District No.2, they will arrange for bringing forward administrative units and service troops attached to District No.2.

c. Personnel of the Allied Commission to be attached to LIGURIA, PIEMONTE and such Provinces of LOMBARDIA and EMILIA as are within the IV Corps area will be assigned to the Staff Sections of Headquarters IV Corps as indicated on the attached chart. Their duties in IV Corps Headquarters will be as directed by the Chiefs of Sections to which attached. Unless by specific direction of the Commanding General, IV Corps, they will continue to serve in the Province or Compartimento for which they are destined.

3. STAFF SECTION RESPONSIBILITIES: All Staff Sections, Headquarters IV Corps will continue to be responsible for the execution of their normal duties. Where normal duties are stated in this memorandum it is for emphasis on the importance of such duties in the special situation confronting IV Corps and does not relieve the Section Chief from continuing to carry out other essential duties not enumerated. The principal additional duties are as follows:

a. Chief of Staff:

- (1) Direct and coordinate the work of the general and special staff.

b. A.C. of S., G-1:

- (1) Selection and assignment of attached personnel (in consultation with A.C. of S., G-5);
- (2) Arrangements for billeting the District No.2 Staff and Allied Commission personnel within the Corps Headquarters area.
- (3) Conduct of ceremonies and reception of distinguished guests, to include international escorts of honor.
- (4) Advise Commanding General as to means and measures to prevent unrest in the liberated areas.

c. A.C. of S., G-2:

- (1) Responsibility for the internal security of the liberated area occupied by IV Corps.
- (2) Maintain lists of those individuals or corporation whose bank accounts should be blocked.

- (3) Maintain lists of those individuals against whom epuration proceedings should be opened.
- (4) Control of daily and weekly press and other publications.
- (5) Propaganda releases to civilian population.
- (6) Press releases and censorship.
- (7) Advise Commanding General and Staff at all times as to changes in public opinion in the liberated areas.

d. A.C. of S., G-3:

- (1) Preparation of plans to occupy areas liberated in northwest Italy.
- (2) Advise Commanding General as to location, strength and composition of military garrisons.

e. A.C. of S., G-4:

- (1) Coordination of the use of all transportation, (military and civilian) available to the Corps in the distribution of essential supplies to military personnel and the civilian population.
- (2) Planning and supervising the establishment of supply installations and the location of service units within the occupied area.
- (3) Arrangements to provide transportation for refugees, patriots and displaced persons within Corps area.
- (4) Planning and supervising the segregation and preservation for use, military or civil, of all local resources.
- (5) Traffic control in the main arteries of military supplies.
- (6) Control and assignment of all real estate in the occupied area.

f. A.C. of S., G-5 (Civil Affairs Section):

- (1) Assignments of Civil Affairs Officers to Communes and provinces and arrangements for their assumption of duties as soon after the occupation as physical limitations permit.
- (2) The establishment of Provincial and Communal governments and the supervision of all activities to include Agriculture, Fine arts and Monuments, Industry, Education, Commerce and Patriots.

- (3) Arrangement for the location of main and sub-offices for enrolling civilian labour and the co-ordination of these activities with those of the Directorate of Labour, DML, and Civil Labour Units. (Co-ordination with G-4 and Engr Off IV Corps for the supply of labour for essential projects to include dock labour).
- (4) Arrangement for the collection of refugees at suitable collecting points for care and transportation as established by Allied Commission (Co-ordination with G-4 for transportation).
- (5) Advise the CG at all times as to developments and activities of AMB to include specific recommendations in the establishment of Allied Military Government and co-ordination of staff activities.

g. The Adjutant General:

- (1) Prepare and request for attachment of personnel to Headquarters IV Corps of all District No.2 and Allied Commission personnel.
- (2) Prepare and issue orders for transfer of personnel, leaves and releases from temporary duty to return to proper station.
- (3) The issuance of all public notices and special proclamations to the civilian population as directed by the Commanding General.
- (4) The maintenance of such personnel records of attached personnel as may be deemed necessary or as directed by Army Regulations.

h. The Judge Advocates:

- (1) Supervise all civil courts whether summary, superior or general in accordance with the Consolidated Instructions for Allied Military Courts - Allied Commission.
- (2) Make assignments of the members of Courts.
- (3) Maintenance of proper court records.
- (4) Assure that the review and appeal procedures are observed.
- (5) Draft all public legal orders, notices and local proclamations and certify same to the Adjutant General for publication.

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- (5) Designate officers to render legal advice and counsel to all officers of IV Corps Headquarters in matters relating to the military government within the Corps Area.

1. The Corps Engineer:

- (a) Assume general supervision of all repairs of highways, bridges, water works, and viaducts, electric power plants and other public utilities. Specifically the initiation of repair of the following roads in order of priority as listed:
- (1) GENOA - ALESSANDRIA
 - (2) PIACENZA - ALESSANDRIA - TURIN
 - (3) PIACENZA - MILAN
- (2) Employ, in addition to the officers attached for the purpose, the services of accredited civilian engineers and specialists who have been ascertained not to be risks to security.
- (3) Assure that all public works projects are previously certified by the Judge Advocate and the Finance Officer as to legality and availability of funds before commencement.
- (4) Supervision of the rehabilitation of electric power and water systems at GENOA and such other places as may be directed.

3. The Ordnance Officer:

- (1) Operation and supervision of maintenance installations, to include civilian garages necessary for the repair and maintenance of civilian trucks and motor cars in use or to be put into use.
- (2) Assure that all available civilian trucks and vehicles are placed in running order within the limitations imposed by spare parts and tires.
- (3) Supervise and assist in the organization of local transportation pools and cooperatives.
- (4) Coordinate with AG of 3, G-4, in the latter's dispatch of civilian vehicles.

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- (1) Supervision of the ordering procedure used by municipalities, consorzi and institutions.
- (2) Establish in connection with Class I, Class II and Class III Quartermaster dumps stockpiles of civilian supplies.
- (3) Establish Class I dumps for Italian military ration and supervise distribution to Carabinieri.
- (4) Coordinate with the Finance Officer in the clearing of credit to be given to municipalities, consorzi and institutions.
- (5) Supervision of arrangements for the distribution of food and clothing to refugees, patriots and other civilians.

l. The Signal Officer:

- (1) Assume responsibility for all civilian telephone, telegraph and radio communication systems.
- (2) Provide, through civilian facilities, where available, for the inter-communication between municipal, provincial and regional governmental offices.

m. The Corps Surgeon:

- (1) Supervise public health activities, civilian hospitals, institutions for care of indigent, mental diseases, and public asylums.
- (2) Coordination of activities of the American Red Cross Field representatives.
- (3) Supervise the reorganization of the Public Assistance Corporation (P.A.C.) and the Pre-natal and Infancy Clinics.
- (4) Assure that civilian medical supplies are secured and supplied to ambulatories, pharmacists and hospitals.
- (5) Take measures to prevent communicable and contagious disease among the civilian population.
- (6) Arrange through the AC of S, G-4, for the transportation of civilian medical supplies.

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n. The Finance Officer:

- (1) Assume responsibility for closing all banks, insurance companies, and financial institutions, immediately upon occupation.

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- (2) Block the accounts of Fascists, Fascists Republicans and others who in the opinion of AC of S, G-2, are now or are potentially a threat to security or whose accounts are to be blocked at the request of the Allied Commission.
- (3) Initiate loans to municipalities, provincial governments and quasi-government corporations as provided by existing directives of the Allied Commission.
- (4) Arrange for payment of civilian employees of Allied Military Government not on the state or provincial payrolls.
- (5) Supervise the examination of accounts and records of banks, municipalities and public corporations.
- (6) Supervise the preparation of municipal and provincial budgets and approve, or submit for approval the same.
- (7) Provide for the audit of all payrolls, vouchers and invoices evidencing receipt and disbursements of Allied Military Government funds passing through his office and submit for final audit and reimbursement reports and supporting vouchers.
- (8) Determine after examination, the time at which banking institutions are to be reopened, the cash balance against deposits to be maintained, and in general establish supervision of all banks reopened for business in the Corps area.
- (9) Arrange to draw the necessary quantities of Allied Military lire from Headquarters Allied Commission and make arrangements for safeguarding and transporting it until its delivery at destination.
- (10) Furnish information at all times as to the availability of funds.

c. The Provost Marshal:

- (1) Assume responsibility for the operation of all civilian police agencies, Carabinieri, Municipal Guards, Finance and Forest Guards in the Corps Area.
- (2) Assume responsibility for the maintenance of law and order among the civilian population.
- (3) Control traffic on the main arteries of military supplies within Corps area.
- (4) Direct, by means of special investigators, screened Quastore agents, or other persons, investigations of civil offenses and crimes.

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- (5) Detail the necessary personnel to represent the AMG in the civil courts to press charges against violators of the A.M.G. Proclamations, Notices and Orders.
- (6) Arrange with Allied Commission to call forward Carabinieri as needed.
- (7) Establish such schools and holding centers for Carabinieri as may be necessary.
- (8) Arrange for the transportation and drawing of rations for the Carabinieri employed directly by Corps.

4. Those General ^{and} Special Staff Sections not specifically mentioned in paragraph 3, above will continue their normal functions until directed otherwise.

5. Personnel of IV Corps Artillery Section will be assigned specific duties within the sections of Corps Headquarters.
