1. Reference is made to your memorandum of 7 June to which was attached a letter dated June 6, AG/3020/6/PH, from Public Health Sub-Commission relative to above subject.
2. The contents of letter were discussed with Mr. David Barr, American Relief for Italy, who indicated that subject matter of cablegram reproduced in para 3 has been handled very satisfactorily insofar as ARI is concerned. A shipment of 80,000 pairs of shoes were received last week and these will be distributed on a relief basis by ARI.
3. A copy of cablegram referred to was sent to the Allied Commission merely as information copy and required no action by AG.
4. Additional shoes which may be required for the Italian population should be discussed with the Italian Government for purchase as a Category "B" item.

- 1 Reference letter IPR/26/4 dated 24 May 45 from Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission (copy attached).
- 2 On 23 May IPR S/C were advised by Commerce S/C that a quantity of light canvas, rejected by MMIA, had become available for release through the Consorzio Nazionale Canape. On the same day the CMC advised IPR S/C that all available light canvas (the quantity is not known) had been allotted to the High Commissioner for War Refugees.
- 3 An application for the release of 22,000 metres of light canvas a month had been submitted by IPR S/C on 2 April to the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labour, who in turn passed it to the CMC. However, no canvas was received in April, and in May, as stated above, the total quantity available for civilian use was released by the CMC to the High Commissioner for War Refugees.
- 4 It is suggested that the CMC be asked to explain their action in omitting the allocation of canvas to IPR S/C during April and May.
- 5 It is further suggested that the position be amended by the allotment to IPR S/C, during June, of an amount equal to that received by the High Commissioner for War Refugees during April, May and June. It is clearly unsatisfactory that this Commission should apply to CMC for material.

1. The following facts are reported to you, as the policy for the releases of materials to the Allied Commission from the Consorzio Nazionale Canapa is not considered satisfactory.

2. In accordance with Commerce Sub-Commission AC/5302/Commerce dated 28 March 1945 applications for the release of 22,000 metres of Light Canvas a month for use by this Sub-Commission was submitted on 2 April 1945 to the Ministry of Industry Commerce and Labour.

3. This bid was eventually passed to the Consorzio Nazionale Canapa who make the releases. They were already in possession of bids for previous months but an allotment had only been made for the month of December 1944 and in February 1945.

4. This Sub-Commission enquired from the Consorzio Nazionale Canapa on 26 April 1945 why releases had not been made and were informed on 3 May 1945 that AFLRS had made no release for civil use in May as all Canvas was required for operational purposes by M.M.I.A.

5. On 23 May 1945 Commerce Sub-Commission stated M.M.I.A. had returned the Canvas as unsuitable and this might be available for release from Consorzio Nazionale Canapa.

6. The C.N.C. were phoned on 23 re this release. They stated that a bid for Canvas had also been made by the High Commissioner for War Refugees whom they considered responsible for all refugees in Italy. The total amount of Canvas available had therefore been allotted to him and this Sub-Commission was told to apply to the High Commissioner for any canvas he could spare.

7. Due to the urgent need for Canvas for palliasses for Displaced Persons in Northern Italy may steps be taken to ensure the release of Canvas is regularly made and that demands of the Allied Commission are given due consideration.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394
(Attn: Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission)

1. Reference is made to your letter of 9 January '45, your file DPR/45/4 addressed to the A.C. Requisition Division, to which was attached lists of requirements for refugee camps and hospitals located both North and South of the Pisa-Rimini line.

2. These requirements have been examined and it is the view of this Headquarters that they be placed through regular established channels.

3. With respect to organizational items including camp tools and equipment, stores, hardware and hospital items it is suggested that requisitions be placed on the Hq. Commandant, AFHQ, for issue from theatre stocks.

4. Other items including clothing, blankets, and similar materials should be presented to the Priority Committee recently established by the A.C. Economic Section.

5. Toilet supplies and cigarettes should be the subject of a separate letter to AFHQ in which authority is requested for receipt and distribution of PX/MARFI supplies.

6. Requests for food items are a responsibility of the A.C. Food Sub-Commission and it is suggested that your requirements in amounts shown on the lists be discussed with that agency.

7. The lists attached to your communication are being returned herewith.
