GENERAL ORDER No 35 A

General Order

WHEREAS under the provisions of GO 35 it was ordered that persons to whom such provisions applied be suspended from their office or employment and in that event and during the period of such suspension receive for their support their basic salary without any further allowance.

AND WHEREAS the Italian Government by IL No. 44 of 23 Feb 45 have provided that certain increases of salary and allowances in addition to their basic salary shall be payable to persons suspended from their office or employment in the course of sanctions against fascism.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ELLERY W. STONE, Rear Admiral, USNR, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows :

ARTICLE I

In the case of all persons listed in Art. I of GO 35 who held office or employment on a temporary basis the order to be made against such persons shall be one of dismissal from office or employment and not one of suspension and Arts II, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X and XI of the said General Order shall be considered as modified accordingly.

ARTICLE II

No temporary official or employee effectively dismissed under the provisions of the precedent article shall be entitled to any salary or allowance from the effective date of dismissal as aforesaid.

ARTICLE III

Basic salaries under Art. XI of GO 35 shall be calculated in accordance with instructions to that effect which shall be issued from time to time by the Provincial Commissioner.

ARTICLE IV

their support their basic salary without any further allowance.

AND WHEREAS the Italian Government by LL No. 44 of 23 Feb 45 have provided that certain increases of salary and allowances in addition to their basic salary shall be payable to persons suspended from their office or employment in the course of sanctions against fascism.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ELLERY W. STONE, Rear Admiral, USNH, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows :

ARTICLE I

In the case of all persons listed in Art. I of GO 35 who held office or employment on a temporary basis the order to be made against such persons shall be one of dismissal from office or employment and not one of suspension and Arts II, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X and XI of the said General Order shall be considered as modified accordingly.

ARTICLE II

No temporary official or employee effectively dismissed under the provisions of the precedent article shall be entitled to any salary or allowance from the effective date of dismissal as aforesaid.

ARTICLE III

Basic salaries under Art. XI of GO 35 shall be calculated in accordance with instructions to that effect which shall be issued from time to time by the Provincial Commissioner.

ARTICLE IV

This Order shall come into operation in any province or part thereof within the Military Government Territory on the date of its first posting therein.

to the same duties as all other citizens.

ART. 2. — The annulments of citizenship in pursuance of Art. 3 of the R. D. L. of 7 Sept. 1938 No. 1381 and of Art. 23 of R. D. L. of 17 Nov. 1938 No. 1728 are void ipso iure (by force of law).

Those whose certificate of citizenship has been revoked in accordance with the provisions cited in the preceding para. reacquire it ipso iure (by force of law).

ART. 3. — Entries of racial character made in the registers of the civil status and in the registers of population will be considered non-existent.

These entries must never be reproduced in the extracts or copies of civil status acts or certificates of vital statistics except upon an express request of the judicial authority or in pursuance of a specific authorization of the Royal Procurator upon application of the interested party.

ART. 4. — All those who have been dismissed from service in consequence of the R. D. L. of Nov. 1938 No. 1779, of the R. D. L. of 17 Nov. 1938 No. 1728 or of any other provision or rule of racial character in whatever form enacted, are readmitted to service.

The readmission in service of those who belonged to the state administration or to local government bodies will take place automatically (d'ufficio) within one year from the effective date of this decree.

Readmission in the case of employees of other administrations, however, will take place upon application of the interested party.

ART. 5. — For the purpose of age limits fixed or to be fixed in respect of competitive examinations of any kind, and candidates already affected by the racial laws, no account shall be taken of the lapse of time between the 5th of September 1938 and the expiration of 6 months after the coming into operation of the present decree.

ART. 6. — Upon request of interested parties and by act of the Minister of National Education any examination passed, within the period beginning on the 5th of Sept. 1938 and ending 6 months after the conclusion of peace, in foreign schools by Italian citizens who were affected by racial laws, will be considered valid for the purpose of obtaining degrees in Italian schools of every grade in such subjects as the Ministry of National Education will in his sole discretion determine.

With respect to the other subjects, the applicant will be admitted to take additional examinations in Italian schools.

Wherever there are age limits, the period lapsed between the 5th of Sept. 1938 and 6 months after the effective date of this decree will not be computed.

— TRANSITORY AND EXECUTORY PROVISIONS. —

ART. 7. — All penal proceedings now pending for violation of the racial laws are quashed. Sentences already passed on a conviction after trial in respect of the aforesaid violations shall be of no further juridical effect.

Record cards concerning the said sentences shall not be compiled; those already compiled shall be struck out of the interested party's judicial record within one month from the effective date of the present decree.

ART. 8. — The Chief of Government is authorized to issue by his own decrees, after hearing the Ministers of Justice and Pardon, and of Finance, any complementary consolidating and regulatory rules for the enforcement of the present decree which becomes operative on the day of its publication in the Official Gazette.

The present decree shall be laid before Parliament to be converted into law.

The Chief of Government is authorized to present the appropriate bill.

We order whomever it may concern to obey the present decree, and cause it to be obeyed as a law of the land.

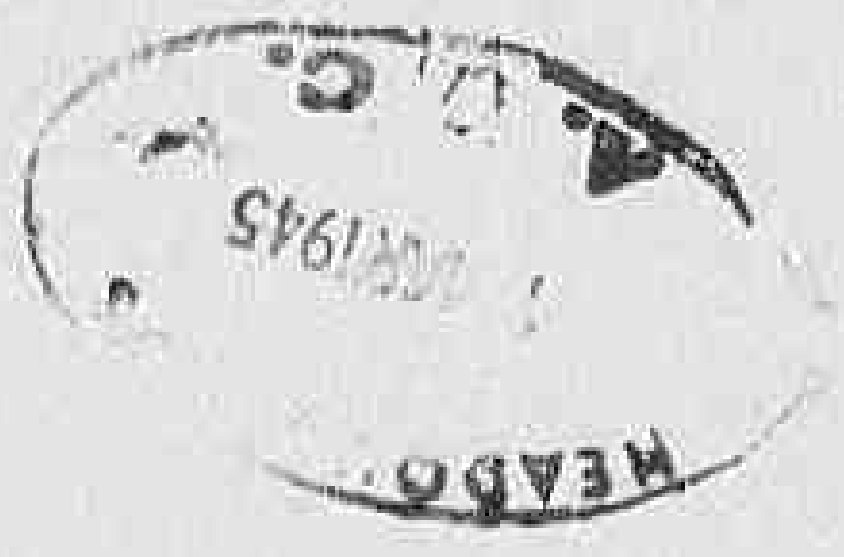

1. Reference is made to your letter 6/5.B/CA of 11 February 45, the contents of which have been duly noted. It is not felt however that the abolition of General Order 26 and its substitution by an Italian Decree meets the future needs of military government with the Armies for the reasons set out below.

2. The collection of grain stocks and the publication and enforcement of laws and orders pertaining thereto is a prime concern of Army A.M.G. in all phases. During the 1944 campaign the spearhead C.A.O. was able on the first day of entry into any commune where life was at all normal to post General Order 26, which explained to all concerned in the commune the regulations about grain collection, before it was physically possible for Italian laws to be implemented.

3. Under the new arrangement implied by the terms of your letter there will be no means of disseminating the amassing regulations to the rural population except the slow process by which other Italian law is implemented. This process involves the following steps after a commune is liberated.

- a. The capture of the Provincial Capital.
- b. The establishment of an Italian Provincial Administration and the appointment of a Prefect.
- c. The handing of the Gazzetta Ufficiale to the Prefect in the provincial capital.
- d. The dissemination of the Gazzetta from the provincial capital to the communes.
- e. The publication of the contents of the Gazzetta to the inhabitants of the commune.

In the case of rural and mountainous communes, with communications interrupted by the normal aftermath of battle, this process will take a considerable time, to be measured in weeks rather than days, however swift the pace of an advance.

4. In the opinion of this Headquarters such a process would be most unsatisfactory for achieving efficient administration in the event of a new advance.

5. It is therefore most strongly requested that a new General Order be prepared for posting by spearhead C.A.Os on first entry into newly-liberated territory, embodying the main provisions of Decree No. 22. The posting of such a General Order would in no way prejudice the effectiveness of the decree at such time as it is physically possible to bring its provisions to the notice of farmers and other interested parties.

6. It is further requested that an early reply be sent whether this request is being acted upon by H.Q. Allied Commission.

1. In reply to your letter Ref 6/5B/AS dated 8th November 1944, the Ministerial Decree of 7 September 1944 is included in the bulk of Italian legislation which is now being implemented in Lucca and Pistoia Provinces under the authority contained in a letter from this Headquarters dated 6th November 1944, a copy of which has been sent to H.Q., Allied Commission. The Decree has already been implemented in the Provinces of Florence and Pisa under the same procedure.

2. Paragraph 4 of the Agricultural Sub-Commission's letter of 5th November is incorrect as no such "plan" was ever proposed by this Division. It is, however, understood that the Agricultural Officer of this Headquarters had a verbal discussion with the Provincial Commissioner and the Prefect of Pistoia as to the possibility of using a stock of Orders prepared (improperly) by UPSEA to make known the contents of the Decree throughout the Province instead of having a fresh print made over the Prefect's signature, and this has apparently led to some confusion in the minds of the Agricultural Sub-Commission. So far as 'implementation' is concerned, the normal procedure has been followed.

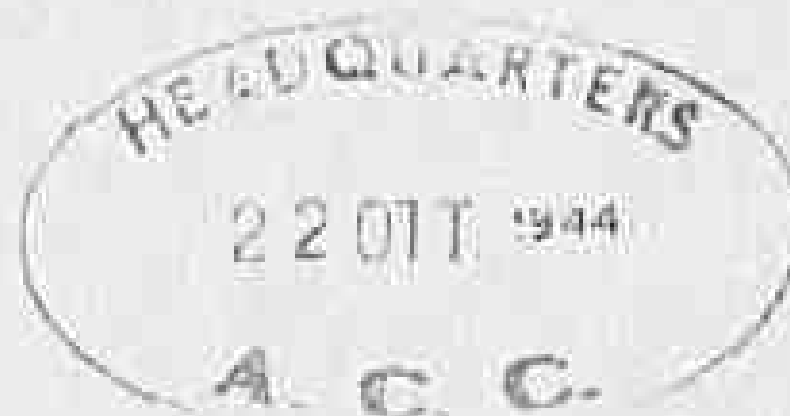

1. When visiting the Provincial Commissioner of Pistoia on Tuesday he showed me a copy of an order issued in his Province by the local director of U.P.S.E.A. as he was doubtful about its legality. I attach a copy of the notice.

2. I pointed out to him that it referred to a ministerial decree dated 7 Sept '41 which was not yet in operation in his Province and that therefore the poster was certainly of doubtful validity. I informed him that on the other hand the Agriculture Sub-Commission worked so closely with the Italian Government that this poster might well be in accordance with directives agreed between them and that I would refer the matter to you.

3. Will you please investigate the matter seeking such local legal advice from the Legal Sub-Commission as you may deem proper and let the Provincial Commissioner know whether he should permit this order to continue or not.

1. The second paragraph of the preamble to Proclamation No. 1 reads as follows:

"Each of this territory has already been restored to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government and it is the intention that all territory freed from German domination shall be restored as soon as possible, to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government."

2. Exception has been taken to the use of the word "all" in the second line as possibly inferring an intention to restore all Italian territory recovered from the Germans, whereas more recent public statements have thrown some doubt on this as to some of the territory in the northeast.

3. This preamble was prepared by this sub-commission and approved by the Political Section before the proclamation was signed in the revised form.

4. I understand that Proclamation No. 1 has been printed--40,000 copies--but not distributed. These copies are ready for shipment now.

5. If the word "all" were blocked out entirely or if there were a complete reprinting and the word "additional" were substituted for "all", the question would be answered. Of course the Italian corresponding words would have to be dealt with in the same way.

6. Whether or not the posting of the proclamation with the word "all" contained would give rise to political repercussions, I could not say. Certainly it would have no legal force at all as the word is used in a clause expressing intention only, even if a proclamation could be considered as having any legal effect in a matter of this kind.

7. Please advise me if any change is to be made.

2. Le direttive riguardanti l'istituzione del Governo Militare ed i particolari delle azioni dichiarate reato sono comunicati al popolo a mezzo di Proclami, Ordini Generali ed Avvisi, che, come vedrete, sono affissi in luoghi pubblici.
3. E' IL DOVERE DI TUTTE LE FORZE DEL SISTEMA DI POLIZIA CIVILE ITALIANA DI FAR SI' CHE LE PRESCRIZIONI DEI PROCLAMI, ORDINI GENERALI ED AVVISI SIANO OBBEDITI DAL POPOLO.
4. E' UGUALMENTE LORO DOVERE DI ARRESTARE IMMEDIATAMENTE, SENZA ATTENDERE ORDINE SPECIFICO DI FARLO, QUALUNQUE PERSONA CHE NON OBBEDISCE A QUESTE PRESCRIZIONI O CHE COMMETTE QUALCUNA DELLE AZIONI DICHIARATE REATO.
5. Non è sufficiente che essi arrestino i contravventori che vengono denunciati a loro, ma essi stessi devono prendere provvedimenti attivi per assicurare obbedienza alla legge militare alleata ed alla legge italiana.
6. Affinche queste prescrizioni possano essere bene assimilate e studiate frequentemente, una copia di ogni Proclama, Ordine Generale ed Avviso sarà affissa nell'interno di ogni caserma o stazione occupata da forze della polizia civile italiana.
7. Gli Ufficiali e Sott'ufficiali sono in ogni tempo responsabili che i loro subordinati abbiano buona conoscenza delle prescrizioni dei Proclami, Ordini Generali ed Avvisi e che facciano conscienziosamente il loro dovere.
8. Trascuranza dei doveri da parte di qualsiasi membro delle forze di polizia civile costituisce un grave reato disciplinare e deve essere trattato come tale.

ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT EIGHTH ARMY

To the Italian Civil Police Agencies.

1. In order to preserve law and order and to provide for the safety and welfare both of the Allied troops and the people of Italy, Military Government is established and certain offences declared.
2. Directions as to the establishing of Military Government and particulars of the declared offences are communicated to the people in Proclamations, General Orders and Notices which, as you will see, are posted in public places.
3. IT IS THE DUTY OF ALL AGENCIES IN THE ITALIAN CIVIL POLICE SYSTEM TO ENSURE THAT THE PROVISIONS OF PROCLAMATIONS, GENERAL ORDERS AND NOTICES ARE OBEYED BY THE PEOPLE.
4. IT IS EQUALLY THEIR DUTY TO ARREST IMMEDIATELY WITHOUT WAITING TO BE TOLD TO DO SO, ANY PERSON WHO FAILS TO OBEY THOSE PROVISIONS OR COMMITS ANY OF THE DECLARED OFFENCES.
5. It is not sufficient for them merely to arrest offenders who are brought to their attention, but they must themselves take active steps to ensure that the Allied Military Law and the Italian Law is not being broken.
6. In order that these provisions may be made thoroughly familiar and frequently studied, a copy of all Proclamations, General Orders and Notices will be posted inside each Caserma or other Station occupied by all Agencies in the Civil Police system.
7. Officers and non-commissioned Officers will be held responsible at all times for ensuring that their subordinates are familiar with the provisions of the Proclamations, General Orders and Notices, and conscientiously perform their duties.
8. Neglect of duty on the part of any member of the Civil Police Agencies is a serious disciplinary offence and must be dealt with accordingly.

- 1 The instructions contained in AMCOT/4007/L of 18 Oct 43 issued by AMG HQ Sicily, are hereby cancelled and the following substituted.
- 2 a The Sub-Commission wishing to originate a Proclamation or General Order will first consult by memorandum with RCMG Sec through the Vice-President of its Section.
 - b After agreement on the rough outline has been reached the originating Sub-Commission will first co-ordinate with all other interested Sub Comsns and then submit requirements in writing to Legal Sub Comsn for drafting.
 - c Legal Sub Comsn will return draft to originating Sub Comsn. Any subsequent revision will be agreed with Legal Sub Comsn, who will certify final draft.
 - d Originating Sub Comsn will submit the certified final draft to C.C.A.O. for signature by the Military Governor in the case of a Proclamation and for the C.C.A.O.'s signature in the case of a General Order.
 - e Signed Proclamation or Order will be passed to the Archivist for safe custody, a copy certified by the originating Sub Comsn being sent to the Printing Officer, HQ ACC.
 - f The Printing Officer will obtain galley proofs and submit them to Legal Sub Comsn who will check until accurate proof received. Legal Sub Comsn passes back final proof duly certified as ready for printing.
 - g The Printing Officer will ascertain from Civil Affairs Branch of RCMG Section the number of copies to be printed, arrange for the printing and report to Civil Affairs Branch when printing is completed.
 - h Publication of Proclamation or Order will be effected under the instructions of RCMG Sec by means of Executive Memorandum, after consultation with the originating Sub Comsn.
 - i Actual posting of Proclamation or Order will be the responsibility of the Regional Commissioner or SCLO of the formation concerned through such channels as he may decide. Officers of the Public Safety Division will normally be used.
- 3 Italian translations of Proclamations or Orders will be provided by the Information Division of Civil Affairs Branch to the Printing Officer who will request them as soon as he receives the English text for printing (para 2 e above). The Italian translations will then follow the same procedure as outlined in 2 f - i above.
- 4 One printed or stencilled copy of the Proclamation or Order will be certified by the Printing Officer and filed with the signed copy by the Archivist. HQ ACC.

- 5 Preparatory documents will be kept by the originating Sub Comsn, the number and location of the file being notified to RCMG Sec (Civil Affairs Branch). That Section will maintain a register of such files to show number, location, originating Sub Comsn, date of publication, distribution and date, all related to the number and official title of the Proclamation or Order concerned.
