SUBJECT : Proclamation 11 - Photography.
TO : HQ. Allied Commission. ✓
(Attention Chief Commissioner).

1. Numerous requests have reached this HQ. requesting an order be issued repealing or declaring Procl. 11, particularly Art. 2, Sect. 1 thereof, to be no longer applicable or operative in Naples Commune.
2. It has been contended by professional photographers and their supporters that Procl. 11 has an adverse effect upon the practice of their profession and consequently has limited their earning power, thereby causing difficult economic conditions to their respective families.
3. A study and investigation of this matter reveals that Procl. 11 has apparently served its purpose but that at present it constitutes a superfluous and unnecessary restriction upon the normal activities of the citizens of Naples Commune. This proclamation does not apply anywhere in Italian Government Territory wherein there would be as much or as little need, as in Naples Commune, for such prohibition as prescribed in Procl. 11. Such discrimination, with respect to photography appears to be unwarranted at this time.
4. Moreover there is a wide disregard of the terms of said proclamation and many persons, in most cases non professional photographers, are profiting at the expense of law-abiding professional photographers. There is no desire on the part of the police, nor is it simple and practicable for them to enforce the terms of the said proclamation. *66* *80*

5. As to the Port area and military installations, including A.M.G. Courts, there is sufficient internal military control as well as instructions and orders from higher authorities, to prevent any unlawful photographing, irrespective of Procl. 11.
6. Accordingly, it is requested that Procl. 11 be repealed or declared inoperative in Naples Commune or that authority be given this HQ. to effect such repeal.

GENERAL ORDER NO. 45

MODIFICATION OF POLICE AND SECURITY REGULATIONS

I, ELLERY WHEELER STONE, Rear Admiral, United States Naval Reserve, Chief Civil Affairs Officer, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I
RADIO RECEIVING SETS

Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person shall be required to declare the possession of any radio or wireless receiving set, or of any equipment, part, accessory or material used in connection with wireless reception, or of any private telephone wire or telegraph wire, or of any carrier pigeon. Possession of such items without declaration may lawfully be had until further notice of the Allied Military Government.

ARTICLE II
PHOTOGRAPHY

1) Permission is hereby granted for the taking of photographs and the developing and printing of photographic films and plates save and except that it is expressly forbidden to take any photograph whether by still or cine or other type of camera of:

a) any Naval, Military or Air Force installation or any equipment of the Allied Forces; or

b) any vessel of war or any vessel engaged in the transportation of supplies or personnel.

2) Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person shall be required to declare the ownership or possession of any camera, telescope binoculars or photographic supplies.

ARTICLE III
PRINTED MATTER

Permission is hereby granted for the importation into and exportation out of Occupied Territory of newspapers, magazines, books and other printed matter.

ARTICLE IV
BLACKOUT

Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, the existing laws and regulations relating to "Blackout" are hereby suspended.

ARTICLE V

This Order applies to all territory subject to Allied Military Government except the Provinces of POLA, FIUME, TRIESTE, GORIZIA and UDINE.

ARTICLE VI

This Order shall come into effect in any province or part thereof on the date of its first posting therein.
