4. Russian officers are reporting 15 ARMY GROUP 1700 hrs 24 May. Tours commence on 25 May.

5. Request 5 ARMY despatch LOS to report A Branch 15 ARMY GROUP 1100 hrs 24 May to arrange itinerary. Presume 5 ARMY will arrange with DISTWO for attendance of LO if required to be provided by DISTWO. It would be useful if 8TH ARMY LO could also attend this meeting but if not able to do so this Hq will signal 8TH ARMY date time and place for take over by them from 5 ARMY of Russian officers for VENICE.

6. On receipt advice numbers of LOS involved will arrange accommodation FLORENCE night 24/25.

SUBJECT: UI/Security Instruction (AUSTRIA) No. 5 -
The Security Control of Displaced Persons in AUSTRIA

- 7 MAY 1945

TO: All Concerned

1. Period Covered. The period covered is that of active operations and the following static period before the assumption of responsibility by the Control Commission/Council.

2. Considerations.

a. The principal displaced persons security problem for the Allied Forces, during the period of active operations, is the infiltration of enemy agents through the Allied lines in the guise of displaced persons. During this period the screening of displaced persons will be the responsibility of Counter Intelligence staffs under present arrangements and Counter Intelligence staffs will be responsible for the necessary measures.

b. During the second period the main security problem will be the prevention of the escape of persons on the Counter Intelligence Wanted List and war criminals posing as displaced persons. All other security problems relating to Allied Displaced Persons will be the responsibility of the respective Allied National authorities. Counter Intelligence personnel will render assistance where necessary.

c. The paramount consideration is the speedy repatriation of Allied Nationals through assembly centres. It is, therefore, the policy of the Supreme Allied Commander that the detailed Security Control of Allied displaced persons should be carried out in the main at the reception centres in their own countries.

3. Procedure at the Assembly Centres for Allied National Displaced Persons

a. Registration

(1) Allied Force Registration Record (DF2) will be completed in duplicate in respect of each displaced person by a Registrar, where possible of his own nationality.

(2) A copy of the Assembly Centre Registration Card (DF3) - which is compiled from the DF2 - will be submitted by the Assembly Centre Director to the UI Travel Control Section at Army/Allied Commission Headquarters in respect of each displaced person who has been registered.

b. Verification

- (1) It will be the responsibility of the appropriate Allied Liaison Officer for repatriation, using the L&S and any additional information he can obtain to verify the nationality claimed by the displaced person. Any inconsistencies in a displaced person's statements will be reported to the Allied Liaison Officer for further investigation. The Allied Liaison Officer will immediately notify the Assembly Centre Director in any case where he has doubts about the bona fides of a displaced person.
- (2) In order to reduce the numbers of enemy or ex-enemy displaced persons who are subsequently discovered at reception centres in Allied countries and are thereby required to be returned to detention camps in GUSTRIA, Assembly Centre Directors will obtain local security clearance by the submission of a complete national roll to the local CI representative for endorsement before a given group leaves an Assembly Centre for a destination outside GUSTRIA. This check to be made against Wanted Persons Lists should be left as late as conveniently possible before departure, in order that full advantage may be taken of all verification of bona fides previously carried out by the Allied Liaison Officer concerned.

c. Disposition of Suspects (Detention). The following categories will be reported as such by the Centre Director to the appropriate military Headquarters:

- (1) Those found to be enemy, or ex-enemy nationals. The military commander will make arrangements for their removal to detention camps and for the safeguarding of any documentary evidence.
- (2) Displaced persons suspected on strong prima facie evidence of active collaboration with the enemy or of anti-Allied activities or of the assumption of a false nationality or identity. The military commander will decide whether arrangements shall be made for their removal from the centre or arrange for supervision and detention until such time as they can be handed over to the appropriate Allied authorities, who will be responsible for the method of repatriation and necessary security measures in each case under the supervision of counter intelligence personnel.

d. Disposition of Suspects (Repatriation). If there are grounds for suspicion against a displaced person and it is established that he does not come under either category (1) or (2) above, the letter "S" will be placed by the Allied Liaison Officer in the upper right hand corner of the L&S card and after his name on all copies of the national roll which are in possession of the Group leader. Brief particulars of the reason for suspicion will also be entered in

space 24 of the D-2 card. He will then be evacuated in the normal manner for ultimate disposition at the reception centre in the Allied country concerned.

e. Doubtful Cases. Assembly centre directors may request the assistance of counter intelligence personnel (including any personnel who may be made available from the Allied Security Services) to advise in difficult cases. They will, however, avoid burdening military commanders with cases of minor importance.

f. Special Cases. US, British and British Commonwealth (including British Indian) Nationals, and neutrals and stateless persons will be dealt with in accordance with instructions issued by this headquarters.

4. Procedure at Assembly Centres for Enemy and Ex-enemy Displaced persons

a. Whenever possible this category of displaced persons will be billeted on the Austrian population. Where necessary, military commanders will require the Austrian authorities to organize assembly centres for them, which may be established as detention camps.

b. Military commanders will supervise the Austrian authorities in the registration of these persons.

c. Security screening of these categories and the necessary security measures will be the responsibility of military commanders and will be carried out by counter intelligence personnel in conjunction with Public Safety Officers. War criminals and those on the counter intelligence wanted list will be removed to detention camps.

5. Procedure at Reception Centres in Allied Countries

a. The Allied security services will be responsible for all security measures undertaken at the reception centres in the Allied country concerned, including:

- (1) Interrogation of suspects and wanted persons
- (2) Comparison of lists of displaced persons arriving at reception centres with lists of wanted persons and suspects
- (3) The collecting for ownership of letters and other documents carried by displaced persons.

b. The Allied Security service of the nation concerned will be responsible for the final disposition of suspects and wanted persons. Any enemy nationals who have been overlooked and are discovered at this stage will be returned to be dealt with as laid down in paragraph 3 c (1).

6. Frontier Control

a. In the case of displaced persons arriving at frontiers under controlled registration procedure, the Group Leader of each party will surrender one copy of the complete nominal roll in respect of his group to the US or British

4. Displaced persons arriving at frontiers without proper documentation will be sent to the nearest assembly centre for processing after examination by counter-intelligence personnel.

TO : A.C. P.S.F. 3/C Rome

It is of great interest to this Command to regain immediate possession of the papers and material which were transported from this General Command in Rome to Brescia after the Armistice on the orders of the pseudo Republican Government.

As this material is of particular importance in defining the position of many CC.RR. Officers and would throw light on the happenings which lead to the deportation of Carabinieri to Germany, I should very much like to send to Brescia an Officer and an NCO, charged by me to take possession of this material before it is lost.

To this end I would send Captain FIORE Mario and Senior Maresciallo PALIMBI Giulio, who would both, for the duration of their mission, be attached to the Organising Nucleo for Lombardy.

I ask for authorisation.

SUBJECT : Royal Finance Guard General Command Mission to
Brescia

TO : Colonel Chapman, P.S. S/C A.C. Rome

As it is known, the pseudo Fascist Government established at Brescia the Hqs of the Republican Finance Guard, transferring from Rome all the accountancy and administrative files, a part of the benevolent funds, part of the furniture, various office fixtures, confidential documents, etc., which were previously at this Hqs.

As I had occasion to point out yesterday to Colonel Chapman, when speaking to him, I hold it to be absolutely necessary that, as soon as the city of Brescia is liberated, two officers and an administrative functionary of this Command should immediately proceed to Brescia to trace and take possession of the funds, material and documents above-mentioned, and particularly the officers confidential records, in order to avoid loss, destruction and thefts which would hinder the definite and complete reorganization of the functioning of this General Command.

The task which these Officers and the functionary - all three persons in my complete trust - would have to perform would not take long and would terminate with the transfer to Rome of whatever was recovered

In order to go to the North and to come back to Rome the party will travel in a truck furnished by this Command together with two men of the Corps, one as driver and the other one as mechanic.

In giving here below the names of the personnel in question I ask for a favorable decision in this regard:-

SUBJECT: Visits of Russian Officers to Army Areas
and Prisoner of War Camps.

TO : Head of the Russian Military Mission,
130, Via Nomentana,
ROME.

1. The Supreme Allied Commander directs me to inform you that he has reviewed the existing arrangements for visits by Russian officers to 5th and 8th Army Areas and Prisoner of War Camps.

2. The Supreme Allied Commander has decided that all previous arrangements (including those set out in letters AG 091.112/480 A-0 of 30 March 1945 and CR/3491/2/G-1(Er) of 31 March 1945, addressed directly to the Russian Military Mission, copies of which are attached for your information) be superseded and that the following procedure be complied with in future:

- (a) No Russian officer is to enter 5th or 8th Army Areas or any Prisoner of War Camp without the written permission of Allied Force Headquarters.

CONTROL OF MOVEMENT - I.A.P. SUBJECT.

With reference to your 17423/S/1367/Cell dated 27th December 1944 and 1608/Cell dated 5th January 1945, herewith copy of latest memorandum 40/17 dated 30th December 1944, issued by M.M.I.A. on the above subject.

CONTINUED

No leave will be granted to visit MARITIMA until further instructions are issued, but arrangements are being made to cover leave to this Island, and particulars will be sent to you shortly.

7. Travel North of the Army Security Control Line for duty is permissible as laid down in Paragraph 11 of Executive Circular No. 77 dated 31st August, but all, repeat all, passes for duty journeys must be submitted to this H. O. for counter signature by this Sub-Commission. In this connection it is once again pointed out that these are only to be submitted and will only be authorised for important missions which will directly benefit the Allied war effort, and no passes will be authorised for any unofficial reasons whatsoever.

MILITARY TRAVEL - HIGH PRIORITY.

He will enter in the remarks column any relevant information available locally, and for a journey to a country which requires a visa he will state whether or not the applicant has obtained a visa. He will add his own domestic or communication to any to appropriate.
6. He will then attach the certificate of presence of the Officer of the form will counter-sign it, and send this office, with the form to HQ ACOM (for attention Public Safety Sub-Committee).
7. In the following cases the application forms will be prepared and forwarded as stated, instead of as above:

 - (b) Members of the Italian Armed Forces; by the Ministry concerned to the appropriate Independent Sub-Committee.

He will enter in the remarks column any relevant information available locally, and for a journey to a country which requires a visa he will state whether or not the applicant has obtained a visa. He will add his own comments or recommendations, if any, he deems fit.

6. He will also obtain the endorsement of P88/215 and on return of the form will countersign it, and his official stamp and signature, the form to HQ AFHQ (for attached Public Service Sub-Commission).

VISITS TO SEVENTH ARMY
AND FRENCH ARMY "B"

1. Visits to Southern FRANCE, because of the nature of operations and lack of accommodations, must be kept to a minimum and be confined to visits of an operational nature.
2. The following policy will govern visits to the Seventh Army:
 - a. Staff sections of this headquarters desiring to send officers to visit Seventh Army will notify the Seventh Army of the officer's visit prior to his departure. Concurrence of G-3, this headquarters, will be obtained before any officer departs for Seventh Army.
 - b. Subordinate headquarters (AAI, SOS NATOUSA, Fifth Army, etc.) desiring to send officers to visit Seventh Army will first obtain concurrence of this headquarters to the proposed visit. G-3 will be responsible to screen the requests and obtain concurrence of Seventh Army.
3. Requests originating in North Africa for the transportation of French personnel to Army "B" will be made in Algiers to MADIST (G-3L); requests originating with French personnel in Italy will be made to G-3, this headquarters, through the Liaison Section, AFHQ.
4. Individual officers will be in the possession of regular travel orders.
5. The above will not apply to nor be construed to prevent visits of officers to Base Section or SOS activities when established in Southern FRANCE, nor to air force or naval officers visiting naval or air installations in Southern FRANCE, nor to members of Advance Detachment, Allied Force Headquarters.
