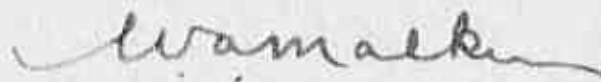

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED CIVIL AFFAIRS COURSE

1. It is the purpose of the Commission to give a brief course of instruction to several small groups of American officers, with a view to their eventual service as civil affairs officers with the armies and with the regions in Venezia and North West Italy.

2. The students will be officers of company grade who have been on combat duty here in Italy. They have been chosen not because of knowledge of any of the various specialties useful in military government but because of their fitness to serve as civil affairs officers in that echelon of military government where direct contact is had with the population and where the officer must deal at first hand with the varied problems that confront CAOs at the communal level. The course is designed to make these officers well-rounded civil affairs officers, competent to deal with immediate and general problems at communal level, with only enough attention being given to higher echelons of military government to enable the officers to understand what they are doing and the relation it bears to the work being done at higher AC levels.

3. Visiting instructors are asked to bear in mind the fact that none of these students has ever served in AE or AC, and that it will not be possible, in a two-week's period, for student officers to do more than grasp some of the fundamental principles of the problems of military government. They must get a glimpse into every aspect of civil affairs work. Experienced AC officers occupying the highest positions in AICO have been asked to make their contribution. It should be realized that too much detail will serve only to confuse these newcomers. Only enough background and detail is desired as is necessary to high-light and delineate closely those aspects of the work that have significance at communal levels.
