SUBJECT: Documentation for entry into Switzerland.

TO : All Concerned.

Letter, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 16 August 1945 is rescinded and the following substituted:

owing to large numbers of military personnel arriving at the Swiss frontier without proper documentation and desiring to visit Switzerland, the following information covering entry into that country is issued for your information and compliance:

a. BRITISH SERVICE PERSONNEL - Entry of British Service Personnel is allowed to the three categories given below:

- (1) Duty or official business. Prior concurrence is sought from the Swiss Government and will be obtained through G-1(B) this headquarters. The phrase "SWISS CLEARANCE OBTAINED" will be quoted on travel orders.
- (2) Compassionate leave. Personnel authorized to enter Switzerland on compassionate leave must be in possession of a valid British passport and Swiss entry visa.

British passport is obtainable from British Consulates at LONDON, MILAN and GENOA or ATHENS for personnel in Greece.

Swiss visas are obtainable from Swiss Legation Rome.

Full details of compassionate leave are given in G-1(B) letter 34830/A of 12 August.

- (3) Parties of military personnel in transit through Switzerland under the "PASSLOC" scheme. Parties of these parties are not permitted to do so while travelling through the country.

b. UNITED STATES SERVICE PERSONNEL - Entry of United States Service personnel is divided into three (3) categories: (Special Service (FOUSA, Bulletin Number 17, contains full particulars of these categories).

- (1) Duty or official business requiring advance clearance with the Swiss Government which will be obtained through this headquarters. Travel orders must include the phrase "SWISS CLEARANCE OBTAINED."
- (2) Organized seven-day conducted tours under ITOWSA orders. Individual members may not leave the tour party at any time during stay in Switzerland.
- (3) United States personnel are permitted to enter Switzerland for the purpose of visiting blood relatives. Procedure is the same as for conducted tours except that ITOWSA orders will specify name, address, and relationship of person to be visited, and include phrase "SWISS CLEARANCE OBTAINED."

c. CIVILIANS:

- (1) Swiss Nationals may enter on production of valid passport.
- (2) Other Nationalities require valid National passport with Swiss entry visas obtainable from Swiss Legation, Rome.

SUBJECT: Travel to and from AUSTRIA - Phasing.

1. Reference ARHQ CI/Security Instruction No 3, AC. 371.2/173
GSI-0 of 2 May, 1945 and ARHQ letter AC. 371.2/173, GSI-0 of 16 June 1945,
which was sent out by this office as Airport and Frontier Control Memor-
andum No 353.

2. It has been decided that the Second-Phase of travel to and
from the British and American Zones of AUSTRIA shall open on 16 July 1945.
It is NOT proposed to announce this fact to the public, but the measures
described in para 2 of CI/Security Instruction No 3 will come into effect
from that date, with certain slight alterations as given in para 3 below.

3. These alterations will be:-

a. Reference para 2d (2) of the Instruction.

Local Military Exit Permits (yellow with green diagonal
band) will be issued by this office until the quadra-
partite control of travel is functioning, when the Military
Exit Permit (blue with red diagonal band) will be taken
into use.

b. Reference para 2d (3)(c) of the Instruction.

The EP2 card is not being used in AUSTRIA. This sub-para
will therefore be deleted.

c. Reference para 2d 4 of the Instruction.

This only applies to British, British Commonwealth (incl
Indian) and American ex-PM. Other ex-PM are allowed to

Local Military Exit Permits (yellow with green diagonal band) will be issued by this office until the quadripartite control of travel is functioning, when the Military Exit Permit (blue with red diagonal band) will be taken into use.

B. Reference para 2d (3)(c) of the Instruction.

The DP2 card is not being used in AUSTRIA. This sub-para will therefore be deleted.

C. Reference para 2d 4 of the Instruction.

This only applies to British, British Commonwealth (incl Indian) and American ex-PW. Other ex-PW are allowed to leave AUSTRIA undocumented provided that they are now in formed bodies and that Frontier Controls are reasonably satisfied that they are genuine.

4. Please note that these arrangements do NOT apply to travel to and from JUGOSLAVIA, the frontier to which is still closed.

5. Will all addressees therefore please take with effect from 16 July, 1945, the necessary measures as laid down in CI/Security Instruction No 3.

1. Effective this date Allied Force permits endorsed 'Valid for entry into AUSTRIA' (specimen as Inclosure I) will be required by all persons entering that part of AUSTRIA controlled by SACRED, with the exceptions noted in paragraph 2 below. Travel will be restricted to the minimum essential to the Allied administration of AUSTRIA. Every application will be considered individually.

2. The exceptions are:

- a. Allied Service personnel on duty
- b. Diplomatic and Consular Officials of the United Nations, including United States or British employees of the State Department and Foreign Office.
- c. Crews of Allied aircraft.
- d. British and United States nationals employed and paid by the following governmental agencies:

- (1) UNRRA
- (2) Office of War Information
- (3) Psychological Warfare Branch
- (4) War Shipping Administration
- (5) Ministry of War Transport
- (6) Any of the Service Ministries in the United States or United Kingdom providing they are in possession of United States or British Service Identity Cards, e.g., technicians in possession of AGO cards, who are assigned to this theater.

e. British and United States civilians employed by, and travelling for the following organizations:

- (1) American and British Red Cross

Applicants desiring to proceed from ITALY to AUSTRIA will follow the normal procedure for exit from ITALY.

c. In SWITZERLAND, SPAIN and PORTUGAL:

4. The permit issuing authority will satisfy itself that:
 - a. There is no local security or other objection to the applicant.
 - b. The proposed journey is essential to the Allied administration of AUSTRIA.
5. Allied Force permits may be issued without reference to this Headquarters in the case of officials in the employment of and paid by any of the governments of the United Nations whose journeys appear to be in the interest of the Allied administration of AUSTRIA. Applications for permits for all other categories of travellers shall be referred to this Headquarters.
6. Duplicate copy of the application form will be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this Headquarters in the case of:
 - a. All applications referred.
 - b. All permits granted without reference.
7. Where special information of security or political interest arises in the case of an application, such information should be forwarded with the application.
8. Urgent cases may be dealt with by cable, but application forms should be forwarded in order to complete records of this Headquarters.
9. Persons other than American and British military personnel who are exempted under paragraph 2 above from the requirements of a permit, will be cleared with this Headquarters by cable before despatch. American and British military personnel however, may travel without telegraphic clearance.
10. Every civilian entering Austrian territory must hold a national passport and must comply with the exit permit regulations in force in the territory he is leaving.
11. Unless otherwise ordered permits will be valid for a return journey.
12. Persons, other than the exempted categories, who arrive in AUSTRIA by water, land or air without Allied Force permits are liable to detention and subsequent deportation to the country from which they start their journey.

13. The provisions of this instruction do not apply to the movement of displaced persons in parties authorized by the Displaced Persons Branch in consultation with the appropriate GI staffs.

14. Supplies of forms and permits will be sent under separate cover by this headquarters to the appropriate authority.

SUBJECT: GI/Security Instruction (Austria) No. 3 - Travel to and from Austria

TO: All Concerned

Travel to and from Austria (Zones occupied by American or British Forces) will be severely restricted and regulated in four phases.

1. First Phase - from the date of surrender or occupation of the whole or part of the territory concerned to the date when a skeleton form of GI Travel Control has been established. During this period:

- a. The frontier zone will be occupied by tactical units with the object of "sealing" the borders as they existed at 31 December 1937.
- b. The frontier will be closed to all travellers (including Kleiner Grenzverkehr - frontaliere) not forming part of the Allied Forces of occupation.
- c. GI/MI Control personnel will take up posts on the frontier.
- d. Forward GI Travel Control Office will be set up at HQ Occupying Force in the American and British Zones respectively, and machinery for occupation and disposition of applications for authorization to cross the frontier will be prepared.

e. Travel to Austria will only be permitted to the following:

- (1) US and British military personnel on duty. When travelling as individuals, military personnel must be in possession of regular travel orders.
- (2) Holders of Allied Force Permits endorsed "Valid for entry to Austria only" and issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, or other authority designated by that office. Allied Force Permits at this stage will be issued "for entry only" and in exceptional circumstances are present and to individuals whose proposed journey is of immediate tactical importance.

f. Travel from Austria will only be permitted to the following:

- (1) US and British military personnel on duty. When travelling as individuals they must be in possession of regular travel orders.

- (2) Persons travelling under escort and/or in possession of a Travel Authority issued by CI/OAI(b), Fifth or Eighth Armies.
- (3) Allied ex-prisoners of war evacuated to Italy by air and controlled under G-1 (A) and G-1 (B) arrangements.
- (4) Russian citizens moved under special arrangements.

2. Legend Phase - after skeleton CI Travel Control is operating. Separate American and British CI Travel Control Offices with Fifth and Eighth Armies will move to Vienna as soon as operationally possible, having due regard to the status of the remainder of the CI organization. During this period:

a. Forward CI Travel Control Offices at Fifth and Eighth Armies' headquarters, respectively, will begin to operate and the frontier will be opened to limited traffic.

b. Frontier Guards drawn from occupational troops will:

- (1) Prevent all persons and goods not forming part of the Allied Forces from entering or leaving Austria except at authorized Frontier Control Posts.
- (2) Arrest and hand over to the nearest CI Frontier Post for examination and detention all unauthorized persons detected crossing or attempting to cross the Austrian Frontier.

c. Travel to Austria will be extended to:

d. Travel from Austria will be extended to:

- (1) Holders of JCS and AF Permits endorsed for a return journey.
- (2) Holders of Military Exit Permits issued by Forward CI Travel Control.
- (3) Displaced Persons accumulated and moved under G-5 arrangements. Each group will carry:

- (a) 1 copy of DF 1 (Index Card) on each individual
- (b) 1 copy of the nominal roll with each Group leader for delivery to GI Frontier Control at crossing point of exit.
- (c) 1 copy of DF 2 (Registration Card) per individual endorsed with visa of country of destination. These will be held by the group leader in respect of each member of his party.
- (4) Allied ex-prisoners of war moved under G-1 (A) and G-1 (B) arrangements. Each (unless evacuated by air under special A.C.F. orders) will hold a P-1 Identity Card issued by a P-1 Contact Officer or his representative.
- (5) Such other categories as may be notified by forward GI Travel Control.

3. Third Phase - after GI Travel Control is fully established. This phase coincides broadly with the remainder of the period of control by this headquarters. During this period:

a. Frontier Guards will continue to operate as before.

b. Personnel engaged on frontier and airport control will confine themselves to travel security duties and operate under the direct command of the Travel Control Sections at Allied Commission/Army Headquarters British and US elements, respectively. Their duties, undertaken in Phase Two where possible, will include:

- (1) Manning of frontier and airport control posts.
- (2) Examination of all travellers and enforcement at the frontier or airports of travel regulations and instructions.
- (3) Making preliminary investigations into and interrogations of doubtful and undocumented travellers and persons detected attempting to cross the frontier or to leave or enter Austria illicitly by air.
- (4) Insuring suspects are sent to detention camps for further investigation.
- (5) Security Control of the movement over the Austrian border of displaced persons and Allied ex-prisoners of war.
- (6) At frontier posts making local arrangements to deal with Kleiner Grenzverkehr (borderers).
- (7) Organizing security patrols on unauthorized routes in conjunction with the local military commander.

(C) Advise the local military commander on the disposition of Frontier guards.

c. Detailed instructions covering military entry and exit, passport procedure will be issued. Civilian traffic will be kept to a minimum compatible with the interests of the Allied Administration of Austria.

4. Fourth Phase - From the time when this Headquarters starts to hand over to the Control Commission. During this period, conditions will be as in the Third Phase, except that:

a. If deemed desirable, the categories of persons who may obtain entry and exit permits will be expanded.

b. Personnel of a purged and reorganized Austrian Frontier Control organization should be available to assist in dealing with the increase in traffic.

5. As a matter of travel control procedure, the beginning and ending of each phase will be decided and publicized by the Counter Intelligence Travel Control Organization for Austria.

SUBJECT: CI/Security Instruction (JUSTIA) No. 2
- Vetting/Screening of Allied Employees in JUSTIA.

TO: All Concerned.

1. All holders of public office and all persons, except serving members of the Allied Armed Forces, who are employed directly or indirectly by units, staffs or branches of formations of the Allied Forces, the Military Government, the Allied Control Commission, or associated units or agencies, and whether or not they are paid from public funds, will be subjected to Security/CI enquiry prior to employment. Examples of some of the types of persons included in this Instruction are:

a. Persons the nature of whose work may give them access to information or premises occupied by the Allied Forces, Military Government or Allied Control Administration, eg, contractors, interpreters, mess waiters, clerks, etc.

b. Officials who hold positions in the following grades of the German Civil Service:

The Political Civil Service	(Der Politische Dienst)
The Upper Service	(Der Oberste Dienst)
The Higher Service	(Der Hohe Dienst)

and whose services it is desired to retain. Also officials who are later engaged in corresponding positions.

c. The only permitted exceptions to the above examples are casual or unskilled labourers whose work does not give them access to information or premises occupied by the Allied Forces, the Military Government or the Allied Control Administration. In such cases, the foreman or ganger only will be subjected to Security/CI enquiry and will be held responsible for the bona fides and conduct of the workers under his control.

d. The types mentioned above are neither exhaustive nor mutually exclusive. They are intended to indicate only the type of person who will be submitted to a Security/CI check. Doubtful cases will be referred to the nearest Field Security/CIC Headquarters. 6261

e. When, for urgent reasons, it is desired to employ individuals in essential services, before completion of CI screening, authority must first be obtained from the local FS/CIC who may, in such exceptional cases, authorize employment provisionally pending CI clearance.

2. Procedure.

a. All Allied units or agencies desiring to employ, or to retain in employment, any individual falling into the category outlined in paragraph 1 will make use of the EMPLOYMENT (PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE) FORM (Specimen at appendix 'A') and the EMPLOYMENT CERTIFICATE FORM (Specimen at appendix 'B'), which are obtainable at HQ Public Safety and PS/CIC offices. These will be dealt with as follows:

- (1) Part I of the Questionnaire will be completed by the proposed employee under supervision of the Allied unit or agency concerned.
- (2) Part II, stating clearly the specific nature of the proposed employment, will be completed by an Allied Officer of the unit or agency.
- (3) The name, address and identity card number of the individual and the designation of the unit or agency will be entered on the Employment Certificate.
- (4) The Questionnaire, with the Employment Certificate attached, will then be forwarded to the nearest Public Safety Officer.

b. If no objection is raised by local Security/CI and HQ Public Safety authorities, the unit or agency will in due course receive from the local HQ Public Safety Officer a completed Employment Certificate countersigned and stamped by the local Field Security Section or CIC Detachment. This will be handed to the employee and he retained by him for the duration of his employment. Should his employment be terminated at any time, it is the responsibility of the unit or agency employing him to withdraw the Employment Certificate and return it to the nearest HQ Public Safety Officer without delay, with the notification that the individual's services have been discontinued. Should a change be proposed in the nature of the employment, the Employment Certificate will similarly first be forwarded to the nearest HQ PSF together with details of the proposed new employment. It will be endorsed and returned.

c. Should there be OBJECTION to the employment of an individual, the unit or agency will be obliged to take effect by the HQ PSF. In such cases the individual will in no circumstances be employed. The reason for rejection of the application will be communicated to the person concerned.

3. All units and agencies will bear in mind that the issue of an Employment Certificate countersigned by PSF/CIC does not guarantee the security reliability of the holder. It is an indication that there is no present known objection to his employment in the capacity shown. All employees are subject to immediate dismissal should relevant information concerning them come to light at any time.

1. Letter, this headquarters, AG 371.2/191 GEG-0, dated 19 November 1944, subject: "Evacuation of Personnel from Roumania and Bulgaria", (not to all addressees) is rescinded.

2. Effective this date, Allied Force Permits (Specimen as Inclosure 1) will be required by all persons entering Italy from the Soviet Union, Yugoslavia, Roumania, Bulgaria, Albania and Greece with the exceptions noted in paragraph 3 below.

3. The exceptions are:

a. Diplomatic and consular officials of the United Nations, including United States or British employees of the State Department and Foreign Office.

b. United States and British service personnel travelling on duty.

c. Allied service personnel in forced bodies engaged in operations.

d. Crews of Allied aircraft.

e. British and United States nationals employed and paid by the following governmental agencies:

- (1) USMRA
- (2) Office of War Information
- (3) Psychological Warfare Branch
- (4) War Shipping Administration
- (5) Ministry of War Transport
- (6) Any of the Service Ministries in the United States or United Kingdom providing they are in possession of United States or British Service Identity Cards, e.g. technicians in possession of AGO cards, who are assigned to this theater.

f. British and United States War Correspondents accredited to Allied Force Headquarters

g. Bona fide merchant seamen sailing in Allied or co-belligerent merchant ships who are properly signed on as members of the crew.

10. Persons other than American and British military personnel who are exempted under paragraph 3 above from the requirements of a permit, will be cleared with this headquarters by cable before dispatch. American and British military personnel however, may travel without telegraphic clearance.

11. No part of this procedure absolves the applicant from the necessary passports, documents of identity, visas, exit permits or laissez-passeurs required by the regulations of the country concerned.

12. Persons, other than the exempted categories, who arrive in Italy by sea or air without Allied Force permits are liable to detention and subsequent deportation to the country from which they started their journey.

13. The requirement of permits may be waived from time to time in the case of large parties of displaced persons, but only after prior concurrence of this headquarters.

14. Supplies of forms and permits will be sent under separate cover by this headquarters to the appropriate authorities.

1. This instruction supersedes that of the same number dated 4 February 1944, amended 12 February 1944, which will be destroyed.

2. AFHQ Military Government Section instruction MCS 300.4-4, dated 4 January 1944, as amended, copy of which is attached to PSI Number 700 dated 4 February 1944, has also been superseded and will be destroyed. Attached for information is copy of letter, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/015 GEX-O, subject: "Military Travel Authorizations", dated 7 November 1944, which embodies the present instructions. Reference is made to paragraphs 3 to 13 of this enclosure for information as to conditions and method of issue of Military Travel Authorizations; in particular to paragraph 5, for guidance in the event of your being required to indorse applications.

3. You will permit to travel through your controls to destinations outside Allied-occupied Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) only persons in possession of valid Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, with the exception of persons listed in paragraph 4 below.

4. The exceptions are:

a. Allied service personnel on duty; but not Yugoslav nationals travelling to destinations other than Yugoslavia.

b. Accredited Diplomats and Consular Officials, including United States and British civilians regularly employed by the State Department or Foreign Office, but not:

- (1) Italian nationals.
- (2) Yugoslavs travelling to destinations other than Yugoslavia.

- (2) Allied Force Permits indorsed valid for Italy issued by the Military Permit Office, London, the Allied Control Commission, Romania, the Allied Control Commission, Bulgaria, Supreme Headquarters, American Expeditionary Force Travel Permit Officers at Paris and Brussels, or SHAEF Southern CI Detachment, provided they are not indorsed "for single journey only".
- (3) Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits issued by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Washington provided they are not indorsed "for single journey only".
- (4) Allied Expeditionary Force Permits issued by the Military Permit Office, London for France, providing they are indorsed "valid for Italy" by a SHAEF Travel Permit Officer and are not so indorsed "for single journey only".

5. It is emphasized that a Military Travel Authorization is merely a permit to leave Italy and that it does not authorize the holder to enter any other territory, unless so indorsed by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters. You will not permit travellers to leave Italy if they do not carry also identity documents as specified in the appropriate space (7) of the Military Travel Authorization or

if they have not complied with British or United States visa requirements, in accordance with Port Security Instruction Number 706 dated 22 November 1944.

6. You will withdraw from passengers departing, at time of embarkation, MTA's valid for single journey only where the passenger is proceeding to neutral territory, and you will withdraw from passengers arriving, at time of disembarkation, MTA's for return journey. MTA's so withdrawn will be sent to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, with the relevant Forms SI 3 and SI 4 (passenger lists).

7. In cases of emergency, you may apply by telegram or telephone (Freedom 188 or Freedom 203) to G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, for permission to allow a passenger not in possession of an MTA to leave Italy. In such cases you will be required to make a responsible recommendation, and to provide for record purposes the information called for in the MTA application form. This practice will be confined to cases of extreme emergency in relation to the war effort.

8. Your attention is drawn to Port Security Instruction Number 709, dated 17 December 1944, concerning the Allied Expeditionary Force Permit requirements for persons proceeding from Italy to France.

- 1 AFHQ Admin Memo 55 dated 8 Dec on the subject of Intra Theatre Travel nevertheless contains instructions which apply to travel inside Italy.
- 2 As to this it provides that all subordinate HQs will submit to COS AFHQ the names of all officers desiring to visit on temporary duty places in Italy north of the line FIORENTINO - SINIG - ANCONA (all Incl), the HQ it is desired to visit, the purpose of the visit and the probable duration thereof will also be stated.
- 3 Officers desiring to visit HQ AAI or subordinate formation will obtain AFHQ sanction before approaching AAI for permission to enter Army Areas.
- 4 The memo then proceeds to state that these instructions will not be construed to prohibit travel required by unit personnel in performance of functional duties. This exception is considered to cover the cases of officers proceeding north of the line on actual duty for AG purposes.
