Reference is made signals 1 98 and 1 99.

1. Not advisable for personnel to be detained in ITALY by Italian Army as detention and release by small parties into THROTE area assured only if personnel detained behind wire otherwise would desert. Forced detention by Italian Army would be big propaganda for BELGRADE and only tend to incite these people against Italian Army.

2. If return of these troops to be used for bargaining purposes with BELGRADE suggest plans provide for movement from UNPAT by ship to isolated port where release could be made only on delivery by BELGRADE of equal number of Italians. This would solve problem of disorders which might be created if men traverse or stop anywhere in ITALY.

3. Suggest return of small parties only so that demobilization can be completed by Italians in matter of hours and immediate transport by truck to zone 1419 arranged by 13 COMUS.

4. Screening to eliminate those who do not desire to return to homes should be done in UNPAT and this class then handled as displaced persons.

5. Civilian clothing should be issued before departure from UNPAT in any case

SUBJECT : Repatriates and Displaced Persons Situation in Northern Italy as at 9 September 1945, (last report circulated 2 August 1945).

TO : Those interested.

1. REMAINING PARAGRAPHS.

- (a) GERMANY - To repatriate some 100,000 Italians. Nearly 8 million have already been repatriated from Germany and Austria. At present repatriates are arriving via Brenner at an average of over 6,000 a day at PISCANTINA (VIENNA). Some 2,000 a day through Switzerland (COMO - DOMIGESOLA), some 1,000 a day ex-Austria and Yugoslavia.
- (b) FRANCE - Practically all Italian refugees repatriated. Some 40,000 FRs in Labour Companies still to be dealt with when demobilized.
- (c) RUSSIAN ZONE - Some 23,000 Italians have already arrived in Germany and many of these have reached Italy. Some 12,000 have come through Austria. There is at present prospect of many more.
- (d) YUGOSLAVIA - Some thousands of Italians have arrived via Trieste - many in poor shape and many have had to be hospitalized.
- (e) SOUTHERN ITALY AND IN NORTHERN ITALY - at least 1,000 per week are being moved South from Lombardy. It is hoped to increase this figure shortly.
- (f) OTHER NATIONALS.
- (g) Northern Eastern European.

The bulk have been repatriated - only a few hundred

(b) Poland - Approximately 100,000 Poles have already arrived in Germany and many of them have reached Italy. Some 40,000 Poles in Labour Companies still to be dealt with when demobilized.

(c) Russian Poles - Some 23,000 it is now already arrived in Germany and many of them have reached Italy. Some 15,000 have come through Austria. There is at present prospect of very more.

(d) Yugoslavia - Some thousands of Italians have arrived via Trieste - many in poor shape and many have had to be hospitalized.

(e) Southern Italians in Northern Italy - At least 1,000 per week are being moved South from Lombardy. It is hoped to increase this figure shortly.

(f) Other Nations

(i) Northern Western Europeans

The bulk have been repatriated - only a few hundred remain in camps.

(ii) Greeks - Mediterranean Region

The numbers during repatriation are few - but Greeks are still in transit from Germany.

(iii) Yemen

The total now in "Centres" number some 6,000 - infiltration from Germany and Central Europe still continues but large scale movement, it is hoped, has been finally stopped.

(iv) Dissident Poles - West Germany

The bulk are now housed - the remainder will be housed shortly. The number of Poles who desire to

GO home is growing and is now about 1,000. Transporta-
tion is still in no far unproved.

2. TRANSPORTATION.

(a) RAILROADS - 17 trains per week South during the last few
weeks has enabled the Southern Railroad, coming from
Germany, to be rapidly cleared.

(b) SHIPPING - A broken road - since open for shipping and
crusade etc., problems, all being resolved.

3. ROAD TRUCKS.

After a month of trouble, petrol, tyres, drivers etc. - most
of the above trucks handed over to Civilian Trucking agencies, (with
a first priority to Germany) are now functioning.

4. HOSPITALIZATION.

In addition to the ambulance trains being run into Marano -
a fair number of others have been hospitalised. Even with those
coming from Russia and Yugoslavia the numbers are not nearly so great
as anticipated.

5. FINANCIAL.

Under the Brenner Route fails - all Italian (not to travel)
in Germany should be restricted before 1st October. The numbers from
Russia are still an uncertainty that it is impossible to make a reliable
forecast.

Programme

The programme for movement of Refugees North and Southbound shown at Appendices 'A' and 'B' for period 3 - 9 September '45 has been agreed by G-4 (Mov & In) AFHQ subject to adjustment in the event of any priority Military Movements materialising.

2.

Loading of trains

(a) Normally trains will be made up of 35 Box cars capacity 40 Refugees maximum per Box car total 1400 per train.

(b) In the event of insufficient Box cars being available it has been agreed that open gondolas will have to be utilised.

Provision of Passenger Rolling Stock

(a) Five sets of Passenger Rolling Stock are now in service for movement of Refugees from Bologna, Southbound.

(b) The loading capacity of these trains will be 1400 Refugees maximum.

(c) Passenger Rolling Stock Trains will in future only work from originating point to Naples at which station all

- (e) Train Conducting Personnel of Passenger Rolling Stock Trains should be informed prior to departure that all Refugees will be required to change at Naples for onward movement.

Small craft will continue to call at Genoa and Piombino as available.

Refugees for Sardinia.
Refugees for Sardinia should be instructed to detrain at Civitavecchia for sea lift, reporting to the Manager Italian Refugee Camp Civitavecchia.

1. reamble.

Life in Static Camp life is one of the chief causes of the evil effects of Camp life on the mentality of the inmates.

Therefore strenuous efforts must be directed to ensure that everybody is occupied in some respect.

2. Camp Staff.

(a) Apart from the minimum allied supervising personnel, the Camp Staff so far as possible, should be drawn entirely from the community living in the Camp. Where a community is homogeneous the reward for services rendered to the community should at the most take the form of monthly "pocket money". This may be given in kind, actual cash or credit.

Only when it is necessary to bring in outside personnel should local wage rates apply, and a substantial deduction (viz. at least 2/3rd) be made, if such personnel are fully rationed and accommodated. This does not apply to special appointments such as Doctors, administrative assistants etc. on rates of pay fixed by H.Q., D.P.R.S.C.

(b) A minimum of 2-3 hrs work per day for the community is exchanged for board and lodging should be insisted on from all capable of doing something - either in homogeneous or non homogeneous community.

2. Camp Staff.

(a) Apart from the minimum allied supporting personnel, the Camp Staff as far as possible, should be drawn entirely from the community living in the Camp.

Where a community is homogeneous the reward for services rendered in the community should at the most take the form of monthly "pocket money". This may be given in kind, actual cash or credit.

Only when it is necessary to bring in outside personnel should local wage rates apply, and a substantial deduction (viz. at least 2/3rd) be made, if such personnel are fully qualified and unaccommodated. This does not apply to special appointments such as Doctors, administrative assistants etc. on rates of pay fixed by A.C., I.P.R.S.C.

(b) A minimum of 2-3 hrs work per day for the community in exchange for board and lodging should be insisted on - from all capable of doing something - either in homogeneous or non homogeneous community.

(c) Certain jobs will have to be full time, but the aim should be to employ as many as possible.

(d) The monthly rate of "pocket money" payment in a homogeneous community should in no case exceed 2,000 Lira and that only for 1 or 2 Senior administrators who carry responsibility. Other full time workers from 800 - 1,000 Lira and graded down to 400 - 600 Lira for 1/3rd "blameless" (always remembering 2-3 hrs per day should be "unpaid" in exchange for board and lodging).

(e) In the case of non homogeneous communities the wage paid should be the local rates less 2/3rd for board and lodging.

3. Persons working outside Camp.

In the very exceptional case when a person is permitted to be fed and accommodated in our Centres while working outside, a substantial payment should be required from him - viz. approx. 75 - 100

4. Accommodation.

Per person 36 square feet and 950 cubic feet should be allowed. Every endeavour should be made to give some privacy to families - old tentage - on light frame-work sprayed with enamel or colour wash is reasonably effective.

5. Recreation facilities.

- (a) Facilities should be made by Centre concerned - Housing Council is at liberty to apply to H.C., I.P.H.S.C.
- (b) Beds - wood frame and old insulated telephone wire - made by Centre concerned.

- (d) Heating stoves should be made and installed in community recreation rooms etc.

TO : Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission

1. Programme

The programme for movement of Refugees North and Southbound shown at Appendices 'A' and 'B' for period 13 August to 19 August '45 has been agreed by 3-1 (MOP & Tn) AFHQ subject to adjustment in the event of any priority Military Movements materialising.

2. Loading of Trains

- (a) Normally Trains will be made up 25 Box cars capacity 40 Refugees maximum per box car; total 1000 per train.
- (b) In the event of insufficient Box Cars being available it has been agreed that open gondolas will have to be utilized.

3. Provision of Passenger Rolling Stock

- (a) Five sets of Passenger Rolling Stock are now in service for movement of Refugees from Bologna, Southbound.
- (b) The loading capacity of these trains will be 1000 Refugees maximum.
- (c) Passenger Rolling Stock Trains will in future only work from originating point to Naples at which station all Refugees will be transferred to Box Cars for onward movement.
- (d) Displaced Persons Representative in Bologna should contact AF Transportation Officer, Bologna, Tel. No. Pittsburgh 162, the day prior to departure to confirm type of Rolling Stock being provided.
- (e) Train Conducting Personnel of Passenger Rolling Stock Trains should be informed prior to departure that all Refugees will be required to change at Naples for onward movement.

4. See list by Italian Cruiser 'Geribaldi' Plombino to Messina

Unless instruction are received from AFHQ to the contrary the Italian Cruiser 'Geribaldi' will make one more trip from Plombino, about 14 August before going out of service for one month. Arrangements are being made for two Destroyers to replace the 'Geribaldi' on the Plombino-Messina lift, details will be advised.

This is to place on record the connection of UNRRA with Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, A.C.S. during the last year.

August - September - October 1944.

Initial discussions over taking over Camps etc.

November 1944.

UNRRA nominee for Head of Southern (Italy) Camps arrived and worked with Commander (D.P.R.S.G.) Southern Camps.

December 1944 - February 1945.

Various other members of UNRRA Camp teams arrived and were placed in D.P.R.S.G. Camps.

February - 1st May 1945.

UNRRA managers gradually took over responsibility.

UNRRA officially assumed responsibility for 3 of the Southern Camps. The other 2 Camps housed Dissident Yugoslavs and these are still working well under a Military manager with great help from UNRRA welfare etc. personnel.

UNRRA trucks gradually became available and Military trucks returned. Food is still being entirely supplied from Military Resources. Accommodation stores, blankets etc. are still mainly those handed over by D.P.R.S.C., A.C.

Note:-

(a) Since 1st May UNRRA have been unable to supply either Camp managers or Welfare personnel for Camps at Bari or AVESSA (Naples).
On the other hand UNRRA (through Friends Assistance) have given great help to several Italian Camps, which have been handed over to the Italian Authorities by D.P.R.S.C.

(b) This memo is not written in any critical spirit, as UNHCR and U.P.R.S.C., A.C. have always worked together in a most friendly spirit, but merely as a record of facts - as there is now a hope that UNHCR will assume more responsibilities as regards Displaced Persons Camps in Italy. From the above facts it would appear advisable for UNHCR if possible to utilise some of the DPR personnel who have considerable practical experience in handling Displaced Persons in Italy.

1. We had the pleasure on Thursday 2 August 1945 of a visit from Don Bicchieri who came to see us on your behalf regarding repatriation of Italians into Italy from Germany.
2. As you are no doubt aware a complete system of repatriation has been set up, and meetings are held from time to time to regulate the rate of flow of refugees into Italy, routes and means of transport, food, medical attention and many other necessary adjuncts. The absolute maximum rate of flow is maintained from all parts at all times, and a great effort is being made to complete the repatriation of all Italians in Europe before the winter months.
3. We were a little perturbed, therefore, to learn from Don Bicchieri that repatriation has been going on without our knowledge. You will understand that such repatriation, if allowed to continue, may result in confusing the regular means in existence. The repatriation already given by Fifth Army for repatriation by truck has therefore been withdrawn, and can only be considered in the future when prior application is made to this H.Q.
4. At the same time we fully appreciate the generous help you have all the time extended. We suggested that local help offered will be most readily accepted and directed into the right channels if the local repatriation officer is approached and told in what respect assistance can be given. Should the assistance offered be of a nature covering a wider field of action we shall always be pleased to deal with the matter here. In this way our co-ordinated effort will be applied.
5. We trust that the matter is now clear, and that we shall be

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- (ii) This leaves Groups of Camps spread over North-Central and Northern Italy which are combinations of Camps for Italians and Other Nationals, and it is considered that these should remain under our guidance.
- (iii) Since it is hoped to have all Italians home by 30 September 1945, the Italian Camps should cease to function before those required for Other Nationals.
- (iv) In the circumstances it is considered that as many Camps as can be handed over, have already been handed over.
- (v) The repatriation of those United Nations Nationals who have to be moved by shipping has been delayed due to shortage of shipping. Rail and road repatriations have been relevantly easy.
- Similarly, the evacuation of Displaced Persons to countries other than those of birth, necessitate delays in obtaining acceptance.
- (vi) See para (iv). There are about 4,000 genuine German Displaced Persons in the BOLENO area. Their ultimate disposal is still under discussion.

SUBJECT: Repatriated and Displaced Persons Situation in Northern Italy as at 28 July 1945.

TO : Those interested.

1. PROBLEMS AND SOME REMEDIES

(a) SHARF ZONE. To repatriate more 300,000 Italians from SHARF and 14th Army DISBURS area. Although well over 100,000 Italians have been repatriated in the last month, more have come to light in SHARF area. At present some 4,500 are arriving at VERONA via BIELLER and some 1000 a day via SWITZERLAND. It is hoped to raise the latter figure to at least 2000 a day shortly.

(b) SWITZERLAND. The 38,000 Italians in Switzerland have practically all been repatriated.

(c) FRANCE. A start has been made on the 90,000 Italians in France requiring repatriation. It is hoped to increase this flow.

(d) RUSSIAN ZONE. The number of Italians in the Russian Zone is still unknown. A few have been repatriated.

(e) SOUTHERN ITALY IN SOUTHERN ITALY. Increased numbers have materialized especially in Lombardy region - where the figure of 200,000 has been mentioned - 1000 per week are being accepted. After mid Sept., when the flow from SHARF will be reduced, more can be moved.

(f) OTHER NATIONALS IN ITALY

(1) Northern & Western Europeans. The bulk have been repatriated - via BIELLER, SUS, SWITZERLAND and GERMANY. At present under 1000 in Germany but a few keep coming in.

(c) RUSSIAN ZONE. The number of Italians in the Russian Zone is still unknown. A few have been repatriated.

(d) SOUTHERN ITALY AND A GREEK ISLAND. Increased numbers have materialized especially in Lombardy Region - where the figure of 200,000 has been mentioned - 1000 per week are being accepted. After mid-Sept., when the flow from Greece will be reduced, more can be moved.

Southerners with over 30/40 kilos baggage cannot be accepted through refugee channels.

(e) GREEK ISLANDS IN ITALY.

(1) Northern & Western Europeans. The bulk have been repatriated - Via FONDRIENTE, SUSO, SALLERLAND and LANSBUR. At present under 1000 in camps but a few keep coming in.

(2) Greeks, Albanians, Mediterranean Nationals. The numbers remaining in Italy are not great but some 10,000 Greeks still required to be repatriated from Greece via Italy. Shipping remains very difficult.

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(3) Jews. Recently 4,500 (Non-Italians) arrived from S.M.P. without earnings. Any further will be returned at once.

(4) Polish and Magyar Jews. The bulk are still under canvas, but unless numbers are greater than anticipated, all will be under cover by winter.

2. DISSEMINATION.

- (i) RAILWAYS. Only 10 trains South per week from Russian area.
- (ii) SHIPPING. Genoa and Venice still not functioning for refugees. "Whitby" is taking 2,500 weekly from Fionchio to Sicily. More shipping is being eagerly sought. The new rumour of an air craft carrier going North claimed many fruitless journeys. Eventually discovered and carried 100 refugees.

3. TRUCKS.

a considerable number of trucks are now available for transportation but unless back-loads are obtained, they are unsuited for long distance or large scale movement.

4. HOSPITALIZATION.

Preparations are fairly well advanced to receive hospital trains via BREMEN and STUTTGART. The numbers anticipated are 5,000.

1. Programme

The programme for movement of Refugees North and Southbound shown at Appendix 'A' and 'B' for period 30 July to 5 August '45 has been agreed by G-4 (May & Tn) AFHQ subject to adjustment in the event of any priority Military Movements materialising.

2. Loading of Trains

- (a) Normally Trains will be made up of 15 Box cars capacity 40 Refugees maximum per Box Car; total 2400 per Train.
- (b) In the event of insufficient Box Cars being available it has been agreed that open gondolas will have to be utilised.

3. Provision of Passenger Rolling Stock

- (a) Five sets of Passenger Rolling Stock are now in service for movement of Refugees from Bologna, Southbound.
- (b) The loading capacity of these trains will be 1,000 Refugees maximum.
- (c) Passenger Rolling Stock Trains will in future only work from originating point to Caserta at which station all Refugees will be transferred to Box Cars for onward movement.
- (d) Displaced Persons Representative in Bologna should contact AS Transport-ation Officer, Bologna, Tel. No. 244444 162, the day prior to departure to confirm type of Rolling Stock being provided.
- (e) Train Conducting Personnel of Passenger Rolling Stock Trains should be informed prior to departure that all Refugees will be required to change at Caserta for onward movement.

- 4. See list by Italian Cruiser "Garibaldi" planning to Messina. Unless instructions are received from AFHQ to the contrary the Italian Cruiser "Garibaldi" will continue to make regular scheduled trips from Fioabine to

No. Florence 1629/Florence Firebox 25, regarding any change in the attached programs so far as their areas are concerned.

The following information received from IGCR HQ in London may be of interest:

Military Responsibility for Displaced Persons.

1. SHAEF have informed us that a Combined Displaced Persons Executive (CDPX) has been set up at Frankfurt to continue present operations and will probably last for about three months. It will be responsible for all matters hitherto handled by Displaced Persons Branch, G-5 Division, SHAEF, and will ultimately transfer to UNRRA those of its responsibilities that are within the UNRRA charter.

2. Existing policies of SHAEF relating to the care and repatriation of Displaced Persons will be continued by CDPX acting with the authority of the British Commander-in-Chief and of the Commanding General, U.S. Forces, in their respective zones of occupation. No French representatives have yet been assigned to CDPX. CDPX will not develop new policies.

3. The elements of CDPX will be -

- (a) British and US officers to be joined by French representatives if the French so desire.
- (b) Allied Liaison Officers.
- (c) AFHQ Liaison Officers.
- (d) POW Liaison Officers.
- (e) UNRRA representatives.
- (f) British and US Transportation representatives from their respective zones.
- (g) Liaison Officer from the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees.

The meeting took place at the Italian Ministero degli Affari

1. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the position of:-

- (a) Those Italians who went to Greece from 1939 onwards.
- (b) Greek-born wives of Italians.
- (c) Italians who had been in Greece since 1912 and had
therefore established themselves in that country.

2. On the question of those Italians who went to Greece from
1939 onwards, the Dean del Bellos expressed the Italian Government's
willingness to accept them back into Italy. The Italian Government
will be willing to pay for this in lire, through U.S.S.R. Those to be
returned will be selected by the Greek Government in conjunction with
U.S.S.R. and Sig. Cicchi (representing the Italian Government). As
nominal rolls will be sent to Italy in advance, but will accompany the
party concerned. All Italians being returned to Italy under this
heading will be processed by U.S.S.R. before sailing, and will be met
on arrival in Italy under arrangements to be made by the Ministero
Assistenza Post Bellica.

3. On the question of Greek born wives of Italians:-

- (a) The Italian Government is willing to accept:-

- (1) Those wives whose husbands are still in Greece. No

(c) Italianas had been in Greece since 1932 and had therefore established themselves in that country.

2. On the question of those Italians who went to Greece from 1939 onwards, the Duce del Balzo expressed the Italian Government's willingness to accept them back into Italy. The Italian Government will be willing to pay for this in lire, through UNRRA. Those to be returned will be selected by the Greek Government in conjunction with UNRRA and Sig. Ciochi (representing the Italian Government). No nominal rolls will be sent to Italy in advance, but will accompany the party concerned. All Italians being returned to Italy under this heading will be processed by UNRRA before sailing, and will be met on arrival in Italy under arrangements to be made by the Ministero Assistenza Post Bellica.

3. On the question of Greek born wives of Italians:-

(a) The Italian Government is willing to accept:-

(1) Those wives whose husbands are still in Greece. No nominal rolls in advance will be demanded by Italy, but numbers only. Nominal rolls to accompany the parties concerned.

(11) Those wives who have received letters from their Italian husbands. The Greek Government to be asked to make available these letters to UNRRA and Mr. Ciochi for authenticity. No nominal rolls in advance will be demanded by Italy, but numbers only. Nominal rolls to accompany the parties concerned.

(b) Regarding those wives who have received no letters from husbands, nominal rolls will be sent in advance with full particulars to the Italian Government. Chain of communication, from UNRRA Greece to A.P.R.C., action copy to A.P.R.S.C., A.C., thence to Ministero degli Affari Esteri for clearance.

(a) Regarding dependants:-

- (1) The Italian Government will accept the children by the marriage with the Italian, or by a former marriage, if the children are minors.
- (11) If the dependants are other than in (1) above, full particulars must be forwarded to the Italian Government, with each case, to be decided by the Italian Government, as far as possible, on humanitarian grounds.

By following the lines indicated above it is hoped to speed up very considerably the return of Italians to Italy and so show the Greek Government a ready will to cooperate on the part of the Italian Government.

5. Regarding Italians who have been in Greece since 1932. In consideration of the above the Italian Government hopes that the Greek Government will interest itself in a lively and practical way to better the conditions of those Italians remaining in Greek territory, and in particular those who have been there since 1932 and have consequently got their roots in the country. It is the desire of the Italian Government that these Italians be allowed to remain. The Italian Government asks both UNRRA Greece and A.C. to give their support in attaining this end.

1. Reference your cable F 29195 dated 29 July 1945 and in confirmation of our signal Ref : 2833 dated 31 July 1945.

2. On receipt of your instructions Major HARTMAN and Major SIMCOCK proceeded to Cine Citta Reception Centre for the purpose of investigating this special case.

3. All index cards and relevant documents pertaining to Polish Citizens were carefully examined on account of Russian names conveying a meaning in the Russian Language, but Polish names usually do not.

4. During the examination of these index cards 10 Russian names were found and these persons were carefully interrogated. A list of these names with the information obtained is submitted herewith for your consideration.

5. 128 of the Polish Citizens at Cine Citta Reception Centre have elected to return to Poland as soon as possible, but the others who are not desirous of returning are being sent to a static Camp in Southern Italy.

6. There is definitely no truth in the accusation made against the Polish Consul, who only visits Cine Citta Reception Centre when his presence is required. Furthermore, there is no evidence to prove that the Polish Consul has issued Polish Passports to Soviet Citizens in the a/m Camp.

7. It appears that this is a repetition on the part of the Russian Representative to Claim Polish Citizens against their own free will.

3. KONJASEVILI, Alexander.
Claims to have been in Polish Army and has a certificate to the effect that he attained the rank of Lieutenant. He was never officially naturalized.
4. TERJASVILI, Anna.
Polish citizen with two children in the Polish Army. Late husband also served in the Polish Army. She was naturalized in 1938.
5. MOHACKI, Serry.
His father was a Russian but he was naturalized as a Polish citizen in 1927. This boy speaks bad Russian.
6. JEMIGANOFF, Elisabetha.
Possesses documents which state that her husband is serving in the Polish Army. She was naturalized in 1930.
7. KORE, Anton.
Left Russia in 1943. Passport No. 622/VI/45-729a/260 which was issued in Rome 26th June 1945. This person is illegitimate and his passport was issued on the basis of a Friendship pass.
8. IMRADKE, Konrad.
This person's wife is a Pole and he was naturalized in 1934.
9. HOLINSKI, Wasył.
This person is a young boy who can hardly speak a word of Russian.
10. PITROWSKI, Vladimir and Cleopatra.
This elderly couple were naturalized in 1923.

The programme for movement of Refugees North and Southbound shown at Appendices 'A' and 'B' for period 6 August to 12 August '45 has been agreed by G-4 (War & Trn) AFHQ subject to adjustment in the event of any priority Military Movement materialising.

- (a) Normally Trains will be made up of 25 box cars capacity 40 Refugees maximum per Box Car; total 1000 per Train.
- (b) In the event of insufficient Box Cars being available it has been agreed that open gondolas will have to be utilized.

- (a) Five sets of Passenger Rolling Stock are now in service for movement of Refugees from Belgrade, Southbound.

- (c) Passenger Rolling Stock Trains will in future only work from originating point to Naples at which station all Refugees will be transferred to Box Cars for onward movement.
- (d) Displaced Persons Representative in Bologna should contact Lt. Transportation Officer, Bologna, Tel. No. Kitzburg 162, the day prior to departure to confirm type of Rolling Stock being provided.
- (e) Train Conducting Personnel of Passenger Rolling Stock Trains should be informed prior to departure that all Refugees will be required to change at Naples for onward movement.

ACUQ have instructed that Polish Refugees must be moved against Italian Refugees and no additional special facilities be made available for their movement. Displaced Persons & Repatriation Sub-Commission will instruct D.P.P. S/C Representative Bologna, Lt. Col. Gidfield on which train accommodation must be allotted.

6. Alteration to current programme. On no account will any alteration be made to the detailed programme set out at Appendices 'A' and 'B' without reference to the local AC. Transportation Officer, who will in turn agree any alteration with Transportation Sub-Commission HQ. Allied Commission, Rome.

1. Reference your G-1 (Br) 3491/A-2 dated 27 July 1945.
2. In accordance with your request we wish to inform you that this H.Q. received a Complaint on 16 June 1945, concerning 700 Soviet Citizens who were being accommodated in our Forli Camps during that period; a copy of which is submitted herewith for your retention.
3. After having investigated this matter, we ascertained that there were 826 Soviet Nationals in this Camp, who had arrived during the emergency phase of Refugees arriving in large numbers from Austria, and it was impossible to ascertain the actual Nationality of each individual until these persons had been registered.
4. In view of the fact that Soviet Nationals are treated as ex P.W.'s, instructions were issued to all our Groups in North Italy that all Soviet Nationals irrespective of sex must be sent to the nearest Allied P.W. Repatriation Representative.
5. These 826 Soviet Nationals were transferred to the Allied P.W. Repatriation Camp at Forli on 18 June 1945, and the Head of the Russian Military Mission was informed accordingly. A copy of our letter is enclosed herewith.
6. Owing to this Sub-Commission having heard nothing further from Col. RUMIN, we considered that the matter had been settled to the satisfaction of all concerned.

At the present time in your FOLRI camp for refugees there is a large group of 200 Soviet Nationals, composed of men, women and children. As a result of a visit of my officers to this Camp the following facts have been established :

1. The Soviet nationals concentrated in this camp for already 20 days are living in extremely bad conditions, which in no way correspond to the spirit of agreement signed in Yalta by Mr. Churchill and Marshall Stalin and precisely:

- (a) All the Soviet nationals are living in buildings not at all suitable for habitation.
- (b) Women, children and men are sharing common rooms and are living in horrible sanitary conditions, in dirt, etc. They are sleeping on bare stone floors.
- (c) They are all complaining of bad feeding. They receive the same food given to the Italian refugees.
- (d) During the entire period of their stay in this camp no one has received cigarettes.
- (e) No one has received financial aid.
- (f) Up to the present moment the Soviet nationals were subjected to rascally actions done by the soldiers of a Polish Military Unit, stationed in Yorli, the members of which are leading a most unfriendly and loose propaganda, but no decisive measures have been taken against that by the local British Command.

2. In relation to the above exposed facts, Sir, I am forced to declare to you that such a situation by no means correspond to the terms of the agreement signed in Yalta and in accordance to which all Soviet nationals should be provided for in a way similar to the treatment of British soldiers and no contrary propaganda be allowed amongst them.

I ask you the following:

- (a) That necessary instructions be given in order to eliminate the abnormal situation and that the camp for the Soviet nationals be brought to appropriate conditions, suitable to accommodate nationals of a United Nation.
- (b) That necessary measures be taken to protect our nationals from the rascally actions of the Polish officer and men, and to put a stop to the unfriendly propaganda lead amongst them.
- (c) To provide the Soviet nationals in accordance with the Yalta agreement, with boots and clothing.
- (d) That instructions be issued in order that all Soviet nationals

I ask you the following:

- (a) That necessary instructions be given in order to eliminate the abnormal situation and that the camp for the Soviet nationals be brought to appropriate conditions, suitable to accommodate nationals of a United Nation.
- (b) That necessary measures be taken to protect our nationals from the rascally actions of the Polish officer and men, and to put a stop to the unfriendly propaganda lead amongst them.
- (c) To provide the Soviet nationals in accordance with the Yalta agreement, with boots and clothing.
- (d) That instructions be issued in order that all Soviet nationals in that camp be rapidly repatriated.

I shall be very grateful if you would let me know immediately the measures, which have been taken by you.

1. Your para 2 is not understood. Many other Camps for Allied Nationals have been opened in the North and South since 30 May. I have never had any intention of opening another Camp near Rome.

2. Your para 3 is also not understood. Cine Citta is now "more" a Transit Camp like Averna and Bari with many in and out each week.

E.G. last week over 1000 West and N. West Europeans left Averna, Cine Citta by train. In the next few days another 1000 will leave from mainly Cine Citta.

About the 1st, 350 Christian Poles (who have been waiting in Cine Citta for some time) will be cleared for the Polish Camps at Barletta.

3. I agree that we would like to keep the more or less static personnel in Cine Citta to under 1000 so as to leave room for the odd influxes of 100 or so who escape through our nets in the North. So long as the total transit keeps under 1000, it is better to collect a batch of Nationals and then send them to a National Camp, than send tens or twenties.

(e) Train Conducting Personnel of Passenger Rolling Stock Trains should be informed prior to departure that all Refugees will be required to change at Caserta for onward movement.

No. Florence 1007/Florence Firebox 25, regarding any change in the attached programme so far as their areas are concerned.
- (b) Any alteration to train schedules from Verona will be made through Maj. Fry, AC. Transportation Officer (Refugees) 65 Army, Tel. No. Lightning 534.
