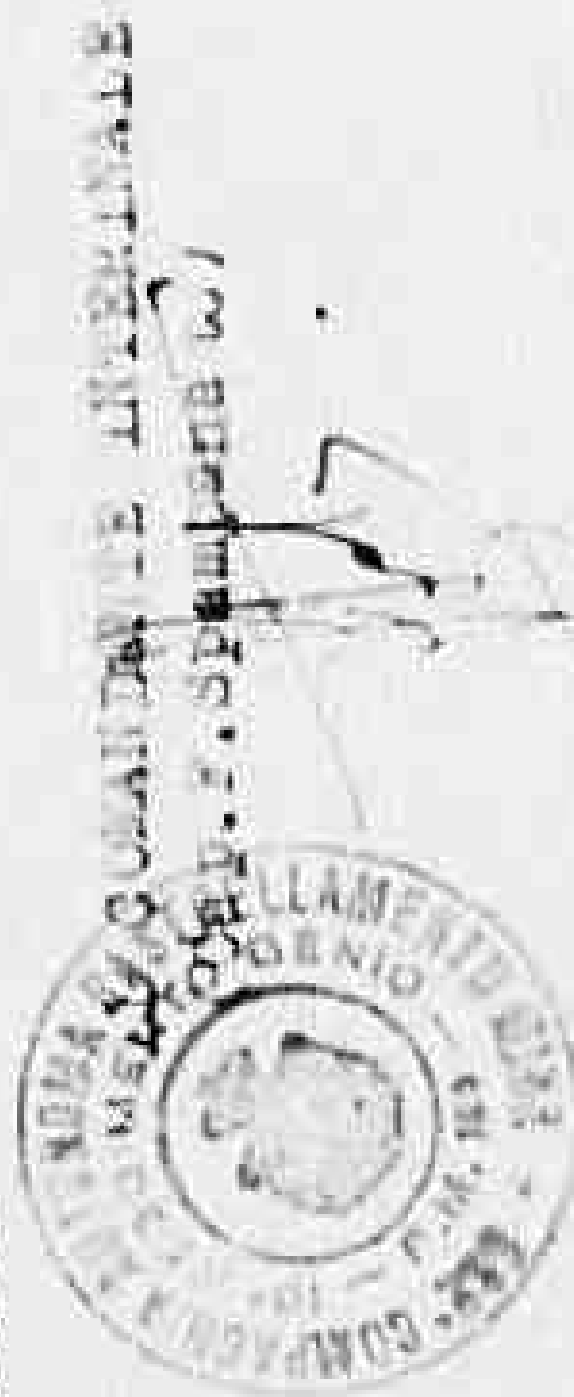

3. As already stated there is a further need of 3 Officers of higher rank and 20 officers of inferior rank for the two new zones (Venezia and Venezia Tridentina) and for the mine clearance zones already organised. It is therefore requested to provide.
4. It is proposed to form 2 Battalion commands and another 4 mine clearance companies; 2 Officers of higher rank, 6 captains and 35 ORs are requested.
5. The above requests, referring to organisation problems which are treated by this Direction in collaboration with the Allied Commission Civil Affairs Section, should be complied with urgently.

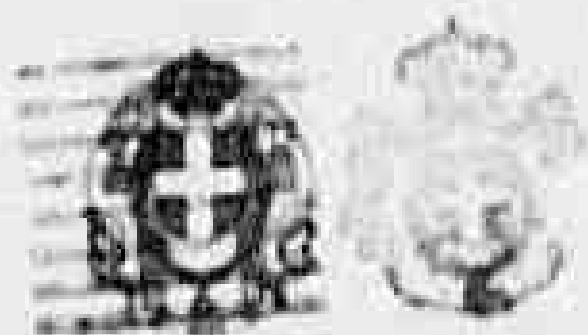

SUBJECT: Mine Clearance.

TO : HQ Emilia Region.

1. The following points have been noted on the Report by Lt. MACABAB on his visit to the Mine Clearing Squads working in your Region.

- (a) The number of mines cleared from 5th February to 5th April (2000) is in proportion to the number of men employed.
- (b) Casualties although high are not excessively so and after further experience should be reduced. In this connection it is considered that the period of training is too short (one week). As training and discipline are essential for this type of work the course should be extended in order that the drill may become automatic. 16 days is the usual duration of mine clearing courses. The second week being devoted to the practical side. Good drill means less casualties. When men tend to become reckless they should be taken off work for a few days and given further instruction.
- (c) The School at TORRI is well run and Lt. MACABAB was impressed by the organisation and administration of the School particularly with regard to the marking and plotting of the mined areas on large scale maps.
- (d) Lack of transport is impeding Maj. HARRISON's efforts to some extent and it is hoped that more assistance can be given to him in this respect.

(b) Casualties although high are not extensively so and after further experience should be reduced. In this connection it is considered that the period of training is too short (one week). As training and discipline are essential for this type of work the course should be extended in order that the drill may become automatic. 15 days is the usual duration of mine clearing courses, the second week being devoted to the practical side. Good drill means less casualties. When men tend to become reckless they should be taken off work for a few days and given further instruction.

(c) The School at CORUI is well run and Lt. MACFARLANE was impressed by the organization and administration of the School particularly with regard to the marking and plotting of the mined areas on large scale maps.

(d) Lack of transport is impeding Maj. HARRISON's efforts to some extent and it is hoped that more assistance can be given to him in this respect.

2. No reports have been received from your HQ on Mine Clearance work. As records are being kept at this HQ it will be obliging if a fortnightly report can be rendered showing number of mines lifted and types for the preceding 14 days. The report should also state number of civilians employed, number under training, and casualties.

THE CHIEF OF STAFF FOR THE ITALIAN ARMY

1. OBJECT

To provide a team of instructors for training civilians within each Region and four Companies of trained Engineers of the Italian Army for use in Mine Clearance work of prior importance.

2. INTRODUCTION

AC will make one team of Italian instructors available to each Region for the training of civilians.

Four Companies of trained Italian Army Engineers will be made available for urgent work in North Italy. They will be under control of HQ AC who will determine where they should be employed after consultation with Regional Commanders. Two Companies will operate in North West Italy and the remaining two Companies will operate in North East Italy.

Mine Detectors released to them will have been allocated and distributed to Regions. Efforts are being made to obtain a further release of Detectors and equipment.

The Italian Ministry of War have divided the country for mine clearance work into Zones corresponding to Regions. The civilian instructors and workers will come under Zones for administration, discipline and pay but will be under control of Regions for operational purposes.

With the limited number of personnel at the disposal of AC and the Regions it will be a question of priorities which can only be determined after a reconnaissance has been made by the Regions. As most of the information will be obtained through Italian and Partisan channels and at Provincial level, it is suggested that a list of priorities on the lines of Appendix "A" be prepared for circulation at an early date. Details need not be detailed but from information supplied it can probably be ascertained where the first centres should be set up.

As priorities are most important it is suggested that the following should be adopted:-

- (a) Communications.
- (b) Public Works & Utilities.
- (c) Ports and large towns.
- (d) Devastated areas.
- (e) Agricultural areas and land.

3. DETAILS

APPENDIX A

ADMINISTRATIVE DISPOSITIONS
IN
PLANNING FOR NORTH ITALY.

1. PLANNING AND ACQUISITION OF CIVILIAN PERSONNEL

It will be necessary to determine where they wish the Mine Training Center to be located.

The Italian Ministry of War will establish Mine Clearing Centers within each Region (to be known as Zone Liguria, Piemonte, Lombardia and Venezia) as soon as practicable to coordinate the work of the civilian squads working in the Region but it will be for Regions to arrange in the initial stages for recruitment and training of civilian squads. Regions will control the squads and will direct their work. In this connection Region could consider whether it might not be possible to obtain and train recruits; new men could be willing to move into their Region at a later date. Such transfer could be initiated at the schools at Lecce (Liguria Region), Fiat (Piemonte Region), Fiat (Lombardia Region) and at Anzio Region. Possible sources of recruitment is Trieste.

The U.N.F. for instance have been trained and are doing Mine Clearance work. This source should also be considered.

2. CONCLUSIONS

It will be a Regional responsibility to make all arrangements for training and housing of instructors, Mine Clearance Companies and civilian squads living and working away from home.

Civilian instructors will be accommodated in or near to the buildings chosen for the centre of instruction.

The Mine Clearance Companies will save their HQ in a control area and the sections will be housed in suitable buildings in or near to the area in which they are working.

Civilian squads when not living at home will be housed near the area of operations.

3. EQUIPMENT

Mine Detectors (Italian Type), Mine Cutters etc. will be provided by the Italian Ministry of War in so far as available. It will be also available to each Region in the first place.

4. REPORTS AND ANALYSIS

2. CONCLUSION

It will be a Regional responsibility to make all arrangements for visiting and housing of instructors, Mine Clearance Squads, and Civilian Squads living and/or working away from home.

Civilian instructors will be accommodated in or near to the existing schools for the purpose of instruction.

The Mine Clearance Squads will have their HQ in a desired area and they will be housed in suitable buildings in or near to the area in which they are working.

Civilian squads when not living at home will be housed near the area of operations.

3. EQUIPMENT

Min. Detachments (Infantry Type), Mine Clearance Sq., will be provided by the Italian Ministry of War in so far as available. It will be also available to each Region in the first place.

4. MEMBERS AND RESERVES

4169

All military personnel will take with them their personal items of black-top clothing. Civilians should also bring with them blankets etc. for their own use. It is anticipated that difficulty will be experienced in order as civilians are concerned and regions may require to take in this respect.

5. NOTES FOR THE CIVILIAN

Attached hereto at appendix 13 is the present needs of wages paid by the Italian Ministry of War to civilian squads working under their scheme. The wages vary in different parts of the country due to different costs of living, insurance and expenses. The figures which remain constant are the basic wages and the daily indemnity for risk (danger money). They are:

The wages vary according to whether the worker is married or not and if married according to the number of children of his.

... economic line will be established in the North which will encourage all sort of living increases authorized in the present liberated Italy. Instructions will be issued by Economic Section in the procedure to be followed. Regions will only be permitted to pay the wages shown in that paragraph which can be accepted as the wage ruling of 3rd April 45 plus family allowances and bonus for the number of miles lifted. Adjustments may require to be made.

6. INFORMATION

... before engaged in hazardous callings are insured under RIL 1765 of 1935 in the state forerunner's compensation institution (INCAVALLO). If employed by the state this is done through INCAVALLO; if employed by allied forces they are covered by INCAVALLO under the terms of an agreement of 1943 with the Finance Ministry and were recently by a law recently passed to explain in 1944 administrative arrangements of 16 December 1944. The insurance is automatic and it does not matter whether the insured is employed by the Italian Government or by a foreigner in the event of injury (fatal or otherwise) claims should be lodged with INCAVALLO.

7. FINANCING

The Italian Ministry of War will arrange for the Company and instructors (Military) granted regions on the Italian Army scale through their own channels. Civilians are entitled to ratings on rating scale as provided for Public Security Agents. (Authority 45-3/47/2002 dated 9 April 45 copy of which is attached at appendix '1').

8. TRANSPORT

While the Italian Ministry of War will grant power to the Zone Commanders of Zones Liguria, Piemonte, Lombardia, Emilia to hire transport Regions must be prepared to assist by providing transport for urgent needs. Without transport the scheme is almost impossible. The War Ministry Department will have some transport of their own but it will require to be supplemented from regional sources. If transport is not made available to the War Ministry Department it will result in their not being fully employed in it may be necessary to use the Companies for other areas where they can be fully employed.

6 Transport

While the Italian Ministry of War will grant power to the Civil Commissioner of Genoa, Liguria, Piemonte, Lombardia and Emilia to hire transport regions must be prepared to assist by providing transport for urgent needs. Without transport the scheme is almost impossible. The Milan Clearance Companies will have some transport of their own but it will require to be supplemented from regional sources. If transport is not made available to the Civil Clearance Companies it will result in their not being fully employed and it may be necessary to move the Companies to other areas where they can be fully employed.

1. It has been decided that civilian personnel engaged in the clearance of land mines shall receive food rations on the scale outlined below. This change will come into effect on 1 May 1965.
2. Persons entitled to these rations must be both full employees of organizations or institutions who are serving directly for the Ministry of War, and are engaged in the actual military clearance.
3. The ration scale, calculated at that for Public Security Agents (from all sources) will be as follows:

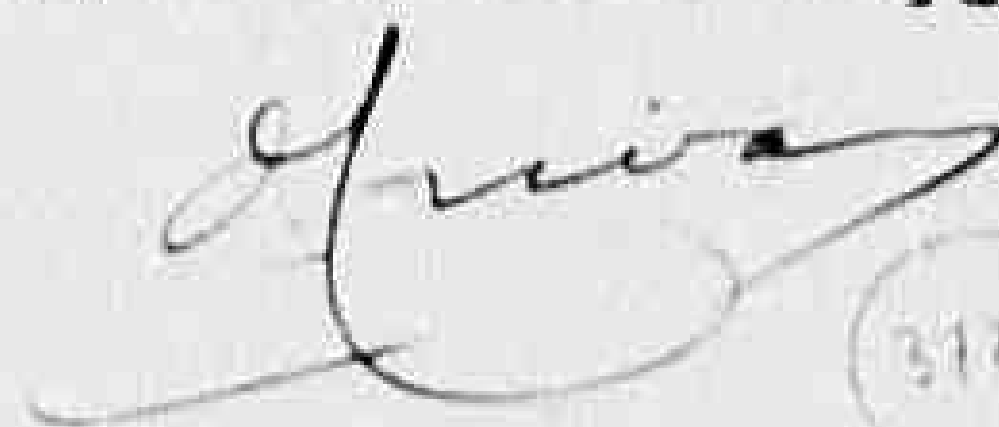

1. The ceiling for Category 5(a) FI-FI Personnel allocated to this Formation is 3000.

2. The units at present authorized within this ceiling total 2956 all ranks, details of which are shown at Appendix 'A' hereto.

3. In view of the expected future commitments of this Formation in N. & Italy the following expansions are proposed:-

(a) eight further Mine Clearance Coys, each with an establishment of 209 all ranks. These, together with the present four, will be formed into three Battalions of four Coys each. There will be three Battalion Hqs each with an establishment of 3 Officers and 17 O.Rs.

Information at present available indicates that there will be many thousands of mines to be cleared in N. & Italy, and it is considered that the above additional Coys will be absolutely necessary.

This will result in an increase of 1732 Mine Clearance personnel over the present strength of 966.

(b) The proposed reorganization of Italian Refugee Camps calls for:-

(i) 20 Frontier Repatriation Posts (capacity 1000 persons) each of 6 Officers and 33 O.Rs.	820
(ii) 20 Transit Centres (capacity 3000 persons) each of 13 Officers and 90 O.Rs	2140
(iii) 5 Group Hqs of 3 Officers and 12 O.Rs	72
Total	3032

These figures do not include O.R. personnel, and will result in an increase of personnel of 2015 over the present strength of 1020.

(c) U.K.B. & Italian P. & Sub Commission propose to establish 20 Collection and Transit Centres in N. & Italy, each with an establishment of 11 Officers and 53 O.Rs, resulting in a total of 1320 all ranks.

4. The total increase under (a), (b) and (c) will therefore be 5067 which, together with the present holding of 2956, gives a figure of 8023 as against the authorized ceiling of 3000.

5. It is requested therefore, in order that the above proposals may be put into effect, and also to provide a margin for further increases which may become necessary in the future, that authority may be given for the ceiling of FI-FI Personnel allocated to this Formation to be increased from 3000 to 9000.
