SUBJECT: Repatriation of US Army Personnel

Paragraph 8a, letter, this headquarters, file AG 383.6/1770 P-3, subject: "Repatriation of American Personnel" dated 18 November 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"2. a. In addition to reports required by paragraph 8b below, the commanders listed in paragraph 6a above, will, in the case of each repatriate, submit a separate report showing:

(1) Name, grade, army serial number, last organizational assignment, place and date of capture, or internment.

(a) Date of return to Allied Military control and category, i.e., escapee, Evader, etc.

(b) Physical condition (good, fair, poor).

(c) Probable disposition (return to US, return to unit, hospitalized).

(d) Location and names of various prisoner of war or internment camps in which held.

(e) Names of other US and allied personnel captured or interned at the same place or places.

(f) Other pertinent information concerning other prisoners or internees.

(2) Parts of the above report which are manifestly inapplicable will be omitted. In cases of personnel to be hospitalized, the designation of the hospital to which forwarded will also be furnished, together with diagnosis. Where large groups of personnel are recovered at the same time, from the same camp, and where it is practicable to do so, consolidated reports will be submitted.

(3) Reports will be forwarded by Air Dispatch Letter Service, or other rapid means of transmission, to reach this headquarters in triplicate.

SUBJECT: Repatriation of American Personnel.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Letter, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 5 October 1944 as amended by letter, same file and subject, dated 30 October 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor.

2. Definitions -- United States military personnel who are returned to Allied military control following capture by enemy forces, evasion of capture in enemy or enemy held territory, release or escape from internment in a neutral country, or liberation from custody in former enemy or enemy controlled country as a result of those countries coming under Allied military control, are reclassified for the purpose of identification as "Repatriates", and are further identified as follows:

a. Escapee -- Repatriate who has escaped from enemy custody, as distinguished from liberated.

b. Evader -- Repatriate who, although not captured by enemy forces, has been in enemy or enemy held territory and isolated from his organization.

c. Internee -- Repatriate who has been released or escaped from internment in a neutral country.

d. Recovered Prisoner of War -- Prisoner of war who has been liberated from custody in former enemy or enemy controlled country as a result of those countries coming under Allied military control.

e. Prisoner of War -- A member of the armed forces who is captured by the forces or people of an opposing belligerent.

3. Disposition of Repatriates, other than those whose last assignment was to an Air Force unit not stationed in this Theater.

(1) Internees will in all cases be returned to the United States as expeditiously as possible.

(2) Escapees and Evaders may be returned to the United States within the discretion of the commanding general of the major command concerned.

(3) Recaptured and Evaders not returned to the United States within the terms of 2a(2), above, will be disposed of as follows:

- (a) Those found physically qualified for further combat service and whose return to combat service is not precluded for reasons of security will be returned to their former unit, irrespective of the present station of that unit, provided the individual so elects. If the individual desires assignment to a unit other than that to which he was last assigned, he will be assigned to a combat unit of suitable arm in this theater.
- (b) Those found not physically qualified for further combat service and those whose reassignment to a combat unit is not considered advisable for reasons of security, but whose return to the United States is not considered necessary, will be reassigned to a service unit in this theater.
- (c) Those found not physically qualified for further overseas service will be returned to the United States.
- (d) Those whose further retention in this theater is considered inadvisable for reasons of security, and those whose proper disposition cannot be determined from local interrogation by the United States Representative, will be reported by letter to this headquarters for final determination. In those cases where further retention in the service is considered inadvisable for reasons of security, an appropriate remark will be made on officers' qualification card (OW 400 Form 55-1, 55-2, or 55-3), and in enlisted man's service record under "Remarks Administrative".

(4) Recovered Prisoners of War

- (a) An individual who has been out of United States control for a period of sixty (60) days or more will be evacuated to the United States as quickly as possible, consistent with his physical condition, unless he affirmatively elects to remain in this theater and the major commander concerned approves. In the latter case, the individual will be reassigned within this theater and report made to this headquarters.
- (b) Individuals who have been absent from United States control for periods of less than sixty (60) days may be reassigned to duty within this theater, within the discretion of the major commander concerned.

(5) In any case of conflict or where special circumstances exist, a full report of the circumstances will be forwarded to this headquarters for the decision of the Theater Commander.

(d) Repatriates who require hospitalization will be hospitalized. When released from the Hospital they will be sent to the appropriate headquarters listed in paragraph 5a below, for disposition, except that seriously ill personnel will be immediately evacuated to the United States through medical channels and full report of circumstances made to this headquarters by the most expeditious means possible. Evacuation of Repatriates through medical channels will be accomplished in accordance with War Department letter, subject: "Procedure For Evacuation of Patients by Water or Air from Overseas Commands", dated 8 June 1944. The return of sick and wounded recovered prisoners of war by aircraft is encouraged.

4. Disposition of Repatriates whose last assignment was to an Air Force Unit and stationed in this Theater. -- This class of personnel will be sent to Headquarters, Army Air Forces, ITO for interrogation. Upon completion of interrogation and other immediate action deemed appropriate, they will be forwarded by Headquarters, Army Air Forces, ITO, to their former organization. Travel by military aircraft is authorized.

4. Liaison with Allied Prisoner of War Repatriation Unit -- An officer will be assigned by this Headquarters to serve as United States Liaison Officer with the Allied Prisoner of War Repatriation Unit. This officer will be responsible for keeping the necessary records pertaining to United States military "Repatriates" and coordinating among the various agencies concerned all matters pertaining to repatriation.

5. United States Representatives to the Allied Prisoner of War Repatriation Unit -- The Commanding General, Army Air Force, HTO, Twelfth Air Force, Fifthteenth Air Force, Peninsular Base Section, and other commanders who may be later designated by this headquarters will each detail one officer to serve as United States Representative to the Allied Prisoner of War Repatriation Unit. These officers will remain on duty with the headquarters which they represent and will, insofar as their particular headquarters is concerned and when practicable, to do so, determine the final disposition of Repatriates and assist and coordinate in their orderly and expeditious disposition. These representatives will also supervise the United States Liaison Officer with all information necessary for the maintenance of complete records of Repatriates.

8. Processing of Personnel within the Theater

c. Headquarters who return to Allied military control will be dispatched as expeditiously as possible, as follows:

(1) To Headquarters, Twelfth Air Force - Those whose last assignment was to that command.

(2) To Headquarters, Fifteenth Air Force - Those whose last assignment was to that command.

(3) To Headquarters, Army Air Forces, MTO, - All Air Force personnel other than personnel enumerated in (1) and (2) above. See paragraph 3b, above.

(4) To Headquarters, Peninsular Base Section - All personnel of ground and service force units.

b. Personnel enumerated in (1), (2), and (4), above, who are to be returned to the United States will, after processing at the headquarters concerned, be sent to the 7th Replacement Depot.

c. Personnel enumerated in (4), above, who are selected for reassignment within the theater will, if classified for limited assignment, be sent to the 7th Replacement Depot; and, if classified for general assignment, will be sent to the 1st Replacement Depot, except that all officers regardless of race or branch and all enlisted men former members of Infantry or Armored Force units will be sent to the 24th Replacement Depot. All general assignment negro enlisted men, regardless of branch of service, will be sent to the 1st Replacement Depot.

d. Air Force personnel selected for reassignment in this theater will be reassigned to an Air Force organization by the appropriate headquarters shown in paragraph 3a(1) or (2), above.

e. Advance intelligence echelons will interrogate Repatriates only to the extent necessary to secure information of immediate tactical value, such as enemy plans, order of battle, installations, equipment, etc. A certificate will be given to each individual which will show that an interrogation has been made and that the individual is not to be interrogated further until a place of detailed interrogation is reached.

f. Medical Examinations and Records.

(1) Each former Prisoner of War will be given a thorough medical examination at the earliest practicable moment. Such examination will make special reference to the existence of infections or contagious diseases and mental afflictions and appropriate reference will be made to treatment furnished by the enemy and to any illnesses or injuries suffered while in custody. Complete statements of such injuries, including affidavits from the individuals concerned, where possible, and from enemy or Allied personnel cognizant of the circumstances, will be obtained and forwarded to this headquarters in duplicate. Medical records, which will be improvised locally and likewise forwarded to this headquarters in duplicate, will contain the information obtained under the provisions of this paragraph.

(2) Other classes of Repatriates will be given a medical examination, as deemed necessary. No record or report is required in these cases.

g. Pay and Pay Records.

(1) Pay that has been received by officers from the enemy pursuant to the provisions of the Geneva Prisoners of War Convention, and work pay received by enlisted men, will not be deducted from the military pay accruing to such individuals while in prisoner status. However, pay records will note the amounts that were paid to the individual prisoners, except work pay, while in enemy custody.

(2) Each Repatriate may, if he so desires, be given a partial payment of not to exceed one full month's pay if pay for more than one month is due, or not to exceed 50% of one month's pay if pay for only one month is due.

(3) For the purpose of this paragraph, pay records will be construed to be:

(a) For Officers.

Pay data card, WD AGO Form 77.

(b) For Enlisted Men.

Individual Pay Record, WD AGO Form 28

Service Record, Remarks Financial, WD AGO Form 24.

(4) Records and pay accounts of Repatriates retained in the theater will be brought up-to-date as soon as possible. Local commanders will request by direct radio to the Office of Special Settlement Accounts, 27 Pine Street, New York 5, New York, the pay data relative to each former prisoner of war. Such radio will contain name, grade, MOS, and name and location of command to which the pay data is to be sent. Advance and partial payments are authorized for the interim between recovery and full settlement of pay accounts, and provisions will be made for charging such payments when full settlement is made.

h. Gratuitous issues of clothing and canteen supplies necessary for health and comfort are authorized and directed.

i. The individual will be informed that his return to Allied control has been reported to the War Department and, by the War Department, to his next of kin. He will be directed to refrain from corresponding by cable, RFM, or other means with relatives and friends for at least ten (10) days following return to Allied military control. This procedure will permit the War Department sufficient time to make official notification to the next of kin and to clarify his status. Subsequent messages then received from the individual by the next of kin will not occasion doubt or alarm as to his safety and whereabouts. This procedure, together with the reason therefor, will be carefully explained to all Repatriates.

j. A temporary service record will be prepared for enlisted men as outlined in paragraph 42, AR 345-125, paragraph 13, AR 345-155, and MTOUSA Circular Number 100, 1944. An entry will be made on the cover of the record that the individual is an escaped prisoner of war, has avoided capture in enemy or enemy held territory, has escaped or been released from internment in a neutral country, or has been liberated from custody in enemy or enemy controlled country.

k. Whenever possible, all decorations and service medals awarded an individual but not yet issued him will be supplied. Ribbons in lieu of medals, when medals are not available for issue, will be supplied. Appropriate entry of such award will be made in temporary service records.

l. Personnel will not be detained longer than three (3) days at any one place unless unavoidable circumstances necessitate a longer delay.

m. In the cases of personnel enumerated in a(4), above, matters pertaining to pay, supply, quarters, subsistence, preparation of records, and award of decorations and service medals will be accomplished at the replacement depot to which forwarded.

7. Orders.

a. An appropriate notation will be made in orders effecting return of the personnel concerned to indicate they are Evaders, Escapees, Internees, or Recovered Prisoners of War.

b. Any United States headquarters to which personnel initially report is hereby authorized to issue such orders as are necessary, including authorization for travel by air, to provide for travel to the proper headquarters shown in paragraph 6a, above.

c. Any of the headquarters listed in paragraph 6a will issue necessary orders to send personnel to their correct destination. Such orders will provide for travel by aircraft or any other means of available transportation.

d. Group movement orders issued to accomplish the actual return to the United States will:

(1) Authorize the Commanding General, Port of Debarkation, to place all Reporters on temporary duty with the Prisoner of War Intelligence Service, Washington, D. C., for a period of not to exceed three (3) days.

(2) Authorize the sending of personnel upon completion of temporary duty in Washington, D. C., to proper reception station, where leave of absence or furlough will be granted and further disposition accomplished.

e. Group movements orders, as provided for rotation personnel in PW War Department, 16 August 1944, will be issued at replacement installations.

9. Reports

a. A radiogram report will be submitted by the headquarters listed in paragraph 5, above, to this headquarters (Attention: AG Casualty Section), showing the name, rank, ASN, former organization, date of internment, capture, separation from unit if evident, date of return to military control and proposed disposition. Names will be grouped by category, i.e., "Escapes", "Evaders", etc.

b. As soon as possible after issuance of orders and so as to arrive in the United States ten (10) days prior to arrival of personnel, one copy of each embarkation order for patients and one copy of each group movement order for other individuals, will be air mailed to The Adjutant General, Attention: Chief, Casualty Branch, Washington 25, D. C., by the issuing authority. In cases of return by air, the issuing authority will make a radio report direct to The Adjutant General, Attention: Chief, Casualty Branch (Cable address AGV-A), at least three (3) days prior to departure, giving name, grade, and ASN of personnel returning by air. Where action prescribed herein is not practicable, copies of orders or radiogram reports will be furnished as early as possible.

c. The base section operating the port of embarkation will furnish the War Department the following information by radiogram as soon as such facts are determined:

- (1) The estimated time of departure.
- (2) The estimated time of arrival in the United States.
- (3) The mode of travel.
- (4) The number of individuals assigned each reception group.

9. Prior to embarkation for return to the United States a careful check will be made to insure that partial payments, when desired, have been made; that a temporary service record has been prepared, complete to the extent that conditions permit, and that all clothing and equipment required for comfort during the voyage have been issued.

10. At replacement installations, and other installations to which personnel may be forwarded for transshipment to the United States, Receptionists will be formed into reception site (en) groups and thereafter processed in accordance with DRI, War Department, 16 August 1944, the same as rotation personnel. Each of these groups will be assigned a separate code designation. Care will be taken that personnel other than Receptionists are not assigned to these groups. Recovered prisoners of war will be accorded priority in return to the United States over all other casual personnel, including rotation personnel, except sick and wounded.

11. Interrogations.

a. Preliminary (See paragraph 5a above).

b. Designated headquarters or agencies will make a detailed interrogation in accordance with instructions contained in letter, this headquarters, file AG 503.6-0, dated 6 July 1944, subject: "Detailed Interrogation of Escapees, Evaders", for the purpose of securing operational and other information and details of escape and assistance received. The security certificates required by the aforementioned letter will be executed even though a similar certificate may have been signed at a preliminary interrogation.

c. Security -- Each Repatriate returned to Allied control under circumstances described in this letter will be interviewed at the earliest opportunity with the necessity for secrecy concerning his escape or evasion of capture and will be required to read and sign a security certificate.

d. Inasmuch as CSDIC is the competent interrogating authority in this theater, close liaison must exist between the headquarters which are designated to conduct detailed interrogations, the United States Representative, and CSDIC, so that qualified interrogators may be made available by CSDIC when and if desired.

12. It is of primary importance that the emergency addressee be officially notified by the War Department before any publicity is given fact of return to military control. Therefore names of Repatriates will not be released to other than United States military forces.

13. Disposition of Naval and Merchant Marine Personnel -- United States Naval and Merchant Marine personnel who return to Allied military control will be forwarded to the nearest base section headquarters for detailed interrogation, processing, clearance by United States Representative, and delivery to Naval control in this theater at the closest point.

14. United States civilians will, after preliminary investigation as to identity and status, and to the extent necessary to secure information of immediate tactical value such as plans, order of battle, installation, equipment, etc., be forwarded to the United States Consul General nearest to place of interrogation. The United States Consul General will submit particulars of all United States civilians to G-2 Section (C.I.) AFHQ, for security clearance prior to repatriation. G-2 Section (C.I.) AFHQ, will issue the necessary military travel authorization for approved applicants for repatriation.
