MESSAGE FROM THE SUPREME ALLIED COMMANDER,
MEDITERRANEAN THEATER

To the Allied Forces in the Mediterranean:

1. Two years ago today Allied forces landed in North Africa. That was a giant stride along the road leading to the enemy's defeat. You of the sea, land and air services have done more than win great victories in those two years; you have proved that Allied solidarity is a reality, not a phrase; you have demonstrated that the three services can work together as a single combat team; you have set the pattern for other invasions. You were pioneers. What you have done here in the Mediterranean Theater has facilitated Allied successes elsewhere.

AFHQ General Orders Number 19; Section II, Number 38; Number 60, all 1943, Section I, Number 17 and Section II, Number 19, both 1944, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

I ---- APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTOR MILITARY RAILWAY SERVICE, ITALY

Announcement is made of the appointment of Brigadier R. D. WAGHORN, R.E., Director of Transportation (Br) as Director Military Railway Service, ITALY, effective 22 October 1944.

II --- APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTY DIRECTOR MILITARY RAILWAY SERVICE, ITALY

Announcement is made of the appointment of Lt. Colonel WILLIAM P. WILSON, 0412895, TC, as Deputy Director Military Railway Service, ITALY, effective 22 October 1944.

III -- DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION OF RAILWAYS IN ITALY

1. The Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY will be responsible for:

a. The advanced planning and development of railways necessary for the support of operations in ITALY under the direction of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater.

b. The proper distribution of available resources of personnel and equipment to meet the requirements in ITALY of the Supreme Allied Commander.

c. The reconstruction of railways in ITALY.

d. The operation of all railways in ITALY, except for those portions which may from time to time be returned to civilian control. The Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY, will however, exercise full control over all locomotives and cars used by the civilian operated railways with the object of affording the maximum support to military operations.

e. Technical advice on all railway matters in ITALY.

AFHQ General Orders Number 25 (cont'd)

2. In order that the Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY may fulfil his mission, all U.S. railway service troops, the Italian railway personnel, military and civilians, together with the British Transportation Service and such other military or civilian railway personnel in ITALY as may come under the Control of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, will be at the Director's disposal and will operate under his direction. In addition all railroad material, American, British, Italian or any other railroad property in ITALY that may come under his control is at the sole disposal of the Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY.

3. The Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY will report to the Chief Administrative Officer, AFHQ.

4. The Deputy Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY will report to the Commanding General, MATOUSKA on solely MATOUSKA matters.

5. The relationship between HQ AAI and the Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY will continue to be maintained in accordance with that which previously existed prior to 22 October 1944, between HQ AAI and the Director General, Military Railway Service, Allied Force, as indicated in AFHQ Nov 3/307A dated 17 September 1944.

6. The Director, Military Railway Service, ITALY has no responsibility for railway operation or construction in North Africa or the South of France.


IV --- DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION OF RAILWAYS IN NORTH AFRICA

SUBJECT : Title of Chief Commissioner.

1. By A.P.H.Q. General Order No 5 dated 24 Jan 44 Section II it was provided :

"THE DEPUTY PRESIDENT, ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION, TO BE CHIEF COMMISSIONER AND CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER."

Lieutenant General Sir FRANK H. MACKENZIE, K.C.B., D.S.O., M.C., while serving as Deputy President of the Allied Control Commission will be the Chief Commissioner of the Allied Control Commission; he will also be Chief Civil Affairs Officer of occupied territory under Allied Military Government. His Headquarters will be Headquarters, Allied Control Commission and, in addition, it will be the Civil Affairs Branch of Headquarters Allied Central Mediterranean Force."

2. By A.P.H.Q. General Order No 21 Section II para 2 dated 11 Sep 44 it was provided :

2. So much of Section II, A.P.H.Q. General Orders Number 5, 1944, as reads: "His Headquarters will be Headquarters, Allied Control Commission and, in addition, it will be the Civil Affairs Branch of Headquarters Allied Central Mediterranean Force.", is rescinded.

3. It therefore follows that the Chief Commissioner A.C.C. remains C.O.A.C. of occupied territory and may therefore appoint a D.C.O.A.C. if he so desires.

4. No reference of this matter to higher authority is in my opinion required.

Development and Operation of Railways II

I -- DESIGNATION OF DEPUTY ASSISTANT CHIEF OF STAFF G-5, AFHQ

1. Section VI, AFHQ General Orders Number 15, 1944, is rescinded.
2. Announcement is made of the designation of Colonel C.E.L. LEWIN-HARRIS, G.S., as Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff G-5, Vice Colonel the Lord MIDDLETON, M.C., T.D., relieved.

II - DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION OF RAILWAYS

1. The development of operations in the area under the operational direction of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, has made it necessary to enlarge the powers of control of the Director General, Military Railway Service. (The provisions of AFHQ General Orders Number 60, 1943, are modified as indicated below.)

2. The Director General, Military Railway Service, will be responsible for:
 - a. The advanced planning and development of railways necessary for the support of operations under the direction of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater of Operations.
 - b. The proper distribution of available resources of personnel and equipment to meet the operational requirements of the Supreme Allied Commander.
 - c. The reconstruction of railways.

d. The operation of all railways in the zone of operation of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, except for those portions which may from time to time be returned to civilian control. The Director General will however, exercise full control over all locomotives and cars used by the civilian operated railways with the object of affording the maximum support to the military operations of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater.

- e. Technical advice on all railway matters.

3. In order that the Director General may fulfill his mission, all U.S. railway service troops, the railway portion of the British Transportation Service; the Italian railway personnel, military and civilian; and such other military or civilian railway personnel as may come under the control of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, will be at the Director General's disposal and will operate under his direction. In addition all railroad material, American, British, Italian and any other railroad property that may come under his control is at the sole disposal of the Director General.

4. To enable the Director General to ensure the proper fulfillment of these responsibilities, he will establish at AFHQ a suitable headquarters, and he will be in constant touch with that headquarters.

5. The Director General will appoint executive deputies in such areas or to such task force commanders as may from time to time be determined necessary. These deputies will be responsible to the Director General for the proper discharge of the Director General's responsibilities to the Supreme Allied Commander as defined in paragraph 2 above. In addition, deputies so appointed will be responsible to the task force commander, or other commanders designated, for meeting the operational and other requirements of the area to which they are appointed, subject to the approved policy of the Director General.

6. a. Pursuant to these instructions, the Director General Military Railway Service, will immediately appoint executive deputies to the following:

(1) Headquarters, AAI

(2) Headquarters, Seventh Army.

b. Additional deputies will be appointed as and when required.

7. The Director General, Military Railway Service, will report to the Chief Administrative Officer, AFHQ.

8. The provisions of this directive will govern in case of conflict with previous directives.

9. The Director General has no responsibilities for railway operation or construction in North Africa.

1. Effective at 0000 hours 17 July 1944, the Caserta area, boundaries shown below, is designated as an exempted area under the direct control of Allied Force Headquarters.

Map reference: Sheet 172, Caserta, 1 : 100,000

Boundaries : CAPUA (incl) - generally EAST along NORTH bank of VOLTURNA River to creek junction 2000 yards EAST of LIMATOLA - SOUTHEAST to PONTE BIFERCHIA (incl) - SOUTH SOUTHWEST along highway (incl) to MADDALONI (incl) - SOUTH SOUTHEAST along railroad (incl) to crossroads at 34.9 - 63.8 - WEST SOUTHWEST along highway (incl) to CAIVANO (excl) - NORTH along main NAPLES - CASERTA highway (incl) to SOUTH bank of REGI LAGNI Canal - WEST NORTHWEST along SOUTH bank of canal to North South grid 10 thence NORTH to VOLTURNA River - EAST along NORTH bank of VOLTURNA to CAPUA.

2. The Commanding Officer, Headquarters Command Allied Force, is announced as area commander of the above area, and as such is charged with general area administration, protection, security, and coordination of allied activities within the area under announced policies or directives of this headquarters.

3. Peninsular Base Section and No 3 District will be the supporting supply agencies for the area and the Commanding Officer, Headquarters Command Allied Force, is authorized to deal directly with the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, and General Officer Commanding No 3 District in matters of supply of American and British units or personnel of Allied Force Headquarters and North African Theater of Operations, United States Army.

By direction of the President, the Soldier's Medal was awarded by the War Department to the following named British officer:

LEO KOENIGSBERT, Major, Pioneer Corps, Allied Force Headquarters (BS) B.W.A.F. (British Army). For heroism on 22 June 1943 near Storeo, Algeria. Major Koenigsbert observed an American officer in distress approximately fifty yards off shore. Realizing the swimmer's plight, Major Koenigsbert, at the risk of his life, swam into the extremely rough surf and reached the drowning officer just as he was going down for the second time. He succeeded, after much difficulty, in bringing the victim safely to shore, whereupon he immediately rendered artificial respiration and after considerable time succeeded in reviving him. The heroic actions of Major Koenigsbert are in keeping with the spirit of mutual assistance which stands out in the Allied Forces.

ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICE OF DIRECTOR OF HARBOR CRAFT,
WESTERN MEDITERRANEAN

General Order Number 11, this headquarters, cs, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The Office of the Director of Harbor Craft, Western Mediterranean, is hereby established as a Staff Section of this headquarters for the purpose of establishing an agency to accumulate data, maintain records, and submit recommendations to appropriate commanders and staff agencies on harbor craft in this theater. The Director of Harbor Craft, Western Mediterranean, does not have executive authority and is not empowered to issue instructions as to the use or movement of craft belonging to any of the services.

2. The Director and Deputy Directors of Harbor Craft will be members of the Mediterranean Shipping Board.

3. The duties of the Director of Harbor Craft are:

a. To study the ports and port operations within this theater in order to advise the appropriate higher authority relative to more efficient use of harbor craft.

b. To make recommendations to appropriate higher authority relative to more expeditious repairs to harbor craft.

c. To advise appropriate higher authorities relative to the progress and efficiency of the assembly of knockdown harbor craft.

d. To investigate and make recommendations to proper authorities for the development of local facilities for building harbor craft.

e. To consolidate and keep up to date the reports of various services on all harbor craft within the theater and submit a monthly report to the Mediterranean Shipping Board on harbor craft which will include statements as to the number of each type of craft, their current location, and state of repair.

f. To coordinate demands for harbor craft other than Nav 5362 on Washington and London for present and future operations.

g. To recommend to the Mediterranean Shipping Board the number and type of harbor craft exclusive of Naval craft required for areas and ports for their proper operation.

4. For the purpose of paragraph 3 g above, the Director of Harbor Craft is authorized to request craft from existing independent agencies and commands in the Mediterranean.

5. Nothing on this order will be interpreted as changing the ownership or authority over any ship or craft, or as relieving any service of its present responsibilities for taking-up (chartering), maintenance, and operation of ships and vessels now under its control.

ALEXANDER, G.C.B., C.B.I., D.S.O., M.C., while serving as General Officer Commanding in Chief, Allied Central Mediterranean Force, will be the Representative in ITALY of the President of the Allied Control Commission and act for and on his behalf carry out the functions of the President of the Allied Control Commission in ITALY in respect to such matters as shall be delegated to him from time to time by the President of the Allied Control Commission. General ALEXANDER will continue to be the Military Governor of such occupied territory in ITALY (including SICILY) as remains under Allied Military Government.

II DEPUTY PRESIDENT, ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION, TO BE CHIEF COMMISSIONER AND CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER.

Lieutenant General Sir FRANK N. MASON MACFARLINE, K.C.B., D.S.O., M.C., while serving as Deputy President of the Allied Control Commission will be the Chief Commissioner of the Allied Control Commission; he will also be Chief Civil Affairs Officer of occupied territory under Allied Military Government. His Headquarters will be Headquarters, Allied Control Commission and, in addition, it will be the Civil Affairs Branch of Headquarters Allied Central Mediterranean Force.

III DISBANDMENT OF HEADQUARTERS ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT, 15TH ARMY GROUP; RESPONSIBILITIES OF ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION.

1. Headquarters, Allied Military Government, 15th Army Group 5361 (Allied Central Mediterranean Force) is disbanded. NUMBER 68)HISTORICAL MONUMENTS1. Buildings.

a. No building listed in the sections "Works of ART" in the "Zone Hand-Books" of ITALY issued by the Political Warfare Executive to all Allied Military Government officers will be used for military purposes without the explicit permission of the Allied Commander-in-Chief or of the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, 15th Army Group in each individual case.

b. Commanders concerned are authorized, as a further measure of security, to close and put out of bounds for troops any of the buildings listed in AMG "Zone Hand-Book" that they deem necessary. Notices to that effect will be affixed to the buildings, and guards provided to enforce them if necessary.

c. Allied Military Government officers are prepared to furnish commanders with a list of historical buildings other than those listed in the AMG "Zone Hand-Book". These buildings are of secondary importance and may be used for military purposes when deemed necessary. Commanders are reminded that buildings containing art collections, scientific objects, or those which when used would offend the religious susceptibilities of the people, should not be occupied when alternative accommodations are available.

2. Looting, Wanton Damage and Sacrilege.

The prevention of looting, wanton damage and sacrilege of buildings is a command responsibility. The seriousness of such an offense will be explained to all Allied personnel.
