I - RESCISSION OF PREVIOUS LETTERS AND DIRECTIVES:

Letters RAAC, file AG 600(G-1), subject: "Billeting," dated 16 December 1944 and 9 January 1945; letter RAAC, file AG 600, subject: "Requisitioning of Civilian Property," dated 21 June 1944; letter RAAC, file AG 600, subject: "Private Rental of Property and Motor Transport," dated 7 August 1944; Sec IV, Daily Bulletin # 3, RAAC, subject: "Utilization of Property," dated 9 June 1944; Sec II, Daily Bulletin # 175, RAAC, subject: "Billeting," dated 18 December 1944; and General Order # 34, RAAC, dated 14 December 1945, are hereby rescinded.

II - BILLETING:

1. It is forbidden for Allied Military personnel in ROME AREA ALLIED COMMAND to live in private houses, hotels or premises unless under military control or scheduled as an authorized billet and no private arrangements will be made with the civilian population.
2. Arrangements for the billeting of Allied Military personnel on temporary duty, leave or transit will be made only by the Billeting Officer in the case of American personnel or in the case of British personnel, 238 Town Major, except where arrangements are made for such personnel to live with units located in ROME AREA ALLIED COMMAND.
3. Leave personnel will live only in the American Rest Center, 56 Rest Camp or Military hotel or billet to which they have been regularly assigned for the period of their stay in ROME.
4. Married personnel only are authorized to live in private accommodation, subject to the approval of their Commanding Officer. They will also be in possession of a pass authorizing them to live in private billets. In the case of British personnel the address of such private accommodation will be registered with 238 Town Major, Piazza ESSEDRA, and in the case of American personnel addresses will be registered with the Billeting Officer, ROME AREA ALLIED COMMAND, Istituto Nazionale Assicurazioni Building, Via Sallustiana, Room 131, Tel: 478507. All officers commanding will ensure that this registration is effected immediately and without exception.

REGULATIONS FOR U. S. ARMY OPERATED HOTELS

1. Pursuant to authority contained in letter, HQ MATOUSA, file AG 004/416 A-O, subject: "Responsibility for Supervision of Hotels in Rome Area," dated 26 September, 1944, all hotels for U.S. Army personnel in the Rome Area are under the general supervision of the Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command, and will be operated under the following regulations:

a. Guests:

(1) Civilian guests will not be permitted in officers' rooms, or above the first or main floors, except in public bars or lounges.

(2) Known prostitutes will not be allowed to enter any hotel.

(3) Unescorted women, other than those who are members of one of the agencies associated with the Allied Armies and dependents of military or civilian personnel, will not be permitted to enter any hotel.

b. Messes - All messes will be operated in compliance with existing regulations and policies of the Theater Commander.

(1) Permanent Officers - Civilian guests except other than those who are members of one of the agencies associated with the Allied Armies and dependents of military or civilian personnel, will be restricted to the evening meal only and limited to two guests per officer or permanent category person per week.

(2) Rest Leave Officers - Civilian guests, except other than those who are members of one of the agencies associated with the Allied Armies and dependents of military or civilian personnel, will be restricted to the evening meal only and to one guest per officer for each three days, or fraction thereof, during the leave period. 5500

c. Black Market - The black market will not be patronized.

d. Electricity - Electric current will be used in compliance with orders issued by the Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command.

e. Hours of Closing:

(1) Bars will be closed at 2400 hours.

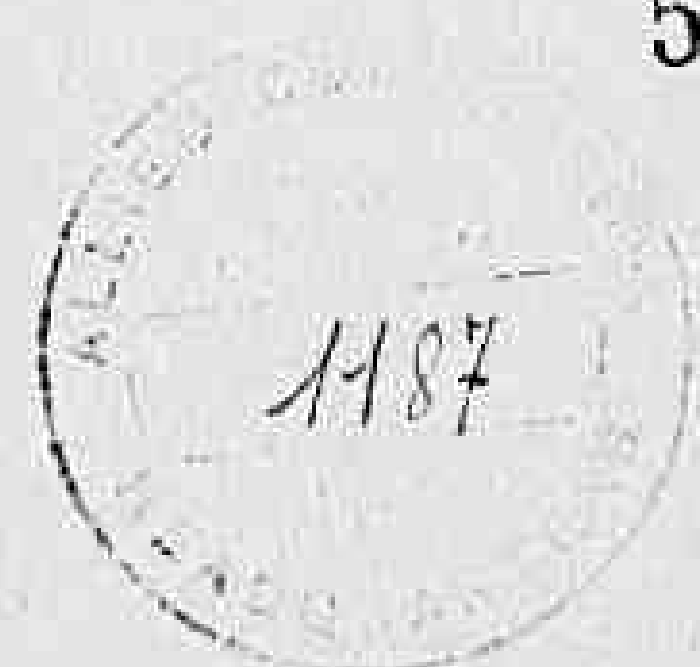

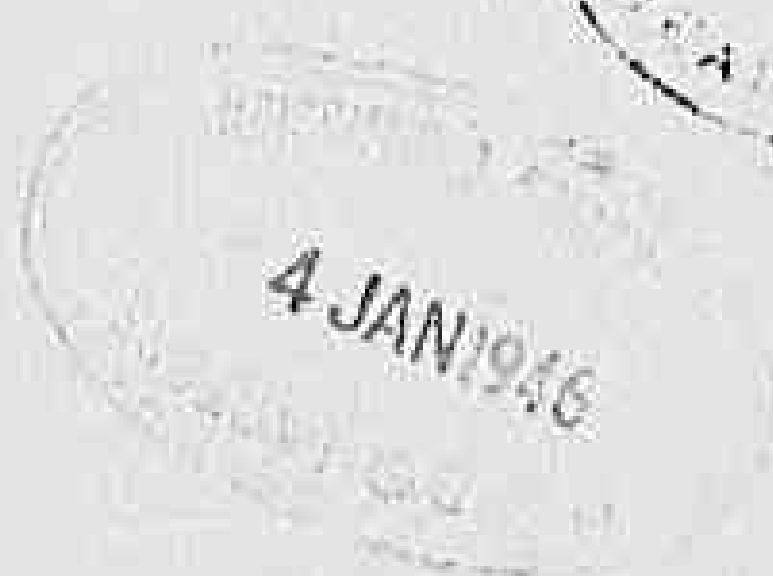
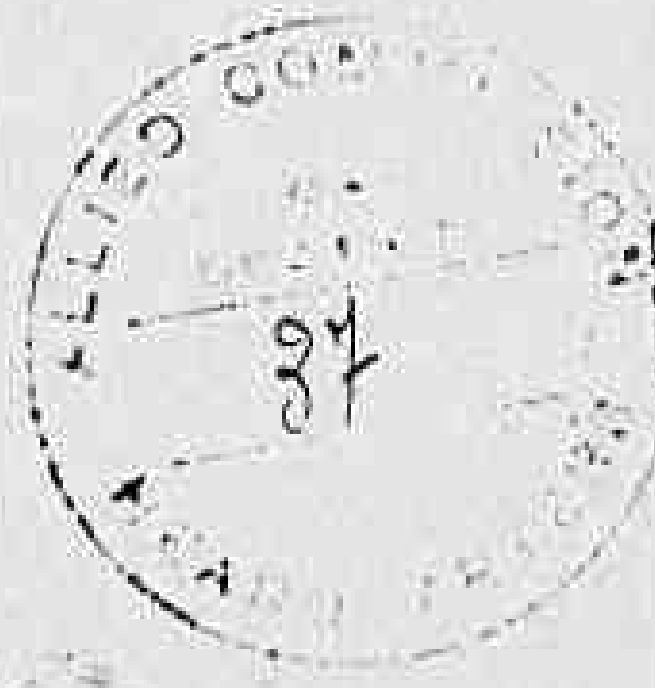

I - INACTIVATION OF 246TH ARMY GROUND FORCE BAND

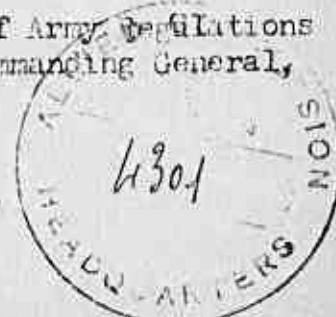
1. The 246th Army Ground Force Band will be inactivated on 30 September 1945 at 2400A hours.

4. Memorial services in honor of our late President will be held in St. Paul's Church on 15 April 1945 at 1100 hours.

5. All U.S. national flags will be displayed at half-mast for 30 days beginning at 0800 hours, 13 April 1945.
