SUBJECT : Proceedings against Dr. G. PEROTTI (formerly head of Ufficio  
Stalco of Azienda Generale Italiana Petroli -AGIP).TO : Central Operation Commission,  
Piazza Santi Apostoli No. 75 -Rome.

1. I have been instructed to convey the following information to you with a view to its being considered by the Central Commission in connection with the proceedings against Dr. PEROTTI.

2. This information is taken from a communication signed by Colonel R. B. HINES, Allied Force Headquarters Petroleum Section, Rome Area Allied Command and dated 19 April 1945.

When officers of this Section arrived in Rome on 5 June 1944, they found that:

- a) The installations and equipment of AGIP and of all the transferred foreign oil companies had been maintained in good working order;
- b) Such material and equipment, which has subsequently proved to be useful both to the Allies and the Italian oil distribution, had been successfully hidden from the Germans;
- c) Dr. PEROTTI, during the initial days, proved himself to be collaborative to the officers of this Section for the two purposes for which they were in Rome, i.e.:
  - (i) to ascertain any possible information on the oil position of the enemy
  - (ii) to organize immediately civilian distribution in Rome.

This Section further understands that Dr. PEROTTI has given every collaboration in the further organization of G.I.P. in liberated Italy.

High Commissioner for Defascism.

1. It is understood that Dr. G. Perotti, formerly Head of the Ufficio Stralcio of Azienda Generale Italiana Petroli, has recently appeared before the Committee for Defascism, has been suspended from his duties, and that he is appealing. It is, therefore, desired to put before the judging commission the facts set out in the following paragraphs.

2. When officers of this Section arrived in Rome on 5 June 44, they found that:

- (a) The installations and equipment of AGIP and of all the transferred foreign oil companies had been maintained in good working order;
- (b) Much material and equipment, which has subsequently proved to be useful both to the Allies and the Italian oil distribution, had been successfully hidden from the Germans;
- (c) Dr. Perotti, during the initial days, proved himself to be collaborative to the officers of this Section for the two purposes for which they were in Rome, i.e.:
  - (i) to ascertain any possible information on the oil position of the enemy;
  - (ii) to organize immediately civilian distribution in Rome.

2. This sub-commission is further advised that the following bodies are still under discussion :-

- (i) Lega Navale - The President of the Council and the Minister for the Interior suggest that this non-political organization which has been in existence since 21 November 1907 and had no link to do with fascism should not be suppressed.
- (ii) Associazione Combattenti.
- (iii) Associazione Militari.
- (iv) Associazione Militari.

Regarding (ii) and (iii) above the President and the Minister for the Interior suggest that these are patriotic and not fascist organizations.

(iv) Legione Volontari d'Italia.

These are patriotic organizations and not fascist.

(vi) I.C.C. - in assumption of a sporting and not a political character. The President is of the opinion that it should not be suppressed.  
(vii) Popolano - The President suggests that this is a non-political organization - with the agreement of the allies Mr. Lanzetta has been appointed as director. The President wishes that this organization, being subject to the supervision of the Minister of Public Education (Pubblica Istruzione) and of the

Minister for War, has no political aims and that the allies have given their approval to the appointment of several persons as Ambassadors.

(ix) Opere arrived in Geneva - no political aims. The allies for the Interior suggests that it should not be suppressed. (x) Political and Administrative Situation - The Minister for War has advised that not only has the situation never been favorable but that it may be that represented by the Ministry and provided a political place of refuge for anti-Communist forces during the years of occupation.

(xi) Public Affairs in Geneva - The Minister for War proposes that this organization should be made a voluntary one and that of course all other affairs be placed in Italy. General Ferris has been appointed Ambassador, with the agreement of the allies.

(xii) Inspector Grigio Provincial - The Minister for War returned by letter No. 1254 of 17 May 1944 states that this is a government organization and not a political one that it had been recognized by the allies who have made up their own staff (collaboration) at this office for lack of staff personnel.

(xiii) Organizational Situation - A letter No. 1111 of 11 May 1944 states that the Ministry of War has no political aims and also to set up a new political order. Only other this was a political order is to be held in it be possible to increase a new national organization which is not.

(xiv) General Provincial, Italy, Province - In the above letter and by the Minister stated in his letter No. 1254 of 17 May 1944. The Minister for Industry suggests that this is a non-political organization and the continuation of the old Bureau of Supplies, non-political and existing since 1942. However he is of the opinion that they should not be dissolved but be assimilated to Italy effort directly with the allied military administration.

(xv) Italian National Resistance Committee - The Minister for Industry suggests that this is a non-political organization and the Ministry of War (Prof.) has been appointed Ambassador with the agreement of the allies.

(xvi) Change in the situation. The Minister for Industry is certain that the allies are not in agreement with suppressing these organizations whose character is non-political and one of national relief.

The Minister of Italian Affairs while Minister agrees with the suppression of organizations listed under above. A request is made for the suppression of the above letter to be cancelled that it is not necessary to be suppressed these bodies and of a political order to be cancelled and not political. A request is made for the suppression of the report of the
