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The political situation in Sardinia, from information in our possession, can be stated as follows:-

1. Officials who held office under the Fascist Govt. of MUSILETTI remain in the majority or ones. No purge has been made of Fascist officials continuing on the old system.
2. Since the Allied occupied Sardinia the prisoners have not been controlled and they continue thousands of arrested persons. For example in the portion of Cagliari most of the prisoners await trial but the majority of the military have not been decanted.
3. Officials of A.D.C. in Sardinia do not like the money indispensable to a "discontinuation" of the political order in Sardinia notwithstanding that the Amintore fans, very soon took into account Articles 29, 30 and 31 of the Amintore of 25 Aug. 43.
4. On this subject the Advisory Council for Italian Affairs recommend to the Allied Control Commission:-
 - (a) That A.D.C. takes the following proposals to the Italian Govt. for the execution of Articles 29, 30 and 31 of the Amintore of 25 Aug. 43:-
 - (i) To proceed immediately with the purging of Fascist officials still concerned in local administration in Sardinia and particularly officials in the local councils, police, governments, justice, and finance, and
 - (ii) To remove M. ATTALIA, President of the province of Sardinia, who has held this position since the time of the Mussolini Govt., (iii) to recode, arrest and bring to trial, other officials who continue 3064 to hold office in Sardinia, e.g., V. MARINI, Commissioner of Police

still effective in local administration in Sicilia and partic-
ularly officials in the local councils, police, gendarmerie,

 - (ii) To remove M. ATTAVANTI, Protect of the province of Messina,
who has held this position since the time of the Socialist Govt.,
(iii) to remove, arrest and bring to trial, other officials who continue
to hold office in Sicilia, e.g., M. VAGLIO, Commissioner of Police
at Messina, and M. RAGGIO, Commissioner of the
overseas agents of the police.
 - (iv) Contact a public entity as quickly as possible into the names
of persons arrested at Messina on 15 Jan. 1944 on the occasion
of a demonstration.
- (b) To direct that ACC will supervise the execution on the part of the

Your Excellency,

The following information is passed to you in case it may be of assistance. I am not in a position to say whether or not the allegations made are correct.

It is suggested that in Sardinia your representative is meeting with certain difficulties. First, the Schedules which he requires have not arrived. Secondly, it is stated that no arrangements have been made to supply him with funds for petty disbursements. Thirdly, that no arrangements have been made to provide him with petrol and there are other minor matters as to which it is understood that the Prefect states that he has no authority to provide or arrange.

The point is I think that it is insufficient to ask the Prefect to co-operate or to assist your representative. He has not the authority to do all that may be required. He can only assist within the limits permitted by his general instructions; if more is necessary, he must either receive wider instructions from the Ministry of Interior or your representative must be given express authority to incur certain expenses, draw petrol and the like.

I do not know whether this criticism applies generally or is particular to Sardinia.

Subject: Defascism - Provincial liaison.

To : The National Commissioner, Region 6.

With reference to DP/4.2/CA or 16 NOV 1944, from H.Q., A.M.G. requesting the co-operation and assistance of the Regional and Provincial Officers to enable representatives of the High Commissioner for Defascism to obtain names etc.

Every assistance will be given as far as the Province are concerned. So far the High Commissioner for Defascism representatives have studiously avoided us. The information regarding Defascism, as I know it at the moment, is as follows.

A Provincial Commission is to be appointed of three members. One appointed by the High Commissioner for Defascism, by the Prefect, and by the Procuratore del Re.

So far the Prefects and Procuratori del Re have nominated their members but the High Commissioner for Defascism has taken no action beyond sending to the Island a pronounced Communist named GILLI, who has spent the two months he has been here either in hospital or else in dispensing Communist propaganda. He has selected three High Commissioner representatives and sent their names to the High Commissioner for Defascism. It is significant that two are Communists and one is a member of the Third Party.

They are - CAGLIARI Signor COI, a Communist,
NUORO Avv. PULITERRA, Third Party,
SASSARI A retired Carabinieri Marocchillo who is a Communist.

Lient. WOOD tells me the SASSARI man is not a very good type. He is a very rough, rather uneducated person.

The NUORO man is a very good type and is very well liked by everybody.

The CAGLIARI man is a poor type. He is coming in to see me on Thursday.

It would appear from this that the Communists, who actually are a very weak party in Sardinia, are going to endeavour to control the Separation, and it seems that we are playing right into the hands of one particular political party. There are numerous good men who never were Fascists and who stood out and suffered because they were not in accord with the Fascist rule. Yet they are passed over and people who tended to the Fascists, but now come out as Communists etc., are placed in positions of considerable importance. If this is the outcome of giving the Italians the reins then the sooner we return to A.M.G. methods the better.

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So far, the League and Procurator del Poco have nominated their members but the High Commissioner for Foreign has taken no action beyond sending to the three other institutions or else in dispensing Committee protocols. He has selected for his office, it is significant that two are Communists and one is a member of the Liberal party.

They are - GALLIANI Signor COI, a Communist,
RUCCO Signor SASSOLI
AVV. PELLEGRINI Signor PASTORE,

It is felt that at the end of the day the more dangerous and important Fascists will remain where they were, whilst the harmless and often quite efficient subordinate employees will be out of work*.
