1. Introduction - Mr. Palmer reported that, on the whole, progress in defining was satisfactory. There were exceptions, PFI were not defined. The Sub-Committee reported that the Air Ministry Commission had suspended activities but had been ordered to resume hearings. The Finance Sub-Committee reported that progress was slow; the 10.11 Commission had not held a single sitting. The Air Committee had only investigated 12 cases and had dismissed only two, but Village were not really advised as they were even as the Air Ministry had been very largely puzzled before the Ministerial Commission had started working. The Sub-Committee was advised that if they received any petitions as to the treatment received by individuals persons, if they refer the matter to their Ministerial Commission. SUBJECT: Directives for the Commissions for Reparation.

In order that HL of 2 July be interpreted and applied according to uniform criteria, I should like to make known some general directives based on inquiries submitted to the High Commission by some Commissions.

The sanctions prescribed by HL No. 159 of 27 July 1944, include besides dismissal from service, loss of right to pension, demotion of grade and reversion to the original or lower list, also the application of loss of every disciplinary measure. These refer to the sanctions prescribed by Art 56 No 1960 of 30 December 1928.

In applying these sanctions, it is most avoid applying measures which, from a practical point of view, are incompatible with the task pursued by the legislator of rehabilitation in the public administration. Therefore, it will be advisable for the Commissions to refrain generally from adopting such measures which, like the revocation of promotions or salaries, aggravate the economic conditions of the party concerned without serving the purpose of reparation. The same can be said of the substitution from the grade or the temporary removal from office; these are measures which usually and by being an obstacle to the speedy return of the administration to their normal operation.

Sanctions for civilians and an analogous sanction for military personnel will therefore suffice as "as severe disciplinary measures".

Loss of right to pension.

The Commissions for Reparation shall proceed with special care in examining the power conferred to them by Art. 22 para 1 of HL No 159 of 27 July 1944 (loss of right to pension).

It must be borne in mind that in many cases the pension constitutes the only source of income of the official dismissed from service.

It is therefore to be avoided creating economic situations, when

The Commission's recommendation by H.L. No. 155 of 27 July 1944, including the Commission's recommendation, that the right to pension, demerit of grade and retirement to the original (normal) field, also the elimination of leave and disciplinary measures. These refer to the sanctions prescribed by Art. 50, No. 255 of 20 December 1923.

In analyzing these conditions, we must avoid adopting measures which, from a practical point of view, are incompatible with the task pursued by the legislation of rehabilitation in the public administration. Therefore, it will be necessary for the Commission to refrain generally from adopting such measures which, like the reduction of salary or salary, aggravate the economic conditions of the party concerned without serving the purpose of separation. The removal of the party from the service or the temporary removal from office, these are measures which usually and by being an obstacle to the speedy return of the administration to their normal position.

Summary for civilians and an analogous sanction for military personnel will therefore suffice as its severe disciplinary measures.

Loss of right to pension.

The Commission for Duration shall proceed with special care in exercising the power conferred by them by Art. 2 Part I of H.L. No 159 of 27 July 1944 (loss of right to pension).

It must be borne in mind that in many cases the pension constitutes the only source of income of the official dismissed from service.

It is then advisable to avoid creating desperate situations, which are regarded more than by the fact that the consequences would fall also on persons who are innocent and unaware of others' faults and responsibilities, which would constitute a negative element in the life of the Nation, and a time that its reconstruction is under way.

Hence, we urge the Commissions to weigh carefully each individual case before deciding on the loss of pension, which can be fully and objectively considered as justified only in the case of a legal culpability or of serious forms of collaboration with the Republic's enemies, or in the case of other cases, instead, we must consider the economic and family conditions of the official concerned from various points of view: if the person concerned does not possess any other means of support, the loss of pension would be to him a loss of the means of support for himself and his family, it is a sad general practice to avoid the severe measure of loss of pension, provided no circumstances exist which could justify the measure.

Reinstatement of officials into service.

Since the decisions of the Commissions shall be carried out only when they have become final, the dismissed official cannot be reinstated into service on the basis of a decision of first degree, unless the time limits allowed for appeals have expired finally, or unless the Central Commission made its approval.

While the trial of first the second degree is pending, it is indeed necessary that the administrations refrain from any act which, either directly or indirectly involving a judgment on the charges, may interfere with the exercise of judgments which belong to the Commissions. The Commissions will report any interference of this kind to this office.

1. The main object of the meeting was to obtain views of sub Comm. of a scheme for expelling 3 Italy by AME order if progress under the Italian procedure proved too slow. A draft order had been drawn but one or two gaps remained for completion when the views of sub Comm. had been ascertained. The draft if put in force would operate through a Provincial Committee of Italians appointed by AME who would only have power to suspend not to dismiss. Persons suspended would later appear before the Italian Expiration Commission.
2. The first point upon which sub Comm. views were required was as to whether suspension should be with or without pay or whether that should be within the discretion of the committee. IT WAS AGREED that persons suspended should receive their basic pay without allowance as in Art 22 of Ill. 159.
3. The second point upon which advice was desired was this. It was intended to remove most quickly the heads of various services. Then to deal with the more important of the remainder and to leave, unless they were very dilatory, the lowest grades to the Italians entirely. Where should the demarcation line be drawn. IT WAS AGREED that the first priority should include grade VI and the second grade IX.
4. The next point was as to the corresponding grades in civil occupations. IT WAS AGREED that all heads should be of first priority namely Directors, Managers (including Works and Branch Managers and Technical Heads) and that all other grades mentioned in the fortnightly return should be second priority namely Deputy and Assistant Managers (whether of Head Office, Branch or Works), Senior Technicians and Senior Foremen. Heads of departments would be in this class.
5. Sir G. B. J. reported on progress of proposed legislation.
 - a) The rules of procedure had been agreed except for one point that it was now proposed to appoint the Provincial Committee centrally. He personally thought that was likely to lead to delay but the Italians were suggesting the contrary. If their lists of appointees were ready they might be right. In his acquiescing as to this, there was also to be considered whether centrally appointed commissions would be acceptable in the North.

- 5) Priority of Grades I-IV. The new proposal took the sting out of the decree, as the I-IV appeared to slow down procedure, but here again the Italians claimed that in fact acceleration would be achieved.
- 6 Sub-Commissions were asked to enquire how many persons had been invited not to attend their offices or been otherwise regularly employed and to take steps to get their cases determined quickly. They should as soon as possible either return to do the work for which they were paid or be dismissed and their pay be stopped.
- 7 It should be agreed with the Italian Government :
 - a) that persons appointed as Commissaries should be cleared by the appropriate Operation Commission before appointment.
 - b) that persons suspended by AMG should not be eligible for any new appointment until they had appeared before an operation commission and been cleared.
- 8 Sub-Commissions would meet again in 14 days time.

NOTE: - Under 6 above the next meeting would be held on 23 Oct. As the next return is for the period ending 30 (not 31) Oct. It is considered desirable to hold the next meeting on 4 Nov. Sub-Commissions are asked to do their best to get the returns in before the meeting.

- 2 With this subject in view -

 - ii Sub-Commissions should press the Purging Commission to proceed more quickly and with this object should open direct liaison with the Commissions and attend some of their sessions.
 - iii The Purging Commission should be asked to commence making returns of their actions.
 - iv That the matter should be reconsidered in 14 days time with the adequacy of progress under the present scheme.

REPORT OF A MEETING OF THE STAFF - 12 AUGUST 1944

Present : All Sub-Commission concerned except Interior.

Col. GREGORY reported that the program being made by the Italian Government and on the whole very satisfactory at least three more decisions had been received proposing further powers, these were under discussion. Sub-Commissions should be informed of the contents when these had been settled. There was also a draft of proposed regulations which were being looked into by legal. NOTES OF A MEETING ON DEFERRING - 6 AUG 44

Present: All Sections and Sub-Commissions responsible for supervising Defection (Col 3 of A/CU 250 of 15 Jul) except Army Sub-Commission.

Col Upjohn explained some of the principal features of Part II of the Decree and that we are not at present taking a sharp interest in the other parts. The object to be achieved is the removal of notorious and ardent fascists from the heads of all departments and national concerns and for the removal of all those who are notorious and conspicuous locally from their positions. It was not intended to dismiss large numbers of the under-~~secret~~ because they had been fascists. To do so might disorganise administration; it might create an unemployment problem, it would create a core of persons with a grievance. Most would require to be maintained.

Having explained the machinery, Col Upjohn impressed on the Sub-Commissions the importance of getting their Commissions at work quickly, they must press for names, excuses should not be accepted. It was not proposed to screen the persons appointed, we must trust the Italians not to appoint fascists. To screen would cause a great deal of delay but if anything was known or found out against any appointee it should be reported. It was pointed out that if all Presidents were taken from the legal side it might affect the working of the Courts. Attention would be drawn to this

The cases of all persons either removed or not re-employed would have to be brought before the Commission. Those expatriated might be re-employed. It was being arranged that we should be notified of cases against such persons so that any evidence we had might be presented and our views made known.

Attention was called to the circular letter on the decree. It would be for Regions to keep Sub-Commissions informed of conspicuous fascists who were not dealt with and also that dismissals were in fact carried out. Regions will supply Sub-Commissions with such reports and returns as may be essential to other progress but paper should be kept down as much as possible.

No person is indispensable, we are pledged to remove notorious fascists and they will be removed. If they have rendered or are rendering good work to the Allied cause they will be brought before the Commission but evidence in mitigation may be given and they may be excused or a punishment less than dismissal may be awarded under Arts 16, 16 or 17 as may be appropriate.
