I received your letter of 30 October and wish to assure you that I am fully aware of the urgent need of the Allied supplies upon which depends the good and efficient functioning of the Italian Federation of the Agricultural Syndicate.

However I wish to point out that I requested the suspension from office of signori Massida Vittorio, Troini Luigi, Tonazzi Stefano and Sbrighi Alberto, officials of the above Ente, from the Ministry for Agriculture and Forests as a result of the charges made against them and proposed to the Judging Commission the suspension from service of the above-mentioned persons.

The pre-trial investigations made by this Commission in the proceedings against the said officials have proved the following charges:

- 1) Massida Vittorio: a) malpractice - b) collaboration with the fascist republican government;
- 2) Troini Luigi : a) collaboration with the Germans after 8 September 1943; b) collaboration with the fascist republican government;
- 3) Tonazzi Stefano : a) collaboration with the Germans after 8 September 1943; b) malpractice; c) collaboration with the fascist republican government;
- 4) Sbrighi Alberto : a) capomanipolo (squad leader) of the fascist militia; b) fascist bias; c) collaboration with the fascist republican government.

Troini and Tonazzi have been denounced to the Judicial Authorities for penal action.

The particular importance and responsibility of my position, and no other reason whatsoever urged me to request the said suspension, which is fully justified by law.

Dear Sir,

This Commission does not as you know take a practice of intervening in cases of individuals subjected to suspension and it has no desire to concern itself with particulars of the suspension proceedings against the officials of the Consorcio Aguari to whom the attached correspondence refers.

The Consorcio Aguario during the last year and a half has been built up as an import organization and has become accustomed to handling and receiving for Allied supplies and this Commission views with concern the suggestion to suspend all the principal heads of the Consorcio which has been made simultaneously with an attempt to replace the Consorcio by another body.

It was an instruction issued by one of your predecessors in office with which this Commission felt itself heartily in accord, that an official should not be suspended from office unless two conditions were fulfilled: a) that his record showed that there was a probability that the suspension would ultimately benefit him, and b) that his continuance in office was in itself dangerous because his retention would either dislocate the office or be a public scandal. It seems in this Commission that these extremely proposed suspensions of persons who have been working efficiently for a long time without attracting any hostile comment do not fall within these conditions.

It is alleged that these suspensions have been made at the request of your office. Will you please be good enough to have the matter looked into to see whether suspension pending trial is really necessary and expedient to decide whether the evidence justifies proceedings.

This Commission is interested solely to ensure that important Allied supplies are efficiently and honestly handled; it has no desire that these officials should be retained if they were genuine fascists but it is so well known that regular administrators are frequently compelled to process fascists that it is reluctant to see the Consorcio which has been laboriously built up for over a year needlessly incapacitated.

1. Reference is made to the attached translation of letter received from the Federation of Consorzi Agrari.
2. The situation has arisen before, in regard to these individuals, but at no time has a case been proven warranting their epuration. There seems to be no justification for suspending them pending action this time - since three of the most important services performed by the Federation have been under the able charge of these men for a year or more.
3. Since the Minister of Agriculture only acts under the direction of the Epuration Commission, it seems somewhat inadequate to request his intervention. No capable replacements are at hand, nor will they become available. The action indicated will result in breaking up the work of the Federation, and require rather radical modifications in the current procedure of distribution of supplies. These are now handled by the Federation, but the Federation is composed of these men, and it is no longer reasonable to say that it is an anonymous body which can be maintained by casual and political appointees.
4. It is recommended that the matter be discussed with the High Commissioner for Epuration, by the Civil Affairs Section.

- Dr. Stefano Tonazzi, Head of the Produce Service "Fedesport"
- Dr. Alberto Sbrighi, Head of the Office of Collateral Societies

Compliance with the above mentioned suspension prejudices the activity of this Federation, also in relation to functions which affect your Commission, and therefore this Federation is indicating the above for such action as your Commission will believe practicable.

The Commissioner of this Federation, who has already interested himself repeatedly in this matter, if asked, will furnish all of the data that your Commission may need.

1. This Sub-Commission entirely concurs with the views put forward by Agriculture Sub-Commission.


2. It cannot be too strongly emphasized that the suspension of key personnel of the Federazione Consorzi Agrari would most seriously jeopardize the efficient handling of the receipt and distribution of imported supplies. The Federation have been charged with the vitally important work of receipt and distribution of imported supplies and they have built up an organization over a period of time and in the face of many difficulties which is now functioning satisfactorily. It will be obvious therefore that any interference with their key executives would probably throw the situation into chaos.

3. It is urged therefore that every effort should be made to examine this case as it is extremely suspicious that these proceedings have been instituted at a moment when efforts are being made by interested parties to oust the Federation from their functions and to replace them by a Body which in the opinion of this Sub-Commission are quite incapable of carrying out the work.

4. In support of the above, translation of letter received from the Ministry of Agriculture and Forests is attached.

While the eventuality is being discussed that the Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari may be excluded from the plan for reception of products for agriculture imported from abroad, this Ministry wishes to point out that the Federazione itself is the fundamental organism of Italian agriculture for the development of technical, economic and commercial functions.

The Allied Commission itself has had numerous occasions to learn and appreciate the seriousness, competency and passion with which the Federazione carried out the work entrusted to it, and you will therefore understand why this Ministry is opposed not only to the exclusion of the Federconsorzi from the plan for reception of imported goods, but also to any intervention by I.C.E., an intervention which would not be advantageous to the further progress of the service.

We are confident that your Commission will agree with this viewpoint and we shall be glad to have your reply in the matter.

As results from the past correspondence, we want to point out, that about half (of a total of 90 members) of personnel belonging to the I.S.C. of Perugia have been discharged for political reasons on 15 August 1944 by order of the I.S.C. of Region IV.

Then, by the same Allied Authority it was ordered that the personnel above mentioned should not be considered discharged, but only suspended, according to the Italian law of evacuation.

Afterwards it was pointed out that in other territories of Italy the personnel in regard to their individual records as oath to the republic fascist Government etc. continue to be in service and so the A.M.G. authorized the resumption of 10 persons, which have taken their normal work.

Actually, 36 foresters in force under the above mentioned regulation are still suspended, however, receiving always their alimentary rate, according to the Italian law, they are not doing any service at great damage to the Administration and particularly regarding the forest services, because of the insufficiency of forest personnel in that province.

On the other side, this Ministry has done everything to speed the proceedings of evacuation in regard to the above persons, but the decision of those practices because of the enormous work which the Evacuation Committee has to carry out in regard to the forest personnel can only be effected in a few months.

I therefore ask your Commission to give to the Ministry the Authority to re-examine and regulate in relation to the Italian law the position of the forest personnel in question, already suspended in mentioned province by allied authorities.

1. With reference to the memorandum which you brought to our attention during our brief discussion on the 14th, I should like to comment on the fact that this seems to quite adequately cover the functions of UNCEA insofar as they apply to the abolition of other agencies now existing in the North.

2. However, as I have explained to the Minister of Agriculture in the course of a general discussion held last Tuesday morning, the Regional Commissioners have been instructed to insure that implementation of proceedings under G.O. 95 (epuration) do not destroy the efficiency of the statistical organizations presently operating in the North, as they are supplanted by UNCEA, in view of the essential nature of their work in regulating and evaluating the harvest which is now under way.

TRANSLATION

THE U.N.S.A. SET UP IN NORTHERN ITALY

INTEFA is a new agency (Ente) that does not derive from the transformation of the Enti Economici dell'Agricoltura, nor from their Association. It was established by the Ministry of Agriculture & Forests, in agreement with the Allied Commission, by the circular issued in Salerno on 28 April 1944.

A Decree will be published shortly containing provisions formally regularizing the institution of the U.N.S.A. and definitely abolishing and liquidating the Enti Economici dell'Agricoltura and its Association.

In order to insure that the operational services of U.N.S.A. be kept going on in Northern Italy at the moment that the above-mentioned decree will be issued, it will be necessary to make the following arrangements immediately:-

1. Abolish the Ufficio Nazionale Servizi per l'Agricoltura (UNSA) established by the puppet Republican government - lawful provision No. 577 of August 30, 1944. This measure has practically transformed the Associazione Nazionale Enti Economici dell'Agricoltura (A.N.E.E.A.) in U.N.S.A., by abolishing the Enti Economici dell'Agricoltura and turning over their properties to U.N.S.A.
2. Fire all the present U.N.S.A. personnel as all its members followed the puppet republican government up North when the A.N.E.E.A. and the Enti Economici were transferred from Rome to Erba.
3. Appoint one or more trustees for all the administrative acts, the archives, the office furniture, materials and equipment of the central U.N.S.A. offices at Erba.
4. Abolish the U.N.S.A. regional coordinating offices in conformity with that U.N.S.E.A. has done with the old coordinating regional offices.
Whenever the Allied P.C. would consider that these regional coordinating offices should be utilized it would be necessary to transform the U.N.S.A. coordinating offices into U.N.S.E.A. coordinating offices and provide an opportune selection among their personnel by keeping in active service only the most capable and indispensable officials.
5. Transform the Uffici Provinciali Servizi dell'Agricoltura (U.P.S.A.) and Communal Offices (U.C.S.A.) respectively in U.P.S.E.A. and U.C.S.E.A.
6. It is agreed that the policy adopted is in accord with para 7 of 12/26/44 of 2/1/45 but the deferment should not be absolute but only for such reasonable time as may be necessary to find a substitute. AC neither wishes it to be alleged generally that it prevents the removal of fascists from office or particularly that it "protects" any particular person.
- 2. In another Reg on recently in which a Director of a Consorzio was retained because of his ability, his retention led to a demonstration which had fatal results.
- 3. The policy is that where essential work would be interrupted by the proposed removal the suspension or dismissal may be deferred but only for such minimum time as is reasonably necessary to appoint a successor whether or not that successor is as capable as the man removed.
- 4. The Agricultural Sub-Commission ^{has been} asked to find a suitable successor as a matter of urgency.

1. Attached is a copy of a letter from the Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari to the Commissario of the Consorzio Agrario Provinciale, Pisa, ordering the suspension of Dr. Antichi, Director of the Provincial Consorzio.

2. It is accused that this suspension is ordered because Antichi was a squadrista. This is true but according to him, this honour was conferred upon him while he was still a University student.

3. Dr. Antichi reported to me in July 1944 while I was in the temporary Headquarters at Volterra, and despite his rank in the Fascist Party, I decided to employ him, having regard to the urgent need for a good grain collector. Since that date he has co-operated with A.-G. 100 per cent, and is, in fact, the most energetic and efficient official in the Province with the possible exception of the Prefect.

4. The Vice Director, Dr. Mario Caccarelli is not co-operative either because he is obstructive or stupid. Instances of this have occurred on many occasions, and as recently as last week Captain Anticklan had to reprimand him for failing to obey one of the Captain's instructions. I am not prepared to accept him as Director, even as a temporary measure.

5. In view of the foregoing instructions have been issued to the Prefect that the suspension will not take effect until confirmed by the Provincial Commissioner. I strongly recommend that the matter be taken up with the Commissario in order that Antichi remain at this post, particularly in view of the importance of the olive oil collection.

6. In any event the mandate of the Commissario or even of the Ministry does not run in Allied Military Government Territory. This was made quite clear by LieutCol White, Civil Affairs Section (Spunation) when he was here recently.

- 1 This is a matter for the Minister rather than the HC. The HC's responsibility is purely investigatory and punitive; he has no means of gauging the technical responsibilities or importance of the work upon which the thousands of persons whose cases he has to review are engaged. If his investigations indicate that a man should be suspended, he may take recommendations to that effect to the Minister concerned. Now the Minister is in a position to know how the man is employed and it is for him to decide whether he will act on the recommendation or not; see Art 11 of No. 285.
- 2 If he does not wish to do so, the action he should take is there laid down. Further there is an agreement with the Italian Govt of which he is cognant with all Ministers should be aware that persons in senior responsible positions whose removal will affect the Allied War Effort will not be removed without sufficient notice to enable a substitute to be found, that alone is sufficient ground for resisting an immediate removal.
- 3 I enclose for your information a copy of the CC letter to the HC of 5 Sep which records the agreement in question.

1. We are advised by the Director-General of the Federation of Consorzi Agrari that the Ministry of Agriculture, at the request of the High Commissioner for Epuration, has directed the suspension of the Director and Vice-Director of the Consorzio Agrario, and one other employee, pending epuration proceedings. He has directed that other personnel be substituted.

2. The Rome Consorzio Agrario, from an operating standpoint, is extremely important. It handles grain imports, rationed foodstuffs, and many other items. The dismissal of these men after months in that work, and all at the same time, will handicap the Consorzio in its functions. Replacements can only be drawn from other important Consorzi, with the same problem of replacement there, for these posts must be filled by very capable technical men.

3. This Sub-Commission has advised the Federation to avoid upsetting other Consorzi to correct the situation here, and a member of the Federation staff is taking over temporarily.

4. It is requested that the attention of the High Commissioner for Epuration be drawn to the desirability of advising the Federation in advance of the dismissal of key employees, or of permitting them to remain in office pending the outcome of proceedings, so that essential services are not interrupted.
