1. Attached is a copy of a memorandum of his life and activities presented to this office by Count Amedeo D'Inzillo.
2. Count d'Inzillo cooperated with the Allied Government in the rehabilitation of the Bonifica Maccarese which has since been put into operation.
3. He has demonstrated a willingness to help the Allied Military Government now and later in the north where he has a number of important connections.
4. Count d'Inzillo has asked us to recommend him for a position as Director either of the AGIP which he informs us is still vacant or as director of the Ente Nazionale del Turismo.
5. It would be much appreciated if Count d'Inzillo could be considered for one of these positions and if this Headquarters could be informed of your action on this request.

Memorandum of Count d'Inzillo

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TRANSLATION

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D'INZILLO Amedeo born in New-York in 1907. Father, American citizen, has worked and lived in America for many years.

Owner of one of the best industrial agricultural enterprises in Calabria; part of the family is now living there; the enterprise, managed by the father himself, is in full activity. Since he came back from America, his father has dedicated himself exclusively to his own estates, purposely and always avoiding to take part in any political activity; no member of the family ever took any part in fascist policy.

An only son, he is married and has two children.

A cavalry officer permanently in active service, he has been many years out of Italy. From 1931 to 1938 he was in Tripolitania - Cirenaica and East Africa, and from May to November 1940 he was in Albania as ADC to his Excellency General Count Visconti Prasca.

He has five distinguished service medals.

When the Nazi troops occupied Rome, he put himself at the disposal of General Visconti Prasca. Because of the arrest of the same General who was transported to Poland after many sufferings, the undersigned was several times requested to present himself before the military authorities, and the German SS actively looked for him. After finding a hiding place for his family because of reprisal threats from the fascist military Authorities, he found shelter in the Basilica of S. Giovanni in Laterano, and later, always with the help of his Excellency Mons. Montini, in the American College, on the Gianicolo. Trusted by the American Rector, the undersigned, in spite of the danger, remained for more than 2 months in contact with about 40 Anglo-Americans who were refugees or who had evaded from concentration camps. He is proud to say that he is the only Italian officer who lived with these prisoners.

When the allied troops came to Rome, he fetched his family and immediately presented himself before his superiors, filling the personal questionnaire requested from him.

When the fact that he did his duty to his country will be acknowledged, the undersigned will permanently resign from the Army for family reasons, and work for the reconstruction of the Country.

He can dedicate all his activity and possibilities to the agricultural-industrial field.

Hidden for many months, he didn't earn anything since August 1943; as he was not working, he spent money but earned nothing.

Owning shares of several North Italy companies, he had to give up all dividends, for fear of being found.

The undersigned is related ^{to} or knows manufacturers or agriculturists in all Italy.

He gives his word of honour that all he said is true, and asks the Allied Regional Commissioner to recompense him morally, putting himself at his disposal for any job which might be deemed useful for an active collaboration, in the heavy task of reconstruction.

SUBJECT : Epuration.

TO : Major Fielden, Public Relations Director.

The position with regard to Epuration is this. The Italian Government has undertaken to remove fascists from positions of responsibility and power. The responsibility for carrying this out is theirs, but ACC is responsible for keeping watch on the process to see that what is done is in fact effective in removing fascists from positions of importance.

The machinery which has been devised for this purpose is to make the appropriate Sub-Commissions responsible for watching how the various ministries carry out epuration.

HRB is the most appropriate body for reporting on the defascising of the Sotto Segretario per la Stampa. The answer to your queries therefore are: 3640

- (a) That HRB is not responsible for the actual epuration but for keeping watch on the process and reporting to Admin Sec as has been ordered.
- (b) That HRB has exactly the same responsibilities toward the defascising of para statal concerns under the Sotto Segretario de la Stampa that is to watch and report how the Sotto Segretario carries out its duties.

The Epuration of Journalists which has been carried out is not of course an epuration under the decree. I enclose a translation of the Decree, Part II of which you will require to read in order to understand what you are watching.

Major Palmieri who is the Defascising Liaison Officer will have an early opportunity of seeing you and discussing the matter with you fully.

SUBJECT: Epuration

14 SEP 1944

TO : Lt. Col. White, Administrative Section

I would like to be quite clear about the attached, certain aspects of which escape me altogether. We have worked hard since we came to Rome to put through an epuration of the press - that is of journalists. Machinery has been set up to issue accreditation tickets to journalists after they have been through certain tests, including the Committee of Epuration set up specifically for this object. It will probably be necessary to follow similar lines with the cinema and radio. But I am not clear on the following two points:

(a) Has this Sub-Commission any responsibility for the epuration of the staff of the Sottosegretario per la Stampa?

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(b) In the case of films and radio which are still parastatal organizations and whose personnel are more or less state employees is epuration the responsibility of this Sub-Commission or of the Epuration Committee of the Ministry of the Interior?

SUBJECT: Epuration Committee

TO : Major L. Fielden, Public Relations Sub-Commission

1. Captain Temple consulted the Epuration Committee of the Ministry of Interior, as well as the Capo di Gabinetto of the Ministry today and was informed that the Ministry have nothing to do with press matters now, but that the Sottosegretario Per la Stampa has jurisdiction over these matters.

2. Lt Col White, Administrative Section, has therefore instructed me to inform you to make direct contact with the Sottosegretario, as well as arrangements for the handling of epuration matters which concern your Sub-Commission. Interior Sub-Commission, which originally had been assigned to co-ordinate the epuration activities for your Sub-Commission as well as other Sub-Commissions, in the Ministry, therefore have no concern with whatever arrangements made and reports compiled pursuant thereto. I suggest that you consult Lt Col White for any further information.
