



1. The Assistant High Commissioner for Operation nor wishes, with the approval of this Headquarters, to suspend in North Italy, operations under DL 159 and the orders in effect thereon which, as you are aware, have already been implemented.
2. Owing to the particular wording of Article 25 of DL 159, you will notice that the time limits within which proceedings must be concluded do not begin to run until after the restoration of the territory to Italian administration but this does not prevent the commencement of proceedings under the decree.
3. The High Commissioner has laid down, with the approval of this HQ, that the cases of persons who have been suspended shall be dealt with in priority of all other cases. Will you please see that this priority is observed and in this connection the provincial Delegates are as much answerable to you and under your control as are other Italian officials in AMG territory.
4. The coming into operation of DL 159 is not in itself any reason for suspension of activity under OO 35 or OO 46. The activities under these ⁷⁷ orders correspond to the investigatory phase under DL 159 and it will naturally be some weeks after the Provincial Delegate commences his own investigatory proceedings before he is in a position to complete his own investigations. OO 35 Commissions will, therefore, continue to investigate the cases before them and to suspend persons where they think that course desirable.
5. When DL 159 Commissions have completely dealt with the cases of persons suspended under OO 35 (that is, when DL 159 has caught up with OO 35) there will be no further reason for the continuation of the OO 35 Commissions and they will then be abolished.

6 A new operation decree No. 702 has been passed and appeared in Gazette No. 136 of 13 Nov 45 but its implementation in AGO territory is under consideration. By this decree officials of grades lower than the 7th are not exparable unless they fall within certain classes and all suspensions of such officials are revoked. GO 35 Commissions are only the regard of DL 159; and the reasons for suspension in GO 35 are the same as those for dismissal in DL 159. As officials of grades lower than the 7th are no longer normally dismissable and their suspensions are revoked by the new decree there is no reason for continuing, in AGO territory, the suspensions already ordered of these classes of officials. You will, therefore, take such action as may be necessary to terminate subject to your own discretion as mentioned in LF/3.3a/UA of 10 Nov 45, the suspensions of all persons in the "affected" category of GO 35.

You will suspend action with regard to officials within the "routine" category of GO 35 (including all school teachers) until you receive a copy of the text of the decree. The cases of all Grade 8 - 9 officials and recent ones will be examined by the GO 35 Commissions to see if any of them should be dealt with under any of the special clauses under Art 2 of the new decree. If so, their commissions will not be revoked but that of officers not within these classes will be revoked subject to your discretion.

8 As soon please arrange for GO 35 Commissions to hand over to the Provincial Delegates the relevant documents and other documents relative to all officials of Grades 1 - 7 who have been suspended and also officials of lesser grades who in your opinion should be proceeded against under Art 2 of the new decree.

10 Future statistical returns will involve only officials in the grades 1 - 7 (including analogous civilian ranks) plus the relatively few officials of lesser grades who are being especially proceeded against.

11 The appropriate instructions as to GO 35 apply also to GO 46.

- 1 Under the Italian Government's new proposals for defusing which are expected to come into force at a fairly early date, officials of grades lower than 7 will no longer be liable to dismissal. You will accordingly instruct CO 35 Commissions that they will hereafter take no further steps whatever with regard to investigating the cases of or suspending officials of the deferred class.
- 2 Your attention is strongly called to clause 16 of the Administrative Instructions issued with CO 35 and especially to the second paragraph thereof which appears to be being completely ignored by CO 35 Commissions.
- 3 Returns under CO 35 for the month ending 31 Oct 45 and the subsequent returns will show only two categories - invalid and routine.
- 4 Persons of the deferred class who have been suspended will normally be re-instated but if serious friction is likely to ensue, you have a discretion to continue the suspension. You will bear in mind however that it is not intended to exercise any such discrimination outside AMG territory as the decree proposes to abolish all suspensions of officials lower than Grade 7 and even to permit the re-employment of suspended persons of Grade 7 & higher where the Department or Command think fit.
- 5 On the handing over, schools of persons in the deferred class will not be handed over.
- 6 Instructions as to Grades 8 and 9 officials will be communicated to you later when the decree is actually passed, but no case of a grade 8 or 9 official will be dealt with unless and until all cases of senior officials have been completed (viz clause 16 of the Instructions).



- 1 I enclose a copy of a letter addressed by the Lytton Commission or the Communication Ministry sitting in Milan to the G.M. of Giosa, No 546/33/R/3 of 12 July. The letter is quite remarkable except for the fifth paragraph.
- 2 D. 35 was not drawn to allow persons of one Region being operated by the Commission of another. It is not administratively sound that nothins and orders signed by an officer of one region should apply inside another. D. 35 also allows a personal hearing. A central hearing in Milan is neither reasonable nor practical; such a ruling would in practice deny the right specifically granted by the order.
- D. 35 also lays down who shall be responsible for the collection and extraction of certain personnel. The Commission has no power to vary the order by directing that they shall be dealt with in some other way (e.g. be submitted by G.M.s) nor to require that evidence and documents shall be submitted to G.M.s.
- 3 The Commission of the Communication Ministry will be instructed to withdraw the paragraph referred to. Arrangements must be made for local commissions. When D. 35 comes into force, Commissions under that decree to determine final rules over and should act centrally; the regulations provide for it -- but that is no their matter.

1. In the Region of Liguria, and particularly affecting the city of Genoa, it is estimated that approximately 1500 Railways employees were summarily dismissed from employment by the C.I.N.

2. The "Il Tribuno del Popolo" a Genoese newspaper of 20 July 1945, page 2 column 2 & 3, contained two separate letters of comment. One deplored the fact that the Provincial Employment Commission at Palazzo Ducale (Genoa) had not rescinded a single Schedule 2 personnel slate in its mass contrary to the provisions of CO 35. That letter went on to point out the hardships that had resulted.

3. The second letter was quite remarkable as a result of the situation and asked the Provincial Commission of the Editor as to what was his conception of "Reparation" and went on to ask if it is possible to separate non-Communist personnel who are non-Collaborationists, then would it not be possible for the C.I.N. to carry out his wishes of the workers committee and re-instate these expatriated workers.

4. A few days ago an employee of the Railway called at the Legal Division of the Spurteria. He stated that when he had gone to the president of this office H.L.O. called in the chairman of the Legal Committee and so furnished him with information to undertake such expatriation. On receipt of this advice under CO 35 he was informed that this committee had no jurisdiction to undertake such expatriation. Legale Division of the Spurteria. 5. As result of this letter it now appears that no action has been taken by the local commission under CO 35 in respect to Railway Employees by way of Spurteria or revision of re-instatement.

Commission at Palazzo Ducale (Genoa) had not received a single signed personnel stating this was contrary to the provisions of GO 35. That letter went on to point out the hardships that had resulted.

3. The second letter was quite rebellious as a result of the situation and asked the pertinent question of the Editor as to what was his conception of "Epuration" and went on to ask if it is possible to epurate non criminal personnel who are non-collaborationists, then would it not be possible for the CLN to carry out the wishes of the workers committee and re-instate these epurated without waiting the actions and decisions of the GO 35 Epuration Committee.

4. A few days ago an employee of the Railway called at the Legal Division of this HQ. and stated that when he had gone to the President of the Epuration Committee under GO 35 he was informed that his committee had no jurisdiction to undertake such epuration. On receipt of this advice the R.L.C. called in the chairman of the Legal Committee of the CLN who could give no explanation. Later on discussing the matter this chairman stated he had had a conversation with the President of the Epuration Committee and was shown a letter from the secretary for the commission of Communication Ministry of Milan. An English translation of this letter is enclosed for your information.

5. As result of this letter it now appears that no action has been taken by the local commission under GO 35 in respect to Railway Employees by way of Epuration or reviews for re-instatement.

6. This HQ. had no knowledge of the such insensitivity on the part of the Epuration Committee or of the existence of any such letter prior to 3 or 4 days ago. It would therefore be appreciated if this HQ. could be fully advised.

7. The immediate protest in Genoa was that they objected to submission to such an Epuration Commission stating they couldn't get witnesses to Milan, that such Commission could not know the former political and social factors under which they lived and in any event objected to central direction and rule from Milan.

Number 25 : Referring to Instruction General Order No.35)

14 June 1945

Several important questions concerning the interpretation and application of various provisions of order 35 have been raised by provincial officers and provincial government commissions. Some of these have been covered by previous directives and instructions. In the interest of uniformity, supplemental administrative instructions will be issued from time to time, as needed for the situation of provincial governments and through them for the operation of commissions in each province.

1. Article 27 of "The & Statute" relating civil-service employees who were forced to leave employment to assist National Government.

Article 27 (c) of General Order 35 provides that any person who has pledged allegiance to the Republic of Peasant Government shall be suspended from service.

Several provincial commissions, commissions feel that Article 27 likely to occur if this provision is applied universally to all "pre 8 Sept. 1943" employees who were forced as a condition of retaining their employment to allegiance to the Peasant Republican Government.

Provision for taking into account existing circumstances to change of this type is contained in Circular No. 1 in the booklet of Instructions for military commissions entitled "Sesquicentennial Provincial Commission Investigation Peasant" issued by the Allied Commission February 1945.

If in the course of their investigations into matters which fall within their competence, the Provincial Inspection Commissions come across facts which indicate that action under part III of D.L.L. 159 may be desirable, they should report such facts to the Intendente di Finanziaria as a basis for further action by the Italian Government at a later date.

2 It is true that there is more than one form of oath. The oath of fidelity and loyalty referred to in the circulars is the oath administered to Senior Government Officials and does not refer to that taken on a large scale by quite minor officials (who alternatively would probably be covered by para 5 of Circular No 2) which is the oath to the Republic (not the Government) and is not within the intention or wording of the order.

3 As mentioned in the preface to the handbook and implied by the letter referred to above, separation is to be carried out in the spirit of the High Commissioners circulars. GO 35 is based on IL 159.

4 It is thought that these circulars sufficiently answer your enquiries.

1. Section (e) of Art. II of the above General Order states in substance that persons who have pledged allegiance to the Republican Fascist Government shall be suspended from service.

2. Many persons in this Province employed by various organizations took an oath to the "Repubblica Sociale Italiana". As an example, I append copy of such an oath taken by employees of the Ferrovie dello Stato, who have several thousand employees. I have seen a directive of this company to its personnel, which states that they must sign such an oath or be dismissed.

3. There are, in my judgment, many thousands of employees who have taken such an oath and who will, either under General Order No. 35 or D.L. 150, be subject to suspension or dismissal. The extent of this may be such that some agencies or concerns may have to suspend operations for lack of employees.

4. I have discussed with a number of Italian officials the difference, if any, between "Republican Fascist Government" and "Republican Sociale Italiana". It appears that members of the P.N.R. took an oath directly to the Republican Fascist Government. Other persons took an oath to the Repubblica Sociale Italiana as shown in the attached paper. If any distinction can be made, it would appear that one oath is to the Government and the other to the Republic.

5. Under the circumstances please advise me if taking the oath attached hereto is cause for mandatory suspension under Section (e) of Art. II.



- 1 Reference your R/507/3 of 18 Jan. An DL 159 has been implemented in Pesaro it is considered that confusion would be likely to be occasioned if GO 35 were put into operation at the same time. The High Commissioner has been asked to expedite the setting up of the Italian Reparation Commission.
- 2 The Provincial Commissions are responsible only for defascising employees of the smaller and purely local concerns, they cannot defascise employees of Government departments or of concerns of national importance. The latter are defascisable centrally; the non-appointment of provincial commissions in no way stops their operation. What has delayed matters is not the non-appointment of provincial commissions but lack of transport which has delayed the sending of central representatives down to conduct investigation locally.
- 3 The High Commissioner is hoping to get over some of this difficulty by appointing divisions of the "central" commission to sit locally especially for the transportation, communication and education services.



1. The Commission is extremely reluctant to authorise the posting of General Order 35 where the Italian Government Decree D.L. 159 is already working, unless there is evidence of a complete breakdown of their system.

2. I am therefore proposing to bring pressure to bear on the Italian Government to expedite the functioning of the Commission in Pesaro Province and will endeavour to find out why they have failed to take action so far; it is, I suspect, because of the change of Government and the change of the High Commissioner and Assistant High Commissioner for Emigration. In this instance I think we must allow them some latitude before threatening the Government with G.O.35.

1. I do not think that you need be unduly alarmed at the delay involved in putting G.O. 35 into effect. Having obtained authority from this Headquarters to put G.O. 35 into effect it is only necessary for you to instruct any given Provincial Commissioner to publish a Provincial Order putting it into operation.

Copies of the Order and Administrative Instructions have been sent to you and therefore there does not seem to be any ground for anticipating a delay.

2. As I pointed out at the last Siena meeting (see Minutes, para 6) the real object of G.O. 35 was to provide for an operational procedure in the north where it is to be expected that there will be substantial delays before the Italian Government can appoint Commissions.

In Tuscany Commissions have already been appointed under D.L. 159 and are working, and it would be very unfortunate if we introduced yet another system in the absence of a complete breakdown of this system in your Region, and I think that G.O. 35 should only be instituted in existing liberated areas until after a solemn warning to the Government that they are failing lamentably to carry out their duties, citing specific instances of such failure.

3. Accordingly I would prefer to leave the matter where it is until you have evidence of a complete breakdown of the Government's procedure.

1. It was my understand from the discussion at the last Regional Commissioners' conference in Siena that General Order No. 35 was to be made operative only when Provincial Commissioners or AMG were being criticized for failure to remove fascists promptly.

2. I have explained the situation to Provincial Commissioners. There are no specific instances in this Region of criticism for failure to act against fascists in territory under Regional control.

3. I now understand from my Legal Officer that there are two steps in putting General Order No. 35 into effect. First, the Region must apply for authority to put it into effect and publish a Regional Order authorising Provincial Commissioners to invoke General Order No. 35. Second, Provincial Commissioners, if and when situations arise thereafter which make the use of General Order No. 35 advisable, should post General Order No. 35 and publish a Provincial Order announcing that it will be put into operation as of a certain date.

4. Since the object of General Order No. 35 is to facilitate prompt action if and when the Italian channels of epuration fail, I hereby apply for authority from the Allied Commission to put General Order No. 35 into effect in Toscana Region with the understanding that it will be put into effect in any particular Province only when the necessity for its use in that Province arises.
