By provision issued on 13 Jun 45 and in accordance with General Order N. 35 the Allied Military Command of Vercelli set up this Section of the Puration Commission which started functioning immediately. Since no provision was issued ordering the cessation of such functions, these continued in being until February 1946.

The Prefecture of Vercelli has made arrangements for the payment of salaries to the members of the a/m Commission up to 31 Dec 45 but has not given the bonus which State employees are entitled to receive from 1 Oct in accordance with the new provisions, nor has it given the Christmas bonus which the members of the Commission were entitled to receive having worked for over six months.

The members of the Commission want to bring this matter to the attention of the Allied Commission, in whose name they were nominated, kindly requesting to take the matter up with the Prefecture of Vercelli so that payment of salaries be made ~~perpetuated~~ up to 28 February 1946 and bonuses be granted for period previous to 31 December 1945.

Each of these decrees provides procedures for the enforcement of D.L. 159. D.L. 6 Oct. 1944, No. 238, provides the required legislation for payment of expenses. The required funds should be requested through the Intendant of the Province of the province by the principal officer of the Provincial Commission under capitoli 286 and 287 (1945-46) of the Minister of the Treasury.

TRANSFER NORTH In this case must be judged how much will was involved in the decision to follow the fascist Government north. If an employee was threatened in any way to such an extent as to remove all freedom from the choice and oblige him to register or suffer the consequences, he should not be considered fully guilty.

On this point, by the way, it is well to point out that the fortunate escape of all the employees who remained from suffering damage could not be foreseen.

The amount of will to collaborate should be judged by careful investigation from the actual collaboration given after the Government was transferred. The fact that special conditions were granted to those who followed the Government should not be sufficient reason to impose sanctions; whatever profits gained from higher wages may be ordered to be forfeited.

DISCUSSION OF THE CHARGES - I have seen many cases of persons submitted to epuration proceedings and acquitted in consequence of founded arguments submitted in ^{the} defence, which had not been collected in the documents or evidence merely, because the person concerned was unaware of the proceedings being taken against them. In order to avoid unnecessary delay caused by proceedings which might easily be eliminated if the evidence and arguments in favor of the accused were duly discussed, I suggest that all cases of persons whose names are submitted for epuration should be thoroughly examined and discussed before beginning the proceeding unless there are absolutely sure proofs which constitute in themselves evidence of guilt.

It may seem that many of the principles I have discussed are too mild to enable epuration to operate thoroughly. But in view of the urgency of satisfying the people's desire to see a quick and effective epuration, it is most desirable to lighten the task of the epurators.
