A group of Maritime entrepreneurs have given me the enclosed letter, to be sent to you for whatever action that is within your jurisdiction.

I should be very grateful if you will do something for 10 families which are suffering because they are not able to obtain employment since the maritime authorities of Cagliari protect only - through an order, the most lurid fascist whom the Epuration Committee should have ousted from this city long ago.

I shall await your reply on the matter. Meanwhile, accept my warmest thanks.

TRANSLATION NO. 721

CAGLIARI, 13 APRIL 1945

Dear Sir,

I wish to inform you of the following:

Comrade Giorgio Lunco of Odesa has been here in Cagliari and he kindly refers us to you in order to obtain justice for what is taking place in this city.

During the dictatorship's fascist band, headed by squadrista Enrico Fernis, a rabid collaborator of the Germans, had complete control over the port, together with the following persons:

Vincenzo Brandi, former officer of the Italian army who was demoted for theft.

Salvatore Lerocca, boatman and stool pigeon of the fascist police and Ignazio Campesolo, spy for the fascist party.

Many honest Maritime agents and entrepreneurs have had to endure for almost 20 years the grave burden of these spies and with the fall of fascism we did not find the work as we had been expecting.

The party has fallen; however, the people in office are all fascist. Consequently things have become worse and the above mentioned band continues to work in the port. Indeed, now more than before, since Colonel Borghi, commander of the Navy HQ, of Cagliari, another well-known fascist, has issued an order to the effect that only the association of Enrico Fernis, invalid of the fascist revolution, must work in the customs' area.

Many of us Maritime entrepreneurs, having been unemployed for more than 2 years, find it difficult to support our families, have asked the authorities for work; they not only have denied us to enter the port, but have even forbidden us to work, saying that Italy is at war and therefore the only qualified concern is that of the heroic scierra littorio, Enrico Fernis, the famous propagandist of hatred for the English, the Russians, the French and the Americans.

Persecuted for so many years by fascism, we are tired of this continuous tyranny, wish to ask the Legation to help us and that, above all, Enrico Fernis, Lt. of the fascist militia be ousted from this city.

As we have always been loyal to your Nation, having risked imprisonment, having

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As we have always been loyal to your Nation, having risked imprisonment, having been persecuted and humiliated, now ask you to administer justice and to put an end to this authority of Cagliari who continues to protect fascist delinquents.
