Major Stearns: reference folio 25:

- 1) This memo concerns Italian Civilian personnel employed by both British and United States Forces and by civilian firms doing work of operational importance for the Allied Forces.

Men falling within the following categories will be listed on separate forms:

Category I - Skilled Labor employed in Military installations.

Category II - All other labor.

- 2) The local British or U.S. Labor representative will complete the certificate appearing on the application form stating whether or not replacements can be provided from civilian sources. He will then forward as follows:

Category I - To appropriate Head of Service or Chief of Special Staff Section at AFHQ, who will in turn forward 2 copies to the appropriate exempting authority with his recommendation.

Category II - To the appropriate exempting authority.

- 3) Exempting Authorities listed on back of page 25. C.O. of ALOOM is one.

The Exempting Authority will take into consideration the certificate of the British or U.S. labor rep. but will not authorize exemption in any case unless satisfied that the retention in employment of the individual concerned is so essential that such individual will be of greater value to the Allied war effort by remaining in his present capacity than he would be if called into the Italian Military Service.

Where exemption is granted the Exempting Authority will complete a Certificate of Exemption and will forward it together with one copy of the application form to the appropriate Italian Authority.

The Certificate of Exemption will be sealed and countersigned on behalf of the Italian Authorities and returned to the Exempting Authority for onward transmission to the employing unit who will hand it to the person exempted.

- 4) Should the Italian Authorities take exception to an exemption authorized by an Allied Exempting Authority, they will return the Certificate of Exemption, with their comments but without Seal or Countersign, to the Exempting Authority, through AMLA, for review. Final determination in each case will rest with the

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Category I - To appropriate Head of Service or Chief of Special Staff Section at AHC, who will in turn forward 2 copies to the appropriate exempting authority with his recommendation.

Category II - To the appropriate exempting authority.

3) Exempting Authority listed on back of page 25. O.C. of AHC is one.

The Exempting Authority will take into consideration the certificate of the British or U.S. labor rep. but will not authorize exemption in any case unless satisfied that the retention in employment of the individual concerned is so essential that such individual will be of greater value to the Allied war effort by remaining in his present capacity than he would be if called into the Italian Military Service.

There exemption is granted the Exempting Authority will complete a Certificate of Exemption and will forward it together with one copy of the application form to the appropriate Italian Authority.

The Certificate of Exemption will be sealed and countersigned on behalf of the Italian Authorities and returned to the Exempting Authority for onward transmission to the employing unit who will hand it to the person exempted.

4) Should the Italian Authorities take exemption to an exemption authorized by an Allied Exempting Authority, they will return the Certificate of Exemption, with their comments but without Seal or Countersign, to the Exempting Authority, through MIA, for review. Final determination in each case will rest with the Exempting Authority, but full consideration will be given to the views of the Italian Authorities and MIA.

5) Exemptions granted under the provisions hereof will be valid only for a period of 6 months with effect from date of exemption.

6) Where an application for permission to retain personnel in employment is refused, the employing unit may continue to employ such personnel until called up by the Italian authorities.

I -- ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES (ITALIAN) BOARD

1. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 41, 1944 is rescinded.
2. The Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board and the various Committees established by it are dissolved.
3. Matters, which formerly required the decision of the Board, will be referred, for final action, through G-5 Section to the Office of the CAO which will be responsible for the necessary Allied and/or Italian coordination.

II -- LOCAL RESOURCES IN ITALY, MAINLAND AND ISLANDS

1. The following instructions are hereby rescinded:
 - Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 42, 1944
 - Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 46, 1944
 - AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 52, 1944
 - Section I, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 2, 1945
 - Section I, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 13, 1945
 - Section II, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 24, 1945
 - Section I, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 29, 1945
 - Section II, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 32, 1945
2. Consequent upon the termination of the activities of the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board the procedures outlined herein will be adopted in obtaining local commodities within Italian territory.
3. The following definitions are applied to commodities/materials required by the procurement services and agencies of the Allied Forces will be adopted in communications regarding local resources.
 - a. Controlled items are those items which are not available to the civilian population until the Allied Forces needs have been satisfied.
 - b. Restricted items are those which can only be procured by the Allied Forces after the essential needs of the civilian population have been met.

Schedules of controlled and restricted items are attached at Appendix "A".

4. Procedure

Any known stocks of controlled items will be made available by the appropriate Ministry of the Italian Government to meet the needs of US/Br Military Services.

Procuring agencies desirous of obtaining supplies of restricted items in any portion of Italy except VENEZIA GIULIA will approach the appropriate Ministry of the Italian Government to ascertain whether surpluses exist above essential civilian needs. If in the opinion of the Italian Authorities there are no surpluses no purchase will be made without prior reference to the CAC's Office as set forth in paragraph 3, Section I. In VENEZIA GIULIA, all transactions relative to the procurement of local resources will be handled by the military procuring agencies directly with the proper AME representatives in that area. Detailed procedure in respect of locally produced foodstuffs is given in paragraph 5 below.

5. Allocation of Locally Produced Foodstuffs

a. In principle, locally produced foods which are readily stored or transportable, and for which transportation can be secured, will not be made available for allocation to the Allied Forces. Specifically, the following are not so available:

Dried Vegetables
Dried Fruits

b. Priorities and Procedure

(1) Hospital Requirements. The certified minimum requirements for hospitals for patients only, both British and American, will be met, and nothing in this instruction is to be read as limiting the necessary minimum supply of locally produced products to hospitals.

(2) Ship's Crews, Italian Armed Forces and Midshift Meal Requirements.

The requirements of foodstuffs for:

- (a) The victualling of the Allied Navies which are operating from Italian ports and are unable to obtain their requirements elsewhere.
- (b) The provision of the locally produced element of the mid-shift meal for Italian civilian employees of the Allied Forces, will be made available as a second priority after meeting the needs of hospitals (see sub-paragraph (1) above). S & T, GHQ CE, and QI, PBS, (both incorporating the needs of such other Allied services as they supply) will notify the Ministero Alimentazione of the Italian Government by the 10th of each month of their intended purchases during the following month of foodstuffs to meet the priority requirements as authorized in sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) above, stating quantities and areas of requirement.

- (3) Normal Maintenance. The Ministero Alimentazione will forward to S & T, GHQ GEF, and QM, PBS, by the 20th of each month a declaration of the anticipated surpluses of foodstuffs above the essential needs of the civilian population, after deduction of the amounts notified in sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) above. The Ministero Alimentazione will not withhold from declared surpluses any commodities for use outside the area in which they are produced unless it has been established that they can be delivered in good condition in the areas in which they are required. Such surpluses may be purchased by Allied procuring agencies to meet the normal maintenance requirements of the Allied Forces. Allied Naval shore personnel, MWT and WSA vessels, and Allied Naval ships which can obtain their requirements elsewhere, will be considered in the same priority as the Allied Armies. S&T, GHQ GEF, and QM, PBS, will agree the proportions which each will obtain, taking into account the needs of other consumers (i.e. RN, USN, EPL, etc.) and will notify the Ministero Alimentazione of the allocations so made. Any case of dispute on allocations will be submitted to the office of the CAC, AFHQ for settlement.

c. Spot Surpluses

Surpluses additional to the declared anticipated surpluses referred to in paragraph a(3) above may arise in some localities. These will be known as "spot" surpluses. SPFAI's (Sezioni Provinciali Alimentazione) in Italian Government Territory and the Regional Supply Officers in AEE/AC Territory are responsible for ascertaining whether spot surpluses are required or not for civilian consumption in other areas and can be moved. If they are not required or cannot be moved, Allied Purchasing Agencies may procure such surpluses without reference to the Ministero Alimentazione.

d. Exchanges

When the surplus of green or root vegetables above civilian needs is inadequate to meet Allied Force requirements, Allied Services may offer the equivalent food value of preserved vegetables to the Ministero Alimentazione in substitution for such green and root vegetables as they require to be made available.

6. Italian Government Controlled Materials

The Italian Government is exercising a control over certain materials which do not necessarily appear on the "Controlled" or "Restricted" list of **1262**

A list of all materials controlled by the Italian Government is given at Appendix "B".

It is not the intention that the control by the Italian Government of the items enumerated should in any way prevent duly authorized agents of the Allied Forces from obtaining supplies as required.

To assist the Italian Government in its task and to avoid delay, all purchasing orders or similar documents of authority issued by Services in respect of any of the items listed at Appendix "B" must be endorsed prior to presentation to the person or firm holding the item concerned, by the Italian Provincial Offices of Industry and Commerce (Uffici Provinciali dell'Industria e Commercio).

7. Italian Civil Import Programme

No items which are included in the Italian Import Programme or articles manufactured from items included in the Import Programme will be procured without prior reference to the CMI as set forth in paragraph 3, Section I.

III- ELECTRIC POWER

1. The control of electric power in Central and Southern Italy will be returned to the Italian Government by 30 November 1945 subject to priority of military requirements.

2. Interested sections of this headquarters, when necessary, in Italy will deal directly with the proper agency of the Italian Government on controversial matters relating to electric power. Those sections may, if deemed necessary, convene such committees as may be desired to consider electric power matters. Matters having Allied implications will be submitted, for final action, to the Office of the SAC which will be responsible for the necessary Allied and/or Italian coordination.

3. The following HQs and Services will be represented on any central committee which may be established by the Italian Government to coordinate the distribution and utilization of electric power:

PRC (representing both PRS and HEUUSA)
 HQ VIII Corps
 HQ 3 District
 HQ 2 District
 HQ 1st Army Allied Command
 HQ Allied Commission
 Director of Works GSC GAF
 Director of Military Railway Service

IV - INDUSTRIAL COORDINATION

1. Controversial matters formerly handled by the Industrial Coordination Committee of AFHQ (I) Board will be referred, for final action, through the G-5 Section to the Office of the SAC which will be responsible for the necessary Allied and/or Italian coordination.

2. To effect the procedure outlined in paragraph 1 immediately above, subparagraphs a, b and c of paragraph 4 of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 14, 1945 are amended, and the following substituted therefor:

"c. Allied Commission then may submit the matter, for final action, to the Office of the SAC which will be responsible for the necessary Allied and/or Italian coordination."

3. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 14, 1945 is amended as follows:

So much of paragraph 2, as reads, "Section III AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 14, 1945" is amended to read, "Section II of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 14, 1945".

So much of paragraph 5b, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 14, 1945 as reads, "Surplus materials, as declared under the provisions of Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 46, 1944, are subject to allocation as set forth in that Memorandum", is amended to read, "Controlled or restricted materials as specified in Section II of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 54, 1945 are subject to allocation as set forth therein".

V -- ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES SECTION

1. The Allied Force Local Resources Section will be inactivated by 31 December 1945.

2. Upon inactivation of AFLRS, Section II of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 20, 1945 is rescinded.

3. Matters formerly referred to the AFLRS will be taken up initially with that section of AFHQ, GINQ CEF or MTOUSA having primary interest therein. Matters having Allied implications will be submitted, for final action to the Office of the CAG which will be responsible for the necessary Allied and/or Italian coordination.

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APPENDIX "A" to AFM, Admin Memo # 54.

CONTROLLED ITEMS

1. Standing timber in the two areas reserved for British services in CALABRIA.
2. Timber in that part of the Province of UDINE lying to the north of UDINE plus the area enclosed by map references B 8460 - B 7360 - B 8080 - C 0380 (Sheet 3, ITALY Road Map 1/200,000), subject to local industry being maintained.

RESTRICTED ITEMS

1. Phosphate Rock.
2. Tanning Materials.
3. Cellulose for paper making.
4. Soap.
5. All foodstuffs including olive oil but excluding wine and salt.
6. Carbon Bimulphide.
7. Poplar Wood.

MATERIALS CONTROLLED BY THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

METALS

1. Iron bars, iron plates, tin plates.
2. Steel - in blooms, ingots, billets and slabs - other than special machine and tool steel.
3. Structural steel, sectional dimension of 150 mm or less.
4. Aluminum in pig, ingots, plates or semi-finished materials, (rolled, drawn, powders, grains, etc.).
5. Scrap metals other than copper and lead.
6. Aluminum scrap.

BUILDING MATERIALS

7. Trunks only of - fir, larch, pine and chestnut trees, average sectional dimension not less than 15 cms.
8. Sawn timber of the above mentioned trees (small boards, planks, big planks, canals, etc.) with a thickness of 20 mm. or more.
9. Beams of the above mentioned trees regardless of manufacture (axed or sawn), sectional dimension not less than 15 cms. x 15 cms.
10. Small beams of the above mentioned trees regardless of manufacture (axed or sawn), sectional dimension not less than 7 cms. x 7 cms.
11. Slats of the above mentioned trees regardless of their sectional dimension and length.
12. Glass (sheet).

GREASES AND SOLVENTS

13. Greases for industrial purposes, excluding petroleum products.
14. Solvents (carbon tetrachloride, trichlorine) excluding petroleum products.

TEXTILE FIBRES

15. Artificial textile fibres.
16. Cotton, cloth and other textile products.
17. Binder twine and 3rd, 4th and 5th quality rope.

MISCELLANEOUS

18. Sulphuric Acid (pure, to be employed for electrical accumulators).
19. Sulphur Rock and processed sulphur.

ALLIED FORCE LABOR AND WAGES COMMITTEE

DEC 20 1945

1. In order to carry out the continuing functions of the former Labor and Wages Control Committee of AFHQ (I) Board relative to the coordination and control of the level of rates of pay and conditions of employment of Italian civilians employed by the Allied Forces, there is hereby established the ALLIED FORCE LABOR AND WAGES COMMITTEE.

2. a. This committee, initially, shall be composed of labor representatives of the following commands:

Flag Officer Italy & Liaison, RM	Hq, MIBUSA
US Naval Forces NW African Waters	Hq, PBS
Air HQ, RAF, Italy	Hq, PBS (Southern District)
GHQ CEF	Hq, ALCON
Military Railways, Italy	Hq, XIII Corps
Hq, Naples Air Force General Depot	Hq, 2 District
Hq, Rome Area Allied Command	Hq, 3 District

b. A command which is about to be dissolved or which has ceased to employ Italian civilians will automatically cease to be a member of the Committee. Any command, which employs local civilians and which initially was not a member of the committee may be entitled to membership therein by vote of the committee.

3. The Chairman of the Committee will be designated by AFHQ. There will be a joint Anglo-American Secretariat. One U.S. Officer will be provided by the Civilian Personnel Division, PBS and one British Officer will be provided by the Labour Directorate, GHQ CEF.

4. The committee will meet as and when considered necessary by the Chairman in consultation with the Secretariat. The location of meeting will be fixed by the Secretariat.

5. The committee shall be empowered:

a. To review rates of compensation and all other conditions of employment for Italian civilian employees of the Allied Forces in Italy.

b. To recommend any regulations considered necessary to control such compensation and other conditions of employment.

c. To exercise the powers vested in AFHQ by AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 25, 1945; and to approve or disapprove the actions of Local Sub-Committees established in accordance with that memorandum.

6. The Secretariat will submit the Committee minutes and any other business for final action through G-4 HTOUSA and Q(Maint) GHQ CMF to the Chief Administrative Officer who will be responsible for the necessary Allied and/or Italian coordination.

CHRISTMAS BONUS (1945) FOR ITALIAN CIVILIANS EMPLOYED BY THE
ALLIED FORCES IN ITALY, SICILY AND SARDINIA

1. General - Following the established policy of keeping conditions of employment and wage scales for Allied Force employees in step with those prevailing in Italian industry, a Christmas Bonus will be paid Italian Civilian employees of the Allied Forces for Christmas 1945.

2. Eligibility and Rate - Italian civilian employees in the employ of the Allied Forces on 20 December 1945 are entitled to receive a Christmas Bonus.

The amount of the bonus for each employee will be two days' current basic pay and cost of living benefits for each completed month of continuous service during the year of 1945 with the present employing unit or the predecessors thereof.

For the purpose of this computation all Italian Civilian employees in employ as of 20 December 1945 will be deemed to be continuing in employment for the balance of the month of December.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT, PAY SCALES, BONUSES AND ALLOWANCES
FOR CIVILIANS EMPLOYED BY THE ALLIED FORCES IN ITALY, SICILY & SARDINIA

Paragraph 2d(1), AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 34, 1945, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"(1) All labor will be paid at or below the minimum rate of pay laid down in Appendices "A", "B", "C", "D", "E", "F", and "G" until trade-tested. Such trade-testing may be effected on engagement. After being trade-tested employees may receive a rate of pay commensurate with their skill and ability below or within the limits set out in Appendices "A", "B", "C", "D", "E", "F", and "G", due regard being given to the local prevailing rate for similar work in industry.

Accommodation for Italian Armed Forces I
Conditions of Employment, Wage Scales, Perquisites and Allowances, for civilians
employed by the Allied Forces in Italy, Sicily and Sardinia II

I -- ACCOMMODATION FOR ITALIAN ARMED FORCES

1. The bulk of the Italian Army is shortly to be returned to the control of the Italian Government, when it will become responsible for the preservation of law and order over the mainland of ITALY (with certain exceptions) and the islands of SICILY and SARDINIA. In these circumstances it is logical that the Italian War Ministry should be able to locate Italian units from an operational point of view.
2. a. Formation, District, and US major commands will therefore insure that Italian Commanders are given assistance in finding suitable accommodation in the areas required for their troops.
- b. Greatest consideration will also be given to releasing to the Italian authorities barracks and other Italian military accommodation which may be in Allied occupation.
3. Any cases where release of accommodation to the Italian Army would be detrimental to the living conditions, morale, or administration of the Allied Forces, will be referred for the personal decision of the Commanders of XIII Corps, 2 District, 3 District, RAAC, or US major command, as applicable, for a decision.
4. In all other cases barracks or Italian military accommodation required by the Italian Armed Forces will be returned to the Italian authorities as rapidly as possible.

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II - CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT, WAGE SCALES, PERQUISITS AND ALLOWANCES, FOR CIVILIANS
EMPLOYED BY THE ALLIED FORCES IN ITALY, SICILY AND SARDINIA

1. Paragraph 5c, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 34, 1945, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor with effect from 15 October 1945:
5. c. Overtime - Overtime may be paid at the rate of time-and-one-half for all completed hours worked over forty-eight (48) in any normal pay week or for all completed hours in excess of eight (8) per day where a normal pay week cannot be established. A normal pay week is a pay week during which hours amounting to forty-eight (48) in total are scheduled over a fixed number of days. The computation of overtime in weeks other than normal shall be done on a daily basis of

eight (8) hours per day. Excepted from these conditions are those employees specifically designated in the Appendices as being ineligible for overtime pay. Overtime rates may also be paid in any locality for the seventh consecutive day of working, whether Sunday or a week day. Overtime should be discouraged in the interests of efficiency and the employment of surplus labor."

2. Paragraph 2, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 37, 1945, is amended by the deletion of paragraphs (b)(2) and (b)(3) and substituting the following therefor, with effect from 15 October 1945:

"6. b. (2) The maximum permissible bonus which may be paid is determined by the basic wage applicable to the individual. For this purpose, the basic wage is the remuneration due to an individual upon completion of:

For Monthly Wage Group

30 days work for hotel, mess and club employees.
30 days for other than hotel, mess and club employees.

For Daily Wage Group

either 48 hours within any normal work week

or 8 hours on any one day.

(3) The proportion of bonus payable varies directly with the proportion of basic wage due (as defined in (2) above), subject to the proviso that Cost-of-Living Bonus will not be paid in respect of any day on which no work is performed.

(4) The Cost-of-Living bonus is not part of the basic wage and will be excluded, for example, from the computations and adjustments for overtime pay and female differential."

(REPLACES GAF & OFFICE DIRECTIVE, 1945)

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 30, 1945, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor, effective as of 1 October 1945.

1. Scope - This memorandum supersedes all former directives on the subject with the exception of AFHQ Circular Number 17, 1945.

2. Applicability - The provisions contained herein are generally applicable throughout ITALY, SICILY and SARDEGNA.

3. Authority - Authority is granted to provide food, as set forth herein, during each working period of eight (8) hours or more for Italian civilians, who are:

- Workers other than office workers.
- Office workers.

for the Allied Forces. This authority is applicable to civilians employed directly by the Allied Army, Navy or Air Forces, by contractors on their behalf, or to employees of industry operating for the Allied Forces.

4. Responsibility - Where the employee works directly for the Allied Forces, the Army, District, Base Section and Area, or equivalent commanders, will be responsible:

- For providing the facilities necessary to prepare and serve meals.
- For ensuring that Allied military personnel are not used for this purpose except in a minimum supervisory capacity where other arrangements are possible.

5. Ration Ration - a. Workers other than office workers - Below are the details of the 1st shift meal for workers other than office workers:

b. Office Workers - Where considered desirable there may be served on the jobs daily issue of a standard meal for office workers, consisting of:

Soup	20 gms
Salt	5 gms
Olive Oil (when available)	5 gms

6. Allowances for other than Office Workers - The following personnel will be entitled to food as detailed in paragraph 5 a above:

a. Workers, other than office workers, employed 100% by the Allied Forces either:

- (1) Directly
- (2) By contractors and/or industries who in turn are employed by the Allied Forces.
- (3) Railway Workers other than those employed in offices.

b. Labor employed, other than as stated in paragraph 6 a above is not entitled to any additional food.

c. Office workers are not entitled to the Midshift Meal.

7. Allowances for Office Workers a. The personnel qualifying for the standard meal for office workers, detailed in paragraph 5 b above are office workers employed by the Allied Forces either:

- (1) Directly
- (2) By contractors or industries who in turn are employed 100% by the Allied Forces.

b. All cases of workers claiming entitlement under paragraph a (2) above will be referred to HQ MCM Food Sub-Commission for a decision as to eligibility.

8. Issues to Contractors - Issues of food to civilians employed by contractors and industry working for the Allied Forces will be strictly controlled by the employing Service in order to insure that:

- a. Only bona-fide employees are fed.
- b. Food is furnished and distributed on the proper scale.
- c. Food leakages do not occur.

9. Deductions - The Service responsible for placing the contract or arranging for the use of the industry will insure that:

4. Contractors and firms working for the Allied Forces deduct from the wages of their employees the amounts prescribed in paragraph 11 hereof.

5. A deduction is made on invoices rendered equivalent to the deduction from employees wages in respect of food.

10. Provision of Supplies - Responsibility for the provision of supplies is placed as follows:

a. Flour, Dehydrated Soup and Dried Vegetables - The Italian Government is responsible for the provision of flour, dehydrated soup and dried vegetables in territory under its control. In AC/AG territory this responsibility rests with the Allied Commission. When these items are not immediately available from Italian Government or Allied Commission sources, for their respective territories, they may be supplied from military stocks. In such cases S & T AFHQ, or Quartermaster, **PBS** ~~will~~ present to AG AGHQ a consolidated monthly total of the amount issued at the scales authorized in paragraph 1 above and Allied Commission will arrange replacement whether the issue was in Italian Government or AC/AG territory.

b. Items other than flour, dried vegetables and soup (i.e. Fresh vegetables, yeast, salt, etc) will be supplied from military stocks. ST AFHQ and Quartermaster **PBS** ~~will~~, as the case may be, will demand allocation of these items, as applicable, in the normal manner from local resources.

c. The buying of meat, the manufacturing of costs and the providing of these items to employing units is a service responsibility.

11. Payment a. Midshift Meal (Workers other than Office Workers)

(1) There will be deducted from the daily wages an amount equivalent to the cost of the food furnished as item of the midshift meal.

This amount will be as follows:

11 ozs of Bread (or equivalent combination of bread, oats and/or flour)	5 lire	
6 ozs of fresh vegetables	3 lire	
1 oz Dehydrated Soup	1 lire	
0.2 ozs Salt	No charge	1248

(2) The whole or any part of the Midshift Meal may be issued at the discretion of the Commanders mentioned in paragraph 4. In all such cases the cost of the components so issued will be as prescribed in sub-paragraph a (1) above.

(3) Every effort must be made to make the full scale ration available where local conditions make it desirable.

b. Standard Meal (Office Workers) - This meal will be furnished at a cost of 5 lire per head per issue, which cost shall be deducted from the employees' wages.

12. Entitlement to Additional Civilian Rations a. Heavy workers will be entitled under civilian economy effective 1 October 1945 to a civilian supplementary ration card authorizing them to purchase the following:

100 gms Bread
20 gms Minestra daily.

or in the case of Miners & Forestry Workers:

400 gms Bread
20 gms Minestra daily.

b. Heavy workers of the Allied Forces are entitled to similar supplementary rations in addition to the midshift meal authorized under paragraph 6 above.

c. To enable employees of the Allied Forces to obtain civilian supplementary ration cards, employing units will issue 'Certificate of Employment' as per Appendices "A" and "B" to all entitled workers on each pay day.

d. All contractors will be responsible for arranging with the local Italian authorities for the issue of civilian supplementary ration cards to their employees in accordance with the instructions issued by the Italian Ministry of Food.

PROCEDURE FOR MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS OF FORCES
UNDER ARMY CONTROL OUTSIDE THE MEDITERRANEAN

1. a. Allied Forces in the Mediterranean theater are maintained by:

- (1) Shipment of requirements from extra Mediterranean sources.
- (2) Intra-Mediterranean movement by sea of existing resources.
- (3) Internal rail movement.

b. The procedure for placing demands for movement by sea to meet the maintenance requirements of Allied Forces in the Mediterranean theater is divided into:

- (1) LONG TERM PROCEDURE
- (2) SHORT TERM PROCEDURE

2. The Long and Short Term maintenance procedure in respect of GREECE will be in accordance with instructions contained in AFHQ letter, file AG 400/081 GDS-0, dated 1 December 1944, as amended by AFHQ letter, file as above, dated 5 July 1945.

LONG TERM PROCEDURE - TONNAGE

3. The loading of vessels from extra Mediterranean sources for the United States and British Forces, for which AFHQ has a maintenance responsibility will be arranged by AFHQ for British Forces and Commanding General, USMUSA for United States Forces, based on forecasts of requirements made by them. The loading of vessels for Coal and Civilian Supplies will be arranged by authorized civilian agencies.

4. In order to insure that the loading of ships in extra Mediterranean sail- is related to port acceptance capacity and overall requirements:

a. Ninety (90) days before the first day of each month, bids will be submitted to G-4 (for a Tn), AFHQ, in respect of tonnage requirements of British Army and Royal Air Force, and to G-4, USMUSA, in respect of US Army Ground Forces and US Army Air Force requirements.

8. These bids will be assumed to have been accepted unless any indication to the contrary is given by G-4 (Mov & Tr) or G-4 ITOMUSA respectively.

SHORT TERM PROCEDURE

For ITALY, NORTH AFRICA, BARCELONA, SICILY AND CORSIKA - at least 30 days before each successive 30 day maintenance period, G-4 (Mov & Tr) and ITOMUSA will receive and examine bids from all users as required, with whom they are respectively concerned, for all destinations shown above and submit finalized demands to G-4 (Mov & Tr) and COT, AFHQ respectively.

6. Twenty-five (25) days in advance of successive 30 day maintenance periods G-4 (Mov & Tr) and COT, AFHQ will examine all bids submitted under paragraph 5 above, and unless information to the contrary is given by G-4 (Mov & Tr) AFHQ, all bids will be assumed to have been accepted.

7. After consideration of bids as in paragraph 6 above, G-4 (Mov & Tr) will submit details of all bids accepted by ports.

Operative Dates

a. The first month to which the Long Term Procedure applies is JANUARY 1945, the bids for which are due at AFHQ on 1 October 1945.

b. The first 30 day maintenance period to which the Short Term procedure applies will be 2 November 1945 to 1 December 1945, requirements for which are due at AFHQ on 2 October 1945.

MAINTENANCE BY RAIL IN ITALY

9. All Headquarters and users having requirements for movements by rail will submit their requirements to arrive at AFHQ ten (10) days in advance of the weekly maintenance period.

1. Paragraphs 1a and 1b are rescinded.

"6. b. The following provisions are generally applicable throughout Italy, Sicily and Sardinia at the discretion of District, Base Section or equivalent commanders for the territory under their control.

(1) Italian Civilians directly employed by the Allied Forces may be paid, in addition to the amounts established in paragraph 4 above, all or part of a cost-of-living bonus as set forth in Appendix "H" hereto.

(2) The maximum permissible bonus which may be paid is determined by the basic wage applicable to the individual. For this purpose, the basic wage is the remuneration due to an individual upon completion of eight (8) hours work if paid on a daily basis; 26 days work if paid on a monthly basis; or 30 days work in the case of Hotel, Mess and Club employees. The cost-of-living bonus is not part of the basic wage and will be excluded, for example, from the computations and adjustments for overtime pay and female differential.

(3) In the case of an employee who does not work a full pay period the proportion of the bonus which may be paid is to correspond with the proportion of basic wages, excluding overtime, earned during that period."

3. The provisions of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 25, 1945, are made applicable to the whole of Italy, Sicily and Sardinia.

I--- ALLIED PUBLICATIONS BOARD

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 50, 1944, and Section 1, Number 22, 1945, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. a. The Allied Publications Board comprised of representatives of the following have been created:

- (1) Psychological Warfare Branch, AFHQ (Chairman).
- (2) Censorship Branch, INC.
- (3) G-2 Section.
- (4) Allied Commission (ALCON).

b. Allied Commission will be represented by the following:

- (1) Political advisors from the US and British Embassies.
- (2) Representatives of the Economic Section.
- (3) Public Relations Officer.

c. Psychological Warfare Branch will be represented by the following:

- (1) Head of PWB Liberated Italy or his representative (Chairman)
- (2) Press Chief, PWB Italy or his representative (Executive Secretary).
- (3) PWO, PWB, 15th Army Group or his representative.

d. Representatives of OWI and MOI.

2. G-1 Section, MFOUSA in conjunction with G-1 (British) will designate a representative who will sit as a member of the Board whenever a question involving any of the officially designated troop morale newspapers (e.g. Stars & Stripes, Union Jack, Eighth Army News and Yea) is before the Board.

3. In conformity with the established policy of the Board of progressively delegating its powers to the Italian authorities, all powers are delegated to the Italian Press Commission to grant and suspend in territory under Italian Government jurisdiction press licenses for the publication of newspapers, magazines, books, posters, placards, brochures and similar publications without

reference to or need of ratification by the Allied Publication Board.

a. The Communes of Naples, Ancona, Livorno, Colle Salvetti and Pisa will be regarded for Allied Publications Board purposes as territory under Italian Government jurisdiction.

b. The Allied Publications Board reserves the right of intervention in territory under Italian Government jurisdiction at the request of Allied authorities in matters concerning military censorship or undemocratic practices, including the right to suspend or revoke licenses through the channels of the Italian Press Commission.

c. The Allied Publications Board will continue to exercise its full powers in all the territory not under Italian Government jurisdiction.

d. The Board is empowered to draft such regulations and perform such functions as are necessary to properly carry out the following:

1. Control the flow into ITALY, SICILY, and SARDINIA of all newsprint and other forms of paper used for printing publications referred to in paragraph 3; to control all such paper found in ITALY, SICILY, and SARDINIA; to perform such functions as are necessary to maintain adequate supply of such paper, including freezing and releasing of stocks.

(1) Procurement of paper after the end of the current year either from abroad or from local resources will be agreed upon between the Economic Section, AICOM and the Italian Press Commission so far as Italian needs in Government Italy are concerned, and between the Economic Section, AICOM, and Allied Publications Board for the needs of AMG territory.

(2) Responsibility for the distribution of paper for use of the Italian Press in Italian Government territory will be assigned to an agency to be designated by the Italian Press Commission.

b. Control the allocation to specific publications and news organizations of all such communications facilities as are made available by the Chief Signal Officer, this headquarters, for collecting and disseminating news and press matter within ITALY.

c. Direct the consolidation, movement or rehabilitation of all equipment necessary for publication production.

d. Enforce the directives of the various sections concerned with publications problems, and to issue censorship and policy directives as are necessary to the proper carrying out of this authority.

e. Provide for the direction and control of the Italian Press and radio in Italian territory under AMG in accordance with the instructions of the Chief of Staff AFHQ and directives approved by him.

5. Stars & Stripes, Union Jack, Yank, and other officially designated troop morale papers are specifically exempt from Allied Publications Board control and supervision except for paper stocks, materials and facilities acquired in or derived from ITALY, SICILY and SARDINIA, which shall be allotted

by Allied Publications Board based upon need and availability. In the event of acute facility shortages, officially designated troop morale publications will be permitted to participate in the use of available facilities on a "Share and share alike" basis with other licensed publications. 6. It shall be the duty of the Board to report its activities and submit any recommendations beyond the scope of this order to this headquarters via Allied Commission.

I--- USE OF GERMAN POW AND SURRENDERED PERSONNEL

1. It is the policy of this headquarters to make full use of German POW and Surrendered Personnel. At the same time, due consideration of the effect of such labor on Italian labor and economy will be given, provided it does not impede the progress of the redeployment program. To insure uniformity of procedure and policy the following will govern:

a. Presently hired civilians will not normally be discharged in order to permit replacement by POW/SP. This is not intended to prevent replacement with POW/SP in the case of employees who are discharged for cause or who leave employment voluntarily.

b. Italian Cooperator Service Units will be replaced by POW/SP labor, except that the loss of skilled, key personnel caused by the withdrawal or demobilization of Italian Cooperator Service Units may, in so far as is practicable, be avoided by the hiring of such individuals as civilian employees.

c. Where an Italian business, factory or facility is presently operating or may in the future be operated by or for the Allies the civilian employees of such concern will not in general be replaced by POW/SP. Augmentation of labor may be by civilian labor or POW/SP as considered preferable.

d. POW/SP's and civilian labor will not be intermingled in work gangs. POW/SP work gangs may, however, work on the same job with civilian laborers provided it is practicable to avoid close contact. Individual POW/SP's may work on administrative and clerical duties in offices provided avoidance of close contact with civilian employees is practicable.

e. On new projects, such as depots and rest areas, the use of POW/SP will be the general rule. Consideration will be given to the local civilian unemployment situation in all such cases. If such situation is acute, civilian labor should where practicable be employed at least on a supplementary basis, but the mere availability of local labor imposes no urgent obligation to hire.

2. When specific questions arise which are not covered by these instructions, the following generalities will be given consideration. Italian civilian labor has been of great assistance to the Allies. Faithful workers should not suffer by the introduction of free labor. The Allies are definitely concerned that there shall be no wide spread disturbances because of Italian unemployment. The adoption of a fair employment policy and consideration of the right of the individual will do much not only to inculcate a receptive attitude toward Allied democratic institutions but also to introduce such policies into Italian labor relations.

1. Definitions - For the purpose of this memorandum the following definitions apply:

a. Northern Italy is that part of Italy to the North of the Northern Boundaries of Ravenna, Firenze, Pistoia and Lucca Provinces and North and West of the Northern and Western Boundaries of Apuania Province.

b. Southern Italy is that part of Italy to the South of the Northern Boundaries of Ravenna, Firenze, Pistoia and Lucca Provinces and South and East of the Northern and Western Boundaries of Apuania Province.

2. Application of the Regulations - These regulations apply to the direct employment of civilian labor and will be observed by all branches of the Allied Forces. These regulations are not applicable to a civilian organization such as a railroad, public utility, etc., which may be taken over by the Allied Forces.

3. Recruitment

a. British Installations and Units - Applications for employees will normally be made to the nearest D.A.D.L. (Civil) or Pioneer Corps Civil Labor Unit. Should this not be possible, applications will be made to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer, AMB.

b. American Installations and Units - Applications for employees will be cleared through the nearest Base Section Headquarters or such other Labor Office as may be established in any particular locality from time to time. Wherever possible, all applications should be routed through the AMB/AC Labor Offices.

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AFM 4-1000-334 (cont'd)

4. Rates of Pay

a. Allied Forces Basic Wage Scale - Employees throughout Italy, Sicily and Sardinia will be paid a basic wage below or within the rates set forth in the schedule attached as Appendixes "A", "B", "C", "D", "E", "F" and "G", which shall be designated the "Allied Forces Basic Wage Scale" and become effective from the date of issue of this memorandum.

b. Monthly Rates of Pay - For the purpose of calculating payment for periods of less than one month, monthly rates of pay are related to an average of 25 working days per month at 8 hours per day; 30 days per month at 12 hours per day in case of hotel, mess and club employees.

c. Procedure in respect of New Grades - Provisional rates for grades not listed may be established by appropriate Labor Officers in conjunction with AF/AFM. They will confirm in writing to AF/AFM and notify the Chairman of the Local Sub-Committee of Labor and Wage Control Committee (AF/AFM (Italian) Board) concerned the classification and provisional rate of pay fixed. Application will then be made through normal channels to the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board for approval.

d. Pay on Engagement - Italy, Sicily and Sardinia

(1) All labor will be engaged at or below the minimum rate of pay laid down in Appendixes "A", "B", "C", "D", "E", "F" and "G" and will be paid at this rate for at least seven (7) days. During this period they will be trade tested and thereafter receive a rate of pay commensurate with their skill and ability below or within the limits set out in Appendixes "A", "B", "C", "D", "E", "F" and "G", due regard being given to the local prevailing rates for similar work in industry.

(2) All labor which has been employed previously by the Allied Forces may, at the discretion of the employing service, be reengaged at the same rate of pay on production of a certificate from the previous employing unit stating reasons for discharge and the latest rate of pay in issue.

e. Pay for Night Shifts - The daily basic rate of all persons employed on night shift may be increased by 10 p.c. This applies only to workers engaged on a night shift, and not to those working through the day shift into the night. Overtime for such workers will be paid at one and one half times the increased basic rate.

f. Differential between Male and Female Employees - The scale and rates of pay for female employees will be 15% less than the comparable rates and scales for male employees except where separate female classifications are listed.

5. Hours of Work and Overtime

a. Hours of Work per Day - All employees will be expected to work a minimum of eight (8) hours per day or forty-eight (48) hours per week, exclusive of meal times or time required to travel to and from the place of employment.

b. Days of Work per Week - They will normally be expected to work a minimum of six (6) consecutive days per week.

c. Overtime - Overtime may be paid at the rate of time-and-one-half for all completed hours worked over forty-eight (48) in any normal pay week and for those whose employment commenced or terminated within any normal pay week for each completed hour in excess of an average of eight (8) hours per day. Excepted from these conditions are those employees specifically designated in the Appendices as being ineligible for overtime pay. Overtime rates may also be paid in any locality for the seventh consecutive day of working, whether Sunday or a week-day. Overtime should be discouraged in the interests of efficiency and the employment of surplus labor.

6. Cost-of-Living Bonus

a. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 62, 1944, as amended by AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 18, 1945, is superseded by the following, effective with the commencement of the first pay period subsequent to the date of issue of this memorandum.

b. The following provisions are applicable to Southern Italy, Sicily and Sardinia only, at the discretion of District, Base Section or equivalent commanders for the territory under their control.

(1) Italian civilians directly employed by the Allied Forces may be paid, in addition to the amounts established in paragraph 4 above, all or part of a cost-of-living bonus as set forth in Appendix "H" hereto.

(2) The maximum permissible bonus which may be paid is determined by the basic wage applicable to the individual. For this purpose, the basic wage is the remuneration due to an individual upon completion of eight (8) hours work if paid on a daily basis; 26 days work if paid on a monthly basis; or 30 days work in the case of Hotel, Mess and Club employees. The cost-of-living bonus is not part of the basic wage and will be excluded, for example, from the computations and adjustments for overtime pay and female differential.

(3) In the case of an employee who does not work a full pay period, the proportion of the bonus which may be paid is to correspond with the proportion of basic wages, excluding overtime, earned during that period.

c. In Northern Italy no bonus is authorized for payment with the exception of that authorized:

(1) Under sub-paragraph d below:

(2) By Local Sub-Committees established in accordance with AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 25, 1945, and subsequent amendments, application of which is hereby extended to Northern Italy, with the proviso that for Northern Italy the powers of Local Sub-Committees as defined in paragraph 6, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 25, 1945, shall be limited to granting so much as may be necessary of a cost-of-living bonus as set forth in Appendix "H" hereto.

d. Essential key personnel who have been previously employed in Southern Italy, Sicily and/or Sardinia, and who have been trained for a specific job may continue to receive their present rates of pay, including bonuses.

7. Advances - No advances of pay or bonuses will be made in any circumstances.

8. Leave

a. Annual Leave with Pay - Leave with pay at the rate of one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day per month may be accumulated by employees in clerical and administrative grades only who have served the Armed Forces satisfactorily for six (6) months or more with the same Employing Service, to accrue from date of employment. Annual leave with pay will be granted to employees whose service has been satisfactory, and if the exigencies of the service permit. Annual leave with pay is not a basic right and cannot be allowed except in the above circumstances. No extra expense to the military unit or installation for the employment of a substitute will be allowed. In no circumstances will pay in lieu of leave be given.

b. Leave without Pay - Leave without pay may be granted for any period, in circumstances approved by the Commanding Officer of the Military unit or establishment.

c. Public Holidays - Public holidays will not be recognized by any military unit or establishment and there will be no extra pay for work performed on feast days or holidays.

9. Feeding of Employees - There will be no feeding of civilian employees except under rules and regulations prescribed by AFHQ.

10. Clothing and Accommodation - Clothing and accommodation will not be provided to civilian employees except under regulations promulgated by AFHQ.

11. Enticement - No unit will be permitted to engage a worker previously employed by an Allied agency unless he has been released by the former employing unit.

12. Allowances

a. Civilian employees when traveling on duty involving absence from the normal place of duty and home pay, in the absence of Service accommodation, and rations, be paid subsistence allowance at the following rates for each full day's absence of 24 hours:

(1) For absences of more than ten but less than 24 hours which involve the procurement of meals only, an allowance of one fifth of the daily allowance rate above may be paid for each meal at the discretion of the Commanding Officer.

JUN 30 1945

AFHQ Administrative Memoranda Number 70, 1943; Numbers 3 and 55, both 1944; and Section II, Number 1 and Section I, Number 9, both 1945, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The following instructions concerning intra-theater travel are published for the information, guidance and compliance by all concerned.

2. For the purpose of this memorandum, the Theater boundary will be considered to include all territory, except Malta and Gibraltar, located within the extreme limits of either the AFMUSA or AFMC boundary.

3. Commanders to whom authority is delegated to issue travel orders will determine the need for and mode of travel necessary for the accomplishment of the duty directed, secure liaison and security clearances when necessary, and then issue written travel orders. However, only those commanders subsequently authorized by this Headquarters, in separate and specific instructions, to authorize travel by aircraft will issue orders authorizing or directing travel by aircraft.

4. Subject to the exceptions contained in paragraph 5 below, and without prejudice to the British system of unit movement orders issued by respective commanders within the limits of their competence, the following commanders are authorized to issue orders directing travel of personnel assigned or attached to their respective commands, and of American or British civilians, as applicable, who are assigned or attached to, or reside within their respective commands, to destinations within the geographical limits of their commands, or to geographical areas and units under the jurisdiction of, or assigned to other major commands, provided the concurrence of the other major commanders is obtained in advance.

Requests for travel to geographical areas and units under the jurisdiction of, or assigned to other major commands will contain name, grade, nature of visit, localities to be visited, expected time of arrival, mode of travel and estimated length of stay.

5. The following types of cases will be referred to AFHQ for approval:
a. Requests for travel to Malta and Gibraltar for other than personnel of the British Armed Services.

b. Requests for travel to points in French North Africa by personnel except:

- (1) Personnel of the British Armed Services.
- (2) Personnel of the French Armed Services.
- (3) ABLS and Ships Manifest Couriers.

(4) Personnel departing from Greece whose travel has been approved by AEF or Headquarters, STMA.

6. The following modes of travel will be used:

a. Surface as necessary.

b. Air:

(1) Priority for air transportation will be granted only in cases where the time element and/or type of mission justifies it.

(2) All travel to be performed via Air Transport Command or Naval Air Transport Service facilities (US) will be governed by the provisions of War Department Circular 451, 1944, as amended, to be subsequently implemented by an AFHQ directive subject: "Procedures Concerning Air Transportation via the Air Transport Command or Naval Air Transport Service".

(3) Each commander or chief of staff section must be certain that the mission of the individual concerned justifies the request and that other means of transportation are less practicable, before he approves a request for air travel to be presented for preparation of orders.

(4) Under no circumstances will air travel be approved solely for the convenience of the individual concerned.

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Administrative memo #33 (Cont'd)

c. Rail: - Full use must be made of existing rail schedules, and when possible, travel will be planned sufficiently in advance to permit utilization of this means of transportation.

d. Government Motor Transportation:

(1) Government motor transportation will not be authorized for transporting individuals to points more than 100 miles distant from points of origin except when it is uneconomical or militarily impracticable to accomplish the mission by any other means of transportation. Whenever possible two or more individuals will use the same vehicle.

(2) Scheduled military bus services will be used to the maximum extent practicable.

(3) When applicable and necessary, all travel orders not involving assignment of motor transportation for principal portion of travel to be performed will include authorization for the appropriate command, having primary responsibility for the area in which initial destination is located, to furnish such motor transportation as may be required for local travel in furtherance of the official mission. Need for such special motor transportation, other than that which is normally furnished for short distances and duration by local motor pools, may be indicated in cables which advise interested headquarters of the expected time of arrival.

7. Upon request of the Delegate, American Red Cross, or an authorized representative, final action on request for travel of American Red Cross personnel within the Mediterranean Theater of Operations may be taken by the Commanders concerned, without reference of higher headquarters. In cases involving unusual circumstances, requests may be forwarded to this headquarters for final action.

8. Air travel for personal reasons:

a. The Chairman, Air Priorities Board, is authorized to consider on its own merits, each request for travel for compassionate reasons which has been personally approved in writing by an officer of the Allied Forces of the grade of Colonel or higher grade, or its equivalent in the other services. In case of travel for temporary duty for rehabilitation, recuperation and recovery, the Chairman, Air Priorities Board, is authorized to grant priorities for travel by aircraft in accordance with provisions of Section V, War Department Circular Number 309, 1944. Compassionate reasons include compassionate leave or furlough, compassionate posting and emergency rotation, and temporary duty for rehabilitation, recuperation, and recovery. 1223

b. Priority rating for air travel solely in connection with leave or furlough other than for compassionate reasons is not authorized and will not be assigned except as in c. below.

c. Lieutenant Colonels or officers of equivalent rank and above, proceeding to the U.K. under "Leave in Addition to PYTHON" or similar scheme may be granted air priority when such officers hold operational commands or positions in this theater, the importance of which necessitates that they return in a minimum amount of time.

I--- ELECTRIC POWER REHABILITATION

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 58, 1944, and Section I, Administrative Memorandum Number 7, 1945, are rescinded.

1. The Electrical Reconstruction Committee created by above Administrative Memoranda is dissolved.
2. The functions of electric power rehabilitation are transferred to the Allied Commission.
3. Military agencies engaged in electric power rehabilitation activities will coordinate their plans with the Allied Commission.

II --LOCAL RESOURCES IN ITALY - MAINLAND & ISLANDS

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 52, 1944, is amended as follows:

1. Section I, Paragraph 2, Restricted Items is amended by the addition of the following after item 1:-
"7. Poplar Wood."
2. Section I, Paragraph 1(5), Industrial Gases and Chemicals, delete Serial 29 and substitute:
"29. Gas Bottles and Containers - other than those specifically designed for the storage of Methane Gas."

POWERS AND RIGHTS OF ALLIED FORCES IN ITALIAN GOVERNMENT TERRITORY

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 57, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. General

a. It is the policy of the Allied Governments, as military exigencies permit and as the Italian Government is able to take on the responsibility, to hand back to its jurisdiction and administration territory formerly subject to Allied Military Government. In such territory Allied Military Government ceases on the hand-over and the Italian Government assumes jurisdiction and administration.

b. In handing back territory to the Italian Government, certain rights are reserved to the Allied Forces by agreement with the Italian Government. It is necessary that Allied troops in these areas should be aware of the most important of these rights and the manner in which they are to be exercised.

c. For the purposes mentioned herein the territory which may from time to time be included in that handed back to the Italian Government is termed Italian Government Territory. At the present time such territory comprises the Islands of Sicily and Sardinia and all provinces on the mainland south of the northern boundary of the provinces of Viterbo, Rieti and Terni with the exception of the comune of Naples which is still under Allied Military Government.

2. Requisitioning - The Allied Forces have retained the power to requisition private and public property and services in Italian Government territory but it is emphasized that this must be exercised sparingly and only for reasons of genuine military necessity. This will be exercised through the Italian authorities. The usual formalities of requisitioning will be followed.

3. Process in Italian Courts - No members of the Allied Forces, Allied followers of such Forces, or British or US Merchant Seamen will be subject to jurisdiction of Italian Courts.

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4. Crimes against Allied Forces

a. In Italian Government territory crimes committed by Italian nationals, will normally be tried under Italian law and in Italian courts.

b. The Allied Forces however, have reserved to themselves the right to hold Allied Military Courts in Italian Government Territory for the trial of Italian nationals who commit acts seriously hostile to the Allied Forces such as cases of espionage or sabotage and to punish them in accordance with the Italian penal code. The reservation of this right is not intended however to encourage the trial of Italian offenders by Allied Military Courts but is to enable them to deal with the most serious offences against Allied personnel or property which cannot effectively be dealt with by Italian Courts.

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R E S T R I C T E D

ASHQ Administrative Memo #31 (Cont'd)

c. The procedure to be followed, if it is desired that an offense should be tried by an Allied Military Court, will be for the military authorities to give a full statement of the facts to Headquarters Allied Commission with a request that an Allied Military Government Court be convened to hear the charges. It will be the responsibility of Allied Commission to frame the charges and constitute the Court. It is emphasized that only in the most exceptional circumstances such as mentioned in paragraph 4(b) will any case in Italian Government Territory be referred to Allied Military Courts and then only on order of Allied Commission.

d. There is reserved to the Allied Forces the power to arrest any persons who are believed to have committed offenses against Allied personnel or property. High ranking Italian officials and officers of the Italian Armed Forces should, however, only be arrested in collaboration with the appropriate Italian official (e.g., the Prefect or the Commanding Officer of the officer concerned).

e. Apart from cases mentioned in this paragraph and in paragraph 7 the Allied Forces have no power of arrest in Italian Government Territory.

5. Military Zones

a. The right is reserved by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater to declare specific areas of Italian Government Territory to be Military Zones. In the issue of such a declaration, the exercise of the powers of Military Government in the Zone in question is assured by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater. Should the situation in any area become such as to convince the District Commander that the establishment of Zones is necessary, he should, after consulting the Headquarters Allied Commission where possible, report accordingly to his headquarters, giving full reasons to justify his view.

b. The right is also reserved by the Supreme Allied Commander to have made available to the Allied Forces such facilities, utilities and installations as may be required by him or his agents for such dispositions, use or operation as may be determined.

6. Use of troops in aid of the Civil Power

In the event that the local Italian authorities ask for the assistance of Allied troops in quelling civil disturbances, the local commander will point out that the quelling of civilian riots or disturbances is a matter for the Italian authorities and he will refuse such assistance, unless he is of the opinion that it is necessary for the protection of Allied military interests. Furthermore, before rendering such assistance, the local commander will warn the local official requesting his assistance that the territory in question will be liable to be made forthwith an Allied Military Zone. If time permits, the local commander will consult his superior commander before giving assistance. In any event, if the decision is made to grant the assistance required, the first troops to be used will be such Italian troops as may be under command of District/Zone Section Commanders. Allied Commanders will inform their superior Commander without delay of any requests made to them and of the action taken thereon.

7. Military and Civilian Interpass - The Allied Forces may continue to hold

or require the Italian Government to hold in custody military or civilian internees in Italian Government territory. If the Allied Forces require to arrest any person for security or similar reasons such arrest should be carried out in collaboration with Italian officials unless, in any particular case, it is thought that a request to the Italian police to arrest a suspect would be ineffective. In all such cases Allied Force Headquarters will be notified as soon as possible after the arrest has taken place, and an information copy of such notification will be forwarded to Headquarters, Allied Commission.

B. Allied Commission Liaison Officers - Details of the disposition and functions of Headquarters Allied Commission Liaison Officers stationed in Italian Government Territory together with information for the use of Commanders concerning the Italian civil organization and the Italian officials who should be approached by them in their dealings with the Italians has been issued separately by AFHQ letter file AG 091.1/081 GEC-O, dated 29 March, 1945, subject: "Withdrawal of Allied Commission Personnel from Italian Government Territory."

SUPPLY OF FOOD TO ITALIAN CIVILIANS FROM CIVILIAN SERVICES
(MIDNIGHT MEAL, OFFICE WORKERS' MEAL AND SUPPLEMENTARY RATIONS)

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 46, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. Scope - This memorandum supersedes all former directives on the subject with the exception of HQUSEA Circular Number 116, 1944 (corrected copy).
2. Applicability - The provisions contained herein are applicable to SICILY, SARDINIA and all portions of the mainland of Italy south of the Army Rear Boundary. The provisions hereof are applicable with in Army Areas as far as operational conditions permit and at the discretion of Army and independent Corps commanders.
3. Authority - Authority is granted to provide food, as set forth herein, during each working period of eight (8) hours or more for Italian civilians, who are:
 - a. Workers other than office workers;
 - b. Office workers;

for the Allied Forces. This authority is applicable to civilians employed directly by the Allied Army, Navy or Air Forces, by contractors on their behalf, or to employers of industry operating for the Allied Forces.

4. Responsibility - Where the employee works directly for the Allied Forces, the Army, District, Base Section & Area, or equivalent Commanders, will be responsible:
 - a. For providing the facilities necessary to prepare and serve meals.
 - b. For insuring that Allied military personnel are not used for this purpose except in a minimum supervisory capacity where other arrangements are not possible.
 - c. In conjunction with Allied Commission, for effecting proper distribution of supplementary ration cards for purchase of additional food as hereinafter provided.

5. Ration Scales

- a. Workers other than Office Workers - Below are the details for Midnight Meal and Supplemental Rations for workers other than office workers:

b. Office Workers - Where considered desirable there may be served on the job a daily issue of a standard meal for office workers, consisting of:

40 grms Pasta
 20 " Dried Vegetables
 20 " Soup
 5 " Salt
 5 " Olive Oil (when available)

c. Allowances for other than Office Workers - The following personnel will be entitled to food and supplemental ration cards according to Scale 1 and 2 detailed in paragraph 5 (a) above:

d. Scale 1 - For workers other than office workers employed 100% by the Allied Armed Forces either:

- (1) Directly;
- (2) By contractors and/or industries who in turn are employed by the Allied Armed Forces;
- (3) Railway workers other than those employed in offices.

h. Scale 2

- (1) For workers other than office workers employed by contractors who are employed less than 100% by the Allied Armed Forces, e.g., Public Utilities.
- (2) Labor employed on heavy work for the war effort other than that in a (1) and b (1) above.

c. Each case of workers other than office workers claiming entitlement to Scale 2 rations will be presented to HQ ALOON for a decision as to whether they will receive the entire "2" ration scale or any portion thereof. In determining this, HQ ALOON will be guided by the following priorities:

Priority I - Public Service workers in electric power, gas, water and communications

Priority II - Heavy workers other than office workers employed by contractors working less than 100% for the Allied Armed Forces

d. Labor employed, other than that stated in paragraphs (c) and b above is not entitled to any additional food or supplemental ration cards.

e. Office workers are not entitled to either Scale 1 or 2 rations.

7. Allowances for Office Workers

a. The personnel qualifying for the standard meal for office workers detailed in paragraph 5b above are office workers employed by the Allied Armed Forces either:

- (1) Directly;
- (2) By contractors for industries who in turn are employed 100% by the Allied Armed Forces.

b. All cases of workers claiming entitlement under paragraph a (2) above will be referred to HQ ALOON for a decision as to eligibility.

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8. Issues to Contractors - Issues of food and supplemental ration cards to civilians employed by contractors and industry working for the Allied Armed Forces will be strictly controlled by the employing services in order to insure that:

- a. Only bona-fide employees are fed.
- b. Food is furnished and supplemental ration cards distributed on the proper scale.
- c. Food leakages do not occur.

9. Deductions - The service responsible for placing the control or arranging for the use of industry will also insure that:

- a. Contractors and firms working for the Allied Armed Forces deduct from the wages of their employees the amounts prescribed in paragraph 11 hereof.
- b. A deduction is made on divisions rendered equivalent to the deduction from employees' wages in respect of food.

10. Provision of Supplies - Responsibility for provision of supplies is placed as follows:

a. Midshift meal for workers other than office workers and standard meal for office workers

(1) Flour, dehydrated soup and dehydrated vegetables - The Italian Government is responsible for the provision of flour, dehydrated soup and dehydrated vegetables in territory under its control. In AC/NE territory this responsibility rests with the Allied Commission. When these items are not immediately available from Italian Government or Allied Commission sources for their respective territories, they may be supplied from military stocks. In such cases, S & T, AFHQ, QI, PBS, or QI, Adriatic Base Command will present to HQ ALCON a consolidated monthly total of the amount issued and Allied Commission will arrange replacement whether the issue was in Italian Government or AC/NE territory.

(2) Other Items - Other items will be supplied from military stocks, S & T, AFHQ, QI, PBS, or QI, Adriatic Base Command as the case may be will demand allocation of these items, as applicable, in the normal manner from local resources.

(3) The baking of bread is the responsibility of the employing service.

b. Supplementary Ration - The supply to the normal civilian channel of the food constituting the supplementary ration is the responsibility of the Italian Government in territory under its control and the responsibility of Allied Commission in AC/NE territory.

11. Payment

a. Midshift Meal (workers other than office workers)

(1) There will be deducted from the daily wages an amount equivalent to the cost of the food furnished as items of the midshift meal. This amount will be as follows:

3/5 lbs Bread	3 lire
6 ozs Fresh Vegetables	3 lire
0.5 ozs Dehydrated Soup	1 lire
0.2 ozs Salt	No charge

(2) The whole or any part of the midshift meal may be issued at the discretion of the Commanders mentioned in paragraph 4. In all such cases the cost of the components so issued will be as prescribed in sub-paragraph a (1) above.

(3) Every effort must be made to make the full scale ration available where local conditions make it desirable.

b. Standard Meal (Office Workers) - This meal will be furnished at a cost of 5 lire per head per issue, which cost shall be deducted from the employees' wages.

Use of Port and Railway Premises and Materials II

1--- LOCAL RESOURCES PROCEDURE IN ARMY AREAS

1. Letter, Headquarters Allied Armies in Italy, above subject, dated 29 September 1944 is hereby rescinded.

2. The following considerations will govern in the procurement of local resources found in Army Areas:

a. Operational requirements of forward formations will have first call on all local resources lying within Army boundaries. In this connection attention is invited to AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 14, 1945, the provisions of which are not altered by this Memorandum.

b. Any balances remaining after the demands at (a) above have been satisfied will be made available to meet the requirements of the Allied Armed Forces and the civil administration.

c. Procurement of local resources will in all areas be restricted to the Service or Staff Sections normally responsible for their supply.

d. AMS/AC will be the sole authority for freezing stocks of commodities required by the Armed Forces.

e. Interchange of available resources between Armies will be arranged mutually.

3. In order to apply the considerations listed in paragraph 2 above the following instructions will be effective:

a. Operational requirements may be met to the limit of availability without reference to this Headquarters.

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b. Available balances of controlled or restricted items not required by Armies in Army Areas will be reported to AFHQ Section, RAAC. Attention is invited to Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 46, 1944, which defines controlled and restricted items.

c. Services and Staff Sections of AFHQ/AFMUSA, including the Allied Navies and Air Forces wishing to investigate local resources in Army Areas will do so only after securing approval from the Army concerned; such approval to be specific as to the object of the investigation and the area to be investigated.

d. Services and Staff Sections of AFHQ/AFMUSA, including the Allied Navies and Air Forces, other than those under command of Armies, will only negotiate purchases of controlled and restricted resources in the execution of a release order issued by the AFHQ Board.

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AFHQ Administrative Memo #29 (Cont'd)

e. The control of electric power is vested in AFHQ.

f. Feedstuffs are not considered as operational requirements of forward formations, as fresh fruits and vegetables are provided as necessary by the normal provisioning services. It is the responsibility of the procurement officers of the provisioning services in Army Areas to coordinate with local AMG/AC officials in the determination and purchase of surpluses. The effect of such coordination will be to eliminate any purchases which would result in depriving the local population of its food supply. Where conditions are such that no surpluses exist and it is imperative that fresh produce be purchased, authority to exchange preserved food for fresh produce will be requested from AFHQ/MTUSA. In this connection attention is invited to Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 42, 1944.

21-- USE OF PORT AND RAILWAY PREMISES AND MATERIALS

1. AFHQ Advance Administrative Echelon, Administrative Instruction Number 15, above subject, dated 11 December 1943, is hereby rescinded.

2. It is of the utmost importance that the essential railways and ports of Italy be rehabilitated with a minimum of delay. In order to assist in this effort the following orders on the use of railway and port transportation premises and materials, and the materials of contractors engaged on work on railways and ports are effective forthwith.

3. All railway premises, including transit sheds, sidings, station buildings, and yards, and all that portion of a port which is specifically set aside for Transportation purposes by agreement of Naval and Military Authorities are Reserved Transportation Areas. No depots or installations will normally be set up within Reserved Transportation Areas, and no stores or materials will be stored in them, except those which are required for port or railway operation. This does not apply to special installations such as Bulk Petrol or Cold Storage Plants.

4. No equipment or materials of an essentially railway nature or especially designed for railway or port working will be acquired from Reserved Transportation Areas (which, for the purpose of this paragraph, include private sidings and yards) by others than British Movements or US Transportation authorities controlling the area without application to such authorities. In case of such application the Movements or Transportation Branch of the staff will insure the proper coordination with the Director of Military Railways or with the Port Transportation Authorities, as the case requires.

5. General engineering stores or materials belonging to the Italian State Railways or to Port Authorities, which have been taken in hand on the effective date of this memorandum by the railways, the BRAC, or Port Authorities in rear of army boundaries, will be treated as in paragraph 4 above. In newly liberated territories the provisions of Section 1, above and Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 46, 1944, apply to all other than equipment and materials of an essential railway nature or especially designed for port working.

6. As a general rule, port and railway buildings will not be occupied as billets except by personnel of Transportation units engaged in repair or operation of ports or railways, or by Transportation or Movement Staff. Other units, except as authorized by Army Commanders in their areas, will obtain permission from the proper Movements or Transportation authority prior to occupancy.

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AFHQ Administrative Memo #29 (Cont'd)

7. When railway premises are occupied by military units or when adjoining sites are occupied, railway employees who are properly identified will not be prevented from working on the premises or denied access to railway stores authorized and required for their work. All railway employees carry an identity card on the outside of which appear the words "Ferrovie Dello Stato". Except in Army Areas for operational reasons, the homes of railway employees will not be occupied by military personnel except on approval of Headquarters AFHQ/STCUSA.

8. While it is not desired to restrict the operational actions of Army Commanders, it must be emphasized that interference with railway and port installations, or the diversion to other use of railway and port equipment, even in the forward areas, may have serious consequences on the reopening of forward railway communications and ports. Special railway and port equipment which is moved in Army Areas for operational requirements will be released and returned, where practicable, as soon as the operational needs permit.

Petroleum Accounting I
Allied Force Local Resources Section III -- PETROLEUM ACCOUNTING

1. With effect from 21 April 1945, all Services holding Common Pool stocks of Slated Petroleum Products, as defined in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 27, 1945, will record issues by nationalities in French North Africa, Sicily, Sardinia, Corsica and Greece, and report to AFHQ Petroleum Section as set out below.

2. Naval Fuels & Lubricants - C-in-C, Mediterranean is requested to direct RM, USN, French, Italian and Greek Navies or Civilian Agencies holding Common Pool Stocks in all Mediterranean ports under his control, including Southern France, to segregate and record issues by nationalities as under:

- a. Naval Units - By Flag
- b. Merchant Ships - By Charter and supported by receipts
- c. Inshore Releases - By nationality of demanding service.

Stocks in Southern French ports are under SHAEF control. Issues will be reported by Southern French Agencies, to Headquarters, COMZON, ETOUSA, for accounting purposes in lieu of the present monthly formula percentage.

3. Ground Requirements - Holding or controlling Services will segregate issues between nationalities within the area under their control.

4. Aviation Fuels and Lubricants - RAF, AAFSC, ATC and other slating agencies will record issues into aircraft by nationalities at airfields under their control. RAF records will include issues at Tripoli (Lybia). Issues to Commercial Air Lines not under Government contract and not refuelled through Civilian Organization be segregated and supported by signed receipts.

5. Issues to Civilians and Indigenous Armed Forces - Such issues will only be made and releases reported as detailed in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 49, 1944.

6. Reports - Monthly summary of issues as at 20th each month will be forwarded by Slating Services to Petroleum Section, AFHQ, through the same channels as their monthly Petroleum Slats.

7. Losses - Internal operational losses will be pro-rated between participating nationals on the basis of withdrawals.

II - ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES SECTION

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 77, 1943, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The Allied Force Local Resources Section (AFLRS) has been established as a staff section of this headquarters under the supervision of the Chief Administrative Officer, with station in Rome.

2. The Section will:

a. Advise the CAO, and, on request, the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board, and any other local resources board which may be organized, concerning local resources including their procurement, utilization, allocation, and price coordination, and concerning wage scales and other matters affecting civil employees of the Allied Armed Forces.

b. Furnish or arrange for the furnishing of information concerning local resources to local boards including their committees and to the supply services and aid in the procurement of local resources required by the armed forces.

c. Draft and submit to the CAO, AFHQ, executive instructions when so directed or in conformity with the agreed action of a local board. This will include the securing of the necessary concurrences of other interested staff sections. Where executive instructions are drafted in conformity with the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board agreed decisions, concurrences are required only to the extent that the draft instruction clearly sets forth the agreed decision of the board.

d. Coordinate with AC/AMC with a view to using the full information collecting facilities of AC/AMC and avoiding duplication of effort.

e. Receive requirements from procuring services for allocations of controlled or restricted local resources by committees of a board, and pass the requirements on to the proper committees, and to issue release orders after allocations have been made by boards/committees.

f. Furnish such secretariat for local resources boards and committees as may be directed by the CAO, and assure proper distribution of board and committee minutes.

g. Issue such non policy informational and procedural instructions as may be directed by the CAO or the Allied Forces Local Resources (Italian) Board.

HANDLING OF IMPORTS OF SLATED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS
IN ITALY (EXCLUDING FUELS)

1. All petroleum products imported into this theater through the medium of the Mediterranean Oil Slates are common pool items.

2. The term "common pool" means that:

a. The requirements for all using agencies of any grade are consolidated and requisitioned for importation in one quantity.

b. On arrival the product is not divided between using agencies but held in one stockpile by one stockholder and issues are made to:

(1) US and British as requested

(2) Other Nationals as allocated, in accordance with AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 49, 1944.

3. Stocks held by the Common Pool Stockholder are available for allocation between the Using Agencies by AFHQ.

4. a. The Common Pool Stockholder will normally be the service which has the greatest offtake of each grade, i.e., the service responsible to the users for the supply of a particular product.

5. Using agencies of the Armed Forces not included on the list of Common Pool Stockholders, will draw up to their stated requirements from Common Pool, by direct application to the stockholding agency concerned. When the stock position requires priority of issue between using agencies, the position will be reported to AFHQ, who will assess such priorities.

6. Records of stock as submitted to AFHQ for slating purposes will include common pool stocks only. Issues made from common pool to using agencies will be regarded as issues to consumption.

7. In the interest of economy, efficient control and fairness to all users, no service will accumulate stocks outside the common pool stocks and sub-stock-piles will not be built up.

8. The Common Pool Stock Holder will be responsible for the dispatch of products under his control direct to the shipside or the consuming agency as directed by AFHQ/AFMUSA.

1. Section II, AFHQ General Orders Number 6, 1943 is rescinded by separate action.
2. The Joint Military Finance Committee (JMFC) is hereby reestablished with composition and terms of reference as shown below:

a. Composition

Secretariat	Joint Secretariat, composed of one member of the staff of the Financial Adviser, British, and one member of the staff of the Fiscal Director, MFCUSA.

b. Terms of reference:

- (1) Insure the co-ordination of Allied military financial policy in the Mediterranean Theater of Operations and advise the GAO thereon.
- (2) Receive from spending special staffs and services and other bodies responsible for originating directives having any financial bearing all proposed directives common to all forces prior to issuance, to insure co-ordination with the policies and technicalities of the respective Allied financial services.
3. In the discharge of its duties the JMFC will work in close co-operation with the Allied Commission. To assist to this end and to assure direct liaison, the Allied Commission will be invited by the JMFC to have a representative present at each scheduled meeting of the committee.

4. The JMEC may at its option add such members as may be desirable and co-opt such other persons as may be necessary for the conduct of its duties.

5. In those forces in which instructions are signed and issued by or on behalf of a chief of a staff or service section, the responsibility for reference to the JMEC of proposals having a financial bearing which may affect some other force, will lie with the officer who will eventually sign and issue the instructions. In those forces in which instructions are signed and issued by an agency which is not responsible for the content of the instructions, responsibility for reference to the JMEC will rest with the general or special staff section having primary interest.

ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL SUB-COMMITTEES OF
LABOR & WAGES CONTROL COMMITTEE

Reference is made to Paragraph 5, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 41, 1944.

1. General - At the twenty-second meeting of the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board held on 7 April 1945, the following was decided:

a. That local Sub-Committees of the Labor & Wages Control Committee will be established in Base Sections and Districts (including Rome Area Allied Command)

b. That such local Sub-Committees will be given strictly limited powers to adjust, where necessary, wages paid by the Allied Forces to civilian employees, to insure that the wages so paid bear a suitable relationship to those paid by civilian industries in the same locality.

2. Object - The object of this instruction is to detail the constitution, terms of reference and powers of the local Sub-Committees referred to in paragraph 1 above.

3. Constitution and Territorial Jurisdiction

a. Chairmanship - The Chairman of any local Sub-Committee will be appointed by the Base Section or District Commander (including Commanding General, RAAC) under whose jurisdiction falls the local administration of the territory concerned.

b. Membership - The original membership will be designated by the Commander appointing the Chairman. The membership should be representative of each employing service, Allied Commission/Allied Military Government, US and British labor advisors, and such others as the situation may demand, but should be kept as small as practicable to give essential representation. By agreement a Sub-Committee may alter its membership and co-opt such parties as may be considered expedient. 211

c. Jurisdiction - The territorial jurisdiction of each Sub-Committee will be clearly defined by the Commander appointing the Chairman. The Sub-Committees will recommend territorial changes when considered desirable.

4. Terms of Reference - The terms of reference of the Local Sub-Committees will be:

a. The establishment of necessary local wage scale or bonus adjustments for civilian employees of the Allied Forces, having regard to the local civilian rates paid in private industry.

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AFHQ Administrative Memorandum #25 (cont'd)

b. The coordinating of employment policy and practices of employing units in one locality.

c. Minutes will be kept of all meetings of Sub-Committees, which minutes will be furnished the Commander appointing the Chairman, AFHQ Rome, AFHQ Rome, CAC AFHQ, and such others as determined by the Sub-Committee.

5. Implementation - When implementing the above terms of reference, the Local Sub-Committees will insure that the Allied Force wages and bonuses paid within a particular locality shall not be permitted to be radically higher nor unreasonably lower than the local prevailing civilian rates. A formula for the determination of the rate appropriate for employees of the Allied Forces in relation to civilian rates is attached as Appendix "A".

6. Power of Local Sub-Committees

a. Local Sub-Committees are empowered to authorize provisional increases in local wages and bonuses over the existing Allied Force Basic Wage Scale and bonuses (as of 31 March 1945) within the territory under their jurisdiction, by an amount not exceeding 100 lire per day per adult (40 lire per day for juveniles) on being assured that any increase so authorized is necessary to keep in step with private industry.

b. That an increase, or a series of increases, have been so authorized for a particular category which will raise that category 100 lire per day for adults and 40 lire per day for juveniles above the Allied Force basic wage scale in effect as of 31 March 1945, no further increase will be authorized for that category by any Sub-Committee without reference to AFHQ. AFHQ will refer all such cases to the AFHQ (It-Eng) Board for decision or, if immediate action is indicated, to AFHQ. When cases are referred in which a local Sub-Committee recommends increases in excess of the stated limitation, full justification for the increase will be furnished.

FORMULA FOR DETERMINATION OF RATE APPROPRIATE FOR
EMPLOYEES OF ALLIED FORCE IN RELATION TO
PRIVATE CIVILIAN WAGE RATES

1. In seeking to fix a rate for employees of the Allied Forces which bears a true relation to the private civilian wage rate it is important to determine the net "take home" wage of the worker in ordinary civilian employment.

2. The total of:

a. Basic wage rate for similar occupation in civilian industry

b. Total of all regular "indemnity"

c. Family allowances for the worker with "notional family" consisting of wage earner, wife and two dependant children

gives the gross wage in private industry.

3. From the gross wage in private industry must be deducted the worker's contribution for social insurance and income tax. This gives the net "take home" wage of the employee in private industry.

4. The appropriate rate for the employee of the Allied Forces should be based on the net "take home" wage of the worker in private industry.

RESERVATION OF PROPERTY OF HISTORICAL
AND EDUCATIONAL IMPORTANCE IN AUSTRIA

1. The following instructions for the protection of property of historical and educational importance apply only to AUSTRIA. Similar instructions were issued with regard to ITALY in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 20, 1945.

2. Tactical considerations must obviously influence the occupation of historical monuments, deposits of important documents (archives) and artistic treasures during actual fighting but a rigid control over such occupation will be imposed by commanders as soon as fighting has ceased. In areas where active operations are in progress it is not proposed to forbid the occupation by troops of any specific buildings except that churches will NOT be used for normal troop accommodation. In cases of extreme necessity in such areas, churches may be used temporarily to shelter wounded personnel awaiting evacuation but this authority is not to be interpreted to allow their use as casualty clearing stations or hospitals. The responsibilities for decisions as to whether historical and other buildings are to be occupied or not within areas where active operations are in progress may be delegated to commanders not below the rank of Divisional Commander or officer of equivalent status, except that during actual fighting, in cases of extreme operational necessity it is realized that lower commanders may have to act.

3. As far as the greater part of the damage is likely to occur between the time the battle moves forward and the time reserve formations and administrative units assume full control, it will be the responsibility of commanders to place guards on all historical buildings and those in which archives are stored during this phase, in so far as their resources allow, so that their eventual occupation will be planned and orderly.

4. In areas where active operations are not in progress historical buildings and those in which archives are housed, will not be occupied when alternative accommodation is available, or without the express authority in writing of Army Headquarters. In such areas churches will NOT in any circumstances be occupied.

5. To assist commanders in preventing needless damage to works of art, lists of the principal historical monuments, deposits of important documents (archives), and artistic treasures of AUSTRIA, have been prepared. These lists are known as the Official Lists of Protected Monuments and Archives - AUSTRIA.

a. For easy reference these lists are printed in sections on a regional basis, one for each Gau, as follows:

- (1) OLD VIENNA
- (2) REICHENBERG

- (3) G-5 SECTION
- (4) DISTRICTS
- (5) SUB-DISTRICTS

These will be issued on demand by G-5 Section Army Headquarters.

5. Headquarters Armies, independent formations and any static headquarters which may be under their command will hold a complete set of the lists referred to above and will insure that appropriate sections of these lists are issued to all concerned. Districts, base sections and other equivalent territorial commands in AUSTRIA will insure that copies of sets are maintained at their headquarters and that the undermentioned keep a file of those sections which affect their areas of administrative control:

Headquarters Areas
Headquarters Sub-Areas
Town Majors
Real Estate Officers.

6. Whenever it is found essential for operational reasons to occupy any such buildings, the commander of the occupying troops will be responsible for seeing that G-5 Section are informed at the earliest opportunity, and that every reasonable precaution is taken to prevent careless or willful damage, and especially souvenir hunting. In the case of museums, galleries, libraries, repositories of documents and other cultural institutions, the contents will be stored separately from the parts occupied, communicating doors between the occupied and unoccupied parts of the building will be blocked, as will also all unnecessary entrances from outside whether to the occupied parts or unoccupied parts. Notice boards will be erected, and all troops billeted in the building will be issued with passes and will be the only troops permitted to enter. A single officer will in each instance be made responsible for the observation of these precautions and arrangements will be made whereby responsible Austrian officials can have access for purposes of inspection.

7. Partial occupation of a large historical building, i.e. the occupation of only a small corner, or occupation by troops of more than one Allied Nation will be avoided wherever possible. In the past buildings so occupied have suffered a high proportion of loss and damage, not necessarily attributable to the occupying unit (s).

8. AFHQ has a staff of Monuments and Fine Arts officers with expert knowledge of such matters who are attached to Armies and in some cases to lower formations and who should be consulted in all cases of doubt. Where such officers hold that specific items, e.g. of furniture should be included in those stored separately, their coding will be binding subject to the right of appeal of the occupying unit to the Headquarters through the normal channels.

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AFHQ Administrative Order No. 1 (Cont'd)

9. In addition to the historical monuments mentioned in the lists, there exist important repositories to which the more valuable treasures of museums and galleries have been removed for safety. The sites of such repositories are, with a few exceptions included in the lists. There may, however, be other repositories which are not included in the lists. It is to be noted that repositories may be situated in the open country and that they may not on first impression appear to contain art treasures. It is essential that except in case of extreme operational necessity they be not occupied, and that particular care be exercised to protect the sites and not to disturb or move the contents until examination can be made. Appropriate action for this purpose will accordingly be taken by commanders and the sites of repositories will immediately be reported to the appropriate AMG Monuments and Fine Arts officer in order that inspections and examinations of the contents may be made forthwith.

10. In the case of organized collections, written papers (archives) and of books it is to be noted that even those which do not appear to be ancient may be of great importance, not only historically but as containing information necessary for the practical purposes of the war. Careless handling or disarrangement can, moreover, be as harmful as destruction. In the event of the occupation of buildings, or parts of buildings, containing such collections, the commander of the occupying troops will be responsible for seeing that all reasonable precautions are taken to prevent damage or dispersal.

11. All operation and administrative orders involving the occupation of territory containing historical buildings will contain clear and specific instructions to troops on the lines indicated in this instruction.

PROCUREMENT AND PAYMENT POLICY IN "ITALIAN TERRITORY"
FOR SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 95, 1943 is rescinded.

1. The provisions of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum 31, 1944 are modified to the extent of permitting certain cash (lire) payments to be made by the military forces, United States and British, in accordance with paragraphs 5 and 8 below, pending the establishment of suitable arrangements along the general lines of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 31, 1944. The provisions of this Memorandum are not retroactive and do not authorize payment of any unpaid invoices covering supplies furnished or services rendered prior to this date, which heretofore were not properly payable under the terms of Administrative Memorandum Number 31, 1944.

2. Separate instructions will be issued by AFHQ/HTOUSA to cover disposal of bills not payable under the terms of this directive or AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Numbers 31 or 95.

3. Nothing in this memorandum will be construed as affecting the controlled allocations of certain types of supplies, made by the AFHQ Board, vide Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 45, 1944. Similarly, it will in no way affect the established policies in regard to captured enemy material or equipment.

METHODS OF PROCUREMENT

4. There are two methods of procurement for supplies and services:

- a. Requisition.
- b. "Payment in cash" (Purchase or Rental).

5. While this headquarters authorizes "Payments in Cash" as an alternate method of procurement, such action is not to be considered as an indication that the Italian Government is not responsible under the terms of the Armistice to furnish supplies and services to Allied Governments in Italian Territory at the expense of the Italian Government. Procurement by payment in cash is resorted to in general as a matter of expediency in order to insure a continuing supply of essentials necessary for the prosecution of the war effort.

DEFINITIONS OF METHODS OF PROCUREMENT

6. The two methods of procurement are defined as follows:

- a. Requisition - The term "Requisition" shall mean the process whereby supplies, equipment, facilities or services are procured.

Allied Forces, or the use thereof, are acquired from their owners, regardless of their wishes in the matter or of the price or rental they require, against delivery to them of a requisition receipt note. It is left to the requisitioning authority to decide, in accordance with the terms of this directive whether to determine and pay a fair compensation, in cooperation with AMG/AC representatives wherever possible, or to turn over a copy of the requisition receipt note to the civil government, through such channels as may be directed by the respective forces (United States and British).

b. Payment in Cash - The term "Payment in Cash" shall mean a transaction between the owner of property or the purveyor of a service, or his duly authorized agent, and a purchasing officer of one of the Allied Forces whereby, at a price or rental in conformity with any price restriction measures, etc., in force agreed between proprietor and buyer, the ownership or use of such property is transferred to or the service is received by one of the Allied Forces and proprietor is paid in cash.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING PROCEDURE7. Requisitions

a. Procurement by requisitioning will be used to the maximum extent consistent with the policies set forth herein.

b. As requisitioning on the civilian population is apt to be a source of friction and misunderstanding, which can be substantially lessened in many cases by the avoidance of direct dealing between the requisitioning officer and the owner of the property to be requisitioned, arrangements will be made whenever possible whereby the service of requisition orders and the taking of property are effected by recognized local civil officials.

c. The requisitioning procedure will be used for the procurement of all items for which "Payment in Cash" is prohibited by paragraph 9 below.

d. The requisitioning procedure may be used in combat zones in those instances where it is impossible or inconvenient to arrange for purchase or rental. In such instances the requisitioning procedure will provide for prompt settlement of the requisition whenever payment in cash is appropriate as stated in paragraph 8 below.

e. The requisitioning procedure may be used in those cases where the owner cannot be located or ascertained with reasonable certainty or whenever it is considered that the price, rental or other terms asked are unreasonable.

f. Supplies and Services are not to be requisitioned unless strictly required for military purposes, the test being whether, if payment had to be made, the charge would be admissible against public funds.

g. Procurement authorities will normally exercise such authority within the areas of their respective area commands. Procurement by one authority in an area of another command will not be made except with the knowledge and consent of the area commander concerned.

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AFHQ Administrative Memo #21 (Cont'd)

8. Payment in Cash (Purchase or Rental) - "Payment in Cash" is authorized in any of the following cases:

- a. Small day to day procurements.
- b. Where this is necessary for operational or security reasons or to insure a continuing supply or
- c. Where hardship to an individual would result from delay in payment.

9. No payment in cash will be made for the following:

- a. All public property to include supplies and facilities taken over from or owned by and services performed by state or local authorities or state owned enterprises.
- b. All communications, transportation and utilities including all ports, harbors, POL installations and other services rendered by or the supplies and facilities of concerns engaged in rendering public services.
- c. Private movable property except as authorized in paragraph 8 above.
- d. All fixed assets in real estate including machinery, plant, equipment, etc, installed therein.

REAL ESTATE

10. The methods for procurement and payment described above will not be employed in obtaining the use of real estate. The real estate sections and hiring officers of the respective Forces shall continue to acquire buildings, land, and all other types of real estate, including accommodation and furnishings thereof, through the Italian Government Comando Genio Militare.

11. Claims will be processed by the various claims sections and passed to the Italian Government for payment under the system now in operation.

PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY OF HISTORICAL
AND EDUCATIONAL IMPORTANCE IN ITALY

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 54, 1944 and Headquarters, AAI (Admin. Echelon) Administrative Instruction Number 10, 1944, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. Tactical considerations must obviously influence the occupation of historical monuments, deposits of important documents (archives) and artistic treasures during actual fighting, however, a rigid control over such occupation will be imposed by Commanders as soon as fighting has ceased. In the Army Areas, the occupation by troops of any specific buildings is not forbidden except that churches will NOT be used for mortal troop accommodation. In cases of extreme necessity churches may be used temporarily to shelter wounded personnel awaiting evacuation. This authority is not to be interpreted to allow their use as casualty clearing stations or hospitals. The responsibilities for decisions as to whether an historical building is to be occupied or not within Army Areas may be delegated to Commanders not below the rank of Divisional Commander or officer of equivalent status, except that during actual fighting, in cases of extreme operational necessity lower Commanders may act to meet emergencies.

2. Inasmuch as the greatest damage is likely to occur between the time the battle moves forward and the time reserve formations and administrative units assume full control, it will be the responsibility of commanders to place guards on all historical buildings during this phase, insofar as their resources allow, so that their eventual occupation will be planned and orderly.

3. In all territory behind rear army boundaries, historical buildings will not be occupied when alternative accommodation is available, or without the express authority in writing of this headquarters which will, in such instances, consult the Monuments and Fine Arts Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission. In territory behind Rear Army boundaries Churches will NOT be occupied in any circumstances.

4. To avoid needless damage to works of art, Allied Commission has prepared lists of the principal historical monuments, deposits of important documents (archives), and artistic treasures of ITALY, with the degree of their importance indicated. These lists are known as "Lists of Protected Monuments" and supersede the lists printed in the Zone Handbook of Italy, and AFHQ General Orders Number 60, 1943, insofar as it refers to the Zone Handbook. For easy reference these lists are printed in sections on a regional basis, and will be issued by the Monuments and Fine Arts Sub-Commission of Allied Commission on demand.

5. Headquarters 15th Army Group will insure that Army Headquarters, independent formations and any static Headquarters which may be under their command, hold a complete set of the lists referred to above and that appropriate sections of these lists are issued to all concerned. Districts, Base Sections and other equivalent territorial commands of AFHQ/TOUSA will insure that complete sets are maintained at their Headquarters and that the undermentioned keep a file of these sections which affect their areas of administrative control:

I -- ALLIED COMMISSION

1. Announcement of the establishment of the "Allied Control Commission" was made in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 74, 1943, and its redesignation as "The Allied Commission" was announced in Section I, Administrative Memorandum Number 45, 1944.

2. The functions of the Allied Commission as set out in Administrative Memorandum Number 74, 1943, were defined as follows:

"1. To enforce and execute the instrument of surrender under the orders and general directives of the Allied-Commander-in-Chief.

"2. To insure that the conduct of the Italian Government conforms to the requirements of an Allied Base of Operations, especially transportation and communications.

"3. To be the organ through which the policy of the United Nations towards the Italian Government is conducted and the relations of the United Nations with the Italian Government are handled."

3. In accordance with the policy of the United Nations to afford Italy a greater degree of self-government, directives have been received from the Combined Chiefs of Staff that the control of the Italian Government under the Armistice and Surrender Instrument will be relaxed, and will only be exercised when military needs require it, thus developing in the Italian authorities a greater sense of responsibility. The rights under the Armistice and Surrender Instrument will thus be held in reserve in the matter of day to day administration subject always to overriding military needs and the requirements of the campaign in Italy.

4. Administrative Memorandum Number 74, 1943, will be interpreted accordingly. Detailed instructions, in accordance with those received from the Combined Chiefs of Staff in their telegram FAN 467 of 31 January 1945, have been communicated to the Acting President, Allied Commission.

PROCEDURE FOR MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS OF FORCES UNDER
AFHQ CONTROL WITHIN THE MEDITERRANEAN

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 66, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

GENERAL

1. a. Allied Forces in the Mediterranean theater are maintained by:

- (1) Shipment of requirements from extra Mediterranean sources.
- (2) Intra-Mediterranean movement by sea of existing resources.
- (3) Internal Rail Movement.

b. The procedure for placing demands for movement by sea to meet the maintenance requirements of Allied Forces in the Mediterranean theater is divided into:-

- (1) LONG TERM PROCEDURE
- (2) SHORT TERM PROCEDURE

LONG TERM PROCEDURE

2. The loading of convoys from extra Mediterranean sources for the United States and British Forces, for which AFHQ has a maintenance responsibility will be arranged by AFHQ for British Forces and Commanding General, USMC, for United States Forces, based on forecasts of requirements made by them.

3. In order to ensure that the loading of ships in extra Mediterranean convoys is related to port acceptance capacity and overall requirements:

a. A Tonnage Allocation Meeting will be held at AFHQ one hundred (100) days before the first day of each month, the purpose of which will be to allocate tonnage for all requirements for each port or group of ports to the following users:

- (1) US Army Ground Forces
- (2) US Navy
- (3) Royal Navy
- (4) British Army
- (5) US Air Corps
- (6) Royal Air Force
- (7) Civilian Supplies
- (8) COMUS
- (9) Common User Items, i.e., Coal: P.O.L.:
Transportation Stores
-1- Forage

b. The tonnage allocation will be made in the light of:

(1) The estimate of discharge capacity for each port or group of ports which will be published by AFHQ five (5) days previous to each Tonnage Allocation Meeting.

(2) The operational forecast for the relevant month and the estimated dispositions and strengths of forces required to be maintained.

SHORT TERM PROCEDURE

4. For GREECE- The procedure for short term maintenance of GREECE will be in accordance with instructions contained in AFHQ letter, file AS 400/081 GRS-0 dated 3 December 1944.

5. For ITALY, GREECE, SOUTHERN FRANCE, NORTH AFRICA, SARDINIA, SICILY and CORSICA - at least 27 days before each successive ten (10) day maintenance period, Q(Maint) and G-5, AFHQ, and MTOUSA will receive, and examine bids from all users, with whom they are respectively concerned, for all destinations shown above and submit finalized demands to G-4 (Mov & Tn) and C.O.I., AFHQ respectively.

6. Twenty-five (25) days in advance of successive ten (10) day maintenance periods - Shipping Priority of Movements meeting will be held at AFHQ. This meeting will:

(a) Arrange to meet the requirements as notified under paragraph 5 above for the relevant period. These demands will be met as far as acceptance of ships will permit by the diversion of stores ships scheduled to arrive during the relevant period from extra Mediterranean sources.

(b) Decide tonnages to be moved by sea within the Mediterranean having taken account of extra Mediterranean shipments under paragraph 6(a) above.

(c) Decide on the acceptance capacity of each port or group of ports for the relevant period.

(d) In the light of (c) above decide if the tonnages bid can be accepted and if not state what total tonnage by ports or groups of ports cannot be accepted.

(e) If reduction in the tonnages bid is necessary under (d) above, decide under the joint direction of G-4, MTOUSA and Q(Maint) in what proportion between users cuts on bids are to be borne.

Subsequent to each Shipping Priority of Movements Meeting, AFHQ will notify all concerned the convey and stores program set up from all sources for shipment under the short term procedure.

7. New Operational Areas within the Mediterranean

a. Operational Areas which may in future be opened in the Mediterranean under control of AFHQ, and which require maintenance by sea, will normally be maintained for the first thirty (30) days under special arrangements detailed in the administrative plan for the operation.

b. Subsequent maintenance will be in accordance with short term procedure as in paragraphs 4 to 6 above.

MAINTENANCE BY RAIL MOVEMENT IN ITALY

8. General

a. Rail Priority of Movements Meetings to cover seven (7) day periods will be held weekly at AFHQ.

b. Bids by commodities for Rail Movement in ITALY will be submitted by Users to AFHQ for each period as instructed in Appendix "A".

9. Allocation of Rail Capacity

a. AFHQ will notify 15th Army Group weekly the provisional allocation of overall rail capacity available for users in the Army Areas.

b. Capacity will be expressed in terms of net tonnages per day and will cover personnel, ambulance trains, stores and vehicles.

c. 15th Army Group will recommend to AFHQ allocations between the various users in the Army Areas as follows:

- (1) To Eighth Army
- (2) To British Increment Fifth Army
- (3) To US Ground Forces
- (4) To Air Forces who do not bid through Army Headquarters
- (5) To Civil Relief which is not bid through Army Headquarters
- (6) To any other user who is not covered by (1) to (5) above.

The capacity notified by AFHQ will cover the requirements of any of the above users in the Army Areas even though such tonnages are required to be delivered at a Railhead behind the Army Rear Boundaries.

d. On receipt of 15th Army Group recommendations AFHQ will notify all concerned of allocations finally approved.

10. Procedure for Implementing Rail Movements - Detailed instructions for implementing rail movement are given in Appendix "A" attached.

11. Operative Dates

a. The first month to which the Long Term Maintenance Procedure was applied was MAY 1945, the tonnage allocation meeting for which was held at AFHQ on 30 January 1945.

b. The first ten (10) day maintenance period to which the short term procedure applied was from 7 - 15 March 1945, requirements for which were due at AFHQ on 9 February 1945, (see paragraphs 5 and 6).

c. The first period to which the Rail Procedure applied was from 15 - 21 January 1945, bids for which were due at AFHQ on 5 January 1945.

PROCEDURE FOR IMPLEMENTING RAIL MOVEMENT IN ITALY

1. Weekly on Tuesdays, AFHQ will notify 15th Army Group total rail capacity expressed in terms of net tons daily available in the Army Area for delivery in the week beginning twenty days later, together with AFHQ priority allocations (if any).

2. On receipt of notification of rail capacity available as at paragraph 1 above, 15th Army Group will recommend to AFHQ at least seventeen days in advance of the weekly maintenance period the distribution of this tonnage capacity as shown in paragraph 9 of the basic document. AFHQ will inform all concerned of final allocations.

3. Rail Movement into Army Areas - Bids for rail movement within the tonnages allocated in paragraph 2 above will be submitted as follows to arrive at AFHQ ten (10) days in advance of the weekly maintenance period.

a. For Eighth Army and British Increment Fifth Army

(1) Tonnage requirements by destinations broken down by commodities and including A.F.Vs. Ambulance and Personnel Trains will be submitted by respective Army Headquarters.

(2) At the same time Services at Eighth Army and British Increment Fifth Army will submit their detailed breakdowns within those tonnages to Services at AFHQ.

b. For Fifth (US) Army - Tonnage requirements by destinations broken down by commodities, in respect of Ground Forces in the Fifth (US) Army Area will be submitted by Commanding General, HQUUSA.

c. For Air Forces - Tonnage requirements by destinations broken down by commodities, for Air Forces located in the Army Areas, which have not been covered by bids made through Army Headquarters, will be submitted by AAFSC/ATO and HAF as applicable. 1197

d. For Civil Relief - Tonnage requirements by destinations broken down by commodities, for civil Relief in Army Areas which have not been covered by bids made through Army Headquarters will be submitted by Headquarters Allied Commission.

e. For Other Users - Tonnage requirements by destinations broken down by commodities, for movement into the Army Areas, not covered by paragraphs a to d above, will be submitted by the responsible Headquarters.

4. Rail Movement out of the Army Areas - Demands for movement by rail out of the Army Areas will be submitted under the same procedure and by the same Headquarters as shown at paragraph 3, above. Armies will indicate priorities when submitting their demands.

5. Rail Movement in Rear of Army Boundaries

a. All Headquarters and Users having requirements for movements by rail behind the Army Rear Boundaries will submit their requirements to arrive at AFHQ

ten (10) days in advance of the weekly maintenance period.

b. Stores bid will show tonnages required by commodities, source of supply and destination. Acceptance of bids for local movement is delegated in certain instances to subordinate Movements (Br) and Transportation (A) Headquarters. Bids for such movements will be submitted to the relevant Movements (Br) and Transportation (A) Headquarters and not to AFHQ.

6. Weekly at 1430 hours on Mondays, a Rail POM Meeting to consider bids for the period commencing seven days later will be held at AFHQ at which the following will be represented:

7. Following the POM Meeting, AFHQ will notify all concerned the firm allocations of rail tonnages made. Final loading instructions to supplying agencies will then be issued through normal channels by the relevant authorities. These instructions will reach supply agencies before noon each TUESDAY.

8. Emergency Bids

a. Alterations to bids, within existing allocations, will be submitted to AFHQ for a decision.

b. Alterations to bids in excess of the tonnages allocated, for movement into the Army Area, will be submitted to AFHQ and to 15th Army Group. 15th Army Group will recommend or otherwise to AFHQ, together with proposals for compensating cuts in other tonnages.

c. Application for adjustment of rail tonnages must be received at AFHQ at least six (6) days before delivery is required.

I--- DEFINITIONS UNDER WHICH ITALIANS WILL BE EXEMPTED FROM THE MILITARY SERVICE

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 10, 1944, is amended as follows:

1. Delete the last sentence of paragraph 2a and substitute the following:

"Forms will be submitted in quadruplicate to the local British or United States Labor representative, except in the case of personnel employed by the Italian State Railways, forms for whom will be submitted direct to the Director Military Railway Service, Italy."

2. Paragraph 3a (15) is added as follows:

"(15) Director Military Railway Service, Italy."

II--- ALLIED FORCE BASIC WAGE SCALE

1. The following new grades will be added to the Allied Force Basic Wage Scale. These will become effective beginning with the first pay period after the receipt by the employing unit of this Administrative Memorandum. They are subject to the cost of living bonus at any rates and under the conditions prescribed by AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 62, 1944.

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2. New Grades to be added to the Allied Force Basic Wage Scale:

- a. To Appendix "D" (Italy) to AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 47, 1944 (as amended),

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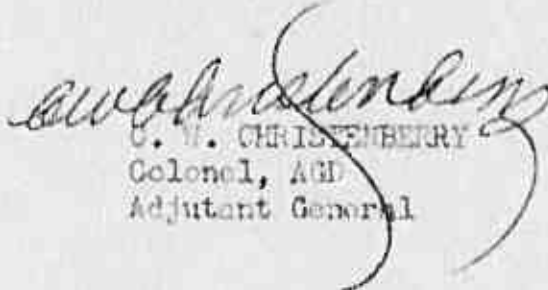

USE OF COMMERCIAL FACILITIES FOR CIVIL REQUIREMENTS

MAR 9 1945

1. It is the responsibility of the Supreme Allied Commander to provide for the civil population of liberated territory that which is necessary to prevent threat and unrest. It is his policy to make the maximum use of local resources in providing for the essential civilian requirements.
2. The safety of all ranks of the Armed Forces in the discharge of the Supreme Allied Commander's responsibilities to the civil population should be constantly present in their minds. All ranks must, even in the absence of active operations, realize that lives that otherwise it is possible to achieve a military object by a direct or indirect otherwise equal, the method which involves least the essential needs of the civil economy is the method to be preferred and adopted. Care must be taken by the responsible commander that, except in definite emergencies, he neither occupies a position that is adjacent to the civil economy nor dismantles, removes by seizure or destruction, the equipment thereof. Except to prevent further loss or destruction, or to meet the immediate operational needs, raw materials or fuel for civil economy will not be unnecessarily requisitioned or removed except by the procedures set forth in Section III, AFHQ Administrative Policies, March 25, 1945.
3. a. In the detailed planning for the occupation of an area, the military authority responsible for such planning, and the Allied Commission, will consult with the municipal military and civil requirements in that area affecting local resources. The military authority will elaborate his plan so far as possible to include any proposals agreed to the result of such consultation. Any such agreement must not necessarily be tentative and adjustments may be dependent upon the physical condition of the area when occupied and upon the military situation. b. In establishing the agreement, the agreement shall include definite facilities reserved for the military and facilities designated reserved for essential civil requirements. Facilities not so designated will not initially be reserved for either military or civil requirements but are subject to transfer agreement as the need is recognized.
4. In planning of the country for which a definite military operational plan is considered necessary, instructions defining military requirements and those civil requirements for which the military assumes responsibility will be issued by the military authority responsible for planning. For the area as a whole, if so desired by Allied Commission.
5. In the case of property to be used for the military which Allied Commission has stated to be essential to the civil economy, the probable duration of requisitioning by the military and the period of occupancy will be stated in the plan.
6. In the immediate execution of operational plans the decision of the Army Group is final and is subject to modification in all cases. However, the

Allied Commission is of the opinion that the use of the facility during military maneuvers will cause undue harm to the civil economy, and local agreement cannot be reached. Allied Commission may, without interrupting the operational plan or the immediate execution, inform the Army or equivalent commander that an appeal will be filed, and submit such an appeal as indicated in paragraph 4 below.

c. In the further execution of a plan in Army or equivalent areas, or in execution of operations within or without Army areas, in the event there is a conflict between military interests and an interest which Allied Commission considers connected to the civil economy with respect to:

(1) The equitable allocation of factories, warehouses, and other commercial and industrial facilities including their personnel, and

(2) The control of their use and operation, the procedures set forth in paragraph 4 will be followed.

d. e. The Allied Commission may present its case and recommend action to the responsible Area, District, Base Section or Army Commander, or other responsible military authority, whether or not operational need has been advanced by the military authority or not. Allied Commission will accompany their case with a complete and factual justification.

f. The responsible military authority to which the case is referred will consider the case and every effort will be made to reach a solution satisfactory to Allied Commission and the military commander. In the event a satisfactory solution cannot be found, the military commander will return the request to Allied Commission with a written statement as to the extent to which he can meet Allied Commission's desires and as to the conditions which he cannot accept.

g. Allied Commission then may submit the matter to an investigating sub-committee appointed by the Industrial Co-ordination Committee of the Allied Forces Local Base Area (Italian) Board, through AFM 14. The investigating sub-committee will investigate the case in detail and attempt to find some solution agreeable to all parties concerned.

h. If no such solution can be found, the sub-committee will submit the case to the ICC (Industrial Co-ordination Committee) with recommendations.

i. The ICC will then adjudicate and make its award. If no protest is received by AFM 14 from an interested party within 48 hours after the award, such award will become effective. In the event of a protest, the matter will be referred to the AFM 14 Board, the decisions of which will be binding upon all parties.

j. k. Except in the immediate execution of operational plans as stated in paragraph 3d above, the military will not exercise initial control of a facility concerning which Allied Commission has initiated a request for adjudication, until definitive action has been taken in accordance with these instructions.

b. When a plant, mine or other commercial facility has been de-requisitioned to permit of its producing materials or services essential to civil economy, all machinery, fixtures, equipment and plant essential to such production, except that which may have been installed by the using Service, shall be exempt from subsequent requisition unless the facility itself is again requisitioned. Surplus materials, as declared under the provisions of Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 46, 1944, are subject to allocation as set forth in that memorandum.

c. Plants, mines or other commercial facilities which may be declared not subject to requisition or which have been de-requisitioned under the provisions of this memorandum will be adequately posted by the local district, base section, or army commander, or other responsible military commander, to prevent unauthorized entry or removal of protected equipment, fixtures, machinery and materials.

d. When considering matters of requisitioning and de-requisitioning, military authorities will show special leniency with respect to facilities of the monopoly industries of the Italian Government such as those engaged in the manufacture of matches, the processing of tobacco and the extraction of salt. These are of special importance in providing essential revenue to the Italian Government.

I -- ALLOCATION OF LOCALLY PRODUCED FOODSTUFFS

Paragraph 2(c), Section III, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 42, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"(c) Certain relatively small quantities are required for the victualling of ships of the Allied Navies which are operating from Italian ports and are unable to obtain their requirements elsewhere. These will be made available as a second priority after meeting the needs of hospitals (see paragraph 6 below). Allied Naval shore personnel, U.S.N. and U.S.A. vessels, and Allied Naval ships which can obtain their requirements elsewhere, will be considered in the same priority as the Allied Armies."

II - SUPPLIES AND STORES FOR DIPLOMATIC AGENCIES

1. United States - All members of United States Embassies, Consulates, State Department, or bona fide representatives of the United States government may draw United States Army rations or be subsisted in United States Army messes. (Payment will be made as outlined in paragraph 3, Section IV, MTOUSA Circular Number 116, 1944) Essential clothing may be purchased at Army Exchange stores as provided in paragraph 11, MTOUSA Circular Number 3, 1944. Request for any other supplies will be submitted to this headquarters for approval. This applies to citizens of the United States only.

2. United Kingdom

a. Rations - The provisions in paragraph 1 above apply except that supplies to British subjects will be issued from British Army stocks, on repayment in accordance with British instructions.

b. Clothing - As detailed in letter AFHQ/6017/Q(AR) dated 2 October 1944 as amended by letter AFHQ/9171/Q(AR) dated 26 January 1945.

3. Other Allied and Neutral Nations - Regulations for subsistence or for purchase of military clothing and Army Exchange supplies for diplomatic agencies (or their territory) will be submitted to this headquarters for approval and designation of supply responsibility, i.e., United States, United Kingdom, or Allied Commission.

Conditions Under Which Italians Will be Exempted from the Military Service . III -- PAYMENTS TO C. I. P. IN ITALY

1. This instruction sets forth the methods to be adopted in the settlement to be made for facilities and services provided by C. I. P. (Comitato Italiano Petroli).

2. In accordance with established policies, payment will not be made to C. I. P. for the use of petroleum plants and facilities which were in existence before the date of liberation from the enemy. Furthermore, payment will not be made to C. I. P. for labor and maintenance materials used in the normal operations of C. I. P., which include receipt, storage and issue of petroleum products, and cleaning and filling containers.

3. Labor employed on the construction and removal of additional petroleum facilities, and in the operation of all new petroleum facilities outside the boundaries of petroleum plants existing at the date of liberation, will be deemed, in cases of work done at the request of the Allied Forces, to be employed direct by the Allied Forces and will be employed and paid in accordance with the current instruction for such payment. Where desired, arrangements may be made for C. I. P. Managers to recruit labor and supervise such operations but in all such cases they will act as representatives of the Allied Forces and not in the name of C. I. P.

4. Payment will be made for services by C. I. P., which cannot be considered as part of the normal maintenance and operation of a petroleum installation or depot. Such services include repairs to plant and equipment not the property of C. I. P., the preparation of containers for the use of products other than petroleum, etc. Such payments will be on a cost basis and will cover only salaries, wages, and any expenses incurred by C. I. P. in the purchase of material and the like.

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 38 and paragraph 14, Administrative Memorandum Number 63, both 1944, are rescinded and the following substituted therefore:

1. The Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, hereby assumes the title and functions of Military Governor of all Italian Territory which is, or from time to time may become, subject to Allied Military Government.

2. Headquarters Allied Military Government, Fifth and Eighth Armies, will operate under the operational command of Commanders Fifth and Eighth Armies and under the technical control of Headquarters, Allied Commission.

3. Commanding General, 15th Army Group will be provided, by Chief of Commission, Allied Commission, with a Civil Affairs Staff, whose duties will be as follows:

a. To advise Commanding General, 15th Army Group on all aspects of military government and civil administration which might affect his operations.

b. To afford liaison between Headquarters, 15th Army Group and Headquarters, Allied Commission.

c. To insure that the operation of AMG in the Armies is coordinated with the tactical plans of Commanding General, 15th Army Group.

4. The size and organization of the staff referred to above will be determined by agreement between Commanding General, 15th Army Group and Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission, provided always that its functions remain as defined in paragraph 3 above.

1. General

a. As a result of the additional commitments undertaken by the Italian Authorities to provide Italian Units for employment as such with the Allied Forces, it is essential that the required Italian personnel be made available for service in these units now being organized to the maximum extent, which is possible without involving depletion of Allied manpower.

b. All Italians in Allied employment, either directly or by contractors, who are subject to call will continue in their employment only on the conditions set forth below.

2. Initial Procedure - Application will be made for authority to release in employment personnel subject to call in the following manner:

a. Application forms (Appendix "A") will be completed by the employing unit in respect of all personnel affected. Men falling within the following categories will be listed on separate forms:

Category I - Skilled Labor employed in Military installations.

Category II - All other labor.

Forms will be submitted in quadruplicate to the local British or United States Labor representative.

b. The local British or United States Labor representative will complete the certificate appearing on the application form stating whether or not replacements can be provided from civilian sources. He will then forward three (3) copies of the application form as follows:

Category I - To appropriate Head of Service or Chief of Special Staff Section (see 4), who will in turn forward 2 copies to the appropriate exempting authority with his recommendation.

Category II - To the appropriate exempting authority (see paragraphs 3 and 5).

3. Exempting Authorities

a. The following are declared to be Exempting Authorities for the purposes of this instruction:

The exempting authority will take into consideration the certificate of the British or United States Labor representative but will not authorize exemption in any case unless satisfied that the retention in employment of the individual concerned is so essential that such individual will be of greater value to the Allied war effort by remaining in his present capacity than he would be if called into the Italian Military Service.

b. Where exemption is granted the Exempting Authority will complete a Certificate of Exemption (Appendix "B") and will forward it together with one copy of the application form to the appropriate Italian Authority as set out below:

c. The Certificate of Exemption will be sealed and countersigned on behalf of the Italian Authorities and returned to the Exempting Authority for onward transmission to the employing unit who will hand it to the person exempted.

d. Should the Italian Authorities take exception to an exemption authorized by an Allied Exempting Authority, they will return the Certificate of Exemption, with their comments but without Seal or Countersign, to the Exempting Authority, through IMIA, for review. Final determination in each case will rest with the Exempting Authority, but full consideration will be given to the views of the Italian Authorities and IMIA.

5. Channels of Application - All applications forwarded by the local British or United States Labor Representative to an Exempting Authority will be submitted through the normal channels of command.

6. Duration of Exemption - Exemptions granted under the provisions hereof will be valid only for a period of six months with effect from date of exemption. Applications for further exemption will be submitted in the same manner except that the form will be marked (RENEWAL) and previous authority quoted.

7. Notification

a. Employing Units will notify the Exempting Authority of any personnel to whom exemption has been granted who is subsequently released from employment, and will instruct the released employee to report to the nearest Reali Carabinieri Headquarters for direction to the nearest Italian Military District.

b. Exempting Authorities will supply full particulars of all personnel whose exemption is cancelled or expired to the appropriate Italian Authority as set out in paragraph 4, b above.

8. Civilian Firms - Applications for exemption will be made by the authority concerned in similar form and on similar grounds as set forth above in respect of personnel employed by civilian firms doing work of operational importance for the Allied Forces.

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AFHQ Adm. Memo. #10 (cont'd)

9. Refusal of Exemption - Where an application for permission to retain personnel in employment is refused, the employing unit may continue to employ such personnel until called up by the Italian authorities.

10. Applicability

a. This instruction is applicable to Italian Civilian personnel employed by both British and United States Forces and by civilian firms doing work of operational importance for the Allied Forces.

b. Nothing in this instruction shall in any way affect Italian prisoners of war (including cooperators) employed by the Allied Forces.

c. Nothing in this instruction shall be construed as providing exemption for deserters from the Italian Armed Forces. In all cases deserters will be turned over to the nearest Italian Military Authority for return to their units for disciplinary action.

b. Providing data and other information pertinent to disposals that may be useful and appropriate.

2. Civilian employees will not, therefore, wear any article of civilian outer clothing with any military or service uniform which they are permitted to wear.

FACILITIES AND SERVICES TO BE EXTENDED TO UNRRA ITALY MISSION

1. The facilities and services set out in this Administrative Memorandum shall be extended to:

a. The UNRRA Italy Mission hereinafter referred to as UNRRA (Italy).

b. Non-indigenous personnel thereof and non-indigenous Voluntary Society workers acting under the authority of UNRRA (Italy). All such personnel are hereinafter referred to as UNRRA (Italy) personnel.

2. a. When required, UNRRA (Italy) personnel will produce evidence of their identity in the form of a special "Certificate of Identity" issued by UNRRA (Italy). This certificate will show the status, category and assimilated rank of the holder. If wearing uniform, UNRRA (Italy) personnel shall wear the approved UNRRA flash at the top of each sleeve.

b. UNRRA (Italy) personnel will be regarded as "persons following the armed forces in the field without directly belonging thereto" under Article 61 of the Prisoners of War Convention. As such they will be covered by that Article and will be subject to the applicable military law (British or United States). Under Article 61 they will receive a certificate setting forth the equivalent Army rank for purposes of status and pay, stating that if captured the holder is to be treated as a prisoner of war. *See 155*

c. Certain UNRRA (Italy) personnel will have the assimilated rank or status of Officers of the Forces. Such status however is only to entitle the holder to such privileges of officers as may be made available under this Administrative Memorandum. This status will be granted prior to entry, or in the field, by the appropriate military authorities in this theater.

3. a. British Army and/or United States Army sources may be drawn upon under this Administrative Memorandum as the convenience of UNRRA (Italy) and local availabilities may dictate, except that, where separate facilities are available locally, British personnel will use British facilities and United States personnel will use United States facilities.

b. The resources of the Allied Commission may be drawn upon hereunder, and the term "the military" as used herein includes the Allied Commission. *1183*

4. The facilities and services set out in this Administrative Memorandum shall be extended subject always to operational requirements and providing the military situation permits, and in the case of the Allied Commission to the extent that demand for civilian requirements permits.

5. a. No payment will be required for facilities and services extended under this Administrative Memorandum except as provided in b. below. b. charge,

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JPRS 68-1000 #6 (cont'd)

however, is to be made to UNRRA (Italy), and accounted for by the military. Disbursement settlement will be effected by UNRRA (Italy) with the British and United States Governments as follows:

3. Personal items such as accommodations, mess bills, PI and/or SPI are paid in cash both by military and non-military personnel. Where a differentiation in price exists for military and non-military personnel the appropriate charge will be made.

4. Facilities and Services to be extended to Personnel for Unit Subsistence and Operation of Unit Vehicles etc. - The following facilities and services will be available:

a. Requisitions - Requisitions or requisitions will be submitted in the normal manner in accordance with the local military procedure. Where available, transportation facilities will be extended under the same conditions as for military personnel.

b. Accommodation - Accommodation for personnel and vehicles, and provision for office and work space.

c. Medical Aid - Medical and dental treatment under the same conditions as for military personnel and admittance to military hospitals, excluding the provision of dentures and surgical appliances.

d. Travel

(1) Issue of travel orders on duty or on leave under same conditions as for military personnel within the theater of operations.

(2) Travel in military vehicles under the same conditions as military personnel.

e. Claims - The Claims Commission or Claims Service will deal with claims arising out of acts of UNRRA (Italy) personnel as if British Service or United States Army personnel were involved, in the same way as. Payments in settlement of such claims will be recovered from UNRRA (Italy).

f. PLI - Issued on production of a trip (work) ticket. UNRRA (Italy) vehicles will be registered in the same manner as military vehicles and must display on the wind-shield, an official printed label "UNRRA (Italy)."

g. Motor Transport - Mechanical maintenance of UNRRA (Italy) vehicles including the supply, if stocks permit, of spare parts, tires and tubes, recovery and repairs in such British or United States Army workshops as may be available, and subject to operational priorities. The transportation of vehicles under the same conditions as for military organizations.

h. Quarters stores etc., Clothing, Necessaries and Equipment - Uniform for UNRRA (Italy) personnel will be provided by UNRRA. Personal equipment and clothing within a scale appropriate to personnel of noncombatant status, accommodations, stores, and mess equipment and office furniture to scales appropriate to military organizations will, if available, be supplied and accounted for

as in paragraph 5. Additional items issuable to military personnel under certain conditions will also be issuable on the same terms.

i. Assistance by the military in the recruitment of civilian personnel, who will be paid by UNRRA in accordance with the official established scales.

j. Stationary - Stationary and office requisites within the normal scales, indents or requisitions for which will be submitted to the nearest stationary depot.

k. Officers' Shops, EPI and PX facilities

(1) Personnel will have the right to use EPI or PX facilities when available, according to their status and under the same conditions as for military personnel.

(2) Personnel of officer status will normally have the right to use United States and RAOC Officers' Shops for replacement purchases only and subject to local availability of stocks in excess of requirements of service officers. Scales of personnel for whom entitlement is claimed will be submitted in duplicate to Q(AE) AFHQ and to the Theater Exchange Officer in the case of United States citizens, when permits will be issued.

(3) Personnel authorized to use PX and United States Army Officers' Shop facilities will not be allowed to use EPI and RAOC Officers' Shop facilities and vice versa.

7. Accommodation Centers and Other Installations for Displaced Persons Transferred or to be transferred by the military to UNRRA (Italy) Administration

a. Upon transfer to UNRRA (Italy) administration, provisions and accommodations will continue to be held by the military authorities under appropriate arrangements to assure continued use thereof for the accommodation of Displaced Persons until UNRRA (Italy), by agreement with the Italian Government or otherwise, shall be in a position to make its own arrangements therefor.

b. Upon transfer to UNRRA (Italy) administration, and until further notice, the military will continue to furnish, to scales presently applicable, the stores, supplies and equipment and outside local services necessary for the operation of such centers and installations.

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AFHQ Form Memo # 6 (Cont'd)

8. Transportation and Storage - Automotive, rail, coastwise and trans-oceanic transportation, handling and storage facilities operated or controlled by the military, including storage at military depots, may be made available to move and store UNRRA (Italy) stores, supplies and equipment.

9. Loan of Supplies - The loan of food, medical and sanitary and other supplies, vehicles and other equipment from stocks owned or controlled by the military is authorized upon arrangement for replacement in kind by UNRRA (Italy), such arrangements to be satisfactory to the military concerned. In future, at the election of the military, charges, in accordance with paragraph 5a in List 2, of replacement in kind, may be required. Vehicles or other non-expendable items turned over to UNRRA (Italy) under these arrangements shall not be altered or modified without the prior approval of the military concerned except for appropriate servicing maintenance and repair. The cost of avoidable loss or damage or in the event replacement in kind is not made will be charged to UNRRA (Italy).

10. Procedure - UNRRA (Italy) will bid for its requirements under paragraphs 7 to 9 inclusive through normal channels.

I - REQUISITIONING AND DEREQUISITIONING OF CIVILIAN MOTOR TRANSPORT

Section II, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 59, 19/4, is amended by the deletion of the words "15th Army Group" where they appear therein, and substituting the words "15th Army Group as appropriate".

II - PAYMENT OF CONTRACTORS' EMPLOYEES

1. Effective 1 January 1945, contractors will pay their employees the following, only:

a. BASE PAY (RETRIBUZIONE ORDINARIA). To be declared by the contractor as the portion of his payroll subject to social insurance contributions, or similar recognized charges arising from Italian Law. The Base Pay so declared, when added to the Presence Indemnity, the Cost of Living Indemnity, and the employer's cost for Family Allowances (i.e., 2% of Base Pay) may not exceed the Allied Force daily maximum compensation for the particular occupation or occupations concerned.

b. PRESENCE INDEMNITY (INDENNITA' DI PRESENZA). Legal rate for private industry.

c. COST OF LIVING INDEMNITY (INDENNITA' DI CAROVITA). Legal rate for private industry.

d. FAMILY ALLOWANCE (ASSEGNO FAMILIARE). Legal rate for private industry.

2. Base Pay will be considered as including all regular, recurring compensation with respect to standard work period as defined in collective labor contracts or established, recognized practice, including only Presence Indemnity, Cost of Living Indemnity and Family Allowance. 1181

3. Overtime and similar extraordinary pay rates (night, Sunday, etc.,) will be calculated on the declared Base Pay.

4. 5. The contractor will pay the social insurance contributions and similar charges required by Italian Law, calculated on the declared Base Pay, and on overtime where applicable.

b. With respect to social insurance, the contractor will pay the employer's contributions for:

Sickness Assistance	(Assistenza Malattia)

Fund for workers called to arms	(Cassa Richiamati alle armi)

and the employee's contribution for:

which contributions will not be deducted from the employee's pay.

c. The contractor's estimate or bid will consider payment for Family Allowances of only 20 per cent of the Base Pay. Note to Contracting Officers: Necessary exceptions to the limitations set forth in the above clause may be made in the following circumstances:

- (1) In cases of employees regularly employed by a firm on a piece-work basis, established piece-work rates may be paid. Such rates will be declared by the contractor and any reasonable necessary excess over the compensation provided for in paragraph 1 of above clause may be approved.
- (2) In cases of employees entitled by a legal collective labor contract to some compensation (premium, indemnity or similar special payment) by reason of particular conditions of employment, in addition to compensation specified in paragraph 1 of the above clause, such compensation may be paid. If payment of such compensation, added to legal Base Pay, Presence Indemnity, Cost of Living Indemnity and employer's cost of Family Allowances, results in total exceeding Allied Forces maximum compensation, any reasonable necessary excess may be approved.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR AIRFIELD CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF
OPERATIONAL AIRFIELDS IN THE MEDITERRANEAN THEATER

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 40, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. Responsibility - The Air C-in-C Mediterranean is responsible, with the technical assistance of Chief Engineer, AFHQ, for:

- a. Determining the policy for airfield construction and maintenance throughout the theater.
- b. The establishment of priorities for airfield construction and maintenance requirements.
- c. The allocation of such special airfield construction stores as are under the control of Commanding General, AAF/ETO. Stores of British procurement will be allocated by AFHQ.

2. The MECE, AFHQ, is responsible for arranging, in consultation with Air C-in-C, for the allocation of British airfield construction resources in accordance with the policy laid down by the latter.

3. Execution

- a. US Aviation Engineer Battalions are part of AAF/ETO and are employed under the orders of the Commanding Officer, AAF Engineer Command, to meet the requirements as determined by the Air C-in-C.
- b. British Airfield Construction Groups, RE, are part of the British Army. They will be employed under the direction of the senior RE officer of the British Army formation concerned, to meet the requirements as determined by the Air C-in-C.
- c. Within the framework of the general policy, the Air C-in-C may delegate the responsibility for determining priorities and general requirements for airfield construction and maintenance to subordinate Air Force commands who will act, where appropriate, in conjunction with the Senior RE officer of the British Army formation concerned.
- d. The maintenance of airfields assigned to American Naval Aviation and American Air Transport Command is the responsibility of the Command to which the particular airfield is assigned. Special arrangements are made for RAF Transport Command and Royal Naval Air stations with Air C-in-C, Mediterranean and MECE, AFHQ as necessity arises from time to time.

c. In the case of joint occupation of airfields and/or facilities, or the operation of facilities serving such installations, the provision of the necessary maintenance services will be a matter for direct mutual arrangement of the Commands concerned.

I --- TRANSACTIONS IN CURRENCY AND FOREIGN EXCHANGE ASSETS

1. Except as otherwise specifically authorized, personnel in this theater are prohibited from:

a. Importing, holding, transferring, exporting, or in any way dealing in United States or British paper currency.

b. Participating in transactions involving the purchase, sale or exchange of gold coin and bullion or any currency against any other currency, except through authorized agencies.

See para. 49a. c. Importing or exporting any currency through mail or parcel post facilities, except currency of small denomination as souvenirs.

d. Participating in any transaction involving gold coin and bullion, or the foreign exchange assets of any person in liberated or occupied territory not belonging to the Allied Forces.

e. Participating in the transfer of any currency against any other currency on behalf of persons not belonging to the Allied Forces in liberated or occupied territory, or on behalf of a person belonging to a unit of the Allied Forces of another nationality.

f. Participating in the importing or exporting of funds, securities, money or other financial assets on behalf of persons not belonging to the Allied Forces in occupied or liberated territory.

I -- SUPPLY OF AIR FORCES

Section II, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 44, 1944, is amended as follows:

1. Paragraph c(2) is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"DST and HTOUSA are responsible for the receipt, handling, storage and issue of bulk and packaged aviation fuel and engine lubricants in Ocean Terminals and in depots other than dumps mutually agreed with HAAF."

2. Paragraph c(3)(b) is amended by the deletion of the words "COMZONE, HATOUSA", and the substitution of the word "HTOUSA" therefor.

II - REQUESTS FOR AIR TRAVEL

Section I, Administrative Memorandum Number 51, 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

- "5. Air Travel for Personal Reasons.

a. Compassionate reasons, including compassionate leave or furlough, compassionate posting and emergency rotation. The Chairman, Air Priorities Board, is authorized to consider, on its own merits each such case which has been personally approved in writing by an officer of the Allied Forces of the grade of Brigadier General or higher grade, or its equivalent in the other services.

b. Leave or furlough other than compassionate. Priority rating for air travel solely in connection with leave or furlough other than for compassionate reasons is not authorized and will not be assigned except as in c below.

c. Lt. Colonels, or officers of equivalent rank and above, proceeding to the U.S. under "Leave in Addition to FITHOM" or similar scheme may be granted Air Priority when such officers hold operational commands or positions in this theater, the importance of which necessitates that they return in a minimum amount of time."
