At 33 in a letter from C-3 forwarding Draft Administrative Memorandum setting out the functions of the Civil Affairs Staff of 15th Army Group. Except for a clerical error in para. 4(a) - CAC which should be SCAC - the draft appears to be all right.

At 25, para. 3, C-3's Draft Order for 15th Army Group stated that the duties would be to advise and to coordinate, and both these points are brought in in the draft now submitted.

At 25, you will remember that the C-3 objected to the word "supervise", which has been omitted in this latest draft.

Finally, you will note that this is an ADHQ Draft Memorandum, and it still remains for 15th Army Group to put out theirs.

1. You have asked me for clarification of the position of Regional Commissioners if Phase 2 is introduced for the civil administration before Phase 2 military occurs.
2. In this interim period we should have 5th Army in charge of ground forces, the Regional Commissioners reporting direct to HQ AG.
3. The situation will be exactly the same as that in AAI Regions last summer behind the Army line. These Regions were in AAI territory and C-in-C, AAI was in fact Commander of the land forces. As such, Regional Commissioners came under the direct command of the HQ AG and rested on sub-para 3 of para III of AFHQ General Order No. 5 which stated "A Regional organization on the present lines will be maintained until further orders. The responsibility for all territory now under Headquarters Allied Military Government passes to Headquarters, Allied Control Commission".
4. You will remember that a Civil Affairs Section was established at HQ AAI under the control of a DCMAG and was at the disposal of the C-in-C, AAI for consultation. I suggest that the position of 5th Army is the same as AAI was then and that the C-5 Section of 5th Army can remain in the same relationship as the DCMAG to C-in-C, AAI. His functions and relations can be the same as those of the DCMAG.
5. When Phase 2 military occurs, there will be no further need for C-5, 5th Army. If the Commanding General, 5th Army wishes to retain him he should lose any executive powers on urgent matters which would be afforded him if he followed the precedent of the DCMAG.

1. The following is an extract from a letter Ref: G-5/1/1.2 of 3 March 1945, received from G-5 Section, 15th Army Group:-

"SB spoke to me yesterday. They had received a message from AFHQ that the War Establishments Committee were unwilling to recommend that the British personnel should be transferred from the Allied Commission to the British Increment, 15th Army Group. They had not any details and Nelson accordingly asked me to phone Brig. Henn, which I did, and also spoke to Col. Lewis-Harris. As I understand it, the position is that although they approve the suggested ranks and numbers of officers and ORs, they are unwilling to support the recommendation of HQ 15th Army Group that such personnel should be transferred to their increments. This will in no way however affect their dual functions as being on the Staff of HQAD and G-5."

2. The Executive Commissioner would like to know the present position regarding the American personnel of G-5 Section in this respect.

I -- MILITARY GOVERNMENT IN ITALY

AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 38 and paragraph 14, Administrative Memorandum Number 63, both 1944, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, hereby assumes the title and functions of Military Governor of all Italian Territory which is, or from time to time may become, subject to Allied Military Government.

2. Headquarters Allied Military Government, Fifth and Eighth Armies, will operate under the operational command of Commanders Fifth and Eighth Armies and under the technical control of Headquarters, Allied Commission.

3. Commanding General, 15th Army Group will be provided, by Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission, with a Civil Affairs Staff, whose duties will be as follows:

a. To advise Commanding General, 15th Army Group on all aspects of military government and civil administration which might affect his operations.

b. To afford liaison between Headquarters, 15th Army Group and Headquarters, Allied Commission.

c. To insure that the operation of AMG in the Armies is coordinated with the tactical plans of Commanding General, 15th Army Group.

4. The size and organization of the staff referred to above will be determined by agreement between Commanding General, 15th Army Group and Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission, provided always that its functions remain as defined in paragraph 3 above.

1. Reference is made to AFHQ Administrative Memorandum 63 of 24 December of which you hold copies. Paragraph 14 of that Memorandum states that pending further instructions the Civil Affairs Staff formerly attached to HQ, Allied Armies in Italy would remain attached to HQ, 15 Army Group and would continue with the same status and functions as heretofore.

2. The phrasing of the paragraph above referred to was a temporary expedient to cover the period until it was finally decided what form and functions the Civil Affairs Staff at 15 Army Group should take.

Military Government in Italy

1. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 38 of 8 September 1944 is hereby cancelled. Paragraph 14 of Administrative Memorandum 63 of 24 December is also cancelled.

2. The Supreme Allied Commander Mediterranean Theater of Operations hereby assumes the title and functions of Military Governor of all Italian Territory which is, or from time to time may become, subject to Allied Military Government.

3. Headquarters Allied Military Government, Fifth and Eighth Armies, will operate under the operational command of Commanders Fifth and Eighth Armies and under the technical control of Headquarters, Allied Commission.

4. CG 15 Army Group will be provided, by Chief Commissioner, AC, with a Civil Affairs Staff, whose duties will be as follows:-

a. To advise CG 15 Army Group on all aspects of civil administration which might affect his operations.

b. To afford liaison between HQ 15 Army Group and HQ Allied Commission.

c. To ensure that the operation of AMG in the Armies is co-ordinated with the tactical plans of CG 15 Army Group. This will normally be done by acquainting Chief Commissioner AC, with the wishes of CG 15 Army Group, but where time and the state of communications do not admit of this procedure, these wishes will be conveyed direct to SCAG's of Armies.

5. The size and organization of the Staff referred to above will be determined by agreement between CG 15 Army Group and Chief Commissioner, AC, provided always that its functions remain as defined in para 4 above.

I attach a copy of a draft which has been, I understand, discussed between Admiral Stone and your Deputy Chief of Staff.

This draft is acceptable to AFHQ. The arrangement whereby the DCCAO is also head of your G-5 section provides, I think, a neat solution of the difficulty. The draft does not stipulate that this combination of functions will always exist, but I feel that any attempt to depart from it in the future might land us into difficulties again.

Referring to my letter of 17 January, I have received the enclosed draft general order establishing a G-5 for 15th Army Group and have discussed it with the drafter, Colonel Charles Salzman, Deputy Chief of Staff, 15th Army Group.

As I anticipated, paragraph 2 of my draft has not been accepted, but I cannot really complain since my proposal did go beyond the actual agreement reached with General Clark.

In order that the proposed G-5 Section should have as little executive power as possible, I think the language in paragraph 2 in the 15th Army Group draft should be modified to eliminate the words "to supervise" since supervision involves the right to take corrective action. I therefore propose to use language similar to that in my original draft.

I also feel that paragraph 4 in my original draft should be reinstated even though it may be superfluous.

I have discussed these changes with Colonel Salzman and he states that they are all acceptable to him personally, although the draft has not yet been cleared by General Gruenther or General Clark. However, he states that he expects no difficulty.

If you are in accord with my revised draft, will you kindly forward same to General Gruenther with a copy to me. Since General Clark and I are both anxious to have Monfort's position with 15th Army Group regularized as soon as possible, I should be grateful for your early consideration of this question.

1. ACHQ General Order No. 5 of 24 January 1944, issued on the amalgamation of AMG, 15 Army Group and the Allied Control Commission, contained Para III which read as follows:

"III. Disbandment of Headquarters Allied Military Government, 15th Army Group; responsibilities of Allied Control Commission."

1. Headquarters, Allied Military Government, 15th Army Group (now Allied Central Mediterranean Force) is disbanded. Headquarters, Allied Military Government, Fifth and Eighth Armies, will operate under the operational command of Commanders Fifth and Eighth Armies and under the technical control of Headquarters, Allied Control Commission.

2. All Italian territory not under Allied Military Government will be administered by the Italian Government, under the direction of the Allied Control Commission.

3. A Regional Organization on the present lines will be maintained until further orders. The responsibility for all territory now under Headquarters Allied Military Government passes to Headquarters, Allied Control Commission."

The same General Order appointed the Deputy President and Chief Commissioner of the Allied Control Commission as Chief Civil Affairs Officer of occupied territory under Allied Military Government, an appointment which you now hold on appointment as Chief Commissioner.

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"III. Disbandment of Headquarters Allied Military Government, 15th Army Group; responsibilities of Allied Control Commission.

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3. A Regional Organization on the present lines will be maintained until further orders. The responsibility for all territory now under Headquarters Allied Military Government passes to Headquarters, Allied Control Commission."

The same General Order appointed the Deputy President and Chief Commissioner of the Allied Control Commission as Chief Civil Affairs Officer of occupied territory under Allied Military Government, an appointment which you now hold on appointment as Chief Commissioner.

2. Administrative Memorandum No. 38 of 8 September 1944, issued on the assumption of title and functions of Military Governor in ITALY by the Supreme Allied Commander, contains the following:

"b. The provision in Paragraph 1 of Section III, AFHQ General Orders Number 5, 1944, to the effect that Headquarters, Allied Military Government, Fifth and Eighth Armies, will operate under the operational command of Commanders Fifth and Eighth Armies and under the technical control of Headquarters Allied Control Commission, is confirmed."

3. This was followed by AFHQ letter AG 323/035 OCT-0 of 28 September 1944 which stated in Para 13(b):

"Military Government within the Operational Zone will be carried out in accordance with AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 38, dated 8 September 1944."

A forward echelon of Headquarters Allied Control Commission and liaison officers from MUSA will be attached to Headquarters AAI."

4. Under HQ AAI Office Instruction of 10 October 1944 (Ref: 5002/A(PS)) the appointment, functions and relations with branches and services at HQ AAI and Armies and Forward Regions, of the Civil Affairs Section, HQ AAI, were laid down as follows:

"(a) Appointment.

A Civil Affairs Section has been established at HQ AAI under the control of the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, Allied Control Commission.

(b) Functions.

The officer holding this appointment is the representative at HQ AAI of the Chief Commissioner, Allied Control Commission. He is at the disposal of the Commander-in-Chief, AAI for consultation on all matters connected with civil affairs in the area administered by the Commander-in-Chief, as Deputy Military Governor.

(c) Relations with Branches and Services, HQ AAI.

The Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer and his staff are available for consultation by Branches and Services on any matters connected with civil affairs in AAI operational zone.

Normally matters of policy or routine should be referred direct to HQ Allied Control Commission, if necessary after consultation with Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer or his staff; matters requiring urgent decision should be referred to Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer or his staff.

(d) Relations with Armies and Forward Regions.

Army AAI Sections and Forward Regions will continue to seek and take their general directions from HQ Allied Control Commission. Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer will, however, be in a position and has authority to give directions on urgent operational requirements."

This definitely designates the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer as the Chief Commissioner's representative at AAI at the disposal of the Commander-in-Chief for consultation.

5. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 63 of 21 December 1944, lays down

- (d) Relations with Armies and Forward Regions.
Army AMG Sections and Forward Regions will continue to seek and take their general directions from HQ Allied Control Commission. Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer will, however, be in a position and has authority to give directions on urgent operational requirements."

This definitely designates the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer as the Chief Commissioner's representative at AAI at the disposal of the Commander-in-Chief for consultation.

Civil Affairs Section at HQ AAI was composed of 6 officers only.

- 5. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 63 of 24 December 1944, lays down in Para 14 that:

"Civil Affairs. Pending further instructions, the Civil Affairs Staff formerly attached to Headquarters Allied Armies in Italy will remain attached to Headquarters 15th Army Group, and will continue with the same status and functions as heretofore."

- 6. The proper person to advise the Commanding General, 15th Army Group, is the Deputy of the Chief Civil Affairs Officer (Chief Commissioner). He has an over-all knowledge of administration and government throughout liberated ITALY, of the economic and supply situation throughout the territory and of the political situation both in Kesselring's ITALY, AMG territory and Italian Government

territory. He has close contact with the Chief Commissioner and his staff at ROME. He receives all information relevant to forward planning and current Allied Military Government. Except in emergencies he does not take executive action with regard to 5th and 8th Army AMG's who depend for technical direction from the Allied Commission.

7. An Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 could not be in the same position nor have the necessary comprehensive knowledge of the whole situation, nor, as a member of the Commanding General's staff and not of the Chief Commissioner's staff, would he be in such a favourable position to obtain personnel, supplies, transportation and all the necessities for administration which can be, and are being, provided on the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer's representations.

8. The Commanding General, 15th Army Group would be better served by an officer whose authority comes from the Headquarters of the Commission, responsible for administration all over Italy, than by a Staff Section whose knowledge and contacts must necessarily be restricted.

SUBJECT: Reorganization of Command and Administration in ITALY.

TO : All Concerned.

Reference is made to letter, this headquarters, file HSD/421, dated 4 September 1944.

PART I - OPERATIONAL

1. Letter of Instruction, this headquarters, number GCT/55/7, dated 4 March 1944, together with Appendix 'A' to letter, this headquarters, GCT/55/7, dated 10 February 1944, both addressed to C-in-C AFHQ, is hereby rescinded and the instructions herein contained, effective from 10 September 1944, are substituted.

2. a. The area of Headquarters AAI Command will be confined to the Mainland of ITALY North of a line to be determined from time to time to conform with the progress of operations, corresponding as far as possible to Provincial boundaries, and defined at the date of this letter as the Northern boundaries of the Provinces of TERAMO, RIETI and VITERBO.

b. The geographical area North of the dividing line will be known as the Operational Zone and the area to the South of it as the Line of Communications Area. The dividing line itself will be known as the AAI Rear Boundary.

c. The Line of Communications area will be under command of this headquarters and will, for purposes of convenience of reference, include the islands of SICILY, SARDINIA, CORSICA and ELBA.

3. Organization and control of AA and coast defenses will be as laid down in AFHQ Operation Memorandum Number 49.

4. C-in-C AAI will furnish all necessary facilities to forces such as MAAP, BAF, SOE, OSS and other organizations which may, under the direction of the Supreme Allied Commander, operate from territories under this command.

5. The control of, and responsibilities for provision, operation and maintenance of all communication facilities of the Army, Navy and Air Forces will be in accordance with current Signal instructions, and special letters of instruction governing particular installations or areas as published by this headquarters.

PART II - ADMINISTRATION

6. a. This headquarters is responsible for the control of General Administration in ITALY.

- b. The existing UNITED STATES System for the administrative support of the Fifth Army will not be affected by this directive.
- c. Within the Operational Zone, Headquarters AAI will be responsible:
 - (1) For the co-ordination of operational administration between BRITISH and UNITED STATES troops under operational direction of Headquarters AAI subject to policies laid down by AFHQ/NATOUSA.
 - (2) For BRITISH local and general administrative arrangements except as specifically reserved by this headquarters.

7. The overall control of movement in the Mediterranean Theater of Operations is vested in this headquarters.

The general policy for the Operational Zone of ITALY, however, is to delegate control in that zone to Headquarters AAI, subject to the reservation by this headquarters of the control of shipping, and the overall control of through movement. Instructions to implement this policy will be issued as necessary.

At Appendix 'A' attached, instructions are given in respect of the following:

- a. Delegation of Powers to Headquarters AAI in respect of Ports within the Operational Zone.
 - b. Procedure for Unit Moves within the Mediterranean Theater of Operations.
 - c. Control of Movement in ITALY by Rail, Road and Air.
 - d. Responsibilities of Director of Transportation (British).
8. In the exercise of their administrative functions Headquarters AAI will be provided by this headquarters with the necessary BRITISH administrative resources.
9. Headquarters AAI will issue such operational administrative instructions direct to Armies as may be necessary and in conformity with AFHQ/NATOUSA policy.
10. a. This headquarters will place under command of Headquarters AAI such static headquarters as may be necessary to administer the Operational Zone.
- b. Details of responsibility for command and administration of Rome Area Allied Command and the islands of SICILY, SARDINIA, CORSICA, ~~and~~ are shown in Appendix 'B' hereto.
11. a. The day-to-day aspects of general administration in ITALY will be the responsibility of the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean, ~~his~~ authorized

representatives in conjunction with this headquarters. In Naval matters affecting ports, the operation of which has been delegated to Headquarters AAI, or affecting the coastwise maintenance of the Armies forward of these ports, Headquarters AAI will deal with the FLAG OFFICERS concerned or their authorized representatives within the Operational Zone.

b. Where the requirements of Headquarters Allied Armies in ITALY cannot be met by the FLAG OFFICER concerned, Headquarters Allied Armies in ITALY will, if necessary, refer the matter to this headquarters for decision in conjunction with Commander-in-Chief Mediterranean.

12. a. Mediterranean Allied Air Forces will deal with this headquarters on all policy matters relating to administration in ITALY generally.

b. Mediterranean Allied Air Forces will from time to time designate the responsible headquarters for dealing with Headquarters AAI on behalf of all Air Force elements operating in the Operational Zone.

13. a. The Allied Control Commission, including the Army Sub-Commission (MMA) will be under command of this headquarters. The status of the Army Sub-Commission in the current organization of the Allied Control Commission will remain unchanged.

b. Military Government within the Operational Zone will be carried out in accordance with AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 38, dated 8 September 1944.

c. A forward echelon of Headquarters Allied Control Commission and liaison officers from MMA will be attached to Headquarters AAI.

14. This headquarters will be responsible for:

a. The Allied Local Resources Board.

b. The electrical rehabilitation of ITALY.

15. This headquarters will issue as soon as possible such instructions or amendments to existing instructions as may be necessary to implement the policy herein contained. Until such new instructions and amendments are issued the provisions of this letter will prevail in case of conflict with existing instructions.

16. This letter supersedes letter, this headquarters, number HSD/431, dated 4 September 1944, which is now cancelled.

Powers in respect of ports within the Operational Zone will be delegated to Headquarters, AAI as follows:

a. British Controlled Ports. Command and control of such military personnel and facilities as are allocated by AFHQ for the operation and maintenance of the port. Responsibility for acceptance of shipping and for establishment of priorities for its discharge.

b. United States Controlled Ports. General co-ordination with Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section in matters affecting acceptance of shipping in the ports and establishment of priorities for the discharge of ships.

The above delegated powers remain subject to AFHQ direction on the employment of ports for berthing, discharge and outloading of ships in connection with the support of operations not under command Headquarters, AAI.

2. Procedure for Unit Moves within the Mediterranean Theater of Operations.

Detailed instructions on this subject have been issued under reference AFHQ, AG 370.5/083 OCT-0, dated 8 September 1944.

3. Control of Movement in ITALY by Rail, Road and Air.

Detailed instructions on this subject have been issued under reference G-4 (Mov. & Tr) Mov. 3/307A dated 17 September 1944.

SUBJECT: Proposed Table of Organization for G-5 Section

TO : Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, Headquarters Fifth Army.

1. In submitting this new T/O for a G-5 Section for an army headquarters, it must be brought out that civil affairs activities in totalitarian war are assuming more and more importance. The execution of the directives and policies concerning civil affairs in a co-belligerent small nation like Italy requires 1600 officers and 2500 enlisted men. The number of civil affairs personnel in Fifth Army within division and corps areas is 91 officers and 145 enlisted personnel.

2. A staff section is absolutely necessary to obtain information concerning the territory about to be liberated, to plan the quick re-establishment of public utilities, education, industries and civil administration, to safeguard the military operations from civilian interference as far as refugees, security, pestilence, plague and communications are concerned, to provide essential items within the country and labor for the military operations, and to handle all other problems dealing with civilians.

3. The problems of dealing with civilians will require constant coordination with the other general staff sections and special staff sections in case that the American forces assume an occupational role. There is an indication that groups are planning to assume a role in civil affairs without proper coordination. (See Annex No. 1 to Operations Memorandum No. 23, Hq II Corps, dated 21 August 1944, prepared by the II Corps G-3 Section, and Operations Memorandum No. 1, Hq Fifth Army City Command Section, 9 October 1944, prepared by Fifth Army G-4 Section).

4. The present arrangement calls for a G-5 Section, by authority of par. 1V of General Order No. 42, Hq Fifth Army, 23 August 1944, but there is no staff section or table of

equipment. The civil affairs functions are being done by ACC personnel of Co. 3, 1675th Regt and British personnel from HQ ACC, who are subject to orders from ACC headquarters. The American personnel are constantly transferred. The T/O submitted is considered a basic one for the operation of a G-5 section in an army headquarters in any theatre. The chief of the section will act as Civil Affairs Staff Officer for the Army Commander and operational head of the Allied Military Government personnel. The need for a lieutenant colonel as Executive is obvious. A Major with staff experience, linguistic ability and administrative background will be needed to consolidate information of economic and political importance in enemy occupied territory, to act as Security Officer, to prepare weekly reports to the Army Commander on civil conditions and civilian attitude in the army area and to be responsible for the handling of the files and the preparation of correspondence. One Captain will be needed as Liaison Officer to civilian agencies and, in addition to his other duties, will act as aide. He must possess a thorough knowledge of the language, customs and habits of the civilians. One Captain is needed to coordinate the requests for local supplies and resources, to consolidate reports of frozen items and to allocate the frozen items. One 1st Lieutenant will be needed to assist in the administrative duties.

- 1 Warrant Officer
- 1 Master Sergeant, S.S.N. 502
- 1 Technical Sergeant, S.S.N. 213
- 2 Technicians 4th Grade, S.S.N. 247

The two technicians 5th grade must be able to act as translators and interpreters. This is a minimum needed to handle the correspondence of the civilian problems confronting the Army Commander and his staff.

6. It is believed that this group should have four (4) carbines, cal. .30, and ten (10) pistols, cal. .45.

7. The vehicles needed for daily use are: 1 sedan, 1 truck, 3/4 ton, C&R, and 1 truck, 1/4 ton.
