SUMMARY: AG Eighth Army Sitrep as at 2359 hrs 24 May.

TO : G-5, AFHQ.

CONFIDENTIAL

The following information has been received from AG Eighth Army dated 24 May:

1. The THINETS Provincial team has been concentrated today at SOVADAGGA and will move into THINETS tomorrow, 25 May, under orders of 13 Corps. All AMG markings have been removed from their vehicles and they will remain inognito until agreement has been reached with the Jugoslavians on the setting up of AG. The Provincial team have been attached to HQ 55 Area.
2. The GORILLA Provincial team has been concentrated at GRADISKA under orders of L.O. 2 U.S. Corps and will be moved into GORILLA as soon as 2 Corps require them.
3. Eight other officers are now concentrated at CEMURS awaiting call forward by Corps L.O.s into commands in GORILLA and THINETS Provinces. Two officers have also been smuggled into MURVALOON under orders of 56 Division and will set up AG there as soon as the situation permits.
4. Almost all JUGOSLAV forces have withdrawn East of the ISKODRA River.
5. VARESH GIMLA Sub-region HQ has now been concentrated at VARESH and will be moved into THINETS as soon as Military Government has been established there.
6. A revised proclamation has been prepared containing provisions of Part I of Proclamation No.1, but reverted to fit the conditions peculiar to VARESH GIMLA. Parts II and III of Proclamation No.1 and the remainder of the proclamations normally posted on first day of entry are being redrafted with the new end in view.
7. It is reported that food conditions in THINETS are deteriorating but that there is no appearance of starvation yet. An application from the Jugoslav authorities to purchase large quantities of yeast in future quantities has been refused. It is also reported that the Jugoslavs

2. The GUATEMALA Provincial team has been concentrated at GUATEMALA under orders of Lt. Col. 2 U.S. Corps and will be moved into GUATEMALA as soon as 2 Corps require them.

3. Night other officers are now concentrated at GUATEMALA assisting call forward by Corps Lt. Col. into commands in GUATEMALA and THURSDAY Provinces. Two officers have also been assigned into MEXICO under orders of 56 Division and will set up HQ there as soon as the situation permits.

4. Almost all JUDICIAL forces have withdrawn East of the MEXICO River.

5. VERMONT GUATEMALA Sub-Region III has now been concentrated at GUATEMALA and will be moved into THURSDAY as soon as Military Government has been established there.

6. A revised proclamation has been prepared containing provisions of Part I of Proclamation No. 1, but revised to fit the conditions peculiar to VERMONT GUATEMALA. Parts II and III of Proclamation No. 1 and the remainder of the Proclamations formerly posted on first day of entry are being redrafted with the same end in view.

7. It is reported that food conditions in VERMONT are deteriorating but that there is no appearance of starvation yet. An application from the Jugoslav authorities to purchase large quantities of yeast in VERMONT Province has been refused. It is also reported that the Jugoslavs are removing large quantities of machinery, spare parts, leather belting, batteries etc., from VERMONT.

8. To the West of the MEXICO the Partisans are still armed and no attempt can be made to proceed with the disarmament until the position vis-à-vis the Jugoslavs is cleared up. There is evidence that the Garibaldi groups have already hidden some quantity of heavy weapons in the Mountains; the latter are said to include captured German Tiger tanks and anti-tank guns.

As disarmament proceeds in VERMONT Province many groups of Partisans, particularly those with leaning towards the Jugoslavs are moving eastwards with their arms into VERMONT Province.

It is reported from WILSON that the Partisans are displaying dissatisfaction in so far as their relations with the Jugoslavs are concerned, and a number of assertions have been taken place. The Communists have stated that when the Jugoslavs withdraw they will join the C.L.N.

9. The question of WILSON has been suspended on account of his unsuitability for the appointment.

Following received from SCAD PIPER Army, 6 May:

Reference on 5 Army Group signal G-3 car 78, following is situation report as of midnight 4/5 May.

1. In all 3 cities military government has been established. CM are well organized, running details of local administration efficiently and anxious to cooperate with AMG.
2. Partisans now disarmed in GENOVA but still in operational use in MILAN and TURIN. In MILAN disarmament will take place shortly.
3. Local utilities running normally and MILAN has exportable surplus of electric power. Communications have suffered little damage: all trams and a few railroad trains are running.
4. Industry undamaged and factories working normally but difficulties will arise when present raw material stocks are exhausted. Wage structure is extremely complicated by variations in special bonuses, grants etc., but the general level appears to be around two thirds of that in Southern ITALY. Prices of manufactured goods are high and are at present thought to be about 75% of those in Southern ITALY.

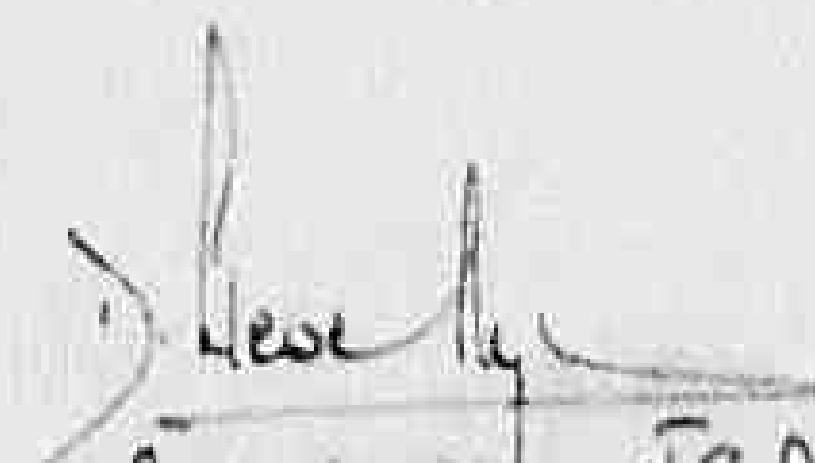

5. North of APENNINE there is abundant food except in mountainous areas, but there is a distribution problem. Food for GENOVA is being sent in up LIGURIAN coast. Some imported food has also been sent to TURIN.

6. First echelon of COMET totalling 3,100 have now been delivered to their destinations.

7. General HUGHES has visited all 3 cities but at present time the complete lack of communications makes it impossible submit accurate regular reports on GENOVA and TURIN."

SUBJECT: Sitrep - VENICE.

TO : O-5, AMHQ.

The following information on VENICE covering the period up to 5 May 1945 may be of interest to you. It was received from AMB Eighth Army on 7 May.

"This city is completely undamaged. The figure of 400,000 given as the estimated population is incorrect, and it looks as if there are only 250,000 in the town and 350,000 in the comune. This figure included 39,000 refugees, mostly from the surrounding country and North.

State of utilities is that the light and power are functioning normally but are naturally overtaxed - water supply is also normal.

There are 230 Vigili Urbani and 1,000 questura. The prison has at the moment 400 so called political prisoners who are being executed by P.O.s. There are only 30 criminal cases.

Medical situation is good, and there are 350 doctors and four hospitals with a capacity of 1,500 beds.

On the financial side the Banca d'Italia has 30,000,000 lire and the various other banks between them have approximately another 20,000,000 lire. In addition there are said to be some 5,000,000 lire in the Post Office.

The food situation is satisfactory and it looks as if there is sufficient food for two months, but, of course, there is the usual shortage of oils and fats. There is however nothing to worry about.

On the political side the CLN is working well and have been cooperative.

Patriots have proved somewhat exuberant. There are said to be some 12,000 in two factions, with rather different views. It was feared that this might lead to incidents so that their disarmament was commenced immediately. These fears appear to have been groundless, although some patriots have let off steam by firing at the windows of houses in which they claim Fascists are hiding. A good excuse but noisy. The situation is well in hand and the bulk of the arms not yet handed in will be dealt with at a Parade to be held on 5th May, in the Piazza San Marco and towards which all VENICE seems to be looking forward with pleasure and anticipation.

The following details of towns recently captured have been received from AMERICAN ARMY:

UP TO 25 APRIL 1945.

1. PERRARA (Province of Ferrara)

A commune of 120,000 of which 75,000 are now in the town. Centre of the town is undamaged, but on the outskirts in the vicinity of the Railway Station, buildings have been destroyed or damaged. The total damaged or destroyed is between 20-25.

No light or power are available at the moment. It may be possible to provide substitute plant with sufficient power to light up the town and run the mills.

The water aqueduct is broken for two kilometres, but sufficient supply is available from wells for the city.

Of a total of 10 mills, four are intact.

All bank buildings with the exception of the Banca d'Italia are in good condition. Banca d'Italia is functioning in another building and holds 55,000,000 lire. Other banks in the town, figures are given as follows: Istituto di Credito 250,000 lire, Cassa di Risparmio 4,500,000 lire, Credito Italiano 1,000,000 lire, Banca del Lavoro 55,000 lire, Banca dell'Agricoltura 500,000 lire. Post Office and public buildings are undamaged.

The hospital has a capacity of 1,000 patients, but 700 beds have been removed and of the present capacity 120 beds are occupied. A second hospital, formerly an insane asylum has 150 beds. There is no shortage of medical supplies, but urgent requirements have been sent in. In the whole commune there are at least 150 doctors. There is no epidemic disease.

No Carabinieri were found in the city, and 100 have been sent in.

No electric supply is available, but water from wells is adequate.

General health conditions are good. There is no hospital but medical kit has been supplied.

Carabinieri have been sent in as none remained on duty.

An issue of grain was made to practically all persons and mixed food supplies have been sent in.

The Cassa di Risparmio is in good condition, but all cash had been taken to BOLOGNA. Both Post Offices have been destroyed.

There are 25 Patriots of the Garibaldi Brigade in the town.

The Committee of National Liberation have been cooperative. There are no problems.

4. S. GIUSEPPE DI PIANO (Province of Bologna)

Sindaco and Giunta have been appointed. About 30 Patriots of the Bologna group are in the town.

3. OLIVANO DELL'ECCELIA (Province of Bologna)

A commune normally of 5,700 persons - now 700 in the town. 30% of the buildings have been destroyed and a further 30% damaged.

Only 100 refugees are in the town who will be returned to CASTEL BOLOGNESE.

No electric supply is available, but water from wells is adequate.

General health conditions are good. There is no hospital but medical kit has been supplied.

Carabinieri have been sent in as none remained on duty.

An issue of grain was made to practically all persons and mixed food supplies have been sent in.

The Casa di Risparmio is in good condition, but all cash had been taken to BOLOGNA. Both Post Offices have been destroyed.

There are 25 Patriots of the Garibaldi Brigade in the town.

The Committee of National Liberation have been cooperative. There are no problems.

4. S. GIORGIO DI PIANO (Province of Bologna)

A commune of 6,500 of which 2,500 are in the town. Only 5% of the buildings are uninhabitable.

There are 1,000 local refugees and a few from Southern ITALY.

No electric supply is available but local supply will be in operation within a week. Water supply from public fountains is satisfactory. The sewage system is undamaged.

No mills are operable at the moment, but sufficient flour has been milled to last one month.

No Carabinieri remained on duty.

There is no hospital, medical supplies were short, and apertand kit has been sent in.

Credito Romagnolo is undamaged and holds 120,000 lire, Cassa di Risparmio is undamaged and holds 50,000 lire. Post Office and other buildings are undamaged.

140 patriots are in the town, of the Bologna Division.

5. IMPERIA (Province of Bologna)

A Census of 6,300 of which only 500 are in the town. Only 5% of the buildings have been destroyed.

The Bank which holds 70,000 lire, Post Office and other buildings are undamaged.

There is no electric supply but water and sanitation are satisfactory.

There are two hospitals with a total bed capacity of 330. Medical supplies have been sent in.

There are 1,000 local refugees in the commune.

The food situation is satisfactory, with 570 quintals of grain in stock.

Eighty patriots of S.A.P. present but no political activity. Giunta has been formed and Commissario appointed.

6. MINERBIO (Province of Bologna)

A Census of 8,000 with 3,000 in the town. It is quite undamaged.

Food stocks and warehousing space are ample.

There is no hospital, but a small quantity of medical supplies are available.

There is no electric supply - water from artesian wells is satisfactory.

No Carabinieri remained in the town. Arrangements are being made for the distribution of Carabinieri from BOLOGNA.

8. 8. PISTOIA DI CASALE (Province of Bologna)

A commune of 10,000 of which 2,600 are in the town. 10% of the buildings have been destroyed and a further 20% require minor repairs.

The bank Credito Romagnolo is undamaged and holds 90,000 lire, Montè di Bologna is partly destroyed but holds 30,000 lire. The Post Office is undamaged and holds 123,000 lire.

12. BOCCIO MARZANO (Province of Ferrara)

The Credito Romagnolo holds 200,000 lire and the Post Office 39,904 lire.

The food position is satisfactory.

Water supply is from wells, the aqueduct being destroyed - two mills are available.

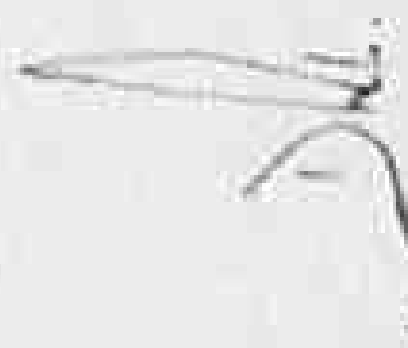

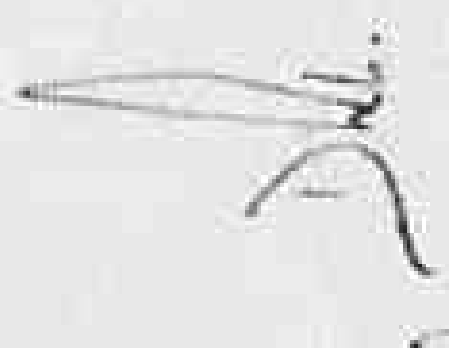

 Thank you for your letter dated 24 Sep 44 received on the 30 Sep 44. I am sorry to hear that there has been unfavourable comment on our weekly SITREP to you and would like to answer specifically your remarks on Fifth and Eighth Army reports.

Our SITREP dated 21 Sep contained a summary of a report from AMG Fifth Army for the period 11-15 Sep., which had just been received. A copy of the latter was sent to you by AMG Fifth Army so you will be able to verify their statement with reference to the water supply in PISA. You should bear in mind that PISA at that time had just been entered and the report would, therefore, have been made on a preliminary reconnaissance.

The next Fifth Army report was for the period 16-19 Sep., a copy of which you have also seen, and the statement in this that "the water supply is improving" would be based on a more detailed examination of affairs. I think you will agree therefore that these reports were factual according to an appreciation of the conditions prevailing at the time.

As regards AMG Eighth Army reports, not a great deal has happened recently on that front from an AMG point of view. We sent you copies of reports on 13 Sep and 27 Sep., the latter dealing fully with SAN MARINO. We are waiting now for a report on RIMINI.

Since I saw you last some further steps have been taken to gather still more information for inclusion in our SITREP, as we are aiming constantly to increase its value to you, so I hope you will soon see an improvement.

I am somewhat disturbed by comments passed along to me upon my return from Rome concerning the quality of recent weekly SITREPS to this Headquarters.

I appreciate the various aspects of the task with which you are confronted in compiling these reports, but it is felt here that more factual matter should be included.

It has been pointed out to me that occasionally discrepancies exist between the weekly SITREP and G-5 reports from Fifth Army. Specifically, it was shown that the SITREP of 21 September stated that water shortages in Pisa would "paralyze the city for some time", while Fifth Army's SITREP of 16-19 September reports that the "water supply (in Pisa) is improving". *see 202 para 4*

A comparison of those two reports will reveal differences which, although slight, tend to create some questions in the minds of officers here responsible for sending such information to Washington and London.

Also, lack of information from Eighth Army has caused some comment. It is realized that you are obliged to compile your reports only on the information sent along to you, and I have invited attention to that fact. However, it is felt a great deal more meaty stuff should be put into the SITREP, and that its status as a weekly report should not be altered.

Perhaps improvement could be attained by pressure on your agents in the field. As actual hostilities pass up through Italy and civil administration assumes a greater role, Washington and London press us more and more for a continuous flow of factual, informative reports. I know you will do everything you can to help.

Dear Lush:

I have just received the 5th Army sitrep No. 3 of 26-27 July. I just want to say that I am very glad the system is working. We are wiring the information to Washington and London where I am certain it will be of great interest. It is also being circulated at this HQ.

Captain Weidman reported yesterday to help us on the matter of information reports. After he has been indoctrinated here I am going to ask him to come to Rome where I hope you will put him in touch with whoever handles reports on your staff.

As I mentioned the other day I am anxious, in addition to the spot reporting contained in the sitreps, to assemble and pass back a certain amount of basic documentary material which will be useful to the War Department and War Office as background. The selection of this material should be done so as to get the maximum information with a minimum effort to your staff. It is for this reason that I think it will be worthwhile to have Captain Weidman come to your headquarters and spend a little time working it out.
