WEEKLY REVIEW No. 12.

Political : Council of Ministers met twice during week. On 3 Nov abolition of the General Staff was decreed and operation tightened by giving more initiative to High Commissioner. On 7 Nov Council reasserted that the six parties of the coalition are the expression of the will of the people and that the constitutional question will be solved by a constituent assembly. This was an answer to implications in Lieutenant General's interview with Matthews of "TIMES" in which the Prince indicated a plebiscite should come before the constituent assembly and gave the impression he thought parties did not fully represent people.

Meeting of 7 Nov approved liquidation of Fascist federale and confederale (parastatal) organizations. Among other decrees touching reconstruction is creation of sottosegretariato (Under Secretariat) for Food.

Communist President of G.L.N. CROSSETTO Province (TERRACINA Region) dismissed by general vote due to opposition to Communists by other parties.

Formation reported in UMBRIA of Union of Independent Democrats.

Fusion of Liberal and Democratic Parties reported at TARANTO.

400 in transit through SALERNO zone and 550 arriving Southern Region by train from ROME.

Aperus. 900 expected at SANI from CORFU.

Problem of finding shelter for troops now acute.

Food and medical supplies everywhere being distributed. Malaria in FISTOIA and PISA improved by increase of bread ration of 200 grams.

LIQUA tobacco factory reopened 26 October.

Marked improvement in efficiency of G.O.R. reported in FLORENCE. Transportation difficulties add considerably to main problem of supply.

ANG 3 ARMY: Reports received on 3 large towns liberated recently. CERRIA only 10 % destroyed and about 15,000 out of normal 25,000 population in the city. Supplies present no immediate problem. In CERNATICO about 25 % of buildings destroyed and many damaged but public services only partially disrupted. CERVIA is first town to be captured in RAVENNA Province. Town practically undamaged.

All military billeted in SAN MARINO have left Republic and only service units under canvas remain.

General Remarks: Serious flood CERRIETO caused by River OMBRONE bursting its banks on 2 Nov. 11 dead, 400 homeless and much loss of cattle. Considerable damage in town. Energetic action taken by Provincial Commissioner who reports flood now subsided and local situation normal. Communications disrupted temporarily and only slowly being restored.

Appointment approved by Italian Minister of Public Instruction of a committee to organize teachers throughout ITALY into small groups with general object of democratizing whole educational system of ITALY.

Red Cross week in ROME (extended to 12 days owing to bad weather) collected 100 tons of clothing and supplies and over 4 million lire in cash.

Allowances to be paid all fighting patriots, indemnities and pensions equivalent to those of Italian Army to be paid to families of wounded and dead.

SUBJECT: Items of interest for inclusion in weekly Sitrep from the CA Section.

TO: CCS Section.

1. The Italian Minister of Public Instruction has approved the appointment of a provisional committee to work out plans for organizing teachers all over Italy into small groups. Each small group will receive a series of bulletins, each bulletin containing one problem confronting Italian Education which will be discussed. After thorough discussion a vote will be taken on the various alternatives. Through a hierarchy of group representatives these grass-roots decisions will be collected, discussed and passed on up with recommendations to the Minister's National Commission on Educational Reconstruction to the effect that this plan can be made to work it will.

- (a) stimulate educational thinking of a high order among teachers everywhere;
- (b) give the minister and his commission direct contact with the thought and experience of the teachers in the field, and
- (c) democratize the whole educational system of Italy.

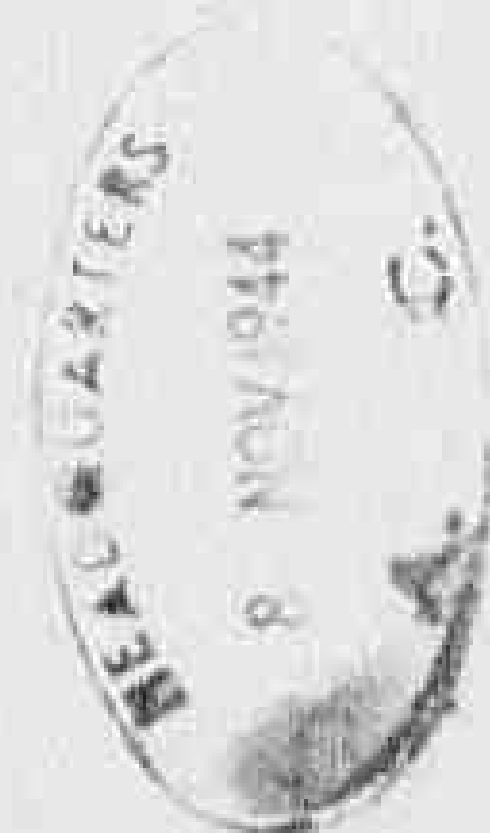

1. It is hoped that arrangements can be made to repatriate 11,745 refugees North from Sicily and Southern Region. They are agriculturalists and are required to cultivate their land.
2. Palermo disturbances were directed against the Italian troops. 9 soldiers were wounded, 16 civilians killed and 104 wounded. Situation was at no time out of control.
3. Arrangements have been made for the rations of all Italian Public Safety organizations to be increased from the heavy workers' scale to the Italian army ration scale from the 1 Nov 44. It is hoped to arrange that the additional cost will not be borne by the personnel.
4. The central directorate of prisons at Naples will be abolished on the 15 Nov 44 by agreement of the Ministry of Grace and Justice.
5. The election of a Rector for the University of Rome will take place in about three weeks time.
6. Secondary schools have held their examinations recently, and will open when available the first week in November.
7. ~~From reports on the conditions of monuments in Greece, it is possible to say that the museums and monuments have suffered practically no damage.~~
8. Representatives of the Public Health Sub-Commission, Typhus Control Unit began a tour of Southern Italy and Sicily during the past week to instruct the Medici Provinciali in dusting technique for typhus control. Small amounts of DDT powder with dusting guns are being left in each province for emergency use.
9. A school for instructing Italians in mine clearance has been opened in Pisa and two more are in the process of being opened at Spoleto and Chieti.

Progress made in ANCONA and PERARA Provinces, but situation in PERARA Province has been complicated by the large number of troops requiring accommodation. This has necessitated some evacuation and a good deal of movement of civilians in coast towns to the country districts outside. The badly devastated area of CORRIDO and in the neighbourhood round about, gradually being re-populated under the personal supervision of the Prefect of PERARA. About 1,000 people are now in the town.

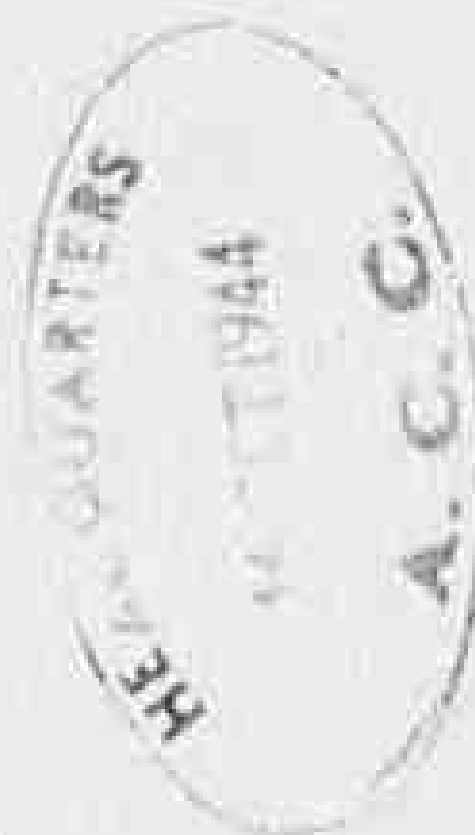

WEEKLEY SITREP NUMBER EIGHT.

Political : The council of ministers met twice during the week. On the sixth the most important measures were the presentation by Siglienti and approval by the Council of new taxes, aimed at raising the state revenue and progressive if not radical in nature, and a draft decree for turning over uncultivated land on large estates to peasants cooperatives. The latter measure is surrounded with many reservations and the land is not to be given outright but only for limited time. The meeting of the eleventh took note of the hand over of six more provinces (L'Aquila, Teramo, Viterbo, Chieti, Pescara and Rieti) to the government which is to take place officially on the 16th. Provision was also made for setting up a Sottosegretariato per l'Alimentazione (under the Ministry of Agriculture) and the question of the workers' living indemnity was postponed again to allow for discussion among interested organisations.

The press has been much concerned with the delay in issuing the decree on the subsidies for workers and has also followed the Ascolini trial (beginning the 9th) with interest. Southern Region report increased Communist activity.
