Food and supplies.....

Food and Supplies: Shortage of flour in CATANIA and REGGIO due to interruption of both road and rail services. Some Communes without bread for four days. Export of flour from REGGIO to CASSINO temporarily stopped owing to interruption of railway line beyond RARI.

General report that olive oil is not being amassed, but is nevertheless moving on the roads in large quantities. It is the view of SOUTHERN Region that the amassing decree is useless without the control of large numbers of Allied officers.

Petrol is in short supply in GAGLIANICO.

The shipment of citrus from SALERNO, mentioned in last week's sitrep, arrived at CIVITAVECCHIA. Of the 23,000 cases on board 1,500 were reported stolen between CIVITAVECCHIA and ROME.

Crime

Series of disturbances have taken place in SICILY since 11 Dec, reported to you separately. Origin is given as protest against military call-up. The move to the Island of two New Italian Army troops when completed will strengthen confidence in ability to deal with untoward events. Also moving to the Island is Montegrupo Bn as re-inforcement for Carabinieri.

An armed robbery by Allied troops is reported from SAN SEVERO, FOGGIA. No identification so far.

BITUNTO (BARI Zone) still quiet.

Rioting reported from SAN GIORGIO, SALERNO Province, over new wine tax and olive oil amassing. Seven arrests by Carabinieri.

Small demonstration outside CASSINO at RUFFI (FROSINONE). Shots were fired, two persons wounded, twelve arrested.

Health

Smallpox in SOUTHERN Region is reported static in NAPLES City and a slight decrease in NAPLES Province. Vaccination programme proceeds energetically. No evidence of typhoid becoming epidemic.

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Control Unit now operating ten dusting stations NAPLES City. No evidence of the disease becoming epidemic.

In LIVORNO outbreak of typhoid at COLLE SALVETTI is under control.

From FLOA an increase in scabies is reported but a decrease in diphtheria and typhoid.

Refugees: 2,800 refugees from the North are expected to arrive in ROMA within the next seven days.

Price Tendencies: Reports of rises in prices are general.

Wheat Collection: Total to-date: 9,938,634 quintals.

ARMY FRONT LINE: Nothing new to report.

ARMY FRONT LINE: Latest report dated midnight 11 Dec deals with entry into RAVENNA. No serious damage. At that time there were 25,000 inhabitants with an estimated 20,000 in surrounding neighbourhood. Power supply was destroyed and serious interruption of water supply.

350 patriots were found in the city and are being gradually disarmed. They are well disciplined and doing excellent work.

The Prefect had fled and the prison contained 95 alleged Fascists imprisoned by patriots.

All of the important mosaics in SAN VITALE, SANTA PIAZZA, SAN APOLLINARE NUOVO, S. APOLLINARE IN CLASSE, THE ARCHBISHOP'S PALACE, the AULAN BAPTISTERY and the ORTHODOX BAPTISTERY are practically intact. The sixth century ivory throne of BISHOP MAXIMIANUS is also safe.

General Remarks: In GENOVA City there is a serious accommodation problem due to influx of troops, aggravated by recent flood conditions.

A strike of employees at NAPLES waterworks was ended after 12 hours by arbitration.

The bid/.....

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The bid for electric power to reactivate the PRATO Industries has not been accepted on account of military requirements. The situation remains therefore that six small firms are working with their own power.

During the week 3,500 Kw of generating capacity was restored at AGRIKOLA HILLS Plant. This unit was transferred from CARLSON HILLS Plant and considered an important achievement in restoration work. Offsetting this was the loss of 1,500 Kw and 3,000 Kw generating capacity at BENT Plate Mill and LAKENHILL respectively, due to breakdown.

There has been an acute shortage of rail cars in CALABRIA Division due to difficulties created by wash outs following heavy rains. All repairs have been effected except at TURRI, where the connection to BENTON is likely to be out of action until end of Jan 1945.

A bid was accepted by ARK for the movement of 500 head of cattle, 300 horses and 2,000 sheep from SARDINIA for the re-stocking of LAKID-URRIA Region.

One further lesson shipment made during week - making a total of 254,000 boxes (10,198 tons) of lessons shipped to UK this season.

1. Region HQ closed at SALTINO 1 December 1944 and opened on the same date in the Palazzo del Turismo, Viale Dante, RICCIONE.

2. The Region has fallen heir to billets which until fairly recently were in the hands of some notorious characters. The officers' mess is at the Villa Fiva, Viale Vittorio Emanuele III which was formerly occupied by Field - Marshal KESSLERING while the EI/OR are accommodated in the Villa Mussolini. This, until the arrival of Allied troops, was the Dictator's summer residence. The annex in which his Carabinieri bodyguard once lived now provides quarters for the Company and Detachment officers.

3. PIACENZA Province moved to SALTINO 1 December 1944 but will shortly have to move again to make room for a rest camp for British troops of FIFTH ARMY. Their new location has not yet been decided. Location of all other Provincial Teams remain unchanged.

PRESIDENT: Announcement was made in AFHQ General Order No. 27 dated 18 November of the delegation by the Supreme Allied Commander Mediterranean Theater, of his functions as President of the Allied Commission to the Right Honorable HAROLD MACMILLAN, M.P., British Resident Minister AFHQ, in addition to his other duties, effective 10 November 1944.

Announcement was made in AFHQ General Order No. 27 dated 18 November of the appointment of Commodore ALBERT W. STONE, USNR, effective 10 November 1944, as Deputy President of the Allied Commission, and in addition to serve as Chief Commissioner of the Allied Commission and Chief Civil Affairs Officer of Occupied Territory under Allied Military Government in Italy vice Lieutenant General FRANK H. MASON MACFARLANE, E.C.B., D.S.O., MC., relieved.

POLITICAL:

Council of Ministers heard reports from High Commissioner of Sicily and Sardinia; declared, on investigation that recent violence (19 Oct) in Palermo was "a crime of the people" and not instigated by any individual or group. The Council also approved decrees to speed reconstruction and increase the war effort.

General Roatta, ex-chief of stato maggiore has been arrested as also his assistant Col. Bertolini.

Several parties have made declarations; the Socialists have asked annulment of the September armistice and restriction of AG powers to a purely military sphere. Other parties have stressed need of unity and working with C.L.N. The position of the partisans has been the object of sympathetic discussion by all sections of the press; it is pointed out that they cannot simply disperse during the winter since it would be suicidal.

Count Garandini, Italy's emissary to England, left for London on 20th November.

Menni, Socialist leader, visited ARSENIO 19th November but held no meetings.

Two short strikes BARI and GAROTA over carovita both settled. Small Partito Agrario formed LECCE, consisting of anti-Communist landowners. Disturbances at CATANZARO where peasants invading land under Italian Government control. First meeting new cooperative society at TARANTO 19th November.

Secretary Communist Party and C.N.L. causing trouble against Sindaco of PUGLIESE, situation under control.

Food & Supplies:

Grave shortage freight cars adversely affects transport and supplies to ROMA and wheat from surplus areas. Good expectancy olive oil crops LIVORNO.

Stockpiles ARSENIO-ARSENIO provinces to be enlarged to provide for 300 grams bread ration if ordered.

Grain amassed ARSENIO provinces spoiled by damaged warehouses.

Regularity of flour delivered LECCE-UMBRIA Region slightly improved, but general position causing anxiety.

Sugar and olive oil in particular demand SALERNO. Olive oil collection started at BARI - 5989 quintals collected. Serious lack

General issue soap and dehydrated vegetables suspended as from 1st December (except in Army areas) owing uncertainty future supplies. All supplementary rations continued.

CRIME:

Improved LARIO-UGNOLA Region since apprehension of gangs of deserters.

Gang of Canadian deserters now less active; military police operating several squads. Much contraband oil seized at FOGGIA and TARANTO.

HEALTH:

Generally satisfactory but 6 fresh cases smallpox in Sicily.

1. Following the capture of FORLI part of the Provincial team is now working in that city. FORLI is still under enemy shell fire and it will probably not be possible to establish Provincial HQ for another week or ten days.

2. In RAVENNA the enemy has broken the banks of the FIUMI UNITI SOUTH of the town and thus added to the flooded area of that Province.

3. Due to the present tactical position the disposition of both Provincial Teams and individual officers has been under review.

4. As already reported this Region is providing the staff for a Headquarters which, under SCAO EIGHTH Army, will administer the liberated portion of EMILIA in EIGHTH Army area. Formal approval of this step has now been received from the Acting Chief of Staff.

5. This development places the emphasis for the time being more with the EIGHTH Army than with FIFTH Army and with the agreement of the latter, the greater part of the Regional HQ Staff is being moved to EAST HQ. Location of Main HQ will however remain unchanged until more accommodation is available at RICCIONE.

6. In spite of the more or less static conditions FIFTH Army continue to make full use of the Region EMILIA Officers under their command. These officers are being employed both in forward areas and as reinforcements for Provinces in FIFTH Army area, and I now have for the first time, an opportunity of spending a few days making contact with these officers in FIFTH Army forward areas.

13. AFH (1) Board approved a new set of "Conditions of Employment" for Armed Forces' employees, including new rules with respect to overtime, annual leave, social insurance coverage, etc.
