SUBJECT : Visit of Signor Parri (President Italian Council of Ministers) to Naples.

TO : HQ. A. G.
(Attention Executive Commissioner).

1. Signor Parri visited Naples on the 8th July and made a tour of the damaged part of the City and the Port, after which he attended a meeting of Administrative representatives in the Chamber of Commerce at the Borsa. The questions brought up and the way in which they were put to him may be of some immediate interest.
2. Signor Parri was introduced shortly by the Sindaco and then Signor Lombardi, the President and Ing. Bertoli, a member, acted as the mouthpieces of the Committee of Liberation. They put forward certain requests for action and two main requests stood out:
 - (a) - That the Allies should evacuate requisitioned buildings, particularly industrial premises;
 - (b) - That a large part of the port of Naples should be handed back to the Italians for their own use and for the institution of repairs.
3. As regards (a) a list of 61 premises capable of giving employment to 27,000 people was mentioned and the unemployment in Naples was stressed, though the actual unemployed were given as 40,000 as against the unofficial estimate of 100,000. The case, which is under discussion by this Office, P.B.S. and No. 3 District, was badly put at the meeting, the inference being that the Allied Forces were impeding Italian efforts to give employment. The fact that the Allied Forces are large employers of labour was omitted. The actual approximate numbers of civilians to whom employment is now given, are as follows:

It will be seen, therefore, that when the Allies leave Naples and give back the premises now asked for, a balance of approximately 100,000 people will have to find other work. When it is remembered that the Allies also provide a midshift meal for their workers, the omission of all mention of this side of the problem was singular.

4. As regards (b) an insistent demand was made for a large part of the Port to be handed back for repairs and use by the Italian authorities. The possibility of such a procedure was referred recently to the Port authorities who replied that the Port was being used to capacity and no interruptions of facilities could be contemplated at present. It may be noted that 6 berths were fenced off and handed over for the exclusive use of the Italians last May. The Italian authorities will also eventually derive permanent benefit from the expensive and extensive repairs carried out to the Port by the Allies.
5. Signor Parri replied very briefly and quietly and pointed out that there were big problems of food, etc. confronting all Italy including a problem of hundreds of thousands of unemployed. He appeared to take a broad view and said there must be no division between North and South Italy.
6. The meeting gave an insight into the lack of balance of the local Committee of Liberation. I have also no great opinion of the local administration. It has been our policy to run this A.M.G. office more as a liaison office than as a strictly A.M.G. office, in fact our staff is insufficient for close control. This meeting, however, did nothing to raise my opinion of local administrative ability and it may be that rather firmer control should be exercised in future until the bulk of the Allied Forces and stores are out of Italy.

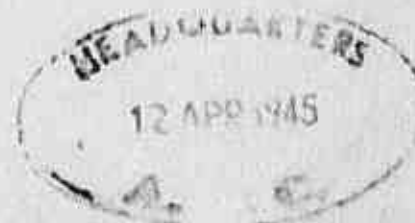
